## MISSION STATEMENT

---

The KHRA is an independent agency of state government charged with the responsibility of regulating the conduct of horse racing and pari-mutuel wagering on horse racing and related activities within the Commonwealth of Kentucky.

The Authority consists of 13 members appointed by the Governor, with the Secretaries of the Environmental and Public Protection Cabinet, Commerce Cabinet and Economic Development Cabinet serving as ex-officio nonvoting members. One member is appointed to serve as chairperson of the Authority. A second member is designated to serve as vice chair of the Authority to act in the absence of the chair.

The KHRA is responsible for the following:

- a) Developing programs and procedures for oversight and regulation of horse racing matters, including, but not limited to, race day medications.
- b) Recommending tax incentives and other options to promote the strength and growth of the thoroughbred industry and to preserve the economic viability of Kentucky's horse farms.
- c) Designing and implementing programs that strengthen the ties between Kentucky's horse industry and the state's universities, with the goal of increasing the economic impact of the horse industry on Kentucky's economy.
- d) Developing and supporting programs that ensure Kentucky remains a national leader of equine research.
- e) Developing and implementing programs that promote Kentucky's horse and tourism industry.



## LETTER FROM CHAIRMAN STREET

---

As provided by KRS 230.370, this 2006-2007 Biennial Report is submitted on behalf of the Kentucky Horse Racing Authority. It has been an honor to serve as Chairman and witness the hard work, diligence and the accomplishments achieved by the Authority members and staff.

The breeding and racing industry in Kentucky is an enormous contributor to the economy of our Commonwealth and complete funding for the racing authority is a necessary priority of consideration by the legislature.

The Authority members are passionate in regulating our industry with fairness for all participants and have worked diligently to ensure thoroughbred, standardbred and quarter horse racing in Kentucky is conducted with the highest standards of integrity. We have made great strides in updating the rules and regulations by which the racing industry abides, but there remains much to accomplish and currently we have the processes in place to develop up-to-date rules and regulations.

With the integrity of our sport so prevalent in the news media this past year, it continues to be a major concern and urgent need for the KHRA to get the necessary funding to hire a Supervisor of Pari-Mutuel Wagering to independently monitor the wagering systems. The betting public is the major contributor of horse racing and is entitled to know that betting on race horses in Kentucky is honest, legitimate and trustworthy. As the regulatory body we must provide our customers with that confidence.

The KHRA members are to be commended for tightening the reins on illegal medications in race horses in Kentucky. As the perception and misuse of steroids in athletes in other sports runs rampant, the time has come to begin the process of regulating the use of anabolic steroids in equine athletes. The need for an Equine Medical Director to assist the KHRA in addressing these upcoming and controversial issues is a priority. With the Racing Medication and Testing Consortium (RMTTC) working to regulate the use of certain steroids in race horses, we must be equipped with equine medical professionals who can lead Kentucky through the process that is fair and beneficial for everyone involved, including our horses. We must develop a solution to protect Kentucky's heritage of breeding the best and strongest horses in the world.

With the development of the new Kentucky Breeders' Incentive Fund (KBIF) program in 2006, we have witnessed an explosion of new horses, breeders and owners coming to Kentucky and wanting to be part of the breeders' incentive awards. During the inaugural year of the KBIF, 1,789 Kentucky thoroughbred breeders qualified for a total of approximately \$12.6 million dollars in awards.

Since the inception of the breeder's awards several top standardbred stallions have come to stand in Kentucky to be eligible for the rich Kentucky Sires Stakes purses. The Red Mile and KHRA staff hosted the first "Unbridled Evening of Champions" to showcase the top standardbred horses in the U.S. and Canada.

The evening was attended by legislators who presented trophies to the winning connections of each race. We are hoping this will be an annual event to highlight the standardbred industry in Kentucky.

The KBIF not only benefits the thoroughbred breeders but everyone who owns, trains and breeds horses in Kentucky as is evidenced by the non-race owners and breeders earning approximately \$1.6 million in awards.

The economic impact has been so substantial that Kentucky farms are being bought by constituents from other states for horse enthusiasts to live breed and compete here in Kentucky. The ground work and foundation of the KBIF was implemented with such thoroughness that the program continues to run smoothly and will become richer and more lucrative in years to come! Statistics of the first two years of the KBIF are included in this report. It has been very rewarding for the KHRA to have played a role in the implementation of this program and watch it grow Kentucky's horse industry to new heights.

In 2006 and 2007, two groups applied for the last race track license available in Kentucky. Extensive work has gone into reviewing and investigating all applicants to determine the quality of leadership, commitment and resources to deserve this license.

Kentucky's own Chief State Steward, John Veitch was inducted into the Racing Hall of Fame in August proving the quality of staff working for the racing authority.

In 2007, the KHRA hired a new licensing director and, in conjunction with the Office of Alcoholic Beverage and Control, conducted training sessions for the KHRA licensing staff on recognizing false identification documents. They also instituted a photo identification protocol requiring all licensees to submit a photo ID before being issued a racing license. A committee was assigned the task of researching the possibility of fingerprinting all licensees in the future to assist the licensing personnel and KHRA investigators in thorough criminal background checks of the more than 18,000 persons who apply every year to participate in racing.

In closing, I would like to congratulate the KHRA members and staff for their hard work in keeping Kentucky moving forward and for their continued passion and commitment.

But there is still much to be done and my sincere hope is that the Authority, along with every racetrack and the Kentucky legislature, will continue to work together for the betterment of the Kentucky horse racing industry, its equine and human athletes and all who participate in this great sport.

## EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S COMMENTS

---

The KHRA has been very busy and has made great strides during calendar years 2006 and 2007, but there is more to do.

I became executive director on October 2, 2006 and have been privileged to work with a professional staff and an outstanding Board dedicated to regulating and promoting the Commonwealth's horse racing industry. The following are highlights from 2006 and 2007:

- The Equine Drug Research Council recommended and the KHRA approved the adopted withdrawal guidelines for equine medications which were incorporated into the revised penalty regulation.
- The Equine Drug Research Council and the KHRA approved entering into a contract with the University of Kentucky for the University of Kentucky to provide an Equine Medical Director to the KHRA.
- Kentucky began participating in the uniform on-track equine injury data reporting system. The injury reporting project will help identify the frequency, type and outcome of racing injuries using a standardized format that will generate valid composite statistics. The injury reporting system is sponsored by the Grayson-Jockey Club Research Foundation, and is being developed by InCompass Solutions, Inc, a subsidiary of The Jockey Club.
- The KHRA now utilizes procedures for selecting laboratories for split sample testing of blood and urine in the event of a positive sample. A list of laboratories approved to serve as the split sample laboratory is constantly being updated as additional medication positives occur.
- On June 22, 2007, investigators found Alpha Cobra Toxin in a barn at Keeneland. That investigation-one of the most complex and time consuming investigations Kentucky racing regulators have ever undertaken-led to the suspension of a veterinarian and a trainer. For the first time the "suspended person" rule has been applied for a violation of Kentucky medication rules. Under the suspended person rule no person may train a horse for the benefit, credit, reputation or satisfaction of a suspended person.
- An emergency regulation was filed relating to the Kentucky Thoroughbred Breeders' Incentive Fund (KBIF) so that breeders would qualify for awards beginning on January 1, 2006. During the inaugural year of the KBIF, a total of approximately \$12.6 million in award money was distributed. During 2007, Kentucky breeders qualified for a total of approximately \$15.4 million in award money.
- During 2007, Fasig Tipton began placing the KBIF logo next to mares registered/ eligible for KBIF.

