SUBJ.: RACETRACK PROPOSALS FOR DISTRIBUTION OF THE \$1 MILLION DOLLAR TRANSFER FOLLOWING THE 2014 LEGISLATIVE SESSION

Senate Bill 26 and House Bill 235 were enacted during the 2014 legislative session and included a \$1 million transfer of funds from the Kentucky Equine Drug Research Council to the Kentucky Thoroughbred Development Fund (KTDF). The purpose of the transfer was to enhance purses in Kentucky. Via a letter from David Switzer to the racetracks, the KTDF advisory committee requested any thoroughbred racetrack interested in receiving a portion of these funds to submit a proposal to the committee for consideration.

On June 24, 2014, the KTDF advisory committee met and reviewed the following racetrack proposals. Kentucky Downs elected not to seek any of the additional funding. Behind this memorandum I have included the letter from David Switzer as well as each racetrack proposal.

CHURCHILL DOWNS:

Churchill Downs proposed to use roughly \$125,000 to cover the anticipated deficit at the end of the spring/summer meet. This will alleviate the need to reduce purses an additional 22%. Churchill proposed the remaining funds be used as an incentive to improve field sizes by offering a bonus to each KTDF starter or by increasing KTDF purses during the remaining 2014 meets.

Committee recommendation:

Committee recommends allocating \$300,000 to Churchill Downs to be disbursed during the 2014 September & November meets.

ELLIS PARK:

Ellis Park proposed using the funds to increase KTDF purses during the remainder of the 2014 summer meet. Specifically, Ellis Park will focus on increasing Maiden, Allowance, Optional Claiming & 2YO Stakes races.



Committee Members:

Churchill Downs has prepared a proposal in response to the May 16th letter from David Switzer regarding an incremental \$1 million dollars of available KTDF funding. Without knowing what portion might be allocated to Churchill Downs, we have currently assumed \$450 thousand, based upon our 45% KTDF participation in the past:

1. We are first proposing to use \$125 thousand to cover our projected deficit at the end of the Spring meet. This will help to avoid an estimated 22% cut of KTDF funding in the September and November meets. The September and Fall KTDF exact purse sizes have not yet been determined and will be proposed to KTDF as we get closer to those scheduled meets.
2. The second part of our proposal is intended to be an incentive to help improve field sizes on KTDF races by offering \$400 to every KTDF starter in our September meet and \$250 to every KTDF starter in the November meet.
 - a. These KTDF starter incentives would be incremental to our usual KTDF purses, which will still be allocated more heavily to the winners.
 - b. Based on the 2013 level of KTDF-eligible starters, we project this incentive to cost \$325 thousand.

Chairman Richardson,

Ellis Park has reviewed our racing schedule and presents the following request that we feel will best complement our racing program.

Ellis Park would like to request \$350,000 of the \$1,000,000 KTDF bonus funds.

Ellis would like to reinstate our (2) two year old stakes, The Anna M. Fisher Debutante for fillies and the J. C. Ellis Juvenile for colts. These races would have a purse value of \$125,000 each. \$50,000 association money and \$75,000 KTDF. These races would require \$150,000 of the \$350,000.

In the last half of our meet in 2013 we ran 18 Maiden races averaging 8.37 starters per race and 14 Allowance races averaging 8.0 starters per race for a total of 32 KTDF supplemented races. By increasing our KTDF on each of these races per the following proposal we feel this number will increase to 40 KTDF supplemented races. By adding an additional \$5,000 per each of the 40 races we would spend an additional \$200,000.

Currently our Maiden races are carded at \$12,500 KTDF plus \$16,000 association for a total of \$28,500. We propose to add an additional \$5,000 KTDF to each race. This would make the value of each Maiden race \$17,500 KTDF and \$16,000 association for a total purse of \$33,500.

Currently our Allowance races start at \$13,500 KTDF plus \$17,000 association for a total purse of \$30,500. With an additional \$5,000 KTDF per race the purse now becomes \$18,500 KTDF plus the association money of \$17,000 for a total purse of \$35,500.

Our Optional Claiming Allowance, for a claiming price of \$40,000, are currently at \$14,500 KTDF and \$18,000 association for a total of \$32,500. These would increase to \$19,500 KTDF and association of \$18,000 for a total purse of \$37,500.

Dear David,

In response to your request for ideas for the distribution of the \$1 million dispersal following the 2014 legislative session, we have put together the following scenarios for your consideration.


