On October 6, 2020, the KTDF Advisory Committee considered the following request from Churchill Downs with its KTDF purse structure for the 2020 Fall meet.

KHRC staff confirms that at the end of the 2020 September meet, Churchill Downs had a surplus of \$859,000. Churchill Downs is proposing KTDF purses of approximately \$3-\$3.5 million. Projections are based on a payout of 86.5% of the amount carded, daily earnings of \$106,508.

Churchill Downs will pay out KTDF funds through last place and in the event of a dead heat, the KTDF portion will be handled the same as the purse.

The KTDF Advisory Committee recommends approval.

Churchill Downs has reviewed our purses and would like to card KTDF purses in the range of \$3.0 million to \$3.5 million for our upcoming Fall Meet. We have based the range on the following information:

- Churchill Downs is estimating a surplus balance of \$859 thousand at the end of our 2020 September Meet.
- 2. Our 2020 Fall Meet will consist of 24 racing days (Sunday, October 25th through Sunday, November 29th). We are projecting daily earnings of \$106,508 which is \$33,166 (or +45.2%) above the \$73,342 earned in 2019. The primary driver is the KTDF earned from pari-mutuel wagering from Derby City Gaming LLC ("Derby City") and Newport Racing and Gaming. Newport Racing and Gaming will begin reimbursing Churchill Downs for the purses allocated from Derby City from December 2019 through March 2020.
- 3. As of this date, we have not received approval from the revenue cabinet which would allow us to split pari-mutuel wagering at Oak Grove Racing and Gaming between the Thoroughbred and Standardbred development funds. If we receive approval prior to the Meet, we would like to have the ability to increase our KTDF allotment and we will make a formal request in writing to the committee for consideration.
- 4. For the Fall Meet, we are assuming a KTDF payout percentage of 86.5% with anticipated KTDF disbursements of \$3.3 million which is \$0.2 million higher than the paid amount during the Fall 2019 Meet.
- 5. To encourage participation during the Fall Meet, we are again planning to pay KTDF purses from first to last to all eligible horses.

THE KENTUCKY THOROUGHBRED DEVELOPMENT FUND (KTDF)

Given the robust business during calendar year 2019, the state-of-the-art historical racing machines at nearby Derby City Gaming has generated \$8.1 million in KTDF for horsemen with Kentucky-sired Kentucky-breds to run for in designated stakes, handicap, allowance, non-claiming maiden races, and allowance optional claiming races with a claiming price of not less than twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) contested at Churchill Downs Racetrack.

Eligible races can be readily recognized in the stakes and condition books by the Kentucky Thoroughbred Development Fund seal, which will appear next to each race in the stakes and condition books.

In accordance with KRS 230.400(5) (d), it is mandatory for a horse to be registered prior to time of entry to be eligible to participate in the distribution of Kentucky Thoroughbred Development Fund monies. Registration is only complete once the application is approved and payment has been received.


Isofootcandle plots for the RSX2 LED P6 40K. Distances are in units of mounting height (30').










RSX2 with Wall Bracket with Surface Conduit Box (WBASC)








Surface Conduit Box (SCB) Mounting Detail




RSX2 with Adjustable Tilt Arm with Wall Bracket and Surface Conduit Box (AAWSC)

Re: Conditions of Racing Association Licensing for 2021

Copies of the Conditions of Racing Association Licensing for 2021 (the "Conditions") proposed by the Kentucky Horse Racing Commission (KHRC) staff are enclosed with the Commissioners' current meeting materials. The proposed Conditions are identical in substance to those which were approved by the KHRC in 2020, with the exception of the following additions:

- 1. Condition number 14 has been altered to include the language, "as permitted under Title 810 of the Kentucky Administrative Regulations," with respect to the administration of race-day furosemide, following the KHRC's implementation of regulatory amendments regarding race-day furosemide administration;
- 2. Condition number 15 has been added to reference the requirement that purse money be paid, distributed, or made available no later than twenty-four (24) hours after notice from the Commission that a final laboratory report has been issued, pursuant to 810 KAR 8:010.

To be considered by the Kentucky Horse Racing Commission on Tuesday, October 20, 2020:

Conditions of Racing Association Licensing for 2021 Kentucky Horse Racing Commission (KHRC)

As a condition of the issuance of a license by the KHRC to conduct horse racing during the 2021 racing year, each Kentucky racing association shall be required to certify that it will comply with the following requirements:

- 1) Each racing association shall notify the KHRC of any communication, report, or investigation conducted or to be conducted by the Thoroughbred Racing Association ("TRA"), Thoroughbred Racing Protective Bureau ("TRPB"), United States Trotting Association ("USTA"), American Quarter Horse Association ("AQHA"), Arabian Jockey Club ("AJC"), National Thoroughbred Racing Association ("NTRA"), or any state or federal regulatory agency that relates to the safety, integrity, or security of the racing association and its participants, or that would reasonably be deemed to affect public confidence in the racing association. Each racing association shall further send a copy of any such communication, correspondence, or report to the KHRC within 24 hours of receipt by the racing association. This paragraph shall not be construed to include information delivered to racing association officials acting in the capacity of members of the board of directors of the above referenced organizations.
- 2) Each racing association shall notify the KHRC any time a member of a local, state, or federal law enforcement agency enters racing association grounds for the purpose of questioning, investigating, or arresting a licensed individual. Each racing association shall further send a copy of any report related to the questioning, investigation, or arrest, prepared by the racing association or prepared by the law enforcement agency, to the KHRC, within 24 hours of preparation and/or receipt by the racing association.
- 3) Each racing association shall send a copy of any self-reporting document, form, or correspondence to the KHRC at the same time it is filed with the state or federal regulatory agency, or any other organization referenced in Condition No. 1, with the exception of any information that is proprietary to the racing association or has no relevance to the safety, integrity, or security of the racing association. The racing association shall identify to the KHRC any information contained in submitted reports that the racing association considers proprietary or irrelevant to the safety, integrity, or security of the racing association.
- 4) Each racing association shall notify the KHRC if it becomes aware of a wagering anomaly related to racing conducted at that racing association or related to a race imported for simulcast wagering at the racing association, even if a report has not been filed with any of the organizations referenced in Condition No. 1. The racing association shall provide transactional data and video of the race to the KHRC upon request. Wagering anomalies

include any incident that might reasonably affect the public's confidence in the racing association's wagering pools, including but not limited to:

- (a) Past posting, cancel delay, and other instances when wagering occurs after the horses have left the gate;
- (b) Off-shore and account wagering fraud;
- (c) Suspected manipulation through computerized robotic wagering;
- (d) Pool odds manipulation;
- (e) Quick pick or random pick malfunction;
- (f) Unusually large cancellation of wagers (especially right as the betting stops);
- (g) Outlets that are habitually late getting into the pools;
- (h) Manual merges;
- (i) Unusual payoffs;
- (j) Failing to remove a scratched horse from the pools (which would then require a re-calculation of payoffs);
- (k) Re-entering a scratched horse to the pools without approval from the Stewards or Judges;
- (1) Suspicious wagering patterns;
- (m) Totalizator or data communications malfunctions;
- (n) Substantial late ticket cancellations; or
- (o) Failure to stop wagering after the official start of a race.

The list of wagering anomalies above is meant to be illustrative and not exclusive.