- The regulation relating to the non-race breed incentive program went into effect during this biennium. This was the first incentive fund developed for non-race breeds in Kentucky and was eagerly awaited by the entire non-race breed community. During 2006, the KHRA received eleven non-race applications for review for awards under the non-race breed incentive fund. A total of nine breeds were approved, including three applications under the same breed umbrella. Groups representing the non-race breeds received a total of \$1,131,706 for 2006 events and a total of \$1,370,007 is anticipated to be distributed for events occurring in 2007.
- Many of the regulations governing the thoroughbred and standardbred industry were either updated or promulgated for the first time.
  - The jockey advertising regulation was amended to clarify permitted advertising. All of the jockeys complied with the regulation during the Derby and the Breeders' Cup.
  - Thirty-three regulations were updated covering the standardbred industry.
  - Regulations were promulgated establishing procedures relating to the various breeder incentive funds.
  - A regulation was promulgated establishing procedures for licensing of HUBs KRS 230.775(1) defines HUB as an international wagering hub, a business, which, through a qualified subscriber-based service, conducts pari-mutuel wagering on the horse races that it simulcasts and other races that it carries in its wagering system.
  - A regulation was promulgated regarding the Kentucky Thoroughbred Development Fund (KTDF), the first time a regulation had been promulgated to provide guidance on the operations of KTDF since the Fund's inception in 1978.
- We met with various legislators to attempt to secure additional funding for fiscal year 2008. Representatives from the race tracks also met with legislators to try to secure additional funding. These attempts were unsuccessful.
- In March of 2006, the KHRA requested that the Office of the Auditor of Public Accounts audit the KTDF. The KHRA had become aware that there was a shortfall in the KTDF which began in the mid-1990's. Money from the KTDF supplements purses to the owners of horses bred in Kentucky and registered with the Kentucky Owners' and Breeders' Association Inc. These purse supplements are an integral part of the racing structure in the Commonwealth. In December 2006, the KHRA approved a Settlement Agreement and Memorandum of Understanding among the four major thoroughbred racing associations, the KHRA and the Kentucky Thoroughbred Development Fund Advisory Committee to resolve the KTDF issue and put controls into place so that the fund is operated properly going forward.


- The KHRA began using a tamper resistant licensing card with a hologram to make duplication of the licenses almost impossible. Every licensee was required to obtain a new digital photo to update photos in the system and the use of the new card has thwarted attempts to copy or duplicate.
- A new protocol was initiated by the licensing division to assure that all license applicants presented a valid identification prior to license badge issuance.
- During 2007, the KHRA compiled a Personnel Manual for the KHRA employees, and received approval from the Authority for use of the personnel manual and conducted training for all personnel on policies and procedures. We are told this is the first time this statutory requirement has been met since the statute requiring a personnel manual was enacted in the 1970s.
- Rulings issued by the Chief State Steward and Chief State Judge are now posted on the KHRA website at [khra.ky.gov](http://khra.ky.gov).
- John Veitch, the Commonwealth's Chief State Steward, was inducted into the Racing Hall of Fame.

These are just a few of our key accomplishments, and I am proud to announce that we made these achievements with one of the smallest regulatory racing staff in the nation.

During 2006, the source of KHRA funding and staffing levels was analyzed by various constituencies. An internal review conducted by the KHRA early in 2006 had resulted in a recommendation to the Authority of a reorganization which would have created a Division of Incentive and Development and added positions such as the supervisor of pari-mutuel betting and additional backside security personnel. The budget bill sent to the Governor by the legislature during the 2006 session provided that \$1.2 million of the KHRA budget normally funded through assessments to the racetracks was to be replaced by general fund dollars during the 2006-2007 fiscal year. No replacement money was appropriated, however, for the second year of the biennium. The Authority did not obtain reimbursements for the expenses incurred by it for racing during the 2006 or 2007 fiscal years even though by statute the tracks are required to make such reimbursement. During fiscal year 2007, the Authority operated off of reserves, licensing fees and a reduced general fund appropriation.

The budget bill also required the Auditor of Public Accounts to audit the Authority. This audit was conducted during 2006 and the report was issued in December 2006. In summary, the Auditor agreed with the conclusions reached internally by the KHRA—the KHRA is under funded and under staffed, as demonstrated by the graphic displayed below. The information below is from the management audit prepared by the Kentucky Auditor of Public Accounts dated December 2006; however, the Kentucky number of employees has been modified to reflect the number of full time employees, which is a more accurate description of the personnel in place as of December 31, 2007.

The Kentucky Horse Racing Authority (KHRA) is the state agency in Kentucky responsible for regulating and promoting our Commonwealth's signature industry. KHRA is privileged to administer programs designed to benefit all Kentuckians involved in horse racing, whether they be horse owner, trainer or the occasional two-dollar bettor.

KHRA is an independent agency attached to the Environmental and Public Protection Cabinet for administrative purposes, and is comprised of an Executive Director and staff, and a 16-member Board.

The KHRA is honored to have the following racing industry and community leaders serve as voting members of the Board:

Chairman William Street, was former President of Brown-Forman Corporation and continues as a member of the Brown-Forman Corporation Board of Directors where he has served since 1971. He also serves on the Board of Papa John's International, Inc. and several other civic boards. Mr. Street is a graduate of Princeton University and the Harvard Business School.

Vice Chair Constance Whitfield, of Hopkinsville, was former attorney for the U. S. Department of Justice and Office of Legal Policy. A Phi Beta Kappa and cum laude graduate of Stanford University, she holds Bachelors and Masters Degrees from Stanford and a Juris Doctorate Degree from the University of California at Los Angeles. Mrs. Whitfield is the Chair of the Equine Drug Research Council.

Mr. Kerry Cauthen, received his undergraduate and law degree from the University of Kentucky. Kerry is a co-owner and managing partner of Four Star Sales with John T.L. Jones, Jr., Dan Kenny and David Greathouse. Kerry serves on the board of the Consignors & Breeders Association (CBA), a trade organization that represents thoroughbred consignors and breeders in educating market participants in matters relating to horse sale rules and regulations. He is a member of the Keeneland Association and Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders Association (TOBA). He is a former Chairman of the National Thoroughbred Racing Association (NTRA) Communications Committee, a member and former director of the Kentucky Equine Education Project (KEEP), the Thoroughbred Club of America and High Hope Steeplechase.