1. Split among the four Kentucky tracks (Churchill Downs, Ellis Park, Turfway and Keeneland). It is our understanding that Kentucky Downs is not going to request any money from this dispersal. This would give each track \$250,000.
 - a. Use this fall (\$250,000 divided by 75 races = approximately \$3,300 per race)
 - b. Use this fall and next spring (\$250,000 divided by 150 races = \$1,600 per race)
 - c. Keep for fall of 2015 in the event that we get Breeders' Cup. We would use the full amount to promote the meet prior to the big event. (\$250,000 divided by 75 races = approximately \$3,300 per race)

2. Distribute the money equally among Keeneland, Churchill Downs and Ellis Park. (Turfway Park doesn't use their current allocation of KTDF funds.) This would give each of the three tracks \$330,000.
 - a. Use this fall (\$330,000 divided by 75 races = approximately \$4,400 per race)
 - b. Use this fall and next spring (\$330,000 divided by 150 races = \$2,200 per race)
 - c. Keep for fall of 2015 in the event that we get Breeders' Cup. We would use the full amount to promote the meet prior to the big event. (\$330,000 divided by 75 races = approximately \$4,400 per race)

3. Distribute the money with 40% (\$400,000) each going to Churchill Downs and Keeneland and 20% (\$200,000) going to Ellis Park. If the desire is to promote the best of Kentucky racing, these two tracks attract the best horses and give away the most day money and KTDF funds.
 - a. Use this fall (\$400,000 divided by 75 races = approximately \$5,300 per race)
 - b. Use this fall and next spring (\$400,000 divided by 150 races = \$2,600 per race)
 - c. Keep for fall of 2015 in the event that we get Breeders' Cup. We would use the full amount to promote the meet prior to the big event. (\$400,000 divided by 75 races = approximately \$5,300 per race)

We look forward to further discussion.


Mr. Switzer,

We are writing in regards to your May 16th letter requesting a Kentucky Thoroughbred Development Fund (KTDF) summary proposal for the additional KTDF funds that will be made available at the close of the 2014 legislative session.

Prior to requesting additional KTDF funds to add to our purse offering, we would like to take a moment to acknowledge and explain any concerns the committee may have in regards to our current KTDF surplus. We see the following as the fundamental issues that affected our ability to efficiently award KTDF funds thus far in 2014:

- Due to the unusually difficult winter Turfway Park was forced to cancel 7 ½ full race cards.
- The weather conditions also had a significant impact on our ability to remain open for training. Horsemen were not afforded an opportunity to maintain their training regiments and in many cases stopped training their better racing stock until conditions improved.
- Turfway Park was under the impression that going above a 100% match was not an acceptable option to us by the committee.
- Racing schedules have changed and purses have increased greatly in other jurisdictions. Horses do not ship back to Kentucky early in the spring, as they did years ago. For example, Keeneland's entries struggled opening week because horsemen stayed at Oaklawn Park until the end their meet.

Moving forward, with the encouragement we received from the committee this spring to increase our KTDF match to greater than 100%, we are confident that we will be able to better utilize the funds and better promote/reward the top tier Kentucky bred horse owners in 2014 and 2015.

Our proposal is designed to create a lucrative 3 year old winter stakes program to incent Kentucky bred horses to remain in state for our winter stakes series. We believe this will also provide incentive for horses entering in Keeneland allowance/stakes to remain here. Our goal is to maintain an attractive stakes series for Kentucky bred best-in-class 3 year olds (Fillies and Colts) in Kentucky for the winter months, strengthening our stakes program and affording us an opportunity to better promote the races leading up to the Horseshoe Casino Cincinnati Spiral Sakes (G III) and the Kentucky Derby. We believe the path to the Kentucky Derby (G I) for Kentucky bred horses should start right here in Kentucky.


Over the next two years we request an additional \$450,000 KTDF funds (\$225,000 per year) to be utilized as follows:

- An additional \$50,000 per year to be added to the 96Rock Stakes (BT) 3yo - \$100,000 Guaranteed (Includes \$50,000 KTDF).
- An additional \$25,000 per year to be added to the John Battaglia Memorial (L) 3yo - \$125,000 Guaranteed (Includes \$50,000 KTDF).
- An additional \$50,000 per year to be added to the Cincinnati Trophy (BT) f 3yo - \$100,000 Guaranteed (Includes \$50,000 KTDF).
- An additional \$50,000 per year to the Bourbonette Oaks (G III) f 3yo- \$200,000 Guaranteed (Includes \$100,000 KTDF).
- An additional \$50,000 per year to the Horseshoe Casino Cincinnati Spiral Stakes (G III) 3yo - \$600,000 Guaranteed (Includes \$100,000 KTDF).

Additionally, in the best interest of Kentucky horse racing and the efficiency of allocating the KTDF funds we make this request with the self imposed condition that if we are unable to utilize the additional funds they shall be re-allotted with great haste where deemed appropriate.

On June 24, 2014 the KHRC received the attached letter from Churchill Downs with its upcoming 2014 September meet KTDF purse structure request.

KHRC staff confirms that at the beginning of 2014 spring/summer meet, Churchill Downs had a deficit of \$19,974.88 and at the end of the meet the anticipated KTDF deficit of \$125,000.

Churchill Downs is proposing KTDF purses in the range of \$176,000-\$235,000 with an expected payout percentage of 85-percent.

The KTDF Advisory Committee met & reviewed the proposal on June 24, 2014. Approval is recommended.

