KTDF PURSE STRUCTURE - CHURCHILL DOWNS' FALL MEET

On October 5, 2021 the KTDF Advisory Committee considered the following request from Churchill Downs with its KTDF purse structure for the 2021 Fall Meet.

KHRC staff confirms that at the end of the 2021 Spring Meet, Churchill Downs had a surplus of \$1,836,966. Churchill Downs is proposing KTDF purses in the range of \$5.5 million to \$6.3 million for the 2021 Fall Meet. Projections are based on a payout of 86.5% of the amount carded and daily earnings of \$110,558.

Churchill Downs will pay out KTDF funds through last place and in the event of a dead heat, the KTDF portion of the non-eligible horse reverts to the Fund.

The KTDF Advisory Committee recommends approval.

Committee Members:

Churchill Downs has reviewed our purses and would like to card KTDF purses in the range of \$5.5 million to \$6.3 million for our upcoming Fall Meet. We would like to include KTDF on the Stakes races during the Meet. We have based the range on the following information:

- 1. At the end of our Spring 2021 Meet, Churchill Downs had a surplus balance of \$1,836,966.
- Our 2021 Fall Meet will consist of 21 racing days beginning on Sunday, October 31st through Sunday, November 28th. We are projecting daily earnings of \$110,558 which is \$50,721 (or +85%) higher than \$59,837 earned in 2020. The primary driver is the KTDF earned from parimutuel wagering from Derby City Gaming LLC ("Derby City") and Oak Grove Racing and Gaming throughout 2021.
- 3. For Fall 2021, we are assuming a KTDF payout percentage of 86.5% with anticipated KTDF disbursements of \$5.4 million which is \$2.3 million higher than the \$3.1 million paid during the Fall 2020 Meet. The primary driver of the increase is the estimated pari-mutuel wagering from Derby City along with attendance continuing to improve as customers return to the track.
- 4. To encourage participation during the Fall Meet, we are again planning to pay KTDF purses from first to last to all eligible horses.

THE KENTUCKY THOROUGHBRED DEVELOPMENT FUND (KTDF)

Given the robust business during calendar year 2019 and the pandemic impacted 2020, the state-of-theart historical racing machines at nearby Derby City Gaming has generated \$15.3 million in KTDF for horsemen with Kentucky-sired Kentucky-breds to run for in designated stakes, handicap, allowance, non-claiming maiden races, and allowance optional claiming races with a claiming price of not less than twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) contested at Churchill Downs Racetrack.

Eligible races can be readily recognized in the stakes and condition books by the Kentucky Thoroughbred Development Fund seal, which will appear next to each race in the stakes and condition books.

In accordance with KRS 230.400(5) (d), it is mandatory for a horse to be registered prior to time of entry to be eligible to participate in the distribution of Kentucky Thoroughbred Development Fund monies. Registration is only complete once the application is approved and payment has been received.

All horses of racing age that are both Kentucky-bred and sired by a Kentucky stallion which stood in Kentucky the entire breeding season the year the horse was conceived are eligible to be registered. Owners of horses of racing age are responsible for registering their horses. Stallion owners are responsible for registering their stallions.

On October 5, 2021 the KTDF Advisory Committee considered the following request from Turfway Park with its KTDF purse structure for the 2021 Holiday Meet & 2022 Winter/Spring Meet.

KHRC staff confirms that at the end of the 2021 Spring Meet, Turfway Park had a surplus of \$2,435. Turfway Park is proposing KTDF purses in the range of \$4.1 million to \$4.6 million for the 2021 Holiday Meet & 2022 Winter/Spring Meet. Projections are based on a payout of 87% of the amount carded, \$1.2 million transfer from Kentucky Downs to Turfway Park and daily earnings of \$50,946.

Turfway Park will pay out KTDF funds through last place and in the event of a dead heat, the KTDF portion of the non-eligible horse reverts to the Fund.

The KTDF Advisory Committee recommends approval.