- 5) Each racing association shall record the date and time (in hours, minutes, and seconds) on all live video feeds originating from a Kentucky track. Each racing association shall be responsible for recording (in hours, minutes, and seconds) the start/off time of each race. Further, each racing association shall require the tote company with whom it does business to certify, and provide evidence of such certification, to the Chief State Steward or Presiding Judge of the closure time (in hours, minutes, and seconds) of the betting windows for each race. Records shall be retained for two years after the date of the race. Records shall be submitted to the KHRC upon request.
- 6) Each of the timing systems mentioned in Condition No. 5 shall be synchronized with the U.S. Naval Observatory Clock at the beginning of each race day.
- 7) Each racing association shall ensure that the tote company and video provider are available as least one week prior to the start of the live race meet for testing by the Director of Pari-Mutuel Wagering. Each racing association shall ensure that the tote company and video provider for its live meet are operating correctly at least 24 hours prior to the start of the live meet.
- 8) Each racing association shall require its tote vendor, video provider, and teletimer provider to share any and all racing and wagering data requested by the KHRC upon request.

- 9) Each racing association is required to post policies and procedures related to pari-mutuel wagering, including the racing association's refund policy, on the racing association's website. Each racing association shall also post a notice in the racing program and a sign at the association's information window informing patrons where they can access a complete copy of the association's policies and procedures related to pari-mutuel wagering, including the association's refund policy.
- 10) Each racing association shall provide a copy of its mutuel department policies and procedures to the KHRC.
- 11) Each racing association shall have protocols in place that mandate exclusion of any receiving track's wagering pool when the racing association cannot verify that all wagers in the receiving track's pool were received prior to the official start of the race. Copies of these protocols shall be provided to the KHRC.
- 12) Each racing association shall have protocols in place and shall publicize to its wagering patrons when, as a receiving track, it is excluded from a host track's wagering pool. These protocols shall include an immediate public announcement and immediate posting on the racing association's video monitors and websites. Copies of these protocols shall be provided to the KHRC.
- 13) Each racing association that does business with any individual, person, or entity that offers advance deposit account wagering ("ADW") to Kentucky residents shall require that ADW to be licensed by the Commonwealth.
- 14) Each racing association offering thoroughbred racing shall require owners to deposit the \$20 fee for the administration of race-day furosemide, as permitted under Title 810 of the Kentucky Administrative Regulations, into the owner's account with the horsemen's bookkeeper by 12:00 noon on the day of the race. Failure of the owner to deposit such fee may result in the owner being subjected to penalties, including fines or suspension. Each racing association shall debit the owner's account for the \$20 fee to the credit of the KHRC.
- 15) Pursuant to 810 KAR 8:010 Section 19, purse money in thoroughbred, flat racing, and standardbred racing will be paid, distributed, or made available no later than twenty-four (24) hours after notice from the Commission that a final laboratory report has been issued.
- Association (NTRA) Safety and Integrity Alliance, and shall abide by the safety and security regulations set forth in Title 810 of the Kentucky Administrative Regulations. Each Standardbred association shall abide by the safety and security regulations set forth in Title 810 of the Kentucky Administrative Regulations. All racing associations shall be subject to inspection by KHRC officials, and shall be required to make any repairs or improvements necessary to comply with the applicable safety and security regulations.

- 17) Each racing association shall settle (and pay, as required) all wagering accounts with simulcast partners on a timely basis, in no event exceeding 60 days past any respective due date.
- 18) All racing associations are required to have a licensed tote employee on the premises during live racing.
- 19) Each racing association shall submit to the KHRC a full employee list that includes the official title of the employee at the racing association and the date of the employee's hire. This shall be submitted in a format approved by the Commission's Director of Licensing on a monthly basis, no later than the 5th business day of the month.
- 20) Each racing association shall report to the KHRC in writing, as required by 810 KAR 3:020, Section 11, the discharge of any licensed employee within 24 hours of the event.
- 21) Each racing association shall ensure that all vendors and vendor employees utilized for racing association operations are properly licensed by the KHRC.
- 22) Each racing association shall require that all vendors and vendor employees display a KHRC identification badge while on racing association grounds.
- 23) An association shall submit an electronic copy of the Kentucky Department of Revenue "Race Track Pari-Mutuel and Admissions Report" Form 73A100 (or its equivalent) to the KHRC Director of Pari-Mutuel Wagering via email by no later than 4:30 p.m. on the 5th business day (excluding Saturday and Sunday) following the close of each racing week. A race week begins on Monday and Ends of Sunday.
- 24) All notices required to be given to the KHRC under these conditions of licensure, unless otherwise stated, shall be provided to the Executive Director, the Chief State Steward/Presiding Judge, and the Director of Pari-Mutuel Wagering and Compliance via hand delivery, electronic mail, and/or facsimile, no later than 24 hours after the event triggering the notice requirement.
- 25) In the event a racing association does not comply with the requirements of these conditions, the KHRC has the authority to assess fines and/or penalties, including but not limited to licensure revocation.
- 26) Additional conditions may be added to these requirements at any time at the discretion of the KHRC.

Re: Racetrack Applications and Requests for Race Dates and Host Status for 2021

All racetrack applications for 2021 licenses to conduct horse racing have been received and reviewed by the KHRC staff and by Commissioners Kling, Simendinger, and Hendrickson. The applications include requests for race dates, simulcast dates, and host status from the tracks. The required consent letters from the Kentucky Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association (KHBPA), the Kentucky Thoroughbred Association (KTA), the Kentucky Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders Association, Inc. (KTOB), and/or the Kentucky Harness Horsemen's Association (KHHA) are each addressed below.

It is anticipated that the KHRC's Race Dates Committee will recommend full Commission approval of each of the following requests during its October 20, 2020 meeting, subject to the conditions outlined in this memorandum.

Churchill Downs Racetrack, LLC (Churchill Downs)

It is anticipated that the KHRC's Race Dates Committee will recommend full Commission approval of the requested race dates and schedule of simulcast signals for the year 2021 submitted by Churchill Downs. Although eleven (11) of the requested race dates conflict with those requested by a separate Standardbred track, the Commission has traditionally allowed overlap between Standardbred and Thoroughbred tracks. Each of the required consent letters for simulcasting have been received from the KHBPA and KTA/KTOB, in accordance with KRS 230.377 and KRS 230.3771.

ECL Corbin, LLC (ECL Corbin)

It is anticipated that the KHRC's Race Dates Committee will recommend full Commission approval of the requested race dates for the year 2021 submitted by ECL Corbin, contingent upon the Commission's approval of ECL Corbin's license application. ECL Corbin intends for the race dates to be hosted at the Lexington Trots Breeders Association, LLC (The Red Mile). Although twelve (12) of the requested dates conflict with those collectively requested by two separate Thoroughbred tracks, the Commission has traditionally allowed overlap between Standardbred and Thoroughbred tracks. ECL Corbin has not yet submitted a schedule of simulcast signals for the year 2021. Therefore, the KHRC does not need to consider any simulcast approval for ECL Corbin at this time. However, because certain simulcasting activities at Standardbred tracks require KHHA consent, the KHRC staff would recommend that any future simulcasting approval be contingent upon the KHRC's receipt of the required consent letter for



simulcasting from the KHHA, as mandated by KRS 230.377, if applicable to the simulcasting activities for which approval is ultimately sought.

Ellis Entertainment, LLC (Ellis Park)

It is anticipated that the KHRC's Race Dates Committee will recommend full Commission approval of the requested race dates and schedule of simulcast signals for the year 2021 submitted by Ellis Park. Although nineteen (19) of the requested race dates conflict with those collectively requested by two separate Standardbred tracks, the Commission has traditionally allowed overlap between Standardbred and Thoroughbred tracks. Each of the required consent letters for simulcasting have been received from the KHBPA and KTA/KTOB, in accordance with KRS 230.377 and KRS 230.3771.

Keeneland Association, Inc. (Keeneland)

It is anticipated that the KHRC's Race Dates Committee will recommend full Commission approval of the requested race dates and schedule of simulcast signals for the year 2021 submitted by Keeneland. Although seven (7) of the requested race dates conflict with those collectively requested by two separate Standardbred tracks, the Commission has traditionally allowed overlap between Standardbred and Thoroughbred tracks. Each of the required consent letters for simulcasting have been received from the KHBPA and KTA/KTOB, in accordance with KRS 230.377 and KRS 230.3771.