Mr. Thomas Gaines is a founding partner in Gaines-Gentry Thoroughbreds, a leading breeder and commercial seller in the thoroughbred industry. He serves as president of KBC International, a worldwide horse equipment company. Mr. Gaines is a partner in one of the largest thoroughbred sales consignors, Eaton Sales, and serves as a member of the Breeder's Cup, Ltd. board of trustees. He is also a director of the Kentucky Equine Education Project (KEEP) where he chairs the political action committee.

Ms. Dell Hancock is a co-owner of Claiborne Farm in Paris, Kentucky. She is currently a member of the Board of Directors for the Kentucky Thoroughbred Association (KTA), a member of the Jockey Club, Chairman of the Grayson Foundation and Chairman of the American Graded Stakes Committee. Ms. Hancock is also a member of the Commission of the Kentucky Horse Park.

Mr. Doug Hendrickson is president of Limestone Associates and Limestone Mortgages and currently owns numerous thoroughbreds in various partnerships. He received a Bachelor of Science from the University of Georgia and graduated from Rutgers University/ABA with a graduate degree in Banking and Finance.

Mr. Tom Ludt is general manager of Vinery, Ltd., a stallion farm located in Lexington, Ky., and Ocala, Fl. He serves on the Board of Trustees for the Breeders' Cup and is a newly elected board member of TOBA. Mr. Ludt is a member of the Sales Integrity Task Force.

Mr. Larry F. Telle has been with the investment firm of J.J.B. Hilliard, W.L. Lyons Inc. for more than 27 years. His role as Senior Vice President includes investing for individual and corporate clients as well as principal trading NASDAQ stocks in the over-the-counter market. Mr. Telle holds a Bachelor of Science degree in Economics and Political Science from the University of Kentucky. He has been an owner and breeder of thoroughbred race horses since 1984, including stakes winners "Double Zero Seven" and "Longsuit." Mr. Telle currently serves on the Board of Directors of the Association of Racing Commissioners International Inc. (RCI) as well as civic boards in Louisville.

Mr. Kenneth Alan Jackson, of Lexington, was appointed December 2006 and is an attorney and co-owner of Kentuckiana Farms. Mr. Jackson is a graduate of the University of Kentucky and received his Juris Doctorate from the University of Louisville. He is a member of the Board of Directors of KEEP, the United States Trotting Association, the Thoroughbred Club of America, TOBA and the Kentucky and Fayette County Bar Associations.

Dr. Jerry Yon was appointed in December 2006 and is a self-employed physician. Dr. Yon is a graduate of the University of Illinois, the University of Kentucky College of Medicine and the University of Illinois Medical Center. He is a member of the Lexington Medical Society, the Kentucky Medical Association, the American Society of Gastrointestinal Endoscopy, the American College of Gastroenterology and the Thoroughbred Club of America.

Mr. Franklin Kling was appointed in December 2006 and is Chairman and CEO of FK Holdings Inc. He received a Bachelor of Arts degree in Accounting from Thomas Moore College in Crestview Hills, KY. Mr. Kling is an owner and breeder of thoroughbreds in the Lexington, Kentucky area and is a member of The Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders Association (TOBA), the Kentucky Thoroughbred Association (KTA), the Kentucky Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders Association (KTOB), the Thoroughbred Club of America and the Keeneland Club.

Mr. Richard Knock was appointed in November 2007 and is the President, Chairman and CEO of Knock Investments and Omaha Enterprises (a real estate investment company) in Union, Kentucky. Mr. Knock is an immediate past member of the Northern Kentucky Airport Board, is the Commissioner of the Boone County Planning & Zoning Commission, chairman of The Knock Family Foundation, Inc. in Union, KY, Honorary Director of Cardinal Hill of Northern Kentucky in Covington, chairman of the Scottish Rite Foundation in Kentucky and former chairman of the Board of Cumberland College. Mr. Knock served as the Mayor (chairman of the Board of Trustees) in Cold Spring, KY from 1962-1964 and received an Honorary Degree, and Doctor of Laws from Cumberland College.

Mr. John Cashman served as president and general manager of Castleton Farms for more than twenty years during which time the Lexington, Kentucky farm was recognized as a worldwide leader in standardbred horse breeding. Mr. Cashman has served as President of the Red Mile, Inc., Tattersalls Sales Company in Lexington and Pompano Park Racetrack in Pompano Beach, Florida. In addition, Mr. Cashman was a director of the American Horse Council and served as chairman of its racing committee. He also served as president of Harness Tracks of America. Other boards he has served on include the University of Kentucky's Gluck Equine Research Center, the Hambletonian Society, the United States Trotting Association and the Horseman Publishing Company which publishes the Horseman and Fair World magazine in Lexington, KY. Mr. Cashman is also a member of the Harness Racing Hall of Fame and is a trustee of the Harness Racing Museum and Hall of Fame. His term with the KHRA expired November 2006.

Mr. Tom Handy is President of Handy Enterprises, Inc. and is a retired attorney for the Commonwealth's 27<sup>th</sup> Judicial Circuit. His professional related experience includes the Governor's Commission for Drug Free Kentucky, Commissioner for the London-Laurel Tourism Commission, Chairman of the Board for UNITE (Unlawful Narcotics Investigation Treatment Education) and he is a member of the Executive Ethics Commission and various Attorney General Legislative task forces. He is on the Board of Directors for the Kentucky Victim Coalition and is a former member of the Governor's Criminal Justice Response Team. Mr. Handy was admitted to practice law by the Commonwealth of Kentucky and the U.S. Supreme Court and is the past president of the Laurel County Bar Association and the Kentucky Commonwealth's Attorney's Association. His term with the KHRA expired November 2006.

Mr. Jack Steinman is a graduate of Miami University in Oxford, Ohio and president of Rhinelander Inc. in Cincinnati, Ohio. He is a board member of the Boy Scouts Dan Beard Council, the Cincinnati Art Museum, the Cincinnati Institute of Fine Arts, and of the Northern Kentucky University Foundation. Mr. Steinman is a former board member of KY Governor's Scholars and the former vice chairman of YMCA, Greater Cincinnati. His term with the KHRA expired November 2006.

Mrs. Donna Smith graduated from High Point College in High Point, North Carolina in 1976 with a degree in Human Relations, a Bachelor of Arts, with a minor in Psychology. Mrs. Smith was a social worker with the High Point YMCA, a Psychological Assistant at Sandhills Mental Health Center in Raeford, North Carolina and worked for Phillip Morris, USA for five and a half years. Her term with the KHRA expired November 2006.

Mr. Ben Walden is founder of Vinery Ltd. which he developed into a major thoroughbred commercial stallion breeding and sales operation. He sold the business in 1998 and has bred over sixty stakes winners. In 2001, Mr. Walden acquired land on Iron Works Pike and named the farm "Gracefield" where it is home to many broodmares and their foals. His term with the Kentucky Horse Racing Authority expired November 2006.