Committee Members:

Churchill Downs has reviewed our KTDF data and would like to card KTDF purses in the range of \$176,000 to \$235,000 for our upcoming September meet. We have based the range on the following information:

1. Churchill Downs began the year with a \$ 19,975 KTDF deficit that is projected to grow to \$125,000 by the end of the Spring meet.
2. To offset this deficit, Churchill Downs is separately requesting \$125,000 of the \$1 million incremental KTDF funding. This will help to avoid an estimated 22% cut on the purses for September and Fall meets.
3. For the September meet, Churchill Downs is projecting KTDF purse payments of \$150,000 to \$200,000. Compared to actual 2013 KTDF payments of \$198,894, this is a decrease of (24)% to an increase of 1%.
4. In September 2013, the September KTDF payout percentage was 79% but Churchill Downs is assuming a payout ratio of 85% for 2014. Therefore the KTDF purse offerings will be in the range of \$176,000 to \$235,000. Churchill does plan to again pay first through last place.
5. Consistent with 2013, our 2014 September meet will consist of twelve racing days. Therefore the KTDF purse offerings will be in the range of \$14,666 to \$19,583. These offerings per day are down 7% to 30% lower than the 2013 daily average of \$21,017.

Upon review of our Kentucky Thoroughbred Development Fund (KTDF) data, Kentucky Downs would like to offer \$2,450,000 in KTDF purse money during our 2014 live season in September. This request will equal a one to one match with association purse money in all eligible races.

Kentucky Downs had a balance of \$456,088.78 at the end of our 2013 live season. Business levels on historical horse racing and simulcast wagering have been strong. Based on a 90% payout rate, we expect to cover any KTDF commitments and still have a balance remaining similar to the 2013 level. This will place Kentucky Downs in a strong position as we look forward to 2015 when we hope to offer more live race days.

To encourage participation, we plan to pay KTDF purses through last place for all eligible horses.

JOCKEY7 WAGER

RULES

The Jockey7 special wagers are individual separate pool bets, with winning wagers defined by points accumulated over seven races. Fans will be wagering on horses, not people. The wager is based upon a point system as outlined below.

Kentucky Downs proposes to offer the Jockey7 special wagers on each live racing day during the 2014 season. The Jockey7 will take place over the last seven races on the scheduled 10 race cards. The Jockey7 will be offered on Sept. 6, 10, 13, 17 and 24.

Patrons will wager on a grouping of horses, which will represent the scheduled mounts for one or more jockeys competing in the last seven races. Each grouping of horses will be assigned a betting number in the program, which will be 1 – 14.

The wagering menu for the Jockey7 special wagers will include win, place, show, exacta and trifecta wagering and will feature the same takeout as those wagers on all races at Kentucky Downs.

As the tote company for the host track, AmTote will designate a different "race number" outside of Kentucky Downs' scheduled 10 races. It is anticipated the Jockey7 will be Kentucky Downs Race #11. Each form of wager utilized in the Jockey7 will consist of a separate pool. When fans wish to place a wager, they will go to the window and say (for example) Kentucky Downs Race #11... \$2.00 to win on #1.

#1 would consist of the horses scheduled to be ridden by a particular jockey in the last seven races on the card. The grouping of horses will initially be arranged so that each horse in the #1 group has the same rider (for example #1 – all mounts scheduled for Robbie Albarado, #2 – all mounts scheduled for Calvin Borel, etc.) One or more betting numbers will have scheduled mounts by more than one jockey, so that all horses are represented and all 14 numbers will have a betting interest. The track will set the final numbers and communicate them to the Stewards by scratch time.

Should a rider in the Jockey7 be unable to fulfill his/her riding obligations on each of the scheduled mounts, the wager would remain in effect, with the fan keeping the same horses, with the substitute rider(s) (This is similar to how a Pick-Six bet is handled).

Kentucky Downs plans to utilize the following point system for each of the seven races:

1st Place Finish: 25 points

2nd Place Finish: 12 points

3rd Place Finish: 9 points

4th Place Finish: 5 points

Late Scratch: 1 point

Horse(s) declared a Non-Starter: 1 point

No Contest Race: 1 point awarded to all starters in the race

Coupled entries will share any points earned by one of more entrants. The total points earned by a coupled entry will be divided by the number of starting horses in that entry and equally allotted to the original betting number that listed the scheduled entry.

Upon the event of a disqualification of a horse by the stewards in any of the races in the Jockey7 races, the horse will receive the points (if any) of the official final finish position assigned by the stewards.

After each race that is part of the Jockey7 is declared official, the presiding steward shall credit the proper amount of points to each entrant finishing 1st – 4th (or any late scratches or non-starters).

In the event of any deadheats (for 1st – 4th place) in a race included in the wager, the point totals for the finish positions involved will be equally divided between the horses involved in the deadheat. (For example, a deadheat for 1st place between two horses in a race would provide 18.5 points for each horse. This represents the 25 points for 1st plus the 12 points for second, divided by two).

After the seventh race in the series, the presiding steward shall determine the final point total for each of the 14 entrants as official, and notify tote and the mutuels department of the final standings and series "order of finish" based upon these point totals. In the event of a tie in final points, the total Win, Place and Show payoffs for each entry in every leg will serve as the tiebreaker. If a tie still exists, then the finish will be declared a deadheat.

Upon such notification, the mutuels department and tote shall declare the bet "official", with payouts calculated consistent with the Kentucky Horse Racing Commission rules for win, place, show, exacta and trifecta wagering.