Kentucky Downs, LLC (Kentucky Downs)

It is anticipated that the KHRC's Race Dates Committee will recommend full Commission approval of the requested race dates and schedule of simulcast signals for the year 2021 submitted by Kentucky Downs. Although three (3) of the requested race dates conflict with those requested by a separate Standardbred track, the Commission has traditionally allowed overlap between Standardbred and Thoroughbred tracks. Each of the required consent letters for simulcasting have been received from the KHBPA and KTA/KTOB, in accordance with KRS 230.377 and KRS 230.3771.

WKY Development, LLC (Oak Grove)

It is anticipated that the KHRC's Race Dates Committee will recommend full Commission approval of the requested race dates and schedule of simulcast signals for the year 2021 submitted by Oak Grove. Although seven (7) of the requested race dates conflict with those collectively requested by two separate Thoroughbred tracks, the Commission has traditionally allowed overlap between Standardbred and Thoroughbred tracks. Furthermore, the owner of one of the affected Thoroughbred tracks, Churchill Downs, is also the owner of Oak Grove, and thus appears to have no objection.

Lexington Trots Breeders Association, LLC (The Red Mile)

It is anticipated that the KHRC's Race Dates Committee will recommend full Commission approval of the requested race dates and schedule of simulcast signals for the year 2021 submitted by The Red Mile. Although twenty-five (25) of the requested race dates conflict with those collectively requested by four separate Thoroughbred tracks, the Commission has traditionally allowed overlap between Standardbred and Thoroughbred tracks. The required consent letter for simulcasting has been received from the KHHA, in accordance with KRS 230.377 and KRS 230.3771.

Turfway Park, LLC (Turfway Park)

It is anticipated that the KHRC's Race Dates Committee will recommend full Commission approval of the requested race dates and schedule of simulcast signals for the year 2021 submitted by Turfway Park. Turfway Park intends to broadcast its simulcast signals at its Newport Racing & Gaming facility. Each of the required consent letters for simulcasting have been received from the KHBPA and KTA/KTOB, in accordance with KRS 230.377 and KRS 230.3771.



Complete copies of the association license applications are available for review at the KHRC office. Please contact the office if you would like to review the complete applications.

The Commission will vote to approve the license applications and requests for race dates and host status. The licenses will also be issued subject to the Conditions of Racing Association Licensing for 2021 (Item 5 of the Agenda), as approved by the Commission.

Re: Proposed changes to 810 KAR 2:020

Chief Steward Barbara Borden recommends two changes to 810 KAR 2:020.

First, Section 1(6) is amended to preclude racing associations from assigning a racing official to work in more than one (1) position during any particular race. The amendment allows for multiple-capacity work during a race in the event of an emergency. However, the amendment will prevent racing associations from making an emergency assignment into a permanent one.

The Commission is invested in preventing racing association officials from working multiple jobs for at least two (2) reasons. First, an official working multiple jobs increases the possibility of errors, which negatively affects the integrity of racing. Second, this amendment preserves the Commission's initial approval of racing officials, which almost always includes different people working in every position.

Second, Section 8 is amended to state that the Commission may approve a horse identifier hired by the association, who will be responsible for properly identifying all horses entered to be raced. A horse identifier accompanies the Commission's veterinarian and certifies that each starter in the paddock matches its registration certificate, digital certificate, and/or racing permit by examining the horse. This provision was inadvertently removed during the Red Tape Reduction initiative in the previous administration.

The Rules Committee voted to recommend approval at its September 29, 2020 meeting. The KHRC staff recommends approval.

Re: Proposed changes to 810 KAR 4:010

Chief Steward Barbara Borden recommends that the Commission approve two (2) amendments to 810 KAR 4:010.

First, Section 3 should be amended to require that an electronic horse identification microchip should be verified by agents of the Thoroughbred Racing Protective Bureau. The microchip should also be documented in The Jockey Club database, or otherwise documented in the records of the comparable authorized organization applicable to the horse's breed.

Second, Section 1 should be amended to refer to a horse's virtual or digital registration certificate. The current version of the regulation uses the term "virtual certificate." However, The Jockey Club refers to electronic certificates as "digital certificates." This regulatory amendment encompasses both terms to avoid confusion.

In addition, Equine Medical Director Bruce Howard and Chief Veterinarian Nicholas Smith also recommend that the Commission approve three (3) further amendments to 810 KAR 4:010.

First, Section 7 should be amended to require commission veterinarian approval for a first time starter five (5) years of age or older prior to entry, in order to best ensure the safety and well-being of the horse.

Second, Section 9 should be amended to prohibit a filly or mare in-foal from being entered in a race 120 days or more after the date of last cover. This is also a measure intended to best ensure the safety and well-being of the horse.

Finally, Section 10 should be amended to require commission veterinarian approval for a horse that has previously raced, but has made no starts in the last 365 days or more, prior to entry. This is a measure intended to best ensure the safety and well-being of the horse as well.

Re: Proposed changes to 810 KAR 4:030

Chief Steward Barbara Borden recommends the following proposed amendments to 810 KAR 4:030.

First, Section 11 currently allows owners to enter into the also-eligible list for a race at the first part of the week and enter the body of a race in the latter part of the week. Since horses do not race more than once a week, this practice allows horse owners to investigate both races, and then make their choice as to which race to run. This leaves an undetermined situation for the racing association. Such a practice can harm the association if the owner chooses to race on their also-eligible day. This is because the association then loses that horse on the day when the horse was scheduled to run in the body of the race. The association may not have an also-eligible list from which to draw another horse.

The attached proposed amendment to Section 11 bars a horse from racing on its also-eligible day when it is entered for a race on a future race date. This prohibition does not include instances where the horse is listed in the body of the race at a subsequent meet in Kentucky, or a race in another jurisdiction. Additionally, the proposed amendment changes the word 'succeeding' to 'future,' in hopes of using language that will generate less confusion.

Second, due to the above issues, the attached proposed amendment to Section 12(3) states that preferences shall not be given to a horse if it is also entered for a race at a future race day.

Third, the stewards recommend amending Section 15. The current version of the regulation requires scratch time to be at a specific time when there is an also-eligible list. However, the stewards sometimes exercise their discretion to extend that scratch time if needed. For instance, if it is raining and there is a possibility that horses will have to race off the turf, the stewards will sometimes extend scratch time so that all parties can make a decision as to whether to race their horses. The regulation does not explicitly provide for this conduct, and it should be amended to account for the stewards' practical and necessary actions. Please see the attached proposed amendment to Section 15(1)(b).

Equine Medical Director Bruce Howard and Ms. Borden further recommend that Section 17 of the regulation, relating to the veterinarian's examination, should be amended in the following ways. As an initial matter, two (2) obsolete references to the racing secretary should be replaced with references to the Equine Medical Director or his or her designee. Additionally, the



regulation contains an exception for a situation in which a racing secretary contacts a trainer to fill an extra race. This reference should be broadened to allow for the exception anytime the secretary contacts a trainer to fill *any* race. Additionally, the written certification paperwork should simply be due on the date that the horse is entered. The reference to providing the paperwork prior to the race should be removed, as it is redundant and confusing.

Re: Proposed changes to 810 KAR 4:060

Chief Steward Barbara Borden recommends a change to 810 KAR 4:060 Section 4 to more clearly indicate that the stewards have the discretion to disqualify either one or both coupled horses in the event of a foul by one of the horses. Specifically, if a horse commits a foul to benefit a coupled horse, then both horses should be disqualified. However, if a horse commits a foul that does not benefit the coupled horse, then both horses should not be disqualified. Additionally, in other jurisdictions, when horses owned by the same person run uncoupled, a jockey sometimes interferes with a horse in order to benefit the owner's other horse. The stewards would like to amend the regulations in order to give them the flexibility to address that situation, even when the horses are not coupled as an entry.