#### EX-OFFICIO MEMBERS (nonvoting)

Mr. Robert D. Vance was appointed Secretary of the Environmental and Public Protection Cabinet on December 17, 2007. Vance is a native of Grant County and earned his business and law degrees at the University of Kentucky. He is also a graduate of the Stonier Graduate School of Banking at Rutgers University and the Executive Banking Institute at the University of Louisville. Vance has served as president of the Maysville-Mason County Chamber of Commerce, board chairman of the Kentucky Bankers Association School of Banking, vice chairman of the Maysville-Mason County Industrial Authority and president of Limestone Family YMCA. He is a past board member of the Kentucky Gateway Museum Center, the Hayswood Foundation, UK Law School Alumni and Integra Bank Corp., of Evansville.

Mr. John Hindman, a native of Ottumwa, Iowa joined United Parcel Service (UPS) in 1974 while attending Iowa State University. Hindman entered full-time management at UPS managing the Des Moines facility and worked in the West Region including Quality Auditing, Marketing, Industrial Engineering, Human Resources, Employee Relations and Public Affairs. Mr. Hindman received the 2007 Governor's Economic Development Leadership Award and was one of the International Association of Business Communicators 2007 Hall of Fame inductees. Appointed to the Louisville Arena Task Force, Hindman chaired the Site Selection Subcommittee in 2006. He was appointed Secretary of the Cabinet for Economic Development in June 2007 and has served on the board of directors for the Kentucky Chamber of Commerce, Associated Industries of Kentucky, Leadership Louisville Foundation, and the Louisville Zoo Foundation.

Mrs. Marcheta Sparrow comes to the post of Kentucky Commerce Secretary with more than 30 years of tourism experience in both the public and private sector. Before her appointment as cabinet secretary, she served nine years as President and CEO of the Kentucky Tourism Council. Sparrow served as Marketing and Public Relations Director at the Shaker Village of Pleasant Hill for nearly nine years where she developed and implemented communications and marketing programs for a National Historic Landmark.

She served as Communications Director for the Kentucky Derby Festival, was the Executive Director of the Frankfort Tourism Commission, and also worked as Director of Tourism for the Louisville Convention and Visitors Bureau. Sparrow chaired the Harrodsburg-Mercer County Tourist Commission for five years and in 1996 received the Kentucky Tourism Council Distinguished Service Award. She is married to Herb Sparrow and they have three children and three grandchildren.

Ms. Teresa J. Hill was Secretary of the Environmental and Public Protection Cabinet. She previously served as Vice Chairman of the Kentucky Public Service Commission. She also has served Governor Fletcher as executive director of boards and commissions and executive director of legal services in the Commerce Cabinet. Ms. Hill is an attorney and a former journalist and practiced law in Corbin, Ky. prior to entering public service. Secretary Hill was replaced by Secretary Robert Vance upon her resignation.

Mr. Marvin E. "Gene" Strong Jr. began his tenure with the Cabinet for Economic Development as Deputy Secretary December 1991, under former Governor Brereton Jones and was named Secretary of the Cabinet in March 1993 by the Kentucky Economic Development Partnership Board. Prior to joining the Cabinet, Strong spent 11 years as executive vice president for a national real estate development company based in Lexington, Kentucky, where his duties included marketing and negotiating office and industrial real estate transactions throughout the U.S. He successfully negotiated and finalized real estate transactions with many of America's Fortune 500 companies. Secretary Strong was replaced by Secretary Hindman upon his resignation.

Mr. George Ward was appointed Secretary of the Kentucky Commerce Cabinet. He was formerly Commissioner of Kentucky Department of Parks. Mr. Ward spent 25 years in the hotel management business and began working in various hotel jobs at the age of 16. Mr. Ward graduated from Cornell University's School of Hotel Administration. Secretary Ward was replaced by Secretary Marcheta Sparrow upon his resignation.



## STAFF

Executive Director, Lisa E. Underwood, assumed leadership of KHRA on October 2, 2006, and has continued to implement changes to enhance KHRA's ability to fulfill its regulatory mission. Director Underwood supervises a full-time staff of racing professionals including the chief steward and chief judge, veterinarians, detention and security personnel, administrative and licensing staff and also the Breeder Incentive Funds. She is a graduate of the University of Kentucky College of Law.

Marc A. Guilfoil has worked for the Kentucky Harness Racing Commission, Kentucky Racing Commission, and the Kentucky Horse Racing Authority for the past 21 years. He has served as Director of Standardbred Racing, Chief Presiding Judge, and Director of Standardbred Development Fund/Kentucky Sire Stakes. Mr. Guilfoil was appointed Deputy Executive Director in July 2007 and now assists the Executive Director in various matters pertaining to the overall operations of the Kentucky Horse Racing Authority.

Jamie Haydon administered the new Breeders' Incentive Funds and the Backside Improvement Fund, and monitored the Health and Welfare Fund. He oversaw the implementation of changes in the operation of the Kentucky Thoroughbred Development Fund and oversaw the Kentucky Standardbred Development Fund.

John Veitch served as Kentucky's Chief State Steward and oversaw the thoroughbred racing industry at live racing meets in Kentucky. Mr. Veitch has been a longtime horseman and trainer and was elected into the 2007 Thoroughbred Racing Hall of Fame in Saratoga, NY, following in the footsteps of his father Sylvester Veitch. He trained Alydar, whose rivalry with Triple Crown Winner Affirmed, is legendary.

John Forgy is a former Kentucky State Prosecutor, who became the general counsel of the Department of Public Protection in June 2004. He now serves as general counsel for the KHRA and has been instrumental in preparing many new regulations and amendments to regulations for the standardbred and thoroughbred industry. Mr. Forgy also managed administrative penalty cases before the Authority as well as civil court litigation to which the Authority is a party.

Leesa Moorman served in the Environmental Public Protection Cabinet (EPPC) in a variety of positions since 1985, including principal assistant, staff attorney and hearing officer. On June 16, 2007 Mrs. Moorman was appointed Director of Licensing for the KHRA. Prior to her appointment she provided legal counsel on employment and regulatory matters to the KHRA. She is a graduate of the University Of Kentucky College Of Law.

Patricia J. Cooksey was appointed Deputy Executive Director of the KHRA in September 2005. She was elected to the Kentucky Athletic Hall of Fame in 2002 and was the recipient of the 2004 “Mike Venezia Memorial Award” instituted by the New York Racing Association to honor a jockey who exemplifies “extraordinary sportsmanship and citizenship.” Cooksey was awarded the Governor’s “Unbridled Spirit Award” in 2005 for her commitment and passion to the people of the Commonwealth of Kentucky and in 2006, received the “Tower Award for Women in Government.” Cooksey was appointed Director of Public Relations for the KHRA in 2007 to oversee the daily operations of the Non-Race Breeders’ Incentive Fund and to promote the horse industry in Kentucky.

Dr. Lafe Nichols was appointed Chief State Veterinarian on April 16, 2007. Dr. Nichols established the Veterinary Medical Center in Henderson, KY in 1985, which supports local thoroughbred, standardbred and quarter horse race tracks, training centers and broodmare farms. He has worked for the KHRA during special events, such as the Kentucky Derby and Breeder’s Cup. Dr. Nichols earned a doctorate in veterinary medicine from Purdue University in 1981 and holds a B.S. in agriculture, also from Purdue.

