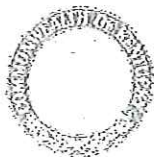

1ST RACE CLEAR
 2ND RACE # 2, DONEGAL COUNTY ran with blinkers on as entered not listed in the program, announced.
 3RD RACE CLEAR

4TH RACE # 6, JACKSON BEND ran with a adjunct bleeder medication not listed in the program, announced.

5TH RACE There was a steward's inquiry into the running of this race involving # 2, PRINCE WILL I AM interfering with # 5, ROMP ridden by Martin Garcia and # 12, A.U. MINER ridden by Calvin Borel. After viewing the films and interviewing the jockeys involved # 2 was disqualified and placed behind # 5. Original order of 4-2-6-12-8-10-7-11-1-5-9-3. Official order of finish 4-6-12-8-10-7-11-1-5-2-9-3. As jockeys were weighing in Javier Castellano the rider on # 2 and Calvin Borel became engaged in an altercation. There was no jockey's objection lodged into the running of this race.

6TH RACE The stall numbers on the starting gate were correct on the front of the gate and incorrect on the back of the starting gate causing a miss load, horses unloaded and reloaded. # 7, WINTER MEMORIES ridden by Jose Lezcano lodged an objection against # 11, MORE THAN REAL ridden by Garrett Gomez for interference at the 1/4 pole. After viewing the films and interviewing the riders involved no action was taken.

LIFE AT TEN : 10th Race, Churchill Downs, November 5, 2010

Interviews conducted by John Veitch

Todd Pletcher (telephonic) 11/7/10 : LIFE AT TEN seemed dull in the paddock. At the walk she was sound. I informed jockey John Velazquez about this fact and told him that to warm her up well during the post parade. I did not approach any Kentucky State Veterinarian with any concerns about the condition of LIFE AT TEN nor did I contact any racing official prior to the running of the race.

John Velazquez (telephonic) 11/9/10 : I (Velasquez) was informed in the paddock by trainer Todd Pletcher that LIFE AT TEN was acting dull in the paddock and to warm her up well. During the post parade LIFE AT TEN was dull and during an interview with ESPN correspondent Jerry Bailey while mounted on LIFE AT TEN on the course prior being loaded into the starting gate stated that LIFE AT TEN was dull and that I (Velasquez) did not know the reason for her condition. I (John Velazquez) did not bring this matter to the attention of the state veterinarian at the starting gate (Dr. Brice Pickham) or any other racing official prior to the start.

Dr. Brice Pickham was on station at the starting gate inspecting all the horse prior to start of the 10th race and was not approached by jockey John Velasquez with any concerns regarding the condition of LIFE AT TEN before she was loaded into the starting gate and the start was taken.

Head outrider Greg Blasi was not approached by jockey John Velasquez at any time during the post parade as to any adverse condition of the horse LIFE AT TEN.

Starter Scott Jordan was not informed by jockey John Velasquez of any problem as to the condition of LIFE AT TEN nor were any of his asst. starters

Amy Zimmer , Asst. Producer for ESPN, in the production truck call the stewards on the drop line and told me (John Veitch) to listen to the feed on ESPN. TV monitor was turned to the ESPN channel and we heard Jockey Velasquez tell Jerry Bailey that LIFE AT TEN was dull and he thought that it might be the lights on the course or the condition track. The stewards heard only the very end of the conversation between Velasquez and Bailey . Jockey Velasquez then continued to warm LIFE AT TEN up, processed to the starting gate where the horse was loaded into the starting gate and the start was taken without jockey Velasquez notifying the state veterinarian, outrider, asst starter or the starter all whom were present at the starting gate as to any problem dealing with the condition of LIFE AT TEN.

A jockey of the stature and experience of John Velasquez knows the protocol to follow when he is not sure of the racing condition of his mount, to report said condition to the state veterinarian for his evaluation. He did not follow that established protocol. Trainer Todd Pletcher also knew the established protocol which he did not follow.