The attached, proposed amendment to Section 4(1)(c) explicitly provides the stewards with the discretion to address fouls involving coupled horses, as well as fouls involving horses that are not coupled, but are owned by the same person.

Chief Steward Barbara Borden recommends a change to 810 KAR 8:060 Section 2(2)(c)(3). Equine Medical Director Dr. Bruce Howard agrees to this change.

Currently, the Commission is required to sample the first, second, and third finishers in all races with purses of \$100,000.00 or more. This is an outdated number, which does not take into account modern purse structures.

This memorandum recommends that the Commission should be required to sample first, second, and third place finishers only in races with purses of \$200,000.00 or more. 810 KAR 8:060 was written when the average purse was considerably lower than it is now. When this regulation was initially promulgated, the \$100,000.00 floor encompassed only a few races per year that were outside of the stakes race provision. At this time, however, our purse structure is such that this \$100,000 floor includes maiden races, allowance races, and others that were not intended to be included.

Of note, the stewards have the latitude to send any horses to the test barn at any time. If there is a horse of interest, the stewards will test that horse at their discretion.

- Section 2. Racing Secretary. The racing secretary shall be responsible for:

- 17 Section 5. Starter.

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- (1) The starter shall be responsible for the fair and equal start of horses in a race at the scheduled starting time by means of a starting gate and bell, or other device activated by his signal.
- (2) So far as practical, the starter shall cause horses to be loaded in order of post position, except the starter may in his discretion load an unruly or fractious horse out of order or may start the unruly or fractious horse on the outside of the starting gate and one (1) length behind the starting line. With permission of the stewards, a race may be started without a starting gate. The

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810 KAR 4:010. Horses.

RELATES TO: KRS 230,215

STATUTORY AUTHORITY: KRS 230.215(2), 230.260(8)

NECESSITY, FUNCTION, AND CONFORMITY: KRS 230.215(2) and 230.260(8) authorize the Kentucky Horse Racing Commission to promulgate administrative regulations regulating horse racing in Kentucky. This administrative regulation establishes requirements for the participation of horses in horse race meetings, protects the safety and welfare of the horse, and creates a level playing field for participants thereby protecting the integrity of pari-mutuel wagering.

Section 1. Definition. "Electronic registration system" means a software application available online and approved by the commission that allows an association's racing secretary or the secretary's designee, or horse identifier or the identifier's designee, full access to horse and trainer records from all tracks in North America, including current owner information.

Section 2. Registration and Identification Required.

- (1) A horse shall not be entered or raced in this state unless:
- (a) The horse is duly registered, as applicable, in The Jockey Club breed registry, the American Quarter Horse Association, the Appaloosa Horse Club, the Arabian Horse Association Registry, or the American Paint Horse Association, or their respective successors; and
- (b)1. The registration certificate, virtual <u>or digital</u> certificate, or racing permit issued by the applicable breed registry for the horse is on file with the racing secretary; or
- 2. The information contained on the registration certificate, virtual <u>or digital</u> certificate, or racing permit is available to the racing secretary through the electronic registration system.
- (2) The stewards may at any time require presentation of a horse's registration certificate, virtual or digital certificate, or racing permit or other proof of ownership.
- (3) Upon claim, sale, or any other transfer of ownership, the horse's registration certificate or racing permit shall be given to the new owner, and any virtual <u>or digital</u> certificate shall be transferred to the new owner electronically. The new owner shall report the change in ownership to the stewards.
- (4) If the electronic registration system fails for any reason, the stewards may require presentation of a horse's registration certificate, <u>virtual or digital certificate</u>, or racing permit prior to a horse being entered or raced in Kentucky.

Section 3. Ringers Prohibited.

- (1) A horse shall not be entered or raced in this state designated by a name other than the name under which the horse is currently registered with the applicable breed registry. If a horse's name is changed with the applicable breed registry, and the horse has raced under its previous name, the horse's former name shall be shown parenthetically in the daily race program the first three (3) times the horse races after the name change.
- (2) A person shall not cause or permit the correct identity of a horse to be concealed or altered. A person shall not refuse to reveal the correct identity of a horse that he or she owns or is in his or her care to a racing official or member of the regular news media.
 - (3) A horse shall not race in this state unless identified by:
- (a) A legible lip tattoo number applied by agents of the Thoroughbred Racing and Protective Bureau, or by the comparable authorized organization applicable to the breed of the horse; An electronic horse identification microchip that accurately identifies the horse, [and] is compliant with the international standards ISO 11784, is verified by agents of the Thoroughbred Racing

<u>Protective Bureau</u>, and is documented in <u>The Jockey Club database or by the comparable authorized organization applicable to the breed of the horse</u>; or (c) With regards to a horse from a foreign jurisdiction participating in a graded stakes race, has otherwise been correctly identified to the stewards' satisfaction.

- (4) A horse shall not be entered or raced in this state if previously involved in a "ringer" case to the extent that:
- (a) A person having control of the horse knowingly entered or raced the horse while designated by a name other than the name under which the horse was registered with The Jockey Club; or
- (b) The person having control of the horse participated in or assisted in the entry or racing of some other horse under the name registered as belonging to the horse in question.

Section 4. Denerving.

- (1) A horse that has had a chemical, surgical, or thermal neurectomy at or above the fetlock shall not be permitted to race.
 - (2) A horse that has had a palmar or plantar digital neurectomy may be permitted to race if:
 - (a) The neurectomy has been reported by the trainer to the stewards; and
- (b) The horse has been approved for racing by the commission veterinarian prior to being entered to race.
- (3) A horse on which a neurectomy has been performed shall have that fact designated on its registration certificate, virtual certificate, racing permit, and entry in the electronic registration system. Responsibility for ensuring that the neurectomy is correctly noted on the horse's registration certificate, virtual certificate, racing permit, and entry in the electronic registration system shall fall:
- (a) Jointly on the practicing veterinarian who performed the operation and the trainer of the denerved horse if the neurectomy was performed at a location under the commission's jurisdiction; and
- (b) Solely on the owner of the denerved horse if the neurectomy was performed at a location not under the commission's jurisdiction.
- (4) If a horse races in violation of this administrative regulation and participates in the purse distribution, then a protest shall not be considered unless submitted in writing to the stewards within forty-eight (48) hours after the race.
- (5) If a horse races in violation of this administrative regulation and is claimed, then a protest shall not be considered unless the successful claimant submits a protest in writing within forty-eight (48) hours after the race requesting the claim be voided. If the claim is voided, the horse shall be returned to the owner who started the horse in the race, and the claim price shall be returned to the claimant.
 - (6) A list of all denerved horses shall be posted in the racing secretary's office.

Section 5. Health Certificate Required.

- (1) A horse shall not be stabled on the grounds of a licensed association or any training center under the jurisdiction of the commission unless a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection is issued by an accredited veterinarian:
 - (a) Not more than ten (10) days prior to the horse's arrival on the grounds; or
- (b) Within a lesser interval as prescribed by the racing association in consultation with the State Department of Agriculture.
- (2) Notice of this requirement shall be included in the stall application of all licensed associations and training centers under the jurisdiction of the commission and all condition books of licensed associations.

Section 6. Workouts. A horse shall not be schooled in the paddock or taken onto a track onassociation grounds for training or workout, other than during normal training hours posted by the association, without special permission of the stewards.

Section 7. Thoroughbred Age Restrictions.

