3 (New Administrative Regulation)

4 810 KAR 6:020. Calculation of payouts and distribution of pools.

5 RELATES TO: KRS 230.210, 230.215, 230.260, 230.361, 230.3615, 230.990

6 STATUTORY AUTHORITY: KRS 230.215(2), 230.260, 230.361(1)

7 NECESSITY, FUNCTION, AND CONFORMITY: KRS 230.215(2) grants the Kentucky Horse  
8 Racing Commission the authority to regulate conditions under which horse racing and pari-  
9 mutuel wagering thereon shall be conducted in the Commonwealth. KRS 230.361(1) requires the  
10 commission to promulgate administrative regulations governing wagering under the pari-mutuel  
11 system of wagering. This administrative regulation establishes the calculation of payouts and the  
12 distribution of pools for pari-mutuel wagering on live horse races.

13 Section 1. Definitions. (1) "Betting interest" means a single horse, or more than one (1)  
14 horse joined as a mutuel entry or joined in a mutuel field, on which a single pari-mutuel wager  
15 may be placed.

16 (2) "Breakage" means the net pool minus payout.

17 (3) "Broken consolation price" means the profit per dollar, plus one (1) dollar, rounded  
18 down to the break point.

19 (4) "Carryover" means nondistributed pool monies that are retained and added to a  
20 corresponding pool in accordance with KAR Title 810.

1 (5) "Consolation payout" means a payout to individuals who do not correctly choose all of  
2 the selections in a multiple-pick wager, or a payout to individuals who wager on a horse in a  
3 multi-pick wager that is subsequently scratched.

4 (6) "Covered betting interest" means a betting interest or combination of betting interests  
5 that has been wagered upon.

6 (7) "Dead heat" means a finish of a race in which the noses of two (2) or more horses reach  
7 the finish line at the same time.

8 (8) "Gross pool" means the sum of all wagers less refunds.

9 (9) "Individual" means a natural person, at least eighteen (18) years of age, except does not  
10 include any corporation, partnership, limited liability company, trust, or estate.

11 (10) "Multi-commission pool" means a pari-mutuel pool where entities accepting wagers  
12 use different takeout rates.

13 (11) "Net pool" means the total amount wagered less refundable wagers and takeout.

14 (12) "Payout" means the amount of the net pool payable to an individual patron on his or  
15 her winning wager.

16 (13) "Performance" means a specified number of races on a given race day that constitutes  
17 a full card of racing.

18 (14) "Profit" means the net pool less the gross amount wagered if using the standard price  
19 calculation procedure and the net pool less the net amount wagered if using the net price  
20 calculation procedure.

21 (15) "Profit split" means to calculate a payout by splitting a pari-mutuel pool equally  
22 between each winning combination and dividing each portion by the number of winning tickets.

1 (16) "Scratch" means the withdrawal of a horse entered for a race after the time of closing  
2 of entries for the race in conformance with KAR Title 810.

3 (17) "Single commission pool" means a pari-mutuel pool where all entities accepting wagers  
4 use the same takeout rate.

5 (18) "Single price pool" means a pari-mutuel pool in which the entire profit is paid to holders  
6 of winning tickets after the deduction of the takeout.

7 (19) "Takeout" means the total amount of money, excluding breakage, withheld from each  
8 pari-mutuel pool, as authorized by KRS 230.3615 and KAR Title 810.

9 (20) "Unbroken consolation price" means the profit per dollar plus one (1) dollar.

10 Section 2. General requirements. (1) All pari-mutuel pools shall be separately and  
11 independently calculated and distributed. The takeout shall be deducted from each gross pool as  
12 stipulated by KRS 230.3615. The remainder of the pool shall be the net pool for distribution as  
13 payoff on winning pari-mutuel wagers.

14 (2)(a) Single commission pari-mutuel pools may be calculated using either the standard  
15 price calculation procedure or the net price calculation procedure.

16 (b) Multi-commission pari-mutuel pools shall be calculated using the net price calculation  
17 procedure.

18 (3) The standard price calculation procedure shall be as follows:

19 (a) Single price pools - Win pool

Gross Pool	=	Sum of Wagers on all Betting Interests - Refunds
Takeout	=	Gross Pool x Percent Takeout

Net Pool	=	Gross Pool - Takeout
Profit	=	Net Pool - Gross Amount Bet on Winner
Profit Per Dollar	=	Profit / Gross Amount Bet on Winner
\$1 Unbroken Price	=	Profit Per Dollar + \$1
\$1 Broken Price	=	\$1 Unbroken Price Rounded Down to the Break Point
Total Payout	=	\$1 Broken Price x Gross Amount Bet on Winner
Total Breakage	=	Net Pool - Total Payout

1 (b) Profit split - Place pool. Profit shall be net pool less gross amount bet on all place  
2 finishers. Finishers shall split profit 1/2 and 1/2 (place profit), then divide by gross amount bet on  
3 each place finisher for two (2) unique prices.

4 (c) Profit split - show pool. Profit shall be net pool less gross amount bet on all show  
5 finishers. Finishers shall split profit 1/3 and 1/3 and 1/3 (show profit), then divide by gross  
6 amount bet on each show finisher for three (3) unique prices.

7 (4) The net price calculation procedure shall be as follows:

## (a) Single price pool - Win pool

Gross Pool	=	Sum of Wagers on all Betting Interests – Refunds
Takeout	=	Gross Pool x Percent Takeout for Each Source
Net Pool	=	Gross Pool - Takeout
Net Bet on Winner	=	Gross Amount Bet on Winner x (1 – Percent Takeout)
Total Net Pool	=	Sum of All Sources Net pools
Total Net Bet on Winner	=	Sum of All Sources Net Bet on Winner
Total Profit	=	Total Net Pool - Total Net Bet on Winner
Profit Per Dollar	=	Total Profit / Total Net Bet on Winner
\$1 Unbroken Base Price	=	Profit Per Dollar + \$1 for each source:

\$1 unbroken price	=	\$1 Unbroken Base Price x (1 - Percent Takeout)
\$1 Broken Price	=	\$1 Unbroken Price Rounded Down to the Break Point
Total Payout	=	\$1 Broken Price x Gross Amount Bet on Winner
Total Breakage	=	Net Pool - Total Payout

1 (b) Profit split - Place pool. Total profit shall be the total net pool less the total net amount  
2 bet on all place finishers. Finishers shall split total profit 1/2 and 1/2 (place profit), then divide by  
3 total net amount bet on each place finisher for two (2) unique unbroken base prices.

4 (c) Profit split - Show pool. Total profit shall be the total net pool less the total net amount  
5 bet on all show finishers. Finishers shall split total profit 1/3 and 1/3 and 1/3 (show profit), then  
6 divide by total net amount bet on each show finisher for three (3) unique unbroken base prices.

7 (5) Each association shall disclose the following in its license application:

8 (a) Which price calculation method it will use for single commission pari-mutuel pools;

9 (b) The ticket denominations for each type of pari-mutuel wager;

10 (c) The procedures for refunds of pari-mutuel wagers;

11 (d) The takeout for each type of pari-mutuel wager;

1 (e) Which pari-mutuel wagers will include carryover and consolation pools and the  
2 percentages of the net pool assigned to each; and

3 (f) For each type of pari-mutuel wagering involving more than one (1) live horse race, the  
4 procedures to be used if a race is cancelled.

5 (6) The individual pools described in this administrative regulation may be given alternative  
6 names by each association if prior approval is obtained from the commission.

7 (7) A mutuel entry or a mutuel field in any race shall be a single betting interest for the  
8 purpose of each of the wagers described in this administrative regulation and the corresponding  
9 pool calculations and payouts. If either horse in a mutuel entry, or any horse in a mutuel field, is  
10 a starter in a race, the entry or the field selection shall remain as the designated selection for any  
11 of the wagers described in this administrative regulation and the selection shall not be deemed  
12 scratched.

13 Section 3. Pools dependent upon entries for live horse races. (1) Except as provided in  
14 subsection (3) of this section, when pools are opened for wagering all associations may:

15 (a) Offer win wagering on all races with four (4) or more betting interests;

16 (b) Offer place wagering on all races with five (5) or more betting interests; and

17 (c) Offer show wagering on all races with six (6) or more betting interests.

