On May 24, the KHRC & the KTDF Committee received the following letter from Churchill Downs seeking an increase in KTDF distributions for the remainder of the Spring Meet (May 30-June 29). The request to increase KTDF purses relates to an increase in dollars generated at Derby City Gaming and a beginning surplus of nearly \$230,000.

Pursuant to KRS 230.230(1), KHRC Executive Director Marc Guilfoil granted conditional approval on May 28, 2019 and the commission is asked to ratify this approval.

Committee Members:

In our letter dated January 17, 2019 to the committee, Churchill Downs requested to card KTDF purses in the range of \$3.0 million to \$3.6 million for the Spring Meet. As a result of better than expected pari-mutuel wagering at Derby City Gaming, Churchill Downs has reviewed our purses for the second condition book (May 30th through June 29th). We would like to card KTDF purses of \$3.4 million which would increase carded KTDF purses to \$4.9 million for the entire Spring Meet. We have based our increase on the following information –

1. Churchill Downs had a surplus balance of \$228,546 at the end of our 2018 Fall Meet.
2. Derby City Gaming has generated \$3.3 million in KTDF from November 26, 2018 through May 19, 2019.
3. Churchill Downs Racetrack has generated \$334 thousand in KTDF from April 27, 2019 through May 19, 2019 ... this does not include the KTDF earned from the other tracks.
4. Given current business trends at Derby City Gaming, we expect to generate another \$750 thousand to \$850 thousand from May 20, 2019 through June 29, 2019 (end of the Spring Meet).
5. For the Spring 2019 Meet, we are assuming a KTDF payout percentage of 89% with an anticipated KTDF disbursement of \$4.4 million.

Re: Request by Churchill Downs to Approve Twenty Additional Ainsworth Game Technology Historical Horse Racing Pools

On June 6, 2019, the Kentucky Horse Racing Commission (“Commission”) received a letter from Churchill Downs seeking approval of 20 additional pari-mutuel wagering pools operated by the technology provider Ainsworth Game Technology (“Ainsworth”). The requested pools and associated entertaining game themes are as follows:

BMM Testlabs (“BMM”), one of the independent, third-party testing lab that provides contractual services for the Commission, has tested the requested pools. Commission staff has reviewed the compliance reports produced by BMM and believes that the additional wagering pools comply with all relevant Kentucky statutes and regulations. All BMM reports for these pools will be forwarded to the Commission members prior to the meeting for review.



The letter from Derby City Gaming also requests updates to the Ainsworth wagering server software. These requests are as follows:

- Update the HHR Wagering System Central Server from v9.0.1.3134 to v9.0.1.139
- Update the BGGame Terminal Software from v9.0.1.148 to v9.0.1.166
- Update the HHR Management Terminal Software from v9.0.1.143 to v9.0.1.147

These system updates correct a number of minor issues that have been discovered in the system software. In addition, the updates provide support for Dynamic Allocation of funds to prize pools to better manage the pool balance for each historical horse racing pari-mutuel wagering pool. BMM Testlabs has tested these software modifications for statutory and regulatory compliance. Details on these modifications can be found in the BMM Report AINS16371, which will be emailed to all commissioners in a separate document.

Commission staff believes that the current initial seed pool amount for the Derby City Gaming property is sufficient to operate these additional pari-mutuel wagering pools and that no adjustment is required to the initial seed pool amount at this time. Commission staff will continue to monitor the initial seed pool to ensure that the amount remains sufficient.

If approved, Churchill Downs staff would be required to submit a final floor layout and pool commingling that includes these wagering pools to Commission staff for review and approval prior to the final reconfiguration. Churchill Downs staff would also be required to submit documents detailing when all system updates will be performed so that Commission staff can test the software after installation.

After a thorough review of this request, Commission staff recommends approval of the 20 additional historical horse racing pari-mutuel wagering pools operated by Ainsworth Game Technology and the three system updates requested by Churchill Downs.

RE: Request to the Kentucky Horse Racing Commission (the “Commission”) to offer entertaining game themes (pari-mutuel wagering pools) at the Derby City Gaming Historical Horse Racing Facility.