- (1) A maiden six (6) years of age or older that has made five (5) life time starts on the flat shall not be entered or start.
- (2) A first time starter five (5) years of age or older shall be approved by a commission veterinarian prior to entry.

Section 8. Other Age Restrictions. A quarterhorse, paint horse, Arabian, or Appaloosa horse six (6) years of age or older shall not be entered or raced in a race restricted to maidens. A horse thirteen (13) years of age or older shall not be entered or raced.

Section 9. Fillies and Mares Bred.

- (1) A filly or mare that has been covered by a stallion shall:
- (a) Be so reported to the racing secretary prior to being entered in a race; and
- (b) Not be entered in a claiming race, unless a written release from the stallion owner is attached to the filly's or mare's registration certificate, or otherwise provided to the stewards, indicating that the stallion service fee has been paid or satisfied.
- (2) A list of all fillies and mares so reported, showing the names of stallions to which they have been bred, shall be posted in the racing secretary's office.
- (3) A filly or mare in-foal shall not be entered in a race 120 days or more after the date of last cover.

Section 10. Serviceable for Racing. A horse shall not be entered or raced that:

- (1) Is not in serviceable, sound racing condition. The stewards may at any time require a horse on association grounds to be examined by a qualified person;
 - (2) Is posted on a veterinarian's list, stewards' list, or starter's list in any racing jurisdiction;
- (3) Has previously raced, but has made no starts in the last 365 days or more, unless approved by a commission veterinarian prior to entry;
 - (3)(4) Is suspended in any jurisdiction;
 - (4)(5) Has been administered any drug in violation of 810 KAR 8:010;
 - (5)(6) Is blind or has seriously impaired vision in both eyes;
 - (6)(7) Is not correctly identified to the satisfaction of the stewards; or
 - (7)(8) Is owned wholly or in part by or is trained by an ineligible person.

Section 11. Equipment.

- (1) Riding crops and blinkers shall be used consistently on a horse while racing.
- (2) Permission to change use of any equipment used on a horse from its previous start shall be obtained from the stewards.
 - (3) A horse's tongue may be tied down during a race with a clean bandage or gauze.
 - (4) A horse's bridle shall not weigh more than two (2) pounds.
- (5) Bits shall be of a metallic alloy base of stainless steel or aluminum and may be encased in rubber, plastic, or leather.
 - (6) War bridles and bitless bridles shall not be used.
 - (7) Bar shoes may be used for racing only with permission of the stewards.
- (8) Any goading device, chain, spurs, electrical or mechanical device, or appliance, except for a riding crop, that can be used to alter the speed of a horse shall not be used on a horse in a

race or workout.

- (9)(a) Any riding crop shall be subject to inspection and approval by the stewards or the clerk of the scales to ensure conformity with the specifications of paragraphs (c) through (e) of this subsection.
- (b) Only riding crops meeting the specifications of this subsection, including the mandatory shock absorbing characteristics, may be used in thoroughbred racing and training.
 - (c) A riding crop shall have a:
 - 1. Maximum weight of eight (8) ounces;
 - 2. Maximum length, including flap, of thirty (30) inches; and
 - 3. Minimum diameter of the shaft of three-eighths (3/8) inch.
- (d)1. The only additional feature that may be attached to the riding crop is a flap that shall have a:
 - a. Maximum length from the end of the shaft of one-half (1/2) inch; and
- b. Maximum width of one and six-tenths (1.6) inches, with a minimum width of eight-tenths (0.8) inch:
 - 2. The flap from the end of the shaft shall not contain any reinforcements or additions;
 - 3. There shall not be binding within seven (7) inches of the end of the flap;
- 4. The contact area of the shaft shall be smooth, with no protrusion or raised surface, and covered by shock absorbing material throughout its circumference; and
- 5. The flap shall have similar shock absorbing characteristics to that of the contact area. (e) A riding crop shall not have:
 - 1. Stingers or projections extending through the hole of a popper; and
 - 2. Any metal parts.
- (10)(a) The following shall not be used on the front shoes of horses while racing or training on any racing surface:
 - 1. Horse shoes that have toe grabs;
 - 2. Bends;
 - 3. Jar calks;
 - 4. Stickers; and
 - 5. Any other traction device worn on the front shoes of horses.
- (b) Wear plates with a height no greater than two (2) millimeters may be used on the front shoes of horses while racing or training.
- (11) Indiscriminate or brutal use on a horse of a riding crop or any other equipment, as determined by the stewards, at any time on the grounds of a licensed racing association or training center under the jurisdiction of the commission shall be prohibited.

Section 12. Sex Alteration. Any alteration in the sex of a horse shall be reported by the horse's trainer to the racing secretary and to the appropriate breed registry applicable to the horse. The alteration shall be noted on the horse's registration certificate, racing permit, virtual certificate, or entry in the electronic system.

Section 13. Reporting Death of Horse. A licensed racing association or training center under the jurisdiction of the commission shall report the death or euthanization of any horse on its grounds immediately to the chief commission veterinarian.

Section 14. Postmortem Examination. A horse that dies or is euthanized on the grounds of a licensed association or training center under the jurisdiction of the commission shall undergo a postmortem examination at the discretion of the commission. If a postmortem examination is conducted:

- (1) All shoes and equipment on the horse's legs shall be left on the horse:
- (2) The commission, through its designee:
- (a) Shall take possession of the horse upon death;
- (b) Shall, if commission personnel are present, collect and submit for analysis blood, urine, bodily fluids, or other biologic specimens immediately, if possible before euthanization occurs; and
- (3) Shall coordinate with the owner or owner's licensed authorized agent to determine and address any insurance requirements. The remains of the horse shall not be returned after completion of the postmortem examination.
- (4) The presence of a prohibited substance in a specimen collected during the postmortem examination may constitute a violation of 810 KAR 8:010.

- 7 NECESSITY, FUNCTION, AND CONFORMITY: KRS 230.215(2) authorizes the Kentucky Horse
- 8 Racing Commission (the "commission") to promulgate administrative regulations prescribing the
- 9 conditions under which all horse racing is conducted in Kentucky. KRS 230.260(8) grants the
- commission the authority to regulate conditions under which horse racing shall be conducted in
- 11 Kentucky. This administrative regulation establishes requirements for entry, subscription, and
- declaration of horses in order to race.
- 13 Section 1. Definition.
- "Subscriber" means an owner who enters a horse into a stakes race and pays the requisite
- entry fee.
- Section 2. Entering Required.
- 17 A horse shall not be qualified to start in any race unless it has been, and continues to be,
- 18 entered in the race. Entries or subscriptions for any horse, or the transfer of entries or
- subscriptions for any horse, may be refused or cancelled by the association without notice or
- 20 reason given.

- 1 Section 3. Procedure for Making Entries.
- (1) An entry, subscription, declaration, or scratch shall be filed with the racing secretary and shall not be effective until received by the racing secretary. The racing secretary shall maintain a record of the time of receipt of an entry, subscription, declaration, or scratch for a period of at
- 5 least one (1) year.

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- (2) An entry shall be made by the owner, the trainer, or an authorized agent of the owner or trainer. An entry shall be in the name of a horse's licensed owner, as completely disclosed and registered with the racing secretary pursuant to subsection (3) of this section.
- (3) An entry shall be submitted in writing or by telephone to the racing secretary. A telephone entry shall be confirmed promptly in writing if requested by the stewards, the racing secretary, or an assistant to the racing secretary.
- (4) An entry shall clearly designate the horse entered as reflected by its registration certificate, racing permit, or virtual certificate.
- (a) A horse shall not race unless registered pursuant to 810 KAR 4:010 or otherwise correctly identified to the satisfaction of the stewards.
- (b) Establishing the identity of a horse shall be the responsibility of its owner and of any other person required to certify the identity of the horse. A person shall be subject to appropriate disciplinary action under 810 KAR 8:030 for incorrect identification.
 - (5) The entry shall indicate usage of furosemide pursuant to 810 KAR 8:010.
- 20 (6) An entry shall not be altered after the closing of entries, except to correct an error with permission of the stewards.
 - (7) A horse shall not be entered in two (2) races to be run on the same day.

