# STATEMENT OF EMERGENCY

809 KAR 10:008E

This emergency regulatory amendment is promulgated to prevent a loss of state funds that are required to be deposited with the State Treasury pursuant to KRS 230.817, and to meet an imminent deadline for the promulgation of an administrative regulation that is established by state statute. More specifically, this administrative regulation is filed on an emergency basis to ensure: (1) that funds are timely remitted to the State Treasury in accordance with the General Assembly's statutory mandate set out in KRS 230.817; and (2) that a fully functioning sports wagering system is established within six (6) months of the effective date of House Bill 551 (2023 Regular Session), pursuant to the timeline established in KRS 230.361. The Kentucky Horse Racing Commission therefore seeks to implement sports wagering on an emergency basis, in order to comply with the abovereferenced statutory requirements.

This emergency regulation will be replaced by an ordinary administrative regulation at this time. The ordinary administrative regulation is identical to this emergency administrative regulation.

- 7 NECESSITY, FUNCTION, AND CONFORMITY: KRS 230.260 requires the
- 8 commission to "promulgate administrative regulations to establish standards for the

- 14 Section 1. Grounds for Disciplinary Actions.
- 15 (1) The racing commission may take disciplinary action against any person holding a

- regulations promulgated thereunder, by the Licensee or its employees or agents.
- 18 (2) Acceptance or renewal of a license by a Licensee constitutes an agreement on the
- 19 part of the License-Holder to be bound by all the racing commission statutes and
- 20 regulations.
- 21 Section 2. Violations.

- 1 (1) It shall be a violation of this administrative regulation if an Applicant or Licensee:
- 2 (a) Provides the racing commission, any advisory committee, or any racing
- 3 commission employee with incorrect, false, or misleading information;
- 4 (b) Fails to furnish information requested by the racing commission, any 5 advisory committee, or any racing commission employee;
- 6 (c) Is charged or convicted of a crime involving moral turpitude, a felony, sports
  7 wagering, cruelty, mistreatment, abuse, or neglect of a horse, or if the crime discredits or
  8 tends to discredit the Commonwealth of Kentucky, Sports Wagering or the gaming
  9 industry;
- 10 (d) Engages in conduct that is against the best interests of horse racing, pari-11 mutuel wagering, or sports wagering; or
- 12 (e) Violates any provision of KRS Chapter 230, KAR Title 810, or KAR Title 809.
- 14 (2) For any violation established in subsection (1) of this regulation, the racing commission may:
- 16 (a) Deny a license application;
- 17 (b) Suspend or revoke a license;
- 18 (c) Issue a fine or monetary penalty;
- 19 (d) Issue licensure conditions, such as restitution of money, restitution of 20 property, or making periodic reports to the racing commission or designee as required; or
- 21 (e) Issue a written reprimand or admonishment.
- 22 Section 3. Disciplinary Process Investigations.

- 1 (1) The racing commission shall investigate suspected violations of KRS Chapter 230
- and Titles 809 and 810 of the Kentucky Administrative Regulations.
- 3 (2) Upon the completion of the investigation, the person or persons completing the
- 4 investigation shall submit a written report to the commission containing a statement of
- 5 facts revealed by the investigation.
- 6 (3) Based on consideration of the investigative report, the commission shall determine
- 7 whether there is probable cause to believe that a violation has been committed.
- 8 Section 4. Notice of Disciplinary Action and Appeals.
- 9 (1) Upon determination that probable cause exists, the commission shall issue written
- notice of disciplinary action. The notice shall establish:
- 11 (a) The statutory or regulatory violation;
- 12 (b) The factual basis on which the disciplinary action is based;
- 13 (c) The penalty imposed; and
- 14 (d) A statement that the notice may be appealed in accordance with KRS
- 15 Chapter 13B by written notice sent to the racing commission within twenty (20) calendar
- 16 days.
- 17 (2) Notice of a disciplinary action under this section may be appealed to an
- 18 administrative hearing.
- 19 (3) A written request for an administrative hearing shall be filed with the racing
- 20 commission within twenty (20) calendar days of the date of the notice. The request shall
- identify the specific issues in dispute and the legal basis on which the racing commission's
- or designee's decision on each issue is believed to be erroneous.

- 1 (4) An administrative hearing under this section shall be conducted in accordance with
- 2 KRS Chapter 13B.
- 3 (5) If the request for an administrative hearing is not timely filed, the penalty laid out
- 4 in the notice of disciplinary action shall be effective upon the expiration of the time to
- 5 request an administrative hearing.
- 6 (6) Denial of an application for licensure may also be appealed in accordance with
- 7 KRS Chapter 13B, by submitting a written request for an administrative hearing to the
- 8 racing commission within twenty (20) calendar days of the date of the notice of denial.

- (a) What this administrative regulation does: This regulation establishes procedures and articulates grounds for disciplinary actions, imposing sanctions, investigating suspected violations, providing notice of disciplinary actions, and requesting and conducting an administrative hearing.
- (b) The necessity of this administrative regulation: This regulation is necessary to provide specific rules related to disciplinary action taken by the commission against a license holder.
- (c) How this administrative regulation conforms to the content of the authorizing statutes: KRS 230.260 requires the commission to "promulgate administrative regulations to establish standards for the conduct of sports wagering." KRS 230.361 states the "racing commission shall promulgate administrative regulations to establish a fully functioning sports wagering system...." This regulation establishes standards related to disciplinary action taken by the commission against a license holder.
- (d) How this administrative regulation currently assists or will assist in the effective administration of the statutes: This regulation will assist in the effective administration of the statutes by establishing clear and specific standards related to disciplinary action against license holders. This protects the wagering public and promotes integrity in sports wagering.

- (a) How the amendment will change this existing administrative regulation: This is a new regulation.
- (b) The necessity of the amendment to this administrative regulation: This is a new regulation.