Dear Mr. Guilfoil:

As you know, on July 17, 2018 and August 21, 2018, the Kentucky Horse Racing Commission (“Commission”) approved Churchill Downs Racetrack, by and through its wholly owned subsidiary Derby City Gaming, LLC, to offer exotic wagers on historical horse races at our Derby City Gaming location at 4520 Poplar Level Road, Louisville, KY 40213 (previously referred to as Trackside). At the same time, the Commission approved the Ainsworth Game Technology Historical Horse Racing Pari-Mutuel Wagering System (the “Ainsworth System”), along with sixty-four (64) entertaining game themes, all of which had been evaluated and certified by an approved independent testing lab. In subsequent meetings the Commission has approved an additional eight (8) entertaining game themes bringing our current total offering to seventy-two (72) game themes.

Derby City Gaming respectfully requests the Commission’s approval of the following additional entertaining game themes to be offered at our Historical Horse Racing Facility at our Derby City Gaming location at 4520 Poplar Level Road, Louisville, KY 40213. In the case that the game theme shares its math with another game theme it will be noted in parenthesis.

- Gates of Olympus v 2018.12.13.8 (Shared with Arctic Explorer, Existing)
- Pac Man Dynamic Edition v 2019.4.8.8

Keeneland/Red Mile (“KRM”) has submitted a request to offer PariMAX Version 3.15.1 pari-mutuel system exotic wagering pools. KRM currently has 902 historical horse racing terminals, of which approximately 615 terminals are currently using the PariMAX system. If PariMAX Version 3.15.1 is approved, KRM will be required to submit an exact floor layout and a list of the terminals that will offer wagering on the PariMAX Version 3.15.1 for KHRC staff review and approval.

The PariMAX system is operated by PariMAX Holdings, LLC (“PariMAX”), a division of AmTote International, LLC (“AmTote”). AmTote is currently one of the two providers of historical horse racing pools at KRM. PariMAX currently offers similar exotic wagering pools in Alabama, Oregon, and Wyoming. Prior to KRM submitting this request, PariMAX Version 3.15.1 underwent testing at Gaming Laboratories International (“GLI”), one of the independent, third-part testing laboratories under contract with the KHRC.

GLI has reviewed PariMAX Version 3.15.1 and affirms that the system complies with all applicable Kentucky statutes and regulations. The GLI report for PariMAX Version 3.15.1¹ will be sent to all commissioners prior to the meeting for review.

If approved by the KHRC, KRM and PariMAX staff will transition the affected wagering terminals to the appropriate wagering pools in a secure manner and with guidance from KHRC staff.

PariMAX Version 3.15.1 includes the following updates to the PariMAX wagering system:

- The "Zeus: Lightning Strike" game theme has been discontinued from the group of games offered as part of the "P6.P3P5_Plus.P2P5_Plus" wager profile and has been replaced with the "Nimbus Strike" game theme.
- The "Splendor of the Sphinx" game theme has been discontinued from the group of games offered as part of the "P6.P3P5_Plus.P2P5_Plus" wager profile and has been replaced with the "Egyptian Splendor" game theme.
- The "Quick Pick Diamonds" game theme has been discontinued from the group of games offered as part of the "P6.P3P5_Plus.P2P5_Plus_QPP" wager profile and has been replaced with the "Scattered Diamonds" game theme.
- A disclaimer has been added to the 'Pick Until You Match 3' bonus in the previously tested "The Great Jackpot" game theme to better explain the functionality of the "Wild +5" symbol within the bonus.

KHRC staff is scheduled to perform on-site testing of this new pool the week of June 3-7, 2019 at KRM and will report any abnormal findings at the KHRC meeting. The testing will be conducted to ensure that the pool functioned as described and that the payouts complied with the documentation provided to the KHRC and to GLI.