(8)(a) A horse that has not started in the past forty-five (45) days shall not be permitted to start unless it has at least one (1) published workout within twenty (20) days of entry at a distance satisfactory to the stewards. If a horse has performed the requisite workout, but the workout does not appear in the past performances, the horse shall be permitted to start if the stewards determine that the workout failed to be published through no fault of the trainer.

- (b) A horse starting for the first time shall not be permitted to start unless it has three (3) workouts, one (1) of which is from the starting gate, one (1) of which is within twenty (20) days of entry, and at least one (1) of which is published.
- (c) A workout not appearing in the official program shall be publicly displayed on television monitors, the tote board, and, if available, the bulletin boards where photo finishes are shown at the time when mutuel windows are opened and shall be displayed until the conclusion of the race in which the horse is entered.
- (d) A horse that has never started shall not be entered until the trainer has produced a document or card issued by the starter indicating that the horse has been adequately trained to race from the starting gate.
- (9) If the published conditions of the race permit, an association may accept in a turf race an entry designated "main track only." Preference shall apply to all horses drawn into a race, except that horses entered as "main track only" shall be listed as also-eligible and be considered only if the race is taken off the turf.
- (10) A horse shall only be permitted to enter if at the time of entry, the owner, trainer, or an authorized agent of the owner or trainer submits a complete medical record for the horse for the fourteen (14) day period prior to the entry date.

- 1 Section 4. Limitation as to Spouses.
- 2 (1) An entry in a race shall not be accepted for a horse owned wholly or in part or trained 3 by a person whose spouse is under license suspension, revocation, or is otherwise ineligible to
- 4 be licensed, at the time of the entry except as established in subsection (2) of this section.
- (2) If the license of a jockey has been suspended for a routine riding offense, depending on the severity of the offense, the stewards may waive the application of this section as to the licensed spouse of the suspended jockey.
- 8 Section 5. Mutuel Entries.

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- 9 (1) More than two (2) horses having common ties through training shall not be entered in a purse race.
 - (2) Horses entered in the same race and owned wholly or in part by the same owner or spouse, shall be joined as a mutuel entry and single betting interest, except as established in subsection (5) of this section.
 - (3) More than two (2) horses having common ties through ownership shall not be joined as a mutuel entry in a purse race. If making a double entry of horses owned wholly or in part by the same owner or spouse, a preference for one (1) of the horses shall be made.
 - (4)(a) Two (2) horses having common ties through ownership shall not start in a purse race to the exclusion of a single entry, unless the horses have been uncoupled pursuant to subsection (5) of this section.
- 20 (b) In a purse race, the racing secretary may uncouple entries having common ties through
 21 training to make two (2) separate betting interests.

- (5) In any stakes race with added money of \$50,000 or more, the racing secretary may uncouple mutuel entries of horses sharing common ties through training or ownership or both.
- 3 Section 6. Subscriptions.

- (1) A subscriber to a stakes race may transfer or declare a subscription prior to the closing of entries for the race.
- 6 (2) Joint subscriptions and entries may be made by any one (1) of the joint owners of a
 7 horse. Each owner shall be jointly and severally liable for all payments due.
 - (3) Death of a horse or a mistake in its entry if the horse is eligible shall not release the subscriber or transferee from liability for all stakes fees due. Fees paid in connection with a subscription to a stakes race that is run shall not be refunded, except as otherwise stated in the conditions of the stakes race.
 - (4) Death of a nominator or original subscriber to a stakes race shall not render void any subscription, entry, or right of entry. All rights, privileges, and obligations shall attach to the successor owner, including the legal representatives of the decedent.
 - (5) If a horse is sold privately, sold at public auction, or claimed, stakes engagements for it shall be transferred automatically with the horse to its new owner. If the horse is transferred to a person whose license is suspended, revoked, or is otherwise ineligible to be licensed, the subscription shall be void as of the date of the transfer.
 - (6) All stakes fees paid toward a stakes race shall be allocated to the winner unless otherwise provided by the condition for the stakes race. If a stakes race is cancelled for any reason, all subscription fees paid shall be refunded.

- 1 Section 7. Closings.
- 2 (1) Entries for purse races and subscriptions to stakes races shall close at the time designated by the association in previously published conditions for the races.
- 4 (a) If a race is not split, an entry, subscription, or declaration shall not be accepted after closing time.
- 6 (b) If a purse race fails to fill, or in an emergency, the racing secretary may extend the closing time, if the approval of a steward has been obtained.
- (2) Entries that have closed shall be compiled without delay by the racing secretary and
 shall be posted along with declarations.
- Section 8. Number of Starters in a Race.

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- (1) The maximum number of starters in any race shall be limited to the number of starting positions afforded by the association starting gate and any extensions approved by the commission as can be positioned across the width of the track at the starting point for the race. The maximum number of starters further shall be limited by the number of horses that, in the opinion of the stewards after considering the safety of the horses and riders and the distance from the start to the first turn, may be afforded a fair and equal start.
- 17 (2)(a) A maiden, starter, or claiming race shall be run if:
- 1. Eight (8) or more horses are entered;
- 2. The horses entered represent different betting interests; and
- 20 3. The race is listed in the printed condition book.
- 21 (b) Except as established in paragraph (c) of this subsection, any other purse race shall be 22 run if:

1. Six (6) or more horses are entered;

- 2 2. The horses entered represent different betting interests; and
- 3. The race is listed in the printed condition book.
 - (c) If a purse race under paragraph (b) of this subsection includes two (2) horses having common ties through training, the race shall be run if eight (8) or more horses are entered.
 - (3) If a purse race in the printed condition book fails to fill with the minimum number of entries required by subsection (2) of this section, the association may cancel or declare the race off. The names of all horses entered in the race shall be publicly posted in the office of the racing secretary on the date of entry.
 - Section 9. Split or Divided Races.
 - (1) If a race is cancelled or declared off, the association may split any race programmed for the same day that may previously have been closed. Races printed in the condition book shall have preference over substitute and extra races.
 - (2) If a purse race is split, forming two (2) or more separate races, the racing secretary shall give notice of the split not less than fifteen (15) minutes before the races are closed in order to grant time for the making of additional entries to the split races.
 - (3) Division of entries upon the splitting of any race shall be made in accordance with the conditions under which entries and subscriptions were made and the conditions established in paragraphs (a) through (c) of this subsection.
 - (a) Horses originally joined as a mutuel entry may be placed in different divisions of a split race unless the person making the multiple entry, at the time of the entry, indicates the coupling of horses is not to be uncoupled if the race is split.

- 1 (b) Division of entries in any split stakes race may be made according to age, sex, or both.
- (c) Entries for any split race not divided by any method provided for in this administrative
 regulation shall be divided by lot so as to provide a number of betting interests as nearly equal
- 4 as possible for each division of the split race.
- 5 Section 10. Post Positions.
- (1) Post positions for all races shall be determined by lot, except as established in Section
 11(5) of this administrative regulation. Owners, trainers, and their representatives shall have the
 opportunity to be present at the drawing.
 - (2) The racing secretary shall assign program numbers for each starter to conform with the post position drawn, except if a race includes two (2) or more horses joined as a single betting interest.
- 12 Section 11. Also-Eligible List.