18 (d) Offer Quinella wagering on all races with four (4) or more betting interests;

19 (e) Offer Exacta wagering on all races with four (4) or more betting interests;

20 (f) Offer Trifecta wagering on all races with five (5) or more betting interests;

21 (g) Offer Superfecta wagering on all races with six (6) or more betting interests;

22 (h) Offer Big Q wagering on all races with three (3) or more betting interests; and

1 (i) Offer Super High 5 wagering on all races with seven (7) or more betting interests.

2 (2) Except as provided in subsection (4) of this section, when pools are opened for wagering,  
3 associations shall not offer Twin Trifecta wagering on any races with six (6) or fewer betting  
4 interests.

5 (3) The chief state steward or presiding judge, or his or her designee, may authorize an  
6 association to offer a subject wager with less than the number of horses required by this section  
7 if:

8 (a) Requested by the association; and

9 (b) The integrity of the wager would not be affected by the smaller field.

10 (4) If a horse is scratched by the judges or stewards after wagering has commenced or a  
11 horse is prevented from running in a live horse race because of a failure of the starting gate, and  
12 the number of actual starters representing different betting interests is reduced below the  
13 requirements in Subsection 1 or Subsection 2 of this section, the association may cancel the  
14 affected wagers and refund the entire affected pools with the approval of the Chief State Steward  
15 or Presiding Judge, or his or her designee.

16 (5) In all cases in which the Chief State Steward or Presiding Judge, or his or her designee,  
17 authorizes the changes described in Subsection 4 or Subsection 5 of this section, the association  
18 shall provide a written report to the commission within 24 hours of the post time of the race  
19 explaining the need to cancel the wagering pool.

20 Section 4. Win Pools. (1) The amount wagered on the betting interest which finishes first  
21 shall be deducted from the net win pool and the balance remaining shall be the profit. The profit



1 shall be divided by the amount wagered on the betting interest finishing first and the result shall  
2 be the profit per dollar wagered to win on that betting interest.

3 (2) The net win pool shall be distributed as a single price pool in the following precedence  
4 based upon the official order of finish:

5 (a) To individuals whose selection finishes first, except if there are not any of those wagers,  
6 then;

7 (b) To individuals whose selection finishes second, except if there are not any of those  
8 wagers, then;

9 (c) To individuals whose selection finishes third, but if there are no such wagers, then;

10 (d) The entire pool shall be refunded on win wagers for that race.

11 (3)(a) If there is a dead heat for first involving horses representing the same betting interest,  
12 the win pool shall be distributed as if no dead heat occurred.

13 (b) If there is a dead heat for first involving horses representing two (2) or more betting  
14 interests, the win pool shall be distributed as a profit split.

15 Section 5. Place pools. (1) The amounts wagered to place on the first two (2) betting  
16 interests to finish shall be deducted from the net pool and the balance remaining shall be the  
17 profit. The profit shall be divided into two (2) equal portions, with each portion assigned to each  
18 winning betting interest and divided by the dollar amount wagered to place on that betting  
19 interest. The result shall be the profit per dollar wagered to place on that betting interest.

20 (2) The net place pool shall be distributed in the following precedence based upon the  
21 official order of finish:

1 (a) If horses in a mutuel entry or mutuel field finish in the first two (2) places, as a single  
2 price pool to individuals who selected the mutuel entry or mutuel field, otherwise;

3 (b) As a profit split to individuals whose selection is included within the first two (2)  
4 finishers, except if there are not any of those wagers on one (1) of those two (2) finishers, then;

5 (c) As a single price pool to individuals who selected the one (1) covered betting interest  
6 included within the first two (2) finishers, except if there are not any of those wagers, then;

7 (d) As a single price pool to individuals who selected the third-place finisher, except if there  
8 are not any of those wagers, then;

9 (e) The entire pool shall be refunded on place wagers for that race.

10 (3)(a) If there is a dead heat for first involving horses representing the same betting interest,  
11 the place pool shall be distributed as a single price pool.

12 (b) If there is a dead heat for first involving horses representing two (2) or more betting  
13 interests, the place pool shall be distributed as a profit split.

14 (4)(a) If there is a dead heat for second involving horses representing the same betting  
15 interest, the place pool shall be distributed as if no dead heat occurred.

16 (b) If there is a dead heat for second involving horses representing two (2) or more betting  
17 interests, the place pool shall be divided, with one-half (1/2) of the profit distributed to place  
18 wagers on the betting interest finishing first and the remainder of the profit distributed equally  
19 among place wagers on the betting interests involved in the dead heat for second.

20 Section 6. Show Pools. (1) The amounts wagered to show on the first three (3) betting  
21 interests shall be deducted from the net pool and the balance remaining shall be the profit. The  
22 profit shall be divided into three (3) equal portions, with each portion assigned to each winning

1 betting interest and divided by the amount wagered to show on that betting interest. The result  
2 shall be the profit per dollar wagered to show on that betting interest.

3 (2) The net show pool shall be distributed in the following precedence based on the official  
4 order of finish:

5 (a) If horses in a mutuel entry or mutuel field finish in the first three (3) places, as a single  
6 price pool to individuals who selected the mutuel entry or mutuel field, otherwise;

7 (b) If horses of a mutuel entry or mutuel field finish as two (2) of the first three (3) finishers,  
8 the profit shall be divided with two-thirds (2/3) distributed to individuals who selected the  
9 mutuel entry or mutuel field and one-third (1/3) distributed to individuals who selected the other  
10 betting interest included within the first three (3) finishers, otherwise;

11 (c) As a profit split to individuals whose selection shall be included within the first three (3)  
12 finishers, except if there are not any of those wagers on one (1) of those three (3) finishers, then;

13 (d) As a profit split to individuals who selected one (1) of the two (2) covered betting  
14 interests included within the first three (3) finishers, except if there are not any of those wagers  
15 on two (2) of those three (3) finishers, then;

16 (e) As a single price pool to individuals who selected the one (1) covered betting interest  
17 included within the first three (3) finishers, except if there are not any of those wagers, then;

18 (f) As a single price pool to individuals who selected the fourth-place finisher, except if there  
19 are not any of those wagers, then;

20 (g) The entire pool shall be refunded on show wagers for that race.

21 (3)(a) If there is a dead heat for first involving two (2) horses representing the same betting  
22 interest, the profit shall be divided with two-thirds (2/3) to individuals who selected the first-

1 place finishers and one-third (1/3) distributed to individuals who selected the betting interest  
2 finishing third.

3 (b) If there is a dead heat for first involving three (3) horses representing a single betting  
4 interest, the show pool shall be distributed as a single price pool.

5 (c) If there is a dead heat for first involving horses representing two (2) or more betting  
6 interests, the show pool shall be distributed as a profit split.

7 (4)(a) If there is a dead heat for second involving horses representing the same betting  
8 interest, the profit shall be divided with one-third (1/3) distributed to individuals who selected  
9 the betting interest finishing first and two-thirds (2/3) distributed to individuals who selected the  
10 second-place finishers.

11 (b) If there is a dead heat for second involving horses representing two (2) betting interests,  
12 the show pool shall be distributed as a profit split.

13 (c) If there is a dead heat for second involving horses representing three (3) betting  
14 interests, the show pool shall be divided with one-third (1/3) of the profit distributed to show  
15 wagers on the betting interest finishing first and the remainder shall be distributed equally  
16 among show wagers on those betting interests involved in the dead heat for second.

17 (5)(a) If there is a dead heat for third involving horses representing the same betting  
18 interest, the show pool shall be distributed as if no dead heat occurred.

19 (b) If there is a dead heat for third involving horses representing two (2) or more betting  
20 interests, the show pool shall be divided with two-thirds (2/3) of the profit distributed to show  
21 wagers on the betting interests finishing first and second and the remainder shall be distributed  
22 equally among show wagers on those betting interests involved in the dead heat for third.

1 Section 7. Exacta Pools. (1) The Exacta shall require the selection of the first two (2)  
2 finishers, in their exact order, for a single race.