KHRC staff recommends approval of the Keeneland/Red Mile request to authorize PariMAX Version 3.15.1 and the exotic wagering pools and entertaining game themes associated with Version 3.15.1 with the following conditions:

- 1) The “Higher Jackpot” option for all PariMAX wager profiles shall not be implemented without prior written approval of the Kentucky Horse Racing Commission.
- 2) Similar to the approval granted in April 2019, the configurable options in previous PariMAX versions shall not be implemented without prior written approval of the Kentucky Horse Racing Commission.

At the meeting on June 18, 2019, the Commission will consider the application of Ellis Entertainment, LLC for a license to conduct horse racing at Ellis Park Race Course in Henderson, Kentucky. Ellis Entertainment is a Kentucky Limited Liability Company and is solely owned by a holding company which in turn is solely owned by Laguna Development Corporation ("LDC"). LDC is a federally chartered corporation that acts as the business development arm of the Pueblo of Laguna. LDC owns several business interests, including restaurants, gas stations, and three casino properties in New Mexico. The Pueblo of Laguna is a federally recognized Native American tribe located in New Mexico.

Ellis Park is currently owned by Ellis Park Race Course, LLC, a subsidiary of Saratoga Hospitality and Casino, LLC. If the license is awarded by the Commission to Ellis Entertainment, Ellis Entertainment will purchase the assets of Ellis Park Race Course, and will thereby become the sole owner of Ellis Park Race Course. Saratoga Hospitality and Casino will surrender its license upon the closing of the transaction if Ellis Entertainment's application is approved

As part of its application, Ellis Entertainment is requesting approval of a total of 1200 Historical Horse Racing machines.

Ellis Entertainment will utilize its own capital for the acquisition, and no debt financing will be required. Background checks have been conducted on the directors and key officers of LDC and Ellis Entertainment and have revealed nothing of concern. The Commission staff have reviewed the application and supplemental information provided by Ellis Entertainment. The applicant has complied



with the statutory and regulatory requirements for filing an application for a license to conduct horse racing.

Behind this memo is a copy of Ellis Entertainment's application, along with a business organization chart. Additional materials including the asset purchase agreement are available for your review.

Representatives of Ellis Entertainment will be present at the Commission meeting to make a presentation concerning this matter and to respond to any questions that the Commissioners may have.

Re: *WKY Development's Request to Amend Section O of its 2019 Application to Conduct Live Horse Racing, Simulcasting and Pari-Mutuel Wagering to Shift Race Dates*

In its application for a 2019 license, WKY Development, LLC sought an award of twelve days of standardbred racing, spread over six weeks with two days of racing each week, beginning in October 2019. This racing will be conducted at a facility to be built in Oak Grove, Kentucky. At a special meeting on October 30, 2018, the Commission awarded twelve days of racing to WKY, contingent on the subsequent issuance of a license to WKY. At a special meeting on November 16, 2019, WKY was awarded a license for its proposed Oak Grove Facility.

On May 31, 2019, WKY filed a request to amend its 2019 application to shift the days on which its racing will be conducted. A copy of that request is included in the materials after this memorandum. Specifically, the request seeks to shift WKY's racing so that races are held Friday, Saturday, and Sunday for four weeks, beginning On October 18, 2019. The request does **not** seek to alter the number of race dates in any way.

The legal staff have reviewed the request and believe it comports with the applicable statutes and regulations. Although the award of additional race dates to a track after the November 1 deadline is not allowed under KRS 230.300(5), except in limited circumstances not applicable here,¹ that is not what WKY seeks. Instead, WKY seeks only to shift dates that have

¹ This reading of the statute is confirmed by two Attorney General Opinions. *See* 1980-1981 Ky. Op. Att'y Gen. 2-883 (1981) ("[I]t is not within the scope of authority of the Kentucky State Racing Commission to award additional racing dates to [a track] in absence of the cancellation of previously scheduled dates due to flood, fire, or inclement weather or an extraordinary disruption of the orderly conduct of business amounting to the same crisis level as a natural disaster."); 1978-1979 Ky. Op. Att'y Gen. 2-539 (1979) ("By fixing the March 1 deadline the

already been awarded. Although such requests have been infrequent, the Commission has traditionally allowed race dates to be shifted if the request is received and approved before the racing on the date is held.² We believe that such action does not constitute the award of race dates, and is thus not barred by the November 1 deadline in KRS 230.300.