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- (1) If the number of entries for a race exceeds the number of horses permitted to start, as established by Section 8 of this administrative regulation, the names of no more than eight (8) horses entered but not drawn into the race as starters shall be posted on the entry sheet as "also-eligible" to start.
- (2) After a horse has been excused from a race at scratch time, also-eligible horses shall be drawn into the body of the race based on preference. If preference is equal, horses shall be drawn by lot, unless otherwise stipulated in the conditions of the race.
- (3)(a) An owner or trainer of a horse on the also-eligible list not wishing to start the horse in a race shall notify the racing secretary prior to scratch time for the race. The horse shall forfeit any preference to which it may have been entitled.

- (b) If there are no scratches in the body of a race, a horse on the also-eligible list not drawn
 into the race shall retain its previously established preference.
- (4) A horse on the also-eligible list for a race on the present day that has been drawn into
 the body of a race on <u>a future</u> [the succeeding] race day, shall not be permitted to run in the
 race on the present day for which it had been listed as also-eligible. This shall not include stakes,
 [and] handicaps, races at subsequent meets, or races in other jurisdictions.
 - (5) A horse on the also-eligible list shall be assigned a post position by preference. If preference is equal, post positions shall be drawn by lot, unless otherwise stipulated in the published conditions of the race.
 - Section 12. Preferred List.

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- (1) The racing secretary shall maintain a list of horses that were entered but denied an opportunity to race because they were eliminated from a race included in the printed condition book either by overfilling or failure to fill.
- (2) The racing secretary shall submit, for approval of the commission at least thirty (30) days prior to the opening date of a race meeting, a detailed description of the manner in which preference will be allocated.
- 17 (3) Preferences shall not be given to a horse otherwise eligible for a race if it is also entered
 18 for a race on <u>a future</u> [the succeeding] race day. This shall not include stakes and handicaps.
- 19 Section 13. Arrears.
- 20 Unless approved by the racing secretary, a horse shall not be entered or raced unless its
 21 owner has paid all stakes fees owed.
- 22 Section 14. Declarations.

- 1 (1) Declarations shall be made in the same form, time, and procedure as required for the 2 making of entries.
- 3 (2) Declarations shall be irrevocable.
- 4 (3) A declaration fee shall not be required by any licensed association.
- 5 Section 15. Scratches.

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- (1) Scratches shall be irrevocable and shall be permitted under the conditions established
 in this section.
 - (a) Except as established in paragraph (b) of this subsection, a horse may be scratched from a stakes race for any reason at any time until four (4) hours prior to post time for the race by obtaining approval from the stewards. Upon receiving a scratch from a stakes race, the racing secretary shall promptly notify the stewards and pari-mutuel manager, and shall cause public announcement of the scratch to be made.
 - (b) If a list of also-eligible horses has been drawn, scratches shall be filed at the regular scratch time as posted by the racing secretary. Scratch time may be extended by the stewards at their discretion if warranted. Thereafter, a horse shall not be scratched unless:
 - 1. A valid physical reason exists; or
- 2. The scratch is related to adverse track conditions or change of racing surface.
- (c) A horse shall not be scratched from a purse race unless:
- 19 1. The approval of the stewards has been obtained; and
- 20 2. Intention to scratch has been filed in writing with the racing secretary or the secretary's assistant at or before scratch time.

- (2) A scratch of one (1) horse coupled in a mutuel entry in a purse race shall be made at or before scratch time, unless permission is granted by the stewards to allow both horses to remain in the race until a later appointed scratch time.
- (3) In a purse race, a horse that is physically disabled or sick shall be permitted to be scratched first. If horses representing more than eight (8) betting interests remain in after horses with physical excuses have been scratched, an owner or trainer may scratch horses without physical excuses at scratch time, down to a minimum of eight (8) betting interests. This privilege shall be determined by lot if an excessive number of owners or trainers wish to scratch their horses.
- (4) A horse that has been scratched or excused from starting by the stewards because of a physical disability or sickness shall be placed on the commission's veterinarian list for six (6) calendar days beginning the day after the horse was scratched or excused.
- (5) Each association shall keep records and statistics documenting the effect upon field sizes of the six (6) day veterinarian list requirement in subsection (4) of this section. Records and statistics kept pursuant to this section shall be retained by the licensed racing association for at least one (1) year.
 - Section 16. Official Publication Statistics.

In determining eligibility, allowances and penalties, the reports, records, and statistics as published in the Daily Racing Form or similar publication as the commission considers appropriate to advise the public and the monthly chart books, or corresponding official publications of any foreign country, shall be considered official, but may be corrected until forty-five (45) minutes prior to post time of the race.

- Section 17. Examination by Attending Veterinarian.
- 2 (1) Subject to the exception in subsection (4), a horse shall only be entered if:
- (a) The horse has been examined by an attending veterinarian licensed by the veterinary regulatory body in the jurisdiction where the examination occurs no more than three (3) days prior to entry;
- 6 (b) The attending veterinarian certifies in writing that the horse is in serviceable, sound
 7 racing condition; and
- (c) The written certification is provided to the [racing secretary] Equine Medical Director or
 designee no later than the time of entry.
 - (2) The examination required by paragraph (a) of subsection (1) of this section shall include watching the horse jog in hand.
 - (3) If the attending veterinarian who examines the horse prescribes a diagnostic test as part of the evaluation of the horse's soundness, the results of the test shall be provided to the commission's veterinarian no later than one (1) day before the horse is set to start.
 - (4) If a racing secretary contacts a trainer to fill [an extra] a race, the trainer may enter a horse prior to obtaining the examination and written certification required in this section, if the certification required in this section is provided to the [racing secretary] Equine Medical Director or designee on the day that the horse is entered. [÷
- 19 (a) On the same day that the horse is entered; and

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20 (b) Prior to the race in which the horse is entered.

- regulation establishes the requirements and procedures for lodging objections and complaints.
- 11 Section 1. Persons Eligible to Lodge Objections or Complaints.
- 12 (1) Except as established by subsection (2) of this section, an objection or complaint against
- a horse or jockey entered in a race shall be received only if lodged:
- 14 (a) In accordance with Sections 2 and 3 of this administrative regulation; and
- 15 (b) By the owner or authorized agent of the owner, the trainer, or the jockey of another
- horse engaged in the same race and whose horse suffered or could suffer by the alleged violation
- 17 of KAR <u>Title</u>[Titles] 810[or 811].
- 18 (2) An inquiry may also be made by a racing official.
- 19 Section 2. Procedures for Objections and Complaints.

- (1) An objection as to interference or a foul occurring during the running of the race shall be lodged with the stewards orally or by telephone. All other objections or complaints shall be made in writing and be signed by the complainant.
- (2) An objection or complaint lodged during a race meeting shall be addressed to the stewards. An objection or complaint lodged after the termination of a race meeting shall be addressed to the commission at the commission's general office.
- 7 (3) An objection or complaint once lodged shall not be withdrawn without permission of 8 the stewards.
- 9 Section 3. Time for Lodging Objections or Complaints.