Jim Cain served as the Director of Enforcement and has performed this function since April 2000. Mr. Cain oversaw investigations of administrative and criminal statutes as they pertained to the horse racing industry in Kentucky. Jim is a retired Lieutenant Colonel of law enforcement with the Jefferson County Sheriff’s Department and brings over twenty-five years of investigative and management experience to the KHRA.

Dr. Nancy Davis served as the Acting Chief State Veterinarian. After more than 30 years with the Kentucky horse industry, Ms. Davis retired from the KHRA April 27, 2007, at the conclusion of the Keeneland Spring meet.



STEWARDS AND JUDGES RULINGS

Calendar Years 2006-2007

The stewards and judges exercise immediate supervision, control and regulation of racing at each licensed race meeting on behalf of the Kentucky Horse Racing Authority. The powers of the stewards and judges include; authority over all horses and all persons, licensed or unlicensed, on association grounds during each race meeting as to all matters relating to racing and the determination of all questions, disputes, protests, complaints or objections concerning racing which arise during a race meeting. As a matter of course Kentucky stewards review the films of each race from three different camera angles before the results are posted “official.” The Chief State Steward and the Presiding Judge are employees of the KHRA. The other two stewards and judges are employees of each racing association.

The Chief State Veterinarian supervises the operations of the test barn, the collection of urine and blood samples for testing and preparation and documentation of the urine and blood samples that are transported to the laboratory.

The KHRA official veterinarians examine horses for soundness and racing fitness to ensure the health and safety of every horse, jockey and driver. By the time a horse reaches the starting gate it has been seen by a KHRA veterinarian three times during the morning leg checks, while in the saddling paddock and during the pre-race warm up. They maintain health records for all horses that compete at each race meet to compare previous injuries to each horse's present condition.

Authority veterinarians are present in the paddock, at the starting gate, in the test barn and on the horse ambulance during live racing in Kentucky. If a horse becomes unruly and injures itself, a KHRA veterinarian could recommend to the Chief State Steward or Presiding Judge that the injured horse be scratched from participating in the race for the protection, safety and health of every horse and rider or driver.

Beginning July 19, 2006, the Authority veterinarians facilitated the performance of necropsies by the University of Kentucky Livestock Disease Diagnostic Center on horses that died or were euthanized as a result of a racing injury or related illness.

The KHRA test barn technicians are responsible for the collection of post race equine urine samples to be sent to Iowa State Testing Laboratory for analysis. A strict "chain of command" protocol is carefully followed with each sample.

Kentucky's new medication withdrawal guidelines went into effect during 2006 to give horsemen and equine practitioners guidelines regarding withdrawal of certain therapeutic medications from a horse prior to a race. This was the first published guidance of its kind in the United States. The KHRA continues to work with industry leaders to update guidelines and assist horsemen with medication regulations.

To keep equine infectious diseases from entering the state, each horse entering the grounds of a race track or training center was required to submit a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI or health certificate) and Coggins (EIA equine infectious anemia) report with the status clearly documented. Each certificate was required to be dated and signed by a licensed, accredited veterinarian.

For the first time in the history of the Kentucky Derby, horses were tested for Epogen (EPO) at Iowa State University prior to the running of the 2007 Derby and all tests reported negative. The KRHA was lauded by the racing industry for being pro active in drug testing.

For the 2007 Breeders' Cup, the KHRA, in conjunction with Monmouth Park, tested horses that were located in Kentucky prior to shipping and all tests reported negative.

In both standardbred and thoroughbred horses the winner plus one other horse was randomly chosen to have blood and urine samples taken for drug testing. Also, in thoroughbred racing all graded stakes races were subject to TOBA (Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders Association) testing, meaning the top four finishers were tested and the laboratory conducted tests for a greater number of illegal medications. TCO<sub>2</sub> blood gas testing was conducted pre-race on a random basis to detect the level of carbon dioxide, a by-product of milk shaking, which neutralizes the buildup of lactic acid in a horse's system. In thoroughbred racing TCO<sub>2</sub> testing is analyzed by the Iowa State Laboratory on a post-race basis, while in standardbred racing TCO<sub>2</sub> testing is performed and analyzed pre-race on a random basis at the test barn.

EPO testing was conducted on every thoroughbred and standardbred blood sample sent to Iowa State for a total of 6,313 EPO samples tested.

#### KHRA UNIFORM DRUG AND MEDICATION CLASSIFICATION SCHEDULE

Class "A" Medications are those that have no legitimate therapeutic indication in the equine athlete and have not been approved for use in the horse by the US Food and Drug Administration. Their potential to influence performance is high based on their presence in Classes 1, 2 or 3 in the Racing Commissioners International Uniform Classification of Foreign Substances. Many of the Class "A" Drugs are not approved for use in any species by the US Food and Drug Administration.

Class "B" Medications are those that may have a legitimate therapeutic indication in the equine athlete but also have a high potential to influence performance based on their presence in Classes 2 or 3 in the Racing Commissioners International Uniform Classification of Foreign Substances. Also in Class "B" are drugs which may have a lower potential to influence performance based on their residence in Class 4 in the Racing Commissioners International Uniform Classification of Foreign Substances but that have not been approved for use in the horse by the US Food and Drug Administration and recognized therapeutic alternatives to these drugs are widely available. Potential contaminant substances are included in this category to provide flexibility pending the outcome of an investigation into the origin of the positive test.

Class "C" Medications are those that have a therapeutic indication in the horse and have a low potential to influence performance based on their presence in Classes 4 and 5 of the Racing Commissioners International Uniform Classification of Foreign Substances.

Class "D" Medications include those therapeutic medications for which concentration limits have been established by the racing jurisdictions as well as certain miscellaneous agents such as dimethylsulfoxide (DMSO) and other medications as determined by the regulatory bodies.

## LICENSING DIVISION

---

The Kentucky Horse Racing Authority requires all persons wishing to participate at Kentucky racetracks and facilities under the jurisdiction of the KHRA to be licensed.

The KHRA provided licensing services in all eight field offices during live racing meets and also at the main office located at the Kentucky Horse Park in Lexington, Ky.

Each day the field licensing staff checked the racing program to ensure participants listed in the official program were licensed correctly and qualified to participate.

In 2006, the licensing unit researched and designed a tamper resistant licensing card with a hologram to make duplication of the licenses practically impossible. Every licensee was required to obtain a new digital photo to update photos in the system and the use of the new card has thwarted attempts to copy or duplicate.

In June 2007, the KHRA hired Leesa Moorman as Director of Licensing and added one more full time and one interim employee to the licensing staff.

In the last half of 2007, several initiatives were implemented to improve the licensing process. In July 2007, all division employees received training from the Office of Alcoholic and Beverage Control (ABC) in the identification of false documents. As of September 11, 2007, all licensees were required to present appropriate photo identification prior to receiving a license. Beginning November 2007, background checks were completed on all applicants using the Racing Commissioners International (RCI) site and a Spanish language license was offered at all licensing locations.

An improved filing system has been implemented for better storage of applications and license fee and cash handling protocols were refined to enhance the security of the collected funds.