The concern that drives the statutory time limit on awarding race dates—“to prevent ongoing battles for dates,” 1978-1979 Ky. Op. Att’y Gen. 2-539 (1979)—is not present here. WKY has already been awarded twelve days of racing for 2019, and the shifted dates will still fall within the same period (mid-October to early November) in which the dates were originally awarded. Also, the shifted dates will not conflict with those held by another harness track. The shifted dates will overlap with racing days for two thoroughbred tracks, but the Commission has traditionally allowed overlap between standardbred and thoroughbred tracks. Moreover, the affected thoroughbred tracks, Keeneland and Churchill Downs, are the owners of WKY, and thus appear to have no objection.

legislature has clearly demonstrated its intent that the Commission shall decide who shall be awarded what dates by that time, and that, under ordinary circumstances, that decision shall be final.”). Indeed, one of those opinions suggests that the award of additional race dates could have dire consequences: “For, if the Commission were to award dates which were obviously unrelated to the purpose of making up for regular scheduled dates which were cancelled, [the track] would be potentially liable not only for maintaining a public nuisance and for promoting illegal gambling activity, but there is also authority to the effect that [the track] would be civilly liable to patrons for the amount of bets placed and lost if it was in fact operating under a license which is invalid under the statute.” 1978-1979 Ky. Op. Att’y Gen. 2-539 (1979).

² A review of the readily available Commission records shows that in June 2012, Kentucky Downs was allowed to shift two race dates (from Tuesdays to Wednesdays). Executive Director Guilfoil believes that Red Mile was allowed a similar shift some years ago, though we have not been able to establish exactly when this occurred.

Re: Churchill Downs' Request to Amend Section P of Its 2019 Application to add to the track a non-contiguous leased facility at the Louisville Thoroughbred Society and to offer simulcast pari-mutuel wagering at the leased facility.

At the regular meeting on June 18, 2019, the Commission will address Churchill Downs' request to amend its association license application (approved last year at the October 16, 2018 meeting) to establish a non-contiguous leased facility at the Louisville Thoroughbred Society. Churchill Downs is also requesting to offer simulcast pari-mutuel wagering at the facility.

The Louisville Thoroughbred Society is located 209 E. Main St., Louisville, KY 40202. It is a private, members-only club oriented toward thoroughbred enthusiasts and their guests.

Churchill Downs will lease an area inside the building where it will accept simulcast wagers. Specifically, Churchill Downs intends to place up to twelve self-service pari-mutuel terminals in the leased area.

The Louisville Thoroughbred Society is wholly owned by Louisville Thoroughbred Society, LLC. The principals and members of the LLC are:

- Gene McLean (currently licensed in Kentucky as an owner)
- Mike Schnell (currently licensed in Kentucky as an owner)
- David Steinbrecher

Background checks are being performed on the three members of the LLC, but results have not yet been received.



Churchill Downs has submitted revisions to its 2019 licensing application outlining the wagering to be offered at the Louisville Thoroughbred Society and adding the leased premises to the legal description of the site of the track. A copy of the request letter and the revised application pages are included in the materials.

Churchill Downs also submitted a seven-page presentation with additional details of the facility, including photos and a floorplan. A copy of this presentation is included with the materials.

Churchill Downs has also provided a copy of the lease agreement between it and Louisville Thoroughbred Society, along with the standard operating procedures that will control operations of the simulcast wagering at Louisville Thoroughbred Society. These materials are available for your review at the Commission's main office.

Churchill Downs seeks to include the leased portion of the Louisville Thoroughbred Society as part of its license track. This is permitted under statute. Specifically, KRS 230.210 defines a "track" as follows:

(22) "Track" means any association duly licensed by the Kentucky Horse Racing Commission to conduct horse racing. **"Track" shall include any facility or real property that is owned, leased, or purchased by a track within the same geographic area within a sixty (60) mile radius of a track but not contiguous to track premises, upon racing commission approval,** and provided the noncontiguous property is not within a sixty (60) mile radius of another licensed track premise where live racing is conducted and not within a forty (40) mile radius of a simulcast facility, unless any affected track or simulcast facility agrees in writing to permit a noncontiguous facility within the protected geographic area.