3 (2) The net Exacta pool shall be distributed in the following precedence based upon the  
4 official order of finish:

5 (a) If horses of a mutuel entry or mutuel field finish as the first two (2) finishers, as a single  
6 price pool to individuals selecting the mutuel entry or mutuel field combined with the next  
7 separate betting interest in the official order of finish, otherwise;

8 (b) As a single price pool to individuals whose combination finished in the correct sequence  
9 as the first two (2) betting interests, except if there are not any of those wagers, then;

10 (c) As a single price pool to individuals whose combination included the betting interest that  
11 finishes first, except if there are not any of those wagers, then;

12 (d) As a single price pool to individuals whose combination included the betting interest  
13 that finished second, except if there are not any of those wagers, then;

14 (e) The entire pool shall be refunded on Exacta wagers for that race.

15 (3)(a) If there is a dead heat for first involving horses representing the same betting interest,  
16 the Exacta pool shall be distributed as a single price pool to individuals who selected the mutuel  
17 entry or mutuel field combined with the next separate betting interest in the official order of  
18 finish.

19 (b) If there is a dead heat for first involving horses representing two (2) or more betting  
20 interests, the Exacta pool shall be distributed as a profit split.

21 (4) If there is a dead heat for second involving horses representing the same betting  
22 interest, the Exacta shall be distributed as if no dead heat occurred.

1 (5) If there is a dead heat for second involving horses representing two (2) or more betting  
2 interests, the Exacta pool shall be distributed to ticket holders in the following precedence based  
3 upon the official order of finish:

4 (a) As a profit split to individuals combining the first-place betting interest with any of the  
5 betting interests involved in the dead heat for second, except if there is only one (1) covered  
6 combination, then;

7 (b) As a single price pool to individuals combining the first-place betting interest with the  
8 one (1) covered betting interest involved in the dead heat for second, except if there are not any  
9 of those wagers, then;

10 (c) As a profit split to individuals whose wagers correctly selected the winner for first-place  
11 and any of the betting interests which finished in a dead-heat for second-place, except if there  
12 are not any of those wagers, then;

13 (d) The entire pool shall be refunded on Exacta wagers for that race.

14 Section 8. Quinella Pools. (1) The Quinella shall require the selection of the first two (2)  
15 finishers, irrespective of order, for a single race.

16 (2) The net Quinella pool shall be distributed in the following precedence based upon the  
17 official order of finish:

18 (a) If horses of a mutuel entry or mutuel field finish as the first two (2) finishers, as a single  
19 price pool to individuals selecting the mutuel entry or mutuel field combined with the next  
20 separate betting interest in the official order of finish, otherwise;

21 (b) As a single price pool to individuals whose combination finished as the first two (2)  
22 betting interests, except if there are not any of those wagers, then;

1 (c) As a profit split to individuals whose combination included either the first- or second-  
2 place finisher, except if there are not any of those wagers on one (1) of those two (2) finishers,  
3 then;

4 (d) As a single price pool to individuals whose combination included the one (1) covered  
5 betting interest included within the first two (2) finishers, except if there are not any of those  
6 wagers, then;

7 (e) The entire pool shall be refunded on Quinella wagers for that race.

8 (2)(a) If there is a dead heat for first involving horses representing the same betting interest,  
9 the Quinella pool shall be distributed to individuals selecting the mutuel entry or mutuel field  
10 combined with the next separate betting interest in the official order of finish.

11 (b) If there is a dead heat for first involving horses representing two (2) betting interests,  
12 the Quinella pool shall be distributed as if no dead heat occurred.

13 (c) If there is a dead heat for first involving horses representing three (3) or more betting  
14 interests, the Quinella pool shall be distributed as a profit split.

15 (3) If there is a dead heat for second involving horses representing the same betting  
16 interest, the Quinella pool shall be distributed as if no dead heat occurred.

17 (4) If there is a dead heat for second involving horses representing two (2) or more betting  
18 interests, the Quinella pool shall be distributed to individuals in the following precedence based  
19 upon the official order of finish:

20 (a) As a profit split to individuals combining the winner with any of the betting interests  
21 involved in the dead heat for second, except if there is only one (1) covered combination, then;

1 (b) As a single price pool to individuals combining the winner with the one (1) covered  
2 betting interest involved in the dead heat for second, except if there are not any of those wagers,  
3 then;

4 (c) As a profit split to individuals combining the betting interests involved in the dead heat  
5 for second, except if there are not any of those wagers, then;

6 (d) As a profit split to individuals whose combination included the winner and any other  
7 betting interest and wagers selecting any of the betting interests involved in the dead heat for  
8 second, except if there are not any of those wagers, then;

9 (e) The entire pool shall be refunded on Quinella wagers for that race.

10 Section 9. Trifecta Pools. (1) The Trifecta requires selection of the first three (3) finishers, in  
11 their exact order, for a single race.

12 (2) For Trifecta price calculations only, the highest placed finisher of any part of a mutuel  
13 entry or mutuel field shall be used, eliminating all other parts of that mutuel entry or mutuel field  
14 from consideration regardless of finishing order.

15 (3) The Trifecta pool shall be distributed in the following precedence based upon the official  
16 order of finish:

17 (a) As a single price pool to individuals whose combination finished in correct sequence as  
18 the first three (3) betting interests, except if there are not any of those wagers, then;

19 (b) As a single price pool to individuals whose combination included, in correct sequence,  
20 the first two (2) betting interests, except if there are not any of those wagers, then;

21 (c) As a single price pool to individuals whose combination correctly selected the first-place  
22 betting interest only, except if there are not any of those wagers, then;



1 (d) The entire pool shall be refunded on Trifecta wagers for that race.

2 (4)(a) If less than three (3) betting interests finish and the race is declared official, payouts  
3 shall be made based upon the order of finish of those betting interests that finish the race.

4 (b) The balance of any selection beyond the number of betting interests completing the  
5 race shall be ignored.

6 (5)(a) If there is a dead heat for first involving horses representing three (3) or more betting  
7 interests, all of the wagering combinations selecting three (3) betting interests that correspond  
8 with any of the betting interests involved in the dead heat shall share in a profit split.

9 (b) If there is a dead heat for first involving horses representing two (2) betting interests,  
10 both of the wagering combinations selecting the two (2) betting interests that finish in a dead  
11 heat, irrespective of order, along with the third-place betting interest shall share in a profit split.

12 (6) If there is a dead heat for second, all of the combinations correctly selecting the winner  
13 combined with any of the betting interests involved in the dead heat for second shall share in a  
14 profit split.

15 (7) If there is a dead heat for third, all wagering combinations correctly selecting the first  
16 two (2) finishers, in correct sequence, along with any of the betting interests involved in the dead  
17 heat for third shall share in a profit split.

18 (8)(a) Trifecta wagering shall not be conducted on any race having fewer than five (5)  
19 separate betting interests.

20 (b) If fewer than five (5) horses start due to a late scratch or malfunction of the starting  
21 gate, the Trifecta shall be cancelled and the gross pool shall be refunded.

1           Section 10. Superfecta Pools. (1) The Superfecta shall require selection of the first four (4)  
2 finishers, in their exact order, for a single race.

3           (2) The net Superfecta pool shall be distributed in the following precedence based upon the  
4 official order of finish:

5           (a) As a single price pool to individuals whose combination finished in correct sequence as  
6 the first four (4) betting interests, except if there are not any of those wagers, then;

7           (b) As a single price pool to individuals whose combination included in correct sequence,  
8 the first three (3) betting interests, except if there are not any of those wagers, then;

9           (c) As a single price pool to individuals whose combination included, in correct sequence,  
10 the first two (2) betting interests, except if there are not any of those wagers, then;

11           (d) As a single price pool to individuals whose combination correctly selected the first-place  
12 betting interest only, except if there are not any of those wagers, then;

13           (e) The entire pool shall be refunded on Superfecta wagers for that race.

14           (3)(a) If less than four (4) betting interests finish and the race is declared official, payouts  
15 shall be made based upon the order of finish of those betting interests completing the race.

16           (b) The balance of any selection beyond the number of betting interests completing the  
17 race shall be ignored.