- 1. At the end of the 2021 Winter / Spring Meet, Turfway Park had a surplus of \$2,435.
- 2. Our 2021 Holiday Meet will consist of 16 racing days and our 2021 Winter / Spring Meet will consist of 41 racing days. We are projecting daily earnings of \$50,946 which is \$24,663 (or +93.8%) above the \$26,283 earned during the 2020 Holiday Meet and 2021 Winter / Spring Meet. The primary driver is the KTDF earned from pari-mutuel wagering from historical horse racing machines at Newport Racing and Gaming and Oak Grove Racing and Gaming.  - Incorporate a new version of the Application for Registration of Kentucky Affiliate with the Kentucky Horse Breeders' Incentive Fund, KHRC Form HB-1 (10/21); and
 - Incorporate a new version of the Claim Form of Incentive Winner for Award from the Kentucky Horse Breeders' Incentive Fund, KHRC Form HB-2 (10/21)
- HB-1 (10/21) is an incredibly streamlined version of the previous application form, which seeks to minimize confusion and avoid redundant and unnecessary submissions from affiliates.
- HB-2 (10/21) updates the name of the form and removes an outdated reference to the 2019 awards.

Re: Proposed Amendments to 810 KAR 6:001

KRS 230.361(1) requires the Kentucky Horse Racing Commission ("KHRC") to promulgate administrative regulations governing and regulating pari-mutuel wagering on horse races under the pari-mutuel system of wagering. Because of the emergent and fluid nature of the technology utilized to offer pari-mutuel wagering, the KHRC regularly proposes amendments to relevant regulations to stay current with terms used throughout the industry. As such, Pari-Mutuel Wagering Director Waqas Ahmed recommends the following amendments to this regulation:

- 1. Adopt the following changes to current definitions:
 - a. Amend "Added money" to include amounts supplemented to a payout for a winning parimutuel wager by an association and any carryover amounts;
 - b. Amend "Equipment" to include components necessary to conduct pari-mutuel wagering; and
 - c. Amend "Terminal" to clarify the criteria for terminals utilized to conduct pari-mutuel wagering on historical horse racing
- 2. Define the following technical terms and benchmarks to aid in developing conditions related to the integrity of pari-mutuel wagering and horse racing:
 - a. "Communications Technology";
 - b. "Control Program";
 - c. "Entertaining Award Display" or "Interactive Award Display";
 - d. "Interactive Terminal" or "HHR Terminal"; and
 - e. "Internal Controls," "Minimum Internal Control Standards" or "Control Standards."

The KHRC staff recommends approval of these amendments to 810 KAR 6:001, as set forth in the attached draft regulation.

- (57) "Place," if used in the context of a single position in the order of finish in a race, means second; if used in the context of pari-mutuel wagering, a "place" wager means one involving a payoff on a betting interest that finished first or second in a race; or if used in the context of multiple positions in the order of finish in a race, "place or placing" means finishing first or second.
- (58) "Player-funded pool" means a pool of money funded by patrons wagering on a live or historical horse race or races that is only used to ensure that a patron will receive a payout on a winning wager in the event of a "minus pool" as defined in this administrative regulation.

- (60) "Post position" means the relative place assigned to each horse, numbered from the inner rail across the track at the starting line, from which each horse is to start a race.
- (61) "Post time" means the advertised moment scheduled for the arrival of all horses at the starting point for a race.
- (62) "Prize" means the combined total of any cash, premium, trophy, and object of value awarded to the owners of horses according to order of finish in a race.
- 16 (63) "Purse" means the gross cash portion of the prize for which a race is run.
- 17 (64) "Quarter horse" is defined by KRS 230.210.
- 18 (65) "Purse race" means any race for which entries close at a time designated by the racing
 19 secretary, and for which owners of horses entered are not required by its conditions to contribute
 20 money toward its purse.

(66) "Race" means a running contest between horses, ridden by jockeys or driven by drivers, over a prescribed course free of obstacles or jumps, at a recognized meeting, during regular

racing hours, for a prize.