(Emphasis added.)

The premises at Louisville Thoroughbred Society are to be leased by Churchill Downs and are within 60 miles of Churchill Downs' main facility. Thus, to constitute a portion of the "track," all that remains is Commission approval.

Any approval should be contingent on the Commissions' receipt of completed, acceptable background checks on the Louisville Thoroughbred Society' principals.

Dear Mr. Guilfoil and Members of the Commission:

Churchill Downs Racetrack ("Churchill Downs") is an association duly licensed by the Kentucky Horse Racing Commission ("Commission") to conduct horse racing and offer pari-mutuel wagering thereon. Pursuant to this license and Kentucky Revised Statute ("KRS") 230.361, Churchill Downs is permitted to conduct pari-mutuel wagering only upon its "licensed premises".

Churchill Downs' current "licensed premises" are described in its License to Conduct Live Horse Racing, Simulcasting, and Pari-Mutuel Wagering. Churchill Downs desires to modify the description of its licensed premises to include certain locations within the Louisville Thoroughbred Society, at 209 East Main Street, Louisville, KY 40202. A copy of the letter requesting amendment of "Section P. LOCATION AND PHYSICAL PLANT" is attached hereto as Exhibit A and incorporated by this reference. As noted in Exhibit A, the Leased Premises refers to a portion of the facilities of the Louisville Thoroughbred Society, as further detailed on the map attached to the letter.

Kentucky law contemplates that property that is not contiguous to the track premises may be included under the definition of "track," as detailed in KRS 230.210(22). In 2004, the General Assembly broadened the definition of "track," effective July 13, 2004 as follows:

"Track" means any association duly licensed by the Kentucky Horse Racing Commission to conduct horse racing. "Track" shall include any facility or real property that is owned, leased, or purchased by a track within the same geographic area within a sixty (60) mile radius of a track but not contiguous to track premises, upon racing commission approval, and provided the noncontiguous property is not within a sixty (60) mile radius of another licensed track premise where live racing is conducted and not within a forty (40) mile radius of a simulcast facility, unless any affected track or simulcast facility agrees in writing to permit a noncontiguous facility within the protected geographic area.

KRS 230.210(22). As the statutory definition makes clear, the Commission has the authority to approve a location not contiguous to the track as part of the "track" and therefore, part of the licensed premises, provided it meets the following three requirements:

- 1) Churchill Downs owns or leases the property where the track is located;
- 2) The property that is not contiguous is located within sixty (60) miles of Churchill Downs; and

- 3) The noncontiguous property is not located within a sixty (60) mile radius of another licensed track premise where live racing is conducted and not within a forty (40) mile radius of a simulcast facility, unless any affected track or simulcast facility agrees in writing to permit a noncontiguous facility within the protected geographic area.

Churchill Downs has met these requirements:

- 1) Churchill Downs has agreed to lease certain locations within the Louisville Thoroughbred Society, at 209 East Main Street, Louisville, KY 40202 for a period of one year with renewal option.
- 2) Churchill Downs is 3.7 miles from the Louisville Thoroughbred Society, at 209 East Main Street, Louisville, KY 40202.
- 3) The Louisville Thoroughbred Society is not located within a sixty (60) mile radius of another licensed track premise where live racing is conducted nor within a forty (40) mile radius of a simulcast facility.

Moreover, the request made herein would be consistent with the General Assembly's restriction on pari-mutuel wagering to licensed premises of licensed persons or associations:

- (1) The racing commission shall promulgate administrative regulations governing and regulating mutuel wagering on horse races under what is known as the pari-mutuel system of wagering. The wagering shall be conducted only by a person licensed under this chapter to conduct a race meeting and only upon the licensed premises. The pari-mutuel system of wagering shall be operated only by a totalizator or other mechanical equipment approved by the racing commission. The racing commission shall not require any particular make of equipment.