18           (4)(a) If there is a dead heat for first involving horses representing four (4) or more betting  
19 interests, all of the wagering combinations selecting betting interests which correspond with any  
20 of the betting interests involved in the dead heat shall share in a profit split.

1 (b) If there is a dead heat for first involving horses representing three (3) betting interests,  
2 all of the wagering combinations selecting the three (3) betting interests that finish in a dead  
3 heat, irrespective of order, along with the fourth-place betting interest shall share in a profit split.

4 (c) If there is a dead heat for first involving horses representing two (2) betting interests,  
5 both of the wagering combinations selecting the two (2) dead-heated betting interests,  
6 irrespective of order, along with the third-place and fourth-place betting interests shall share in  
7 a profit split.

8 (5)(a) If there is a dead heat for second involving horses representing three (3) or more  
9 betting interests, all of the wagering combinations correctly selecting the winner combined with  
10 any of the three (3) betting interests involved in the dead heat for second shall share in a profit  
11 split.

12 (b) If there is a dead heat for second involving horses representing two (2) betting interests,  
13 all of the wagering combinations correctly selecting the winner, the two (2) dead-heated betting  
14 interests, irrespective of order, and the fourth-place betting interest shall share in a profit split.

15 (6) If there is a dead heat for third, all wagering combinations correctly selecting the first  
16 two (2) finishers, in correct sequence, along with any two (2) of the betting interests involved in  
17 the dead heat for third shall share in a profit split.

18 (7) If there is a dead heat for fourth, all wagering combinations correctly selecting the first  
19 three (3) finishers, in correct sequence, along with any interest involved in the dead heat for  
20 fourth, shall share in a profit split.

1 (8) Superfecta wagering shall not be conducted on any race having fewer than six (6)  
2 separate betting interests. If fewer than six (6) horses start due to a late scratch or malfunction  
3 of the starting gate, Superfecta wagering shall be cancelled and the gross pool shall be refunded.

4 Section 11. Super High-Five Pools. (1) The Super High-Five shall require selection of the first  
5 five (5) finishers, in their exact order, for a single race.

6 (2) Unless otherwise stated, the net Super High-Five pool shall be distributed as a single-  
7 priced pool to those who have selected all five (5) finishers, in exact order, based upon the official  
8 order of finish.

9 (3)(a) Each association shall disclose in its license application whether it intends to schedule  
10 Super High-Five wagering and, if so, shall disclose:

- 11 1. The percentage of the pool to be retained for the winning wagers; and
- 12 2. The designated amount of any cap to be set on the pool to be retained for the winning  
13 wagers.

14 (b) Any subsequent changes to the Super High-Five scheduling shall require prior approval  
15 from the commission or its designee.

16 (4) If there are no winning wagers selecting all five (5) finishers, in exact order, the entire  
17 Super High-Five pool shall be added to the carryover.

18 (5) If due to a late scratch the number of betting interests in the Super High-Five pool is  
19 reduced to fewer than seven (7), the Super High-Five pool shall be cancelled and shall be  
20 refunded, except not the Super High-Five carryover pool.

1 (6) If a betting interest in the Super High-Five pool is scratched from the race, there shall  
2 not be any more wagers accepted selecting that scratched runner and all tickets previously sold  
3 designating that horse shall be refunded and that money shall be deducted from the gross pool.

4 (7) If any dead-heat occurs in any finishing position, all wagers selecting either of the  
5 runners finishing in a dead heat with the correct runners not finishing in a dead heat shall be  
6 winners and share the Super High-Five pool. Payouts shall be calculated by splitting the pool  
7 equally between each winning combination, then dividing each portion by the number of winning  
8 tickets.

9 (8)(a) On the final day of a meeting, an association shall make a final distribution of all  
10 accumulated carryovers along with the net pool of the Super High-Five pool conducted on the  
11 final day of the meeting as a single price pool to:

12 1. Individuals with tickets selecting the first five (5) finishers, in exact order, for the  
13 designated race, or, if there are not any of those wagers, to;

14 2. Individuals with tickets selecting the first four (4) finishers, in exact order, for the  
15 designated race, or, if there are not any of those wagers, to;

16 3. Individuals with tickets selecting the first three (3) finishers, in exact order, for the  
17 designated race, or, if there are not any of those wagers, to;

18 4. Individuals with tickets selecting the first two (2) finishers, in exact order, for the  
19 designated race, or, if there are not any of those wagers, to;

20 5. Individuals with tickets selecting the winner for the designated race, or, if there are not  
21 any of those wagers;

1           6. All money wagered into the Super High-Five pool that day shall be refunded and any  
2 carryover shall be retained and added to the Super High –Five pool on the first racing day of the  
3 next meeting.

4           (9) If, for any reason, the Super High-Five carryover shall be held over to the corresponding  
5 Super High-Five pool of a subsequent meeting, the carryover shall be deposited in an interest-  
6 bearing account approved by the commission. The Super High-Five carryover plus accrued  
7 interest shall then be added to the net Super High-Five pool of the following meeting on a date  
8 and performance approved by the commission.

9           Section 12. Double Pools. (1) The double shall require the selection of the first-place finisher  
10 in each of two (2) specified races.

11           (2) The net double pool shall be distributed in the following precedence based upon the  
12 official order of finish:

13           (a) As a single price pool to individuals whose selections finished first in each of the two (2)  
14 races, except if there are not any of those wagers, then;

15           (b) As a profit split to individuals who selected the first-place finisher in either of the two  
16 (2) races, except if there are not any of those wagers, then;

17           (c) As a single price pool to individuals who selected the one (1) covered betting interest  
18 that finished first in either race, except if there are not any of those wagers, then;

19           (d) As a single price pool to individuals whose selection finished second in each of the two  
20 (2) races, except if there are not any of those wagers, then;

21           (e) The entire pool shall be refunded on the double wagers for those races.

1           (3)(a) If there is a dead heat for first in either of the races involving horses representing the  
2 same betting interest, the double pool shall be distributed as if no dead heat occurred.

3           (b) If there is a dead heat for first in either of the races involving horses representing two  
4 (2) or more betting interests, the double pool shall be distributed as a profit split if there is more  
5 than one (1) covered winning combination.

6           (4) If a betting interest in the first half of the double is scratched prior to the close of  
7 wagering on the first double contest, all money wagered on combinations including the scratched  
8 betting interest shall be deducted from the double pool and refunded.

9           (5) If a betting interest in the second half of the double is scratched prior to the close of  
10 wagering on the first double race, all money wagered on the combinations including the  
11 scratched betting interest shall be deducted from the double pool and refunded.

12           (6) If a betting interest in the second half of the double is scratched after the close of  
13 wagering on the first double race, all wagers combining the winner of the first race with the  
14 scratched betting interest in the second race shall be allocated a consolation payout.

15           (a) In calculating the consolation payout, the net double pool shall be divided by the total  
16 amount wagered on the winner of the first race and an unbroken consolation price obtained.

17           (b) The broken consolation price shall be multiplied by the dollar value of wagers on the  
18 winner of the first race combined with the scratched betting interest to obtain the consolation  
19 payout.

20           (c) Breakage shall not be included in this calculation.

21           (d) The consolation payout shall be deducted from the net double pool before calculation  
22 and distribution of the winning double payout.

1 (e) Dead heats including separate betting interests in the first race shall result in a  
2 consolation payout calculated as a profit split.

3 (7) If either of the double races is cancelled prior to the first double race, or the first double  
4 race is declared "no contest," the entire double pool shall be refunded on double wagers for  
5 those races.

6 (8)(a) If the second double race is cancelled or declared a "no contest" after the conclusion  
7 of the first double race, the net double pool shall be distributed as a single price pool to  
8 individuals who selected the winner of the first double race.

9 (b) If there is a dead heat involving separate betting interests, the net double pool shall be  
10 distributed as a profit split.

11 Section 13. Big Q Pools. (1) The Big Q shall require selection of the first two (2) finishers,  
12 irrespective of order, in each of two (2) designated races.

13 (a) Each winning ticket for the first Big Q race shall be exchanged for a free ticket on the  
14 second Big Q race in order to remain eligible for the second half Big Q pool.