Renewal applications were mailed to owners and trainers in the last quarters of 2006 and 2007. Applications may also be downloaded from the KHRA web site at [www.khra.ky.gov](http://www.khra.ky.gov)

A total of 18,272 thoroughbred, 2,071 standardbred and 138 quarter horse licenses were issued by the five members of the licensing staff during 2006 for a total of 20,481. There were 16,468 thoroughbred, 1,958 standardbred and 200 Quarter Horse licenses issued in calendar year 2007 for a total of 18,626 racing licenses issued.

## ENFORCEMENT DIVISION

---

The primary duty of the Enforcement Division is to investigate and detect any violations of the laws as they pertain to thoroughbred, standardbred and quarter horse racing. The Enforcement Division is made up of a Director of Enforcement and one Investigator. The Enforcement Division conducts numerous investigational interviews with applicants who indicate on their license application to having criminal records and convictions for a public offense or a suspension of or revocation of a license for any racing related infraction.

The Division utilizes records and information from the Association of Racing Commissioners International (RCI), Thoroughbred Racing Protective Bureau (TRPB) and the KHRA database, as well as information from local police departments and the court systems, to gain information for criminal background checks and the suitability for licensure.

The Enforcement Division reviews documents supporting eligibility for employment of resident aliens and all foreign workers applying for licenses to prevent any problems between the applicant and the Immigration and Naturalization Service.

Alleged or actual criminal offenses are investigated including human drug violations, assault on association grounds, burglary, theft, forgery and disorderly conduct. Investigations are also conducted regarding a vast array of other potential violations, such as hidden ownership, claims violations and pari-mutuel concerns. Barn searches are conducted as necessary.

The Enforcement Division works closely with local, state and Federal law enforcement agencies as well as with all security departments of racing associations under the jurisdiction of the Kentucky Horse Racing Authority. They constantly share intelligence information with all racing jurisdictions throughout the United States and Canada as well as internationally.

The following is an explanation for the decrease in track reimbursements for FY 2007 and the increase in general fund revenue for FY 2007. The Authority has historically received a portion of its funding from the assessment of the Commonwealth’s racing facilities. The general assembly indicated it wanted the KHRA to discontinue collecting reimbursements from the tracks and included additional general fund money to offset the loss to KHRA for FY 2007. The general assembly did not include a replacement for the track assessment from general fund dollars in the 2008 budget. Meanwhile, an audit was performed by the Auditor of Public Accounts to determine what a proper staffing levels and budget would be for the KHRA. The KHRA has not collected track reimbursements from the tracks since the beginning of FY 2007. The small amount shown during FY 2007 is an assessment for race dates at the end of FY 2006.

- (1) **KRS 138.510** Except for the conduct of harness racing at a county fair, each track with a daily handle of one million two hundred thousand dollars (\$1,200,000) or above shall be required to pay pari-mutuel tax in the amount of three and one-half percent (3.5%) of all money wagered during the fiscal year.
- (2) **KRS 138.510 (6)** One-tenth of one percent (0.1%) of the total amount wagered in Kentucky shall be deducted from the pari-mutuel tax levied and deposited in a revolving fund for the construction expansion or renovation of facilities or the purchase of equipment for equine programs at state universities (Kentucky Council for Post-Secondary Education)
- (3) **KRS 230.550** Two-tenths of one percent (0.2%) of the total amount wagered on live racing in Kentucky and one-twentieth of one percent (0.05%) of the total amount wagered on inter-track wagering shall be deducted for the pari-mutuel tax and allocated to the equine industry program trust and revolving fund for the equine industry program at the University of Louisville.
- (4) **KRS 138.480** Except for the conduct of harness racing at a county fair, each person entering the grounds or enclosure of any race track at which live racing is being conducted under the jurisdiction of the Kentucky Horse Racing Authority, for the purpose of attending races or for any purpose therewith, shall pay a tax of fifteen cents (\$0.15) to the state except as otherwise provided in this section.
- (5) **KRS 137.170** Any race track for any year commencing December 1 and ending the following November 30 for the days upon which races are actually conducted for any stake, purse or prize, shall pay a license tax based on the average daily mutual handle for the proceeding year as noted in this section.

1) **KRS 230.265** The KHRA shall receive one-tenth of one percent (.05%) of total amount wagered and subject to the pari-mutuel tax levied in KRS 138.510. This money shall be used in financing drug research and testing in Kentucky.

2) **KRS 230.400** Money from the Kentucky Thoroughbred Development Fund shall be allocated to each licensed association in an amount equal to the amount the association contributed to the fund. Money is to be deducted from the tax paid by the host tracks and deposited to the thoroughbred development fund in the amount of three quarters of one percent (0.75%) of the total live handle for thoroughbred racing and two percent (2.0%) of the simulcast handle for thoroughbred racing.

3) **KRS 230.770** Money allocated to the fund under provisions of KRS 138.510; The KHRA shall provide for distribution of money to the credit of the development fund to persons, corporations or associations operating licensed standardbred race tracks within Kentucky. The fund is to be used to promote races and to provide purses for races for horses sired by stallions standing in Kentucky, this fund is composed of two-tenths of one percent (0.02%) of simulcast handle from thoroughbred tracks and .0125% of live handle at standardbred tracks per KRS 138.510. This fund is also composed of certain funds submitted by the off-track betting parlors per KRS 230.380.

4) **KRS 230.398** All sums reported under this fund shall be used for purses at harness racing events at county fairs within the Commonwealth of Kentucky that have been licensed and approved by it. This fund is composed of all unclaimed standardbred tickets and certain funds submitted by the off-track betting parlors per KRS 230.380.

5) **KRS.380** After a deduction for local economic development, a commission is taken on wagers placed at a simulcast facility. The Kentucky Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders Inc. receives six percent (6%) of that commission.

6) **KRS 230.218** The Backside Improvement Fund is a revolving fund that consists of money allocated to the fund under provisions of KRS 230.361(5), together with any other money which may be contributed to or allocated to the fund from other sources.

7) **KRS 230.361** All sums reported and paid to KHRA relating to unclaimed thoroughbred tickets with the exception of funds paid under KRS 230.398, shall be paid by the KHRA to the Kentucky Health and Welfare Fund Inc.

## HEALTH AND WELFARE FUND/ COUNTY FAIR PURSE FUND

---

The Kentucky Racing Health and Welfare Fund Inc. is an independent charitable organization, for the benefit, aid, assistance and relief of thoroughbred owners, trainers, jockeys, valets, exercise riders, grooms, stable attendants, pari-mutuel clerks and other thoroughbred racing personnel employed in connection with racing, and their spouses and children, who can demonstrate their need for financial assistance connected with death, illness or off-the-job injury and are not otherwise covered by union health and welfare plans, workers' compensation, Social Security, public welfare or any type of health, medical, death or accident insurance. Proceeds from unclaimed pari-mutuel tickets provide the revenue for this fund.