KRS 230.361(1). Once the definition of Churchill Downs' "licensed premises" is approved, Churchill Downs, an association licensed to conduct pari-mutuel wagering on Thoroughbred horse races, would continue to offer pari-mutuel wagering upon its existing licensed premises and would expand to further offer pari-mutuel wagering at the Louisville Thoroughbred Society upon its opening to conduct business.

Pursuant to KRS 230.361, the Commission has promulgated administrative regulations that regulate the pari-mutuel wagering system of wagering in Kentucky. These regulations include TITLE 810 PUBLIC PROTECTION CABINET - KENTUCKY HORSE RACING COMMISSION ("810 KAR") Chapter 1 Section 011, Pari-mutuel wagering, which establishes the requirements for the operation of pari-mutuel wagering under Kentucky law. Of particular concern with respect to the subject request, Section 9 contains multiple requirements with respect to the sale of pari-mutuel tickets and security, stated below in relevant part:

Section 9. Sale of Pari-Mutuel Tickets on Live Horse Races.

...

(2) Pari-mutuel tickets on live horse races shall not be sold except by a licensed association or a simulcast facility authorized by KRS 230.380.

(3) Pari-mutuel tickets on a live horse race shall only be sold at regular ticket windows, self-service totalizator machines, by mobile pari-mutuel tellers with hand-held totalizator devices, or by any other method approved in writing by the commission prior to being

offered to the public. At least one (1) regular ticket window shall be made accessible to handicapped patrons.

...

(5) A pari-mutuel wager shall not be made on a race after the totalizator has been locked for that race.

(6) Any claim by a patron that he or she has been issued a pari-mutuel ticket other than that which was requested shall be made before the patron has left the ticket window or before the mobile teller has initiated a transaction with another patron. A claim for an incorrect ticket shall not be honored after the totalizator has been locked.

Further, Section 12 of 810 KAR contains the following security concern regarding a minor wagering:

Section 12. Minors Prohibited from Wagering. A minor shall not be permitted by any licensed association or simulcast facility to purchase or cash a pari-mutuel ticket.

Churchill Downs has complied with these requirements at its currently licensed premises and would follow the same protocols and observe the same security measures with respect to the wagering at the Louisville Thoroughbred Society.

Churchill Downs presents an opportunity to the Commission to improve access to simulcast wagering for horse racing fans who live and work near the downtown area of Louisville on a year-round basis. It is hoped that this access contributes to expanded wagering handle and improved customer satisfaction.

Churchill Downs respectfully requests the Commission grant its request as set forth herein at its upcoming April 2019 meeting.

CONDITION ELIGIBILITY

Horses are preferred by their available conditions in all allowance races beginning with Graded Stakes winners (Grade I-II-III), open stakes winners through their allowance conditions providing the horse has finished 1st, 2nd, 3rd, or 4th for \$25,000 or more since starting for less than \$25,000. In allowance/optional claiming races a horse's eligibility cannot exceed the condition of the race. Starter races for less than \$16,000 will be considered as claiming races for condition eligibility.

PREFERENCE SYSTEM

Preference for entering will be the star preference. Horses which have been entered into a book race (excluding stakes, substitute races and extras) that fails to fill, as well as those which have been excluded from races that that are carded shall be given preference the next time that they are entered, provided that they are entered in a race of similar distance (under a mile or over) and within a price range of \$5,000 either way.

- No Star Only entries will be accepted.
- No star will be assigned to the second choice of an un-split same owner entry.
- No star will be assigned to an in-today horse.
- Stars must be re-established after starting in a race at Kentucky Downs.
- Horses starting at another racetrack will forfeit any star (s) they may have accumulated.
- A horse on the also-eligible list for a race on the present day that has been drawn into the body of a race on the succeeding race day, shall not be permitted to run in the race on the present day for which it had been listed as also-eligible. This shall not include stakes and handicaps.