15 (b) Exchange tickets shall be exchanged at attended ticket windows prior to the second race  
16 comprising the Big Q.

17 (c) There shall not be a monetary reward for winning the first Big Q race.

18 (d) Each of the designated Big Q races shall be included in only one (1) Big Q pool.

19 (2) In the first Big Q race only, winning wagers shall be determined using the following  
20 precedence based on the official order of finish for the first Big Q race:



1 (a) If a mutuel entry or mutuel field finishes as the first two (2) finishers, those who selected  
2 the mutuel entry or mutuel field combined with the next separate betting interest in the official  
3 order of finish shall be winners, otherwise:

4 (b) Individuals whose combination finished as the first two (2) betting interests shall be  
5 winners, except if there are not any of those wagers, then;

6 (c) Individuals whose combination included either the first- or second-place finisher shall  
7 be winners, except if there are not any of those wagers on one (1) of the two (2) finishers, then;

8 (d) Individuals whose combination included the one (1) covered betting interest included  
9 within the first two (2) finishers shall be winners, except if there are not any of those wagers,  
10 then;

11 (e) The entire pool shall be refunded on Big Q wagers for that race.

12 (3)(a) In the first Big Q race only, if there is a dead heat for first involving horses representing  
13 the same betting interest, individuals who selected the mutuel entry or mutuel field combined  
14 with the next separate betting interest in the official order of finish shall be winners.

15 (b) In the first Big Q race only, if there is a dead heat for first involving horses representing  
16 two (2) betting interests, the winning Big Q wagers shall be determined as if no dead heat  
17 occurred.

18 (c) In the first Big Q race only, if there is a dead heat for first involving horses representing  
19 three (3) or more betting interests, individuals whose combination included any two (2) of the  
20 betting interests finishing in the dead heat shall be winners.

1 (4) In the first Big Q race only, if there is a dead heat for second, the winners shall be those  
2 who combined the first place finisher with any of the runners involved in the dead heat for  
3 second.

4 (5) In the second Big Q race only, the entire net Big Q pool shall be distributed to individuals  
5 in the following precedence based upon the official order of finish for the second Big Q race:

6 (a) If a mutuel entry or mutuel field finishes as the first two (2) finishers, as a single price  
7 pool to individuals who selected the mutuel entry or mutuel field combined with the next  
8 separate betting interest in the official order of finish, otherwise;

9 (b) As a single price pool to individuals whose combination finished as the first two (2)  
10 betting interests, except if there are not any of those wagers, then;

11 (c) As a profit split to individuals whose combination included either the first- or second-  
12 place finisher, except if there are not any of those wagers on one (1) of those two (2) finishers,  
13 then;

14 (d) As a single price pool to individuals whose combination included one (1) of the covered  
15 betting interests included within the first two (2) finishers, except if there are not any of those  
16 wagers, then;

17 (e) As a single price pool to all exchange ticket holders for that race, except if there are not  
18 any of those wagers, then;

19 (f) In accordance with subsection (2) of this section.

20 (6)(a) In the second Big Q race only, if there is a dead heat for first involving horses  
21 representing the same betting interest, the net Big Q pool shall be distributed to individuals

1 selecting the mutuel entry or mutuel field combined with the next separate betting interest in  
2 the official order of finish.

3 (b) In the second Big Q race only, if there is a dead heat for first involving horses  
4 representing two (2) betting interests, the net Big Q pool shall be distributed as if no dead heat  
5 occurred.

6 (c) In the second Big Q race only, if there is a dead heat for first involving horses  
7 representing three (3) or more betting interests, the net Big Q pool shall be distributed as a profit  
8 split to individuals whose combination included any two (2) of the betting interests finishing in  
9 the dead heat.

10 (7) In the second Big Q race only, if there is a dead heat for second involving horses  
11 representing two (2) or more betting interests, the Big Q pool shall be distributed to individuals  
12 in the following precedence based upon the official order of finish:

13 (a) As a profit split to individuals combining the winner with any of the betting interests  
14 involved in the dead heat for second, except if there is only one (1) covered combination, then;

15 (b) As a single price pool to individuals combining the winner with the one (1) covered  
16 betting interest involved in the dead heat for second, except if there are not any of those wagers,  
17 then;

18 (c) As a profit split to individuals combining the betting interests involved in the dead heat  
19 for second, except if there are not any of those wagers, then;

20 (d) As a profit split to individuals whose combination included the winner and any other  
21 betting interest and wagers selecting any of the betting interests involved in the dead heat for  
22 second, then;

1 (e) As a single price pool to all exchange ticket holders for that race, except if there are not  
2 any of those tickets, then;

3 (f) In accordance with subsection (2) of this section.

4 (8) If a winning ticket for the first half of the Big Q is not presented for exchange prior to  
5 the close of betting on the second half Big Q race, the ticket holder shall forfeit all rights to any  
6 distribution of the Big Q pool resulting from the outcome of the second race.

7 (9) If a betting interest in the first half of the Big Q is scratched, the Big Q wagers including  
8 the scratched betting interest shall be refunded.

9 (10)(a) If a betting interest in the second half of the Big Q is scratched, an immediate public  
10 announcement and immediate posting on the association's video monitors and website  
11 concerning the scratch shall be made and a reasonable amount of time shall be provided for  
12 exchange of tickets that include the scratched betting interest.

13 (b) If tickets have not been exchanged prior to the close of betting for the second Big Q  
14 race, the ticket holder shall forfeit all rights to the Big Q pool.

15 (11) If either of the Big Q races is cancelled prior to the first Big Q race, or the first Big Q  
16 race is declared "no contest," the entire Big Q pool shall be refunded on Big Q wagers for that  
17 race.

18 (12) If the second Big Q race is cancelled or declared "no contest" after the conclusion of  
19 the first Big Q race, the net Big Q pool shall be distributed as a single price pool to wagers selecting  
20 the winning combination in the first Big Q race and all valid exchange tickets. If there are not any  
21 of those wagers, the net Big Q pool shall be distributed as described in subsection (2) of this  
22 section.

1 Section 14. Pick-(n) Pools. (1) The Pick-(n) requires the selection of the first place finisher in  
2 each of (n)-specified races designated by the association and approved by the commission where  
3 (n) is any number of races greater than 2. Any changes to the Pick-(n) format shall be approved  
4 by the commission before implementation.

5 (2) The Pick-(n) pari-mutuel pool consists of amounts contributed for a win only selection  
6 in each of (n) races designated by the association. Each individual placing a Pick-(n) wager shall  
7 designate the winning horse in each of (n) races comprising the Pick-(n).

8 (3) The net Pick-(n) pool shall be apportioned in one the following methods based upon the  
9 official order of finish: (a) Method 1, Pick-(n) with Carryover: The net Pick-(n) pool and carryover,  
10 if any, shall be distributed as a single price pool to those who selected the first-place finisher in  
11 each of the Pick-(n) contests, based upon the official order of finish. If there are no such wagers,  
12 then a designated percentage of the net pool shall be distributed as a single price pool to those  
13 who selected the first-place finisher in the greatest number of Pick-(n) contests; and the  
14 remainder shall be added to the carryover. Where there is no correct selection of the first-place  
15 finisher in at least one of the Pick-(n) contests, based upon the official order of finish, the day's  
16 net pool shall be refunded and the previous carryover pool amount, if any, shall be carried over  
17 to the next scheduled corresponding pool.

18 (b) Method 2, Pick-(n) with 100% Carryover: The net Pick-(n) pool and carryover, if any, shall  
19 be distributed as a single price pool to those who selected the first-place finisher in each of the  
20 Pick-(n) contests, based upon the official order of finish. If there are no such wagers, then 100%  
21 of that day's net pool shall be added to the carryover. Where there is no correct selection of the  
22 first-place finisher in at least one of the Pick-(n) contests, based upon the official order of finish,

1 the day's net pool shall be refunded and the previous carryover pool amount, if any, shall be  
2 carried over to the next scheduled corresponding pool.