Any reported pari-mutuel ticket that has not been claimed within one year from the time the ticket became payable is presumed to be abandoned. Each year, any person or association holding any unclaimed tickets presumed abandoned as of July 1 of that year (in other words, any person holding on July 1 any tickets that have not, as of that date, been claimed for a year or more) is required to create a list of the tickets. The list, which records the amount of each ticket, is then submitted to the Authority by September 1 of the same year. Between November 1 and November 15, the person or association then turns over to the Authority the sum represented by the tickets as reported.

In summary, the money turned over to the Health and Welfare Fund relates to pari-mutuel tickets that are over one year old. Specifically, the money given to the Health and Welfare Fund during 2006 relates to tickets that were originally sold to bettors between July 1, 2004, and June 30, 2005, and were still unclaimed a year (or more) later on July 1, 2006. The KHRA staff informally refers to these tickets as the “2006 tickets.”

## KENTUCKY THOROUGHBRED DEVELOPMENT FUND (KTDF)

---

Money from the KTDF is allocated to each licensed association in an amount equal to the amount the association contributed to the fund. This fund is used for purses and advertising. The KTDF receives an amount which is .75% of all wagers from thoroughbred racetracks on live races and 2% of all wagers on simulcast races. It is an incentive program that seeks to encourage owners to buy from Kentucky markets, to board and breed mares on Kentucky farms, to mate them with Kentucky stallions, then to race the Kentucky-foaled horse at Kentucky tracks. This program was created in 1978 and placed under the general jurisdiction of the KHRA. A five-member Advisory Committee is appointed on July 1st of each year to advise and assist the KHRA with the implementation of this program. KTDF money supplements purses in stakes, handicap, allowance and non-claiming maiden events in Kentucky. Only registered Kentucky-sired Kentucky-foaled horses are eligible to share in Fund purse supplements. Only the first four finishers participate, and on a basis of 65% to the winner, 20% to second, 10% to third and 5% to fourth.

The KHRA became aware of a shortfall in the KTDF which began in the mid 1990's and in March 2006 the KHRA requested an audit from the Office of the Auditor of Public Accounts of the KTDF. In December 2006, the KHRA approved a Settlement Agreement and Memorandum of Understanding among the four major thoroughbred associations, the KHRA and the Kentucky Thoroughbred Development Fund Advisory Committee to resolve the KTDF issue and put controls into place so that the fund will be operated properly going forward. There were five KTDF Advisory Committee meetings in calendar year 2007.

Funds that are reverted to the KTDF are a result of non-Kentucky bred horses placing in the designated race receiving those funds. These monies are not distributed to the owner since the horse is not eligible or KTDF registered, but returned to the association for distribution on another designated race.

## KENTUCKY BREEDERS' INCENTIVE FUND (KBIF)

---

The Kentucky Breeders' Incentive Fund was implemented in 2005. Included in the plan were tax incentives to ensure the strength and growth of the horse industry. The Breeders' Incentive Funds are financed through the 6% sales taxes paid on stallion stud fees. This is not a new tax. It is the same tax that has been required to be paid on stallion stud fees previously. Prior to the establishment of this Breeders' Incentive Fund, the stallion stud fee went into the General Fund of the Commonwealth – not back to the Kentucky horse industry.

Kentucky Thoroughbred Breeders' Incentive Fund (KBIF) The Kentucky Thoroughbred Breeders' Incentive Fund is financed from 80% of the receipts collected from the sales and use tax on the fees paid for breeding a stallion to a mare in Kentucky, together with any other money contributed, appropriated or allocated to the fund from all other sources. The money deposited in the Kentucky Thoroughbred Breeders' Incentive Fund is used to administer the fund and provide rewards for breeders of horses bred and foaled in Kentucky.

To qualify for the program, the mare must have been covered by a Kentucky stallion and remain in Kentucky from the time of cover until foaling. For each breeding season, the intended breeder of record is required to register the unborn foal with the KHRA before Aug. 1 of the cover year, plus pay a filing fee of \$60 for each mare.

In 2006 and 2007, the Thoroughbred Breeders' Incentive Fund paid awards to Kentucky bred winners of horses racing in Kentucky in Maiden Special Weight (MSW), Allowance(ALW), Stakes Races and Grade I, II, and III, and in other states outside of Kentucky in MSW, ALW for two, three and four olds and Grade I, II and III races. Awards are also paid in Grade I, II and III races in Canada, England, Ireland and France.

For the first year of registration, approximately 11,200 mares were registered by Kentucky Thoroughbred breeders. Registrations can be made through the end of the yearling year so additional registrations for the 2006 breeding season are still arriving in the KHRA office and could continue up to December 31, 2008, for the 2006 breeding season.

Foals born in 2006 and prior years are grandfathered into the KBIF program if the foal is eligible for the KTDF. In 2006, Kentucky-bred horses won 3,989 races that qualified for incentives totaling \$12,654,845 to 1,789 Kentucky breeders for an average check of \$7,073 per breeder. The first Kentucky race which qualified under this new program was run at Turfway Park on January 1, 2006 and breeder James E. Nelson received a check for \$4,691 for "On the Border's" win.

## Kentucky Standardbred Breeders' Incentive Fund (KYSBIF)

The Kentucky Standardbred Breeders' Incentive Fund is financed from 13% of all receipts collected from the sales and use tax on the fees paid for breeding a stallion to a mare in Kentucky, together with any other money contributed, appropriated, or allocated to the fund from all other sources. The money deposited in the Kentucky Standardbred Breeders' Incentive Fund is used to administer the fund and provide rewards for breeders or owners of Kentucky-bred standardbred horses through the KSDF.

In 2006, six standardbred stallions relocated to Kentucky with five-time leading trotting sire in Illinois, "Valley Victor" leading the roster. For 2007, one of the fastest 2-year-old pacers of all time, "Fox Valley Barzgar," will stand at Walnut Hall Ltd. in Lexington, KY beginning with the 2008 breeding season, making his foals eligible to the rich Kentucky Sire Stakes. Also, world champion trotting sire "Ponder," relocated to Kentucky from Pennsylvania, and will stand the 2008 breeding season at Peninsula Farm.

On September 13, 2007 the first ever "Unbridled Evening of Champions" was conducted at the Red Mile showcasing the U.S. and Canada's top competitors. During the biggest event of standardbred racing in Kentucky, the Red Mile and KHRA staff hosted a dinner for the owners, trainers and drivers of the Kentucky Sires Stakes program. Also in attendance were Kentucky legislators to make trophy presentations to the winning connections of each race.

## Kentucky Horse Breeders' Incentive Fund (KHBIF)

The non-race breeds are awarded under the Kentucky Horse Breeders' Incentive Fund from 7% of all receipts collected from the sales and use tax on the fees paid for breeding a stallion to a mare in Kentucky, together with any other money contributed, appropriated or allocated to the fund from all other sources. The money deposited in the KHBIF is used to administer the fund and provide rewards for owners and breeders of horses bred and foaled in Kentucky. On Monday, April 16, 2007, the Kentucky Horse Racing Authority, on the recommendation of the Horse Breeders' Incentive Fund Advisory Committee, approved nine applications for the fund. This application period will cover calendar years 2006, 2007 and 2008.