- Preferences shall not be given to a horse otherwise eligible for a race if it is also entered for a race on the succeeding race day. This shall not include stakes and handicaps.
- Winners are preferred in all non-maiden races.
- Stars are condition specific (e.g. a maiden star is not a preference in a winner's race and a 1XOT star is not a preference in a 2XOT, etc.).
- A star obtained in a filly and mare race is not preference in a colt and gelding race.
- If a horse is scratched it shall lose its preference (star (s)).
- No star shall be assigned to a horse on a list. Additionally, any horse going on a list shall lose its star (s).
- Horses on the also-eligible list who have an opportunity to draw in the body of the race at scratch time and elect not to run shall lose their star (s).
- Stakes and handicap races are not subject to star preference.
- Stars are transferred through change of ownership and changes in trainer after the proper transfer procedures have been completed through the Steward's office and delivered to the Racing Secretary's Office.
- Star preference rules will not supersede KHRC rules regarding preference, eligibility or scratches.
- A horse that is a scheduled starter in a canceled race will retain its previously earned star (s).

DATE PREFERENCE SYSTEM

The Date System of preference will be used at Churchill Downs as described below:

Foal Certificates are no longer required to be on file in the racing office to enter or start at Churchill Downs; however, foal certificates must be on file to obtain a preference date and to get a horse tattooed. To receive a zero (0) date, foal papers must be on file with the Horse Identifier by the day before the first day of entries unless posted otherwise.

Preference by condition eligibility then by:

1. In over-filled races, preference will be given to horses in order of their assigned preference dates, earliest date first. Horses having identical dates will be chosen by lot, however, where entry and running dates are the same, the horse with the entry date will have preference.
2. All horses intended for racing at Churchill Downs will be assigned a preference date. Dates assigned will be of two types:

E-Date

This date will correspond to:

- a) the day on which a horse's foal papers and name tag are submitted to the identifier (the earliest date being the day when entries are first taken for the meeting).
- b) the day on which a horse is first entered if his papers are not on file with the identifier.

To qualify for the latter E-Date, a horse must have been excluded from a race which appears on the overnight or he must have been entered in a condition book race which failed to fill through insufficient entries.

R-Date

This date will correspond to the day of a horse's most recent race at Churchill Downs.

An R-Date will also be assigned to a horse which scratches, providing the foal papers are on file with the identifier.

3. A horse retains his R-Date until he receives a newer R-Date. No horse with an established R-Date may receive an E-Date. A horse whose papers are removed from the identifier's office will lose his date and must subsequently re-establish a date in order to receive preference. A horse with an E-Date cannot receive a newer E-Date. Horses starting at another racetrack will forfeit any date they may have at Churchill Downs. Additionally, horses racing at Churchill Downs without foal papers on site will not retain their R-Date.
4. Preference dates will consist of two categories: Dirt (D) and Turf (T). Preference dates are good for any type of race or distance.
5. A horse that runs in a race, which has been taken off the Turf will retain its Turf date and establish a Dirt R-Date. A scratched horse will receive an R-Date from the date scratched for both Turf and Dirt.

6. When a race is taken off the Turf, Main Track Only (MTO) horses will receive an R-Date if they run or scratch. If the race remains on the Turf, MTO horses will retain their previous date.
7. Horses on the Also-Eligible list shall be permitted to draw into races in order listed. A horse entered as MTO shall be listed as an Also-Eligible. If the race remains on the Turf, a horse listed as MTO shall not be permitted to draw into the race.
8. No E-Date will be assigned to the second choice of an unsplit same-owner entry.
9. A horse which has been placed on a list (veterinarian, steward, starter or paddock judge) will lose their date and be assigned an R-Date corresponding to the day removed from list (provided the foal papers are on file with the identifier).
10. A horse which is a scheduled starter in a canceled race will not receive an R-Date for that race but will retain its previous date.
11. Stakes and handicap races are not subject to date preference.
12. Preference dates are transferred through change of ownership and changes in trainer after the proper transfer procedure have been completed through the Steward's office and delivered to the Racing Secretary's Office.
13. Date preference rules will not supersede KHRC rules regarding preference, eligibility or scratches.
14. Winners will be preferred in all non-maiden races.