Re: Conditions of Racing Association Licensing for 2022

Pursuant to KRS 230.290(2), the Kentucky Horse Racing Commission ("KHRC") may prescribe conditions for all licenses granted under this chapter. Therefore, the Conditions of Racing Association Licensing for 2022 ("Conditions") proposed by the KHRC staff are enclosed with the Commissioners' current meeting materials. The proposed Conditions are virtually identical to those which were approved by the KHRC for 2021. The largest change includes the addition of appropriate references to the federal Horseracing Integrity and Safety Act of 2020 ("HISA").

Kentucky Horse Racing Commission Conditions of Racing Association Licensing for 2022

As a condition of the issuance of a license by the KHRC to conduct horse racing during the 2022 racing year, each Kentucky racing association shall be required to certify that it will comply with the following requirements:

- 1. Each racing association shall notify the KHRC of any communication, report, or investigation conducted or to be conducted by the Thoroughbred Racing Association ("TRA"), Thoroughbred Racing Protective Bureau ("TRPB"), United States Trotting Association ("USTA"), American Quarter Horse Association ("AQHA"), Arabian Jockey Club ("AJC"), National Thoroughbred Racing Association ("NTRA"), the Horseracing Integrity and Safety Authority ("HISA"), or any state or federal regulatory agency that relates to the safety, integrity, or security of the racing association and its participants, or that would reasonably be deemed to affect public confidence in the racing association. Each racing association shall further send a copy of any such communication, correspondence, or report to the KHRC within 24 hours of receipt by the racing association. This paragraph shall not be construed to include information or documents delivered to racing association officials acting in the capacity of members of the board of directors of the above-referenced organizations.
- 2. Each racing association shall notify the KHRC any time a member of a local, state, or federal law enforcement agency enters racing association grounds for the purpose of questioning, investigating, or arresting a licensed individual. Each racing association shall further send a copy of any report related to the questioning, investigation, or arrest prepared by the racing association, or prepared by the law enforcement agency, to the KHRC, within 24 hours of preparation and/or receipt by the racing association.
- 3. Each racing association shall send a copy of any self-reporting document, form, or correspondence to the KHRC at the same time it is filed with the state or federal regulatory agency or any other organization referenced in Condition No. 1, with the exception of any information that is proprietary to the racing association or has no relevance to the safety, integrity, or security of the racing association. The racing association shall identify to the KHRC any information contained in submitted reports that the racing association considers proprietary or irrelevant to the safety, integrity, or security of the racing association.
- 4. Each racing association shall notify the KHRC if it becomes aware of a wagering anomaly related to racing conducted at that racing association or related to a race imported for simulcast wagering at the racing association, even if a report has not been filed with any of the organizations referenced in Condition No. 1. The racing association shall provide transactional data and video of the race to the KHRC upon request. Wagering anomalies are defined as any incident that might reasonably affect the public's confidence in the racing association's wagering pools, including, but not limited to:
 - a. Past posting, cancel delay, and other instances when wagering occurs after the horses have left the gate;
 - b. Off-shore and account wagering fraud;
 - c. Suspected manipulation through computerized robotic wagering;
 - d. Pool odds manipulation;
 - e. Quick pick or random pick malfunction;
 - f. Unusually large cancellation of wagers (especially right as the betting stops);
 - g. Outlets that are habitually late getting into the pools;
 - h. Manual merges;
 - i. Unusual payoffs;

- j. Failing to remove a scratched horse from the pools (which would then require a recalculation of payoffs);
- k. Re-entering a scratched horse to the pools without approval from the Stewards or Judges;
- I. Suspicious wagering patterns;
- m. Totalizator or data communications malfunctions;
- n. Substantial late ticket cancellations; and/or
- o. Failure to stop wagering after the official start of a race.

The list of wagering anomalies above is meant to be illustrative and not exclusive.