For the 12-month collection period of July 1, 2005, through June 30, 2006, the Department of Revenue collected and transferred \$1,131,706 to the KHBIF account. These monies will account for the 2006 calendar year awards for this fund with the exception of the Saddlebred Breed which began awards in 2007. There was \$1,370,006 collected and transferred by the Department of Revenue for the Fiscal Year 2007.

- Turfway Park, the first track in North America to run over a synthetic surface, showed substantial gains in handle both on and off track for its winter/spring meet.
- Turfway's 22-day fall meet ended with double-digit increases in off-track and all sources mutual handle, an increase of 23.6% over the 2005 fall meet.
- During the 2006 Keeneland Spring meet, average daily attendance and total attendance records were set.
- A Keeneland single day attendance record was set on April 14, 2006, when 23,882 fans watched a great day of racing.
- The 17-day Keeneland 2006 fall meet set all-time records for all-sources handle while racing over the synthetic Polytrack surface for the first time.
- The Trakus Technology System was used for the first time at Keeneland to track horses during the running of each race and displayed on a giant screen.
- Wagering records were set on the 2006 Kentucky Oaks with a 43% increase over 2005 Oaks Day.
- Louisville-based Yum! Brands Inc. became the first-ever presenting sponsor of the \$2 million Kentucky Derby.
- The North American record for wagering on a single race was shattered when total wagering on the 2006 Kentucky Derby, which includes on-track and simulcast betting, soared to over \$118 million.
- A record \$10 million in stakes purse money was offered during the Churchill Downs Spring/Fall meets with a total of 47 stakes races.
- The Breeder's Cup World Championships made a record sixth appearance at Churchill Downs on Nov. 4, 2006.
- Ellis Park saw gains in average daily on-track wagering and attendance.
- Four track records were broken during the Ellis Park meet.
- Apprentice jockey Julien Leparoux set several new records over the course of 2006. He set a new record at the Turfway Park Winter/Spring meet with 167 wins from 529 mounts, a win rate of 32%. He also set his second record at the Turfway Park Fall meet with 38 wins, tumbling a 38-year record.

- In addition, Mr. Leparoux became the first apprentice jockey to win a leading rider title at the Keeneland Spring meet when he tied with Rafael Bejarano for leading jockey honors. Mr. Leparoux won the Churchill Downs Spring meet title and became the first apprentice jockey to win a Downs riding crown since 1949.

#### KENTUCKY STANDARDBRED RACING HIGHLIGHTS      Calendar Year 2006

- In the standardbred circuit, two-year olds raced for three \$50,000 legs and a \$200,000 final for the first time ever in the Kentucky Sire Stakes.
- The Red Mile was named “The Track of the Century” by the United States Trotting Association.
- The Kentucky Filly Futurity required a dramatic two-horse, three heat match race to determine the eventual winner, “Passionate Glide.”
- The second jewel of the Trotting Triple Crown saw a stunning win by three year-old colt “Glidemaster” as his driver said the win was redemption after Glidemaster had run off during the post parade of the 2005 Futurity, ruining his chances for victory that year.

#### KENTUCKY THOROUGHBRED RACING HIGHLIGHTS      Calendar Year 2007

- Queen Elizabeth II and Prince Phillip attended the Kentucky Derby for the first time in Derby history marking it a day of royalty!
- Keeneland’s 2007 spring meet ended with a total wagering record exceeding \$158 million for the fifteen day meet. The new polytrack surface attracted full, competitive fields.
- The 2007 Toyota Bluegrass Stakes day set wagering records for all-source handle and also handle for the pick six, pick four and pick three wagering pools. Wagering from all sources on the ten-race card totaled \$19,246,840 eclipsing the 2006 record of \$18,319,492 set on the 2006 Toyota Bluegrass Day.
- Eclipse-award winning apprentice jockey, Julien Leparoux, was atop the jockey standings for his third consecutive Keeneland riding title.
- On April 12, 2007 the two-year old filly “One Hot Wish” set a world record on the Keeneland polytrack when she ran 4 ½ furlongs in :48.87 to win by 12 ¼ lengths in a maiden special weight race.

- Record attendance was set at the conclusion of the 2007 Keeneland 17-day fall meet with 239,236 attending the races. It was the second-highest for any meet in track history.
- Leading trainer Bill Mott recorded his 200<sup>th</sup> career win at Keeneland with a victory in the Grade III Fayette Stakes in the final race of the meet.
- Average attendance was up for the Churchill Downs' spring meet as daily attendance rose 5.48% over last years meet and average on-track betting increased 6.29%.
- Kentucky Downs concluded the 2007 meet with its second highest on-track handle and third largest handle in the 17 year history of the European-style, all turf race track.
- Twelve fewer races were run due to excessive rain at Kentucky Downs but on-track handle for the six racing days was up 21.2% while total handle was up 12.7% from last year.
- Chicago based jockey, Larry Stirling, Jr. earned the leading jockey title for his first ever meet at Kentucky Downs, while Daniel "Speedy" Smithwick, Jr. won his first training title at Kentucky Downs with 6 wins from 15 starters.
- The top two Kentucky Derby finishers "Street Sense" and "Hard Spun" matched up in the Kentucky Cup at Turfway Park to an estimated crowd of 13,640, the largest in the 14 year history of the Kentucky Cup.
- Betting on the 12 race card was up about 8% from that bet on the 2006 Kentucky Cup card. All sources wagering on the 2007 Kentucky Cup Classic was \$1,251,022, up 39% from last year.
- With new owner Ron Geary at the helm, Ellis Park saw revenues climb 14%, concession sales rose 26% and total wagering was up 5% for the 2007 summer meet.
- Ellis Park hosted the National Claiming Crown on August 4, 2007 showcasing the blue collar claiming horses that fill the ranks of racing throughout the year. This was a huge success and Kentucky hopes to welcome the event back in the near future.

## World Records Broken

- In 2007, the success of the Kentucky Sires Stakes continued when three year-olds set the stage for a Kentucky Super Night of racing when all eight divisional championships competed for over \$500,000!
- Winner of the Hambletonian, the first leg of the trotting Triple Crown, ***Donato Hanover***, tied the fastest mile ever by a trotter when he won the 115<sup>th</sup> Kentucky Futurity in 1:50.1 at the Red Mile. ***Donato Hanover's*** winning time set a world record for 3 year-old colt trotters for his 18<sup>th</sup> consecutive victory.
- ***Snow White*** became the fastest 2 year-old trotter in history, male or female, with a stunning victory in a division of the International Stallion Stake (INSS) at the Red Mile on October 2, 2007 with a final clocking of 1:52.4. She toppled the world record of 1:53.2 set earlier in the year by freshman colt trotter Muscle Mass.
- ***Hana Hanover*** equaled the world record for sophomore filly pacers in 1:49.2 on September 28, 2007 at the Red Mile.
- The fastest juvenile pacing filly ever, ***A and G'sconfusion*** set a world-record at the Red Mile on September 26, 2007 while winning a division of the Bluegrass.