3 (c) Method 3, Pick-(n) with Minor Pool and Carryover: The major share of the net Pick-(n)  
4 pool and the carryover, if any, shall be distributed to those who selected the first-place finisher  
5 in each of the Pick-(n) contests, based upon the official order of finish. The minor share of the  
6 net Pick-(n) pool shall be distributed to those who selected the first place finisher in the second  
7 greatest number of Pick-(n) contests, based upon the official order of finish. If there are no  
8 wagers selecting the first-place finisher of all Pick-(n) contests, the minor share of the net Pick-  
9 (n) pool shall be distributed as a single price pool to those who selected the first-place finisher in  
10 the greatest number of Pick-(n) contests; and the major share shall be added to the carryover.  
11 Where there is no correct selection of the first-place finisher in at least one of the Pick-(n)  
12 contests, based upon the official order of finish, the day's net pool shall be refunded and the  
13 previous carryover pool amount, if any, shall be carried over to the next scheduled corresponding  
14 pool.

15 (d) Method 4, Pick-(n) with No Minor Pool and No Carryover: The net Pick-(n) pool shall be  
16 distributed as a single price pool to those who selected the first-place finisher in the greatest  
17 number of Pick-(n) contests, based upon the official order of finish. If there are no winning  
18 wagers, the pool is refunded.

19 (e) Method 5, Pick-(n) with Minor Pool and No Carryover: The major share of the net Pick-  
20 (n) pool shall be distributed to those who selected the first place finisher in the greatest number  
21 of Pick-(n) contests, based upon the official order of finish. The minor share of the net Pick-(n)  
22 pool shall be distributed to those who selected the first-place finisher in the second greatest

1 number of Pick-(n) contests, based upon the official order of finish. If there are no wagers  
2 selecting the first-place finisher in a second greatest number of Pick-(n) contests, the minor share  
3 of the net Pick-(n) pool shall be combined with the major share for distribution as a single price  
4 pool to those who selected the first-place finisher in the greatest number of Pick-(n) contests. If  
5 the greatest number of first-place finishers selected is one (1), the major and minor shares are  
6 combined for distribution as a single price pool. If there are no winning wagers, the pool is  
7 refunded.

8 (f) Method 6, Pick-(n) with Minor Pool and No Carryover: The major share of net Pick-(n)  
9 pool shall be distributed to those who selected the first-place finisher in each of the Pick-(n)  
10 contests, based upon the official order of finish. The minor share of the net Pick-(n) pool shall be  
11 distributed to those who selected the first-place finisher in the second greatest number of Pick-  
12 (n) contests, based upon the official order of finish. If there are no wagers selecting the first-place  
13 finisher in all Pick-(n) contests, the entire net Pick-(n) pool shall be distributed as a single price  
14 pool to those who selected the first-place finisher in the greatest number of Pick-(n) contests. If  
15 there are no wagers selecting the first-place finisher in a second greatest number of Pick-(n)  
16 contests, the minor share of the net Pick-(n) pool shall be combined with the major share for  
17 distribution as a single price pool to those who selected the first-place finisher in each of the Pick-  
18 (n) contests. If there are no winning wagers, the pool is refunded.

19 (g) Method 7, Pick-(n) with Carryover and "Unique Winning Ticket" Provision: The net Pick-  
20 (n) pool and carryover, if any, shall be distributed to the holder of a unique winning ticket that  
21 selected the first-place finisher in each of the Pick-(n) contests, based upon the official order of  
22 finish. If there are multiple tickets selecting the first-place finisher in each of the Pick-(n)

1 contest(s), a share that has been declared by the Association and approved by the commission,  
2 of the net Pick-(n) shall be distributed as a single price pool to those who selected the first-place  
3 finisher in each of the Pick-(n) contests and the remaining share shall be added to the  
4 carryover. If there are no tickets selecting the first-place finisher in each of the Pick-(n) contests,  
5 then; the entire net Pick-(n) pool shall be added to the carryover. Associations may suspend  
6 previously approved unique winning ticket wagering with the prior approval of the commission.  
7 Any carryover shall be held until the suspended unique winning ticket wagering is reinstated.  
8 Where there is no correct selection of the first-place finisher in at least one of the Pick-(n)  
9 contests, based upon the official order of finish, the day's net pool shall be refunded and the  
10 previous carryover pool amount, if any, shall be carried over to the next scheduled corresponding  
11 pool. In obtaining authorization for operating the Pick-(n) pool under this subsection, associations  
12 must clearly identify which definition under paragraph 16(b) will be relied upon for determining  
13 the existence of a unique winning ticket.

14 (4) If there is a dead heat for first place in any of the Pick-(n) races involving contestants  
15 representing the same betting interest, the Pick-(n) pool shall be distributed as if no dead heat  
16 occurred.

17 (5) If there is a dead heat for first place in any of the Pick-(n) races involving contestants  
18 representing two or more betting interests, the Pick-(n) pool shall be distributed as a single price  
19 pool with each winning wager receiving an equal share of the profit.

20 (6) If a betting interest is scratched or is designated to run for purse money only from any  
21 leg of the Pick-(n), the association shall use the actual favorite, as evidenced by total amounts  
22 wagered in the Win pool at the host association, for the contest at the close of wagering on that



1 contest, and shall be substituted for the betting interest that was scratched or designated to run  
2 for purse money only for all purposes, including pool calculations. In the event that the Win pool  
3 total for two or more favorites is identical, the substitute selection shall be the betting interest  
4 with the lowest program number. The totalizator shall produce reports showing each of the  
5 wagering combinations with substituted betting interests which became winners as a result of  
6 the substitution, in addition to the normal winning combination.

7 (7) If for any reason more than half of the races comprising the Pick-(n) are cancelled or  
8 declared a "no contest", and there was no previous carryover amount, wagering on the Pick-(n)  
9 shall be cancelled and all wagers shall be refunded.

10 (8) If for any reason more than half of the races comprising the Pick-(n) are cancelled or  
11 declared a "no contest", and a previous carryover amount existed, the carryover amount shall be  
12 frozen and added to the next scheduled Pick-(n) event. Wagering on the Pick-(n) for the cancelled  
13 Pick-(n) wager races shall be cancelled and all wagers shall be refunded.

14 (9) If the condition of the turf course warrants a change of racing surface in any races of the  
15 Pick-(n), and the change has not been disclosed to the public prior to "off time" of the first race  
16 of the Pick-(n), the stewards shall declare the changed races an "all win" race for Pick-(n) wagering  
17 purposes only. An "all win" race shall assign the winner of that race to each Pick-(n) ticket holder  
18 as their selection for that race.

19 (10) The Pick-(n) carryover may be capped at a designated level approved by the  
20 commission so that if, at the close of any performance, the amount in the Pick-(n) carryover  
21 equals or exceeds the designated cap, the Pick-(n) carryover will be frozen until it is won or  
22 distributed under other provisions of this rule. After the Pick-(n) carryover is frozen, 100 percent

1 of the net pool, part of which ordinarily would be added to the Pick-(n) carryover, shall be  
2 distributed to those whose selection finished first in the greatest number of Pick-(n) contests for  
3 that performance.

4 (11) A written request for permission to distribute the Pick-(n) carryover on a specific  
5 performance may be submitted to the commission. The request must be for a specified date no  
6 greater than one (1) year from the date the request is submitted and contain justification for the  
7 distribution, an explanation of the benefit to be derived, and the intended date and performance  
8 for the distribution.

9 (12) Should the Pick-(n) carryover be designated for distribution on a specified date and  
10 performance in which there are no wagers selecting the first-place finisher in each of the Pick-(n)  
11 contests, the entire pool shall be distributed as a single price pool to those whose selection  
12 finished first in the greatest number of Pick-(n) contests. The Pick-(n) carryover shall be  
13 designated for distribution on a specified date and performance only under the following  
14 circumstances: (a) Upon written approval from the commission as provided in subsection (8) of  
15 this rule.

16 (b) Upon written approval from the commission when there is a change in the carryover  
17 cap, a change from one type of Pick-(n) wagering to another, or when the Pick-(n) is discontinued.

18 (c) On the closing performance of the meet or split meet.