- (1) Except as established by subsection (2) of this section, an objection or complaint based on one (1) of the following violations of KAR Title 810 shall be lodged by an aggrieved person within the time prescribed:
- (a) At least one (1) hour before post time of the race, if the objection or complaint is based on incorrect weight allowance claimed for a horse entered to race;
- (b) Before the race has been posted as official on the infield results board, if the objection or complaint is based on interference by a horse, improper course run by a horse, foul riding by a jockey, or any other matter occurring during and incident to the running of the race;
- (c) Not later than one (1) year from the date the race was run, if the objection or complaint is based on fraudulent or willful misstatement in an entry under which a horse has run;
- 20 (d) Not later than forty-eight (48) hours after post time of the race, if the objection or complaint involves the claim of a horse or a violation of 810 KAR 4:010, Section 4; and

- 1 (e) Within one (1) week after post time of the race, if the objection or complaint is based
- 2 on any other violation of KAR Title 810.
- 3 (2) A steward may declare a horse ineligible or disqualified at any time.
- 4 Section 4. Final Determination of Objections to Acts in Race.
- 5 (1) The stewards shall:

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- 6 (a) Make all findings of fact as to all matters occurring during and incident to the running of 7 a race;
- 8 (b) Determine all objections and inquiries based on interference by a horse, improper course run by a horse, foul riding by a jockey, and all other matters occurring during and incident to the running of a race; and
 - (c) Determine the extent of disqualification, if any, of horses in a race for a foul committed during the race. The stewards shall have the discretion to include a horse that is coupled with an offending horse or any horse owned wholly or in part by the same owner in determining the extent of the disqualification. The stewards shall also have discretion to place a horse that is coupled with an offending horse or any horse that is owned wholly or in part by the same owner behind any horse that may have suffered by reason of the foul.
 - (2) Findings of fact and determination shall be final and shall not be subject to appeal.
- (3) In determining the extent of disqualification, the stewards shall consider the seriousness
 and circumstances of the incident and may:
- (a) Disqualify and place the offending horse[, and any horses coupled with it as an entry,]behind any horse that may have suffered by reason of the foul;

- (b) Disqualify and declare the offending horse[, and any horses coupled with it as an entry,]unplaced;
- (c) Disqualify the offending horse[, and any horses coupled with it as an entry,] from
 participation in all or any part of the purse;
- (d) Declare void a track record set or equaled by a disqualified horse[, or any horses coupled
 with it as an entry];

- (e) Affirm the placing judges' order of finish and suspend the jockey if, in the stewards' opinion, the foul riding had no effect on the order of finish; or
- (f) Disqualify the offending horse and not suspend the jockey if, in the stewards' opinion, the interference to another horse in a race was not the result of an intentional foul or careless riding on the part of the jockey.
- Section 5. Dispute of a Race after Declared Official for Parimutuel[Parimutuel] Payoff.

SUBJECT: EIPH scoping study proposal

The changes in the furosemide administration regulations for two-year olds in 2020 and in Stakes horses in 2021 have made it clear that evaluation of the airways of these groups of horses is very important. It is also imperative that we obtain this information in an unbiased manner and contribute to ongoing research regarding EIPH.

The study proposed by Dr. Bayly will allow us to obtain the information about the prevalence and severity of EIPH in these groups of horses as well as be a part of a larger nationwide study which will examine the immune system response to exercise in 2 year-old racehorses.

Dr. Bayly's proposal is based on 3 participants and 70 horses in each category. We currently have 7 participants committed to the project. There are several more groups in talks with the organizers which will likely participate at some level. A commitment of no more than \$30,000.00 will cover the costs of obtaining the equipment, collecting samples and analyzing data for the Kentucky 2 year-olds which we desire. We anticipate as more groups come on board this cost will be reduced for each participant.

The EDRC, at its October 9th, 2020 meeting unanimously approved funding of this project, not to exceed \$30,000.00.

We feel that this study is an integral part of understanding EIPH and evaluating the impact changes in furosemide administration may have.

The staff at the KHRC recommends approval.





Inflammatory Gene Expression Analysis

- Measuring differences in whole-blood messenger RNA (mRNA) markers
- Avoid supply chain issues with equinespecific protein quantification
- ► PCR analysis of mRNA expression is highly sensitive and specific
- Changes in inflammatory markers take hours to be detectable
 - Samples taken immediately post-injury likely reflect the pre-race status

Hypothesis and Goals

- ► <u>Hypothesis</u>: Thoroughbred racehorses that experience a catastrophic (fatal) injury while racing will have evidence of increased inflammation when compared to non-injured controls
- ► Goal was to enroll:
 - ▶ 150 catastrophically injured horses
 - ▶ 300 post-race controls (matched to injured horses)
 - ~700 pre-race controls (general racing population)

Quick Study Facts

- ► Participants:
 - ► 4 state jurisdictions
 - ▶ 1 race track
- ▶ Out of 1055 total samples:
 - ▶ 107 horses with catastrophic injuries
 - ► 374 pre-race control samples
 - ▶ 205 post-race control samples

Racing Effect on Inflammation

- Previous work with horses has shown inflammatory changes take hours in response to exercise
- Used paired pre-race and post-race samples from the same horses to evaluate the effect of racing on mRNA markers
- ► Eliminated 12 markers from our analysis due to racerelated effects
- ▶ Of the remaining 9 markers, 3 markers show promise with regards to identifying horses at risk for catastrophic injury

Individual Markers of Interest

Insulin-like Growth Factor 1 (IGF-1)

- Growth Hormone
- Increased in CI horses
- Role in bone development and repair
- Previously shown to decrease during early inflammation before increasing

Matrix Metalloproteinase-2

- Increased in CI horses
- Important for tissue repair
- Shown to play an important role in fracture remodeling



- Also known as IRAP
- Potent anti-inflammatory
- Decreased in CI horses

- All three markers combined
- Sensitivity- 76%= 24% false negative rate
- Specificity- 88%= 12% false positive rate
- Accuracy ~88%

Date Preference System

The following date system of preference is used at Turfway Park:

Foal certificates no longer are required to be on file in the racing office to enter or start at Turfway Park; however, foal certificates must be on file to obtain a preference date and to have a horse tattooed.

Each day's overnight will list the dates of horses in and on the also-eligible list to enable trainers to see what dates are getting horses into over-filled races.

- 1. In over-filled races, preference will be given to horses in order of their assigned preference dates, earliest date first. Horses having identical dates will be chosen by lot; however, where entry and running dates are the same, the horse with the entry date will have preference.
- 2. All horses intended for racing at Turfway Park will be assigned a preference date. A horse can have only one date at any particular time. Dates assigned will be of two types:

E-Date

This date will correspond to: (a) the date on which a horse's foal papers and name card are submitted to the Identifier (the earliest date being the day when entries are first taken for the meeting); (b) the day on which a horse is first entered if his papers are not on file with the Identifier. To qualify for the latter E-Date, a horse must have been excluded from a race that appears on the overnight or he must have been entered in a condition book race that failed to fill through insufficient entries.

R-Date

This date will correspond to the day of a horse's most recent race at Turfway Park. An R-Date will also

be assigned to a horse that scratches, providing the foal papers are on file with the identifier.

- 3. A horse retains his R-Date until he receives a newer R-Date. No horse with an established R-Date may receive an E-Date. A horse whose papers are removed from the Identifier's office will lose his date and must subsequently re-establish a date in order to receive preference. A horse with an E-Date cannot receive a newer E-Date. Horses starting at another racetrack will forfeit any date they may have at Turfway Park. Additionally, horses racing at Turfway Park without foal papers on site will not retain their R-Date.
- 4. Preference dates are good for any type of race or distance (other than maiden dates).
- 5. Maiden dates will be kept separately and will not have preference in winners' races.
- 6. No E-Date will be assigned to the second choice of an un-split same-owner entry.
- 7. A horse that has been placed on a list (Veterinarian, Steward, Starter, or Paddock Judge) will lose his date and be assigned an R-Date corresponding to the day he is removed from the list.
- 8. Horses on the Also-Eligible list shall be permitted to draw into races and will be assigned post positions in the order of their dates, earliest dates first.
- 9. A horse that is a scheduled starter in a canceled race will not receive an R-Date for that race but will retain his previous date.
- 10. The draw of stake and handicap races is not subject to date preference.
- 11. Preference dates are transferred through change in ownership and changes in trainer only after the proper transfer procedures have been completed through the Stewards' Office and delivered to the Racing Secretary's Office.
- 12. Date preference rules will not supersede KHRC rules regarding preference, eligibility, or scratches.