19 (13) Notwithstanding subsections (10) and (12), if for any reason the Pick-(n) carryover must  
20 be held over to the corresponding Pick-(n) pool of a subsequent meet, the carryover shall be  
21 deposited in an interest-bearing account approved by the commission. The Pick-(n) carryover

1 plus accrued interest shall then be added to the net Pick-(n) pool of the following meet on a date  
2 and performance designated by the association and approved by the commission.

3 (14) With the written approval of the commission, the association may contribute to the  
4 Pick-(n) carryover a sum of money up to the amount of any designated cap.

5 (15) The association may suspend previously-approved Pick-(n) wagering with the prior  
6 approval of the commission. Any carryover shall be held until the suspended Pick-(n) wagering is  
7 reinstated. An association may request approval of a Pick-(n) wager or separate wagering pool  
8 for specific performances.

9 (16) As it relates to any distribution method under section (2) which contains a unique  
10 winning ticket provision: (a) A written request for permission to distribute the Pick-(n) unique  
11 winning ticket carryover on a specific performance may be submitted to the commission. The  
12 request must contain justification for the distribution, an explanation of the benefit to be derived,  
13 and the intended date and performance for the distribution. Should the Pick-(n) unique winning  
14 ticket net pool and any applicable carryover be designated for distribution on a specified date  
15 and performance in which there is no unique winning ticket, the entire pool shall be distributed  
16 as a single price pool to those who selected the first-place finisher in the greatest number of Pick-  
17 (n) contests.

18 (b) Associations must clearly identify which selection under clauses (i) and (ii) below will be  
19 relied upon for determining the existence of a unique winning ticket:

20 1. there is one and only one winning ticket that correctly selected the first place finisher in  
21 each of the Pick-(n) contests, based upon the official order of finish, to be verified by the unique  
22 serial number assigned by the tote company that issued the winning ticket; or

1           2. the total amount wagered on one and only one winning combination selecting the first-  
2 place finisher in each of the Pick-(n) contests, based up on the official order of finish, is equal to  
3 the minimum allowable wager.

4           (17)(a) Each association shall disclose in its license application whether it intends to  
5 schedule Pick-(n) races and, if so, shall disclose:

6           1. The percentage of the pool to be retained for the winning wagers, and

7           2. The designated amount of any cap to be set on the pool to be retained for the winning  
8 wagers.

9           3. Any changes to the Pick-(n) scheduling shall require prior approval from the commission  
10 or its designee.

11           (18) An association may request permission from the commission to distribute the Pick-(n)  
12 carryover on a specific performance. The request shall contain justification for the distribution,  
13 an explanation of the benefit to be derived, and the intended date and performance for the  
14 distribution.

15           (19) Upon written approval of the commission, a sum of money up to the amount of any  
16 designated cap may be contributed to the Pick-(n) carryover by an association.

17           The association may supply information to the general public regarding the winning dollars  
18 in the Pick-(n) pool. The information shall not be selectively distributed. This shall not prohibit  
19 necessary communication between totalizator and pari-mutuel department employees for  
20 processing of pool data.

21           Section 15. Twin Trifecta Pools. (1) The Twin Trifecta requires the selection of the first three  
22 (3) finishers, in their exact order, in each of two (2) designated races. (a) Each winning ticket for

1 the first Twin Trifecta race shall be exchanged for a free ticket on the second Twin Trifecta race  
2 in order to remain eligible for the second half Twin Trifecta pool.

3 (b) The winning tickets may only be exchanged at attended ticket windows prior to the  
4 second Twin Trifecta race.

5 (c) Winning first half Twin Trifecta wagers shall receive both an exchange and a monetary  
6 payout.

7 (d) Both of the designated Twin Trifecta races shall be included in only one (1) Twin Trifecta  
8 pool.

9 (2) After wagering closes for the first half of the Twin Trifecta, and the takeout has been  
10 deducted from the pool, the net pool shall then be divided into two (2) separate pools: the first  
11 half Twin Trifecta pool and the second half Twin Trifecta pool.

12 (3) In the first Twin Trifecta race only, winning wagers shall be determined using the  
13 following precedence based upon the official order of finish for the first Twin Trifecta race: (a) As  
14 a single price pool to individuals whose combination finished in the correct sequence as the first  
15 three (3) betting interests, except if there are not any of those wagers, then;

16 (b) As a single price pool to individuals whose combination included, in correct sequence,  
17 the first two (2) betting interests, except if there are not any of those wagers, then;

18 (c) As a single price pool to individuals whose combination correctly selected the first-place  
19 betting interest only, except if there are not any of those wagers, then;

20 (d) The entire Twin Trifecta pool shall be refunded on Twin Trifecta wagers for that race and  
21 Twin Trifecta wagering on the second half shall be cancelled.

1 (4) Except as set forth in subsection (16) of this section, if no first half Twin Trifecta ticket  
2 selects the first three (3) finishers of that race in exact order: (a) Exchange tickets for the second  
3 half Twin Trifecta pool shall not be distributed; and

4 (b) The second half Twin Trifecta pool shall be retained and added to any existing Twin  
5 Trifecta carryover pool.

6 (5)(a) Tickets from the first half of the Twin Trifecta that correctly select the first three (3)  
7 finishers shall be exchanged for tickets selecting the first three (3) finishers of the second half of  
8 the Twin Trifecta.

9 (b) The second half Twin Trifecta pool shall be distributed to individuals in the following  
10 precedence based upon the official order of finish for the second Twin Trifecta race:

11 1. As a single price pool, including any existing carryover monies, to individuals whose  
12 combination finished in correct sequence as the first three (3) betting interests except if there  
13 are not any of those wagers, then;

14 2. The entire second half Twin Trifecta pool for that race shall be added to any existing  
15 carryover monies and retained for the corresponding second half Twin Trifecta pool of the next  
16 consecutive performance.

17 (c) If a winning first half Twin Trifecta ticket is not presented for cashing and exchange prior  
18 to the second half Twin Trifecta race, the ticket holder may still collect the monetary value  
19 associated with the first half Twin Trifecta pool except the ticket holder shall forfeit all rights to  
20 any distribution of the second half Twin Trifecta pool.

21 (6) Mutuel entries and mutuel fields shall be prohibited in Twin Trifecta races.

1 (7) If a betting entry in the first half of the Twin Trifecta is scratched, Twin Trifecta wagers  
2 including the scratched betting interest shall be refunded.

3 (8)(a) If a betting interest in the second half of the Twin Trifecta is scratched, an immediate  
4 public announcement and immediate posting on the association's video monitors and website  
5 concerning the scratch shall be made and a reasonable amount of time shall be provided for  
6 exchange of tickets that include the scratched betting interest.

7 (b) If tickets have not been exchanged prior to the close of betting for the second Twin  
8 Trifecta race, the ticket holder shall forfeit all rights to the second half Twin Trifecta pool.

9 (9) If, due to a late scratch, the number of betting interests in the second half of the Twin  
10 Trifecta is reduced to fewer than the minimum, all exchange tickets and outstanding first half  
11 winning tickets shall be entitled to the second half pool for that race, except they shall not be  
12 entitled to the Twin Trifecta carryover.

13 (10)(a) If there is a dead heat or multiple dead heats in either the first or second half of the  
14 Twin Trifecta, all Twin Trifecta wagers selecting the correct order of finish, counting a betting  
15 interest involved in a dead heat as finishing in any dead-heated position, shall be winning wagers.

16 (b) If the dead heat occurs in the first half of the Twin Trifecta, the payout shall be calculated  
17 as a profit split.

18 (c) If the dead heat occurs in the second half of the Twin Trifecta, the payout shall be  
19 calculated as a single price pool.

20 (11) If the first Twin Trifecta race is canceled or declared "no contest", the entire Twin  
21 Trifecta pool shall be refunded on Twin Trifecta wagers for that race and the second half shall be  
22 cancelled.

1 (12)(a) If the second half Twin Trifecta race is cancelled or declared "no contest", all  
2 exchange tickets and outstanding first half winning Twin Trifecta tickets shall be entitled to the  
3 net Twin Trifecta pool for that race as a single price pool, except they shall not be entitled to the  
4 Twin Trifecta carryover.

5 (b) If there are no outstanding first half winning Twin Trifecta tickets, the net Twin Trifecta  
6 pool shall be distributed as described in subsection (3) of this section.

7 (13)(a) The Twin Trifecta carryover may be capped at a designated level approved by the  
8 commission so that if, at the close of any performance, the amount in the Twin Trifecta carryover  
9 equals or exceeds the designated cap, the Twin Trifecta carryover shall be frozen until it is won  
10 or distributed under the provisions of this administrative regulation.

11 (b) After the Twin Trifecta carryover is frozen, 100 percent of the net Twin Trifecta pool for  
12 each individual race shall be distributed to winners of the first half of the twin Trifecta pool.

13 (14) A written request for permission to distribute the Twin Trifecta carryover on a specific  
14 performance may be submitted to the commission. The request shall contain:

15 (a) Justification for the distribution;

16 (b) An explanation of the benefit to be derived; and

17 (c) The intended date and performance for the distribution.

18 (15) If the Twin Trifecta carryover is designated for distribution on a specified date and  
19 performance, the following precedence shall be followed in determining winning tickets for the  
20 second half of the Twin Trifecta after completion of the first half of the Twin Trifecta:

21 (a) As a single price pool to individuals whose combination finished in correct sequence as  
22 the first three (3) betting interests, except if there are not any of those wagers, then;



1 (b) As a single price pool to individuals whose combination included, in correct sequence,  
2 the first two (2) betting interests, except if there are not any of those wagers, then;

3 (c) As a single price pool to individuals whose combination correctly selected the first-place  
4 betting interest only, except if there are not any of those wagers, then;

5 (d) As a single price pool to holders of valid exchange tickets, except if there are not any of  
6 those wagers, then;

7 (e) As a single price pool to holders of outstanding first half winning tickets.

8 (16) For a performance designated to distribute the Twin Trifecta carryover, exchange  
9 tickets shall be issued for those combinations selecting the greatest number of betting interests  
10 in their correct order of finish for the first half of the twin Trifecta.

11 (a) If there are no wagers correctly selecting the first-, second-, and third-place finishers, in  
12 their exact order, then exchange tickets shall be issued for combinations correctly selecting the  
13 first- and second-place finishers.

14 (b) If there are no wagers correctly selecting the first- and second-place finishers, in their  
15 exact order, exchange tickets shall be issued for combinations correctly selecting only the first-  
16 place finisher.

17 (c) If there are no wagers selecting the first-place finisher only in the first half of the Twin  
18 Trifecta, all first half tickets shall be winning tickets and shall be entitled to 100 percent of that  
19 performance's net Twin Trifecta pool, and any existing Twin Trifecta carryover.

20 (17) The Twin Trifecta carryover shall be designated for distribution on a specified date and  
21 performance only under the following circumstances:

1 (a) Upon written approval from the commission as provided in subsection (14) of this  
2 section;

3 (b) Upon written approval from the commission if there is a change in the carryover cap or  
4 if the Twin Trifecta is discontinued; or

5 (c) On the closing performance of the meeting or split meeting.

6 (18) If, for any reason, the Twin Trifecta carryover shall be held over to the corresponding  
7 Twin Trifecta pool of a subsequent meeting, the carryover shall be deposited in an interest-  
8 bearing account approved by the commission. The Twin Trifecta carryover plus accrued interest  
9 shall then be added to the second half Twin Trifecta pool of the following meeting on a date and  
10 performance so approved by the commission.

11 (19) Associations shall not provide information to any individual regarding covered  
12 combinations, the number of tickets sold, or the number of valid exchange tickets. This shall not  
13 prohibit necessary communication between totalizator and pari-mutuel department employees  
14 from processing of pool data.


15 (20)(a) Each association shall disclose in its license application whether it intends to  
16 schedule Twin-Trifecta wagering and, if so, shall disclose: 1. The percentages of the net pool  
17 added to the first half pool and the second half pool; and

18 2. The amount of any cap to be set on the carryover.

19 (b) Any subsequent changes to the Twin Trifecta scheduling require prior approval from the  
20 commission or its designee.

## REGULATORY IMPACT ANALYSIS AND TIERING STATEMENT

(1) Provide a brief summary of:

(a) What this administrative regulation does: This regulation establishes the regulatory framework that applies to the calculation of all pari-mutuel wagers placed on live wagers on races conducted in the Commonwealth.

(b) The necessity of this administrative regulation: This new administrative regulation is being promulgated as part of a comprehensive revision of the Kentucky Horse Racing Commission's regulatory scheme. This regulation is intended to replace previous regulations concerning the same subject matter which are being concurrently repealed.

(c) How this administrative regulation conforms to the content of the authorizing statutes: KRS 230.215(2) grants the commission the authority to regulate conditions under which horse racing and pari-mutuel wagering thereon shall be conducted in Kentucky. KRS 230.361(1) requires the commission to promulgate administrative regulations governing and regulating pari-mutuel wagering on horse races under the pari-mutuel system of wagering.

(d) How this administrative regulation currently assists or will assist in the effective administration of the statutes: KRS 230.215(2) grants the commission the authority to regulate conditions under which horse racing and pari-mutuel wagering thereon shall be conducted in the Commonwealth. This regulation establishes methods by which racing associations in the Commonwealth shall calculate payouts on winning pari-mutuel wagers on live horse races conducted in the Commonwealth. This will consolidate the wagering rules for all breeds into a single, uniform regulation.

(2) If this is an amendment to an existing administrative regulation, provide a brief summary of:

(a) How the amendment will change this existing administrative regulation: This is a new administrative regulation.

(b) The necessity of the amendment to this regulation: This is a new administrative regulation.

(c) How the amendment conforms to the content of the authorizing statute: This is a new administrative regulation.

(d) How the amendment will assist in the effective administration of the statutes: This is a new administrative regulation.

(3) List the type and number of individuals, businesses, organizations, or state and local governments affected by this administrative regulation: This administrative regulation will affect the seven currently-licensed racing associations in the Commonwealth, any applicant for a racing association license, all licensed participants in racing in the Commonwealth, all patrons who place pari-mutuel wagers on live horse races conducted in the Commonwealth, and the commission.

(4) Provide an analysis of how the entities identified in question (3) will be impacted by either the implementation of this administrative regulation, if new, or by the change, if it is an amendment, including:

(a) List the actions that each of the regulated entities identified in question (3) will have to take to comply with this administrative regulation or amendment: Since all of the entities listed in Question 3 currently comply with previous versions of this administrative regulation, no action is expected to be required to comply with this new administrative regulation.

(b) In complying with this administrative regulation or amendment, how much will it cost each of the entities identified in question (3): Since the infrastructure is currently in place to comply with previous versions of this administrative regulation not additional costs are expected to be required.

(c) As a result of compliance, what benefits will accrue to the entities identified in question (3)? Kentucky's seven currently-licensed racing associations, any applicant for a racing association license, all licensed participants in racing in the Commonwealth, all patrons who place pari-mutuel wagers on live horse races conducted in the Commonwealth, and the commission will benefit from the establishment of clearly defined regulatory guidelines concerning pari-mutuel wagering and the calculation and distribution of pools.

(5) Provide an estimate of how much it will cost the administrative body to implement this administrative regulation:

(a) Initially: The total initial cost would be expected to be minimal since most of the regulatory personnel and regulatory infrastructure are currently in place.

(b) On a continuing basis: The total ongoing costs would be expected to be minimal since most of the regulatory personnel and regulatory infrastructure are currently in place.

(6) What is the source of the funding to be used for the implementation and enforcement of this administrative regulation: Racing associations and advance deposit wagering licensees are currently required to pay an excise tax on the gross amount of money wagered on live and simulcast races for which the associations accept pari-mutuel wagers. A portion of this excise tax is used to pay for regulation. In addition, licensees are required to reimburse the commission

pursuant to KRS 230.240 to cover the commission's increased regulatory costs relating to compensation of additional personnel and other expenses.

(7) Provide an assessment of whether an increase in fees or funding will be necessary to implement this administrative regulation, if new, or by the change if it is an amendment:

(8) State whether or not this administrative regulation establishes any fees or directly or indirectly increases any fees: This amendment does not establish any new fees or increase any current fees to participate.