- 5. Each racing association shall record the date and time (in hours, minutes, and seconds) on all live video feeds originating from a Kentucky track. Each racing association shall be responsible for recording (in hours, minutes, and seconds) the start/off time of each race. Further, each racing association shall require the tote company with whom it does business to certify, and provide evidence of such certification, to the Chief State Steward or Presiding Judge of the closure time (in hours, minutes, and seconds) of the betting windows for each race. Records shall be retained for two years after the date of the race. Records shall be submitted to the KHRC upon request.
- 6. Each of the timing systems mentioned in Condition No. 5 shall be synchronized with the U.S. Naval Observatory Clock at the beginning of each race day.
- 7. Each racing association shall ensure that the tote company and video provider are available at least one week prior to the start of the live race meet for testing by the Director of Pari-Mutuel Wagering. Each racing association shall ensure that the tote company and video provider for its live meet are operating correctly at least 24 hours prior to the start of the live meet.
- 8. Each racing association shall require its tote vendor, video provider, and teletimer provider to share any and all racing and wagering data requested by the KHRC upon request.
- 9. Each racing association is required to post policies and procedures related to pari-mutuel wagering, including the racing association's refund policy, on the racing association's website. Each racing association shall also post a notice in the racing program and a sign at the association's information window informing patrons where they can access a complete copy of the association's policies and procedures related to pari-mutuel wagering, including the association's refund policy.
- 10. Each racing association shall provide a copy of its mutuel department policies and procedures to the KHRC.
- 11. Each racing association shall have protocols in place that mandate exclusion of any receiving track's wagering pool when the racing association cannot verify that all wagers in the receiving track's pool were received prior to the official start of the race. Copies of these protocols shall be provided to the KHRC.
- 12. Each racing association shall have protocols in place and shall publicize to its wagering patrons when, as a receiving track, it is excluded from a host track's wagering pool. These protocols shall include an immediate public announcement and immediate posting on the racing association's video monitors and websites. Copies of these protocols shall be provided to the KHRC.
- 13. Each racing association that does business with any individual, person, or entity that offers advance deposit account wagering ("ADW") to Kentucky residents shall require that ADW to be licensed by the Commonwealth.
- 14. Each racing association offering thoroughbred racing shall require owners to deposit the \$20 fee for the administration of race-day furosemide, as permitted under Title 810 of the Kentucky

- Administrative Regulations, into the owner's account with the horsemen's bookkeeper by 12:00 noon on the day of the race. Failure of the owner to deposit such a fee may result in the owner being subjected to penalties, including fines or suspension. Each racing association shall debit the owner's account for the \$20 fee to the credit of the KHRC.
- 15. Pursuant to 810 KAR 8:010 Section 20, purse money in thoroughbred, flat racing, and standardbred racing will be paid, distributed, or made available no later than twenty-four (24) hours after notice from the Commission that a final laboratory report has been issued.
- 16. Each thoroughbred association shall be accredited by the National Thoroughbred Racing Association (NTRA) Safety and Integrity Alliance and shall abide by the safety and security regulations set forth in Title 810 of the Kentucky Administrative Regulations and/or any applicable federal requirements mandated by the Horseracing Integrity and Safety Act of 2020, as set forth in 15 U.S.C. 3051 through 3060 ("HISA"). Each standardbred association shall abide by the safety and security regulations set forth in Title 810 of the Kentucky Administrative Regulations and/or any applicable federal requirements mandated by HISA. All racing associations shall be subject to inspection by KHRC officials and shall be required to make any repairs or improvements necessary to comply with the applicable safety and security regulations.
- 17. Each racing association shall settle (and pay, as required) all wagering accounts with simulcast partners on a timely basis, in no event exceeding 60 days past any respective due date.
- 18. All racing associations are required to have a licensed tote employee on the premises during live racing.
- 19. Each racing association shall submit to the KHRC a full employee list that includes the official title of the employee at the racing association and the date of the employee's hire. This shall be submitted in a format approved by the Commission's Director of Licensing on a monthly basis, no later than the 5th business day of the month.
- 20. Each racing association shall report to the KHRC in writing, as required by 810 KAR 3:020, Section 11, the discharge of any licensed employee within 24 hours of the event.
- 21. Each racing association shall ensure that all vendors and vendor employees utilized for racing association operations are properly licensed by the KHRC.
- 22. Each racing association shall require that all vendors and vendor employees display a KHRC identification badge while on racing association grounds.
- 23. An association shall submit an electronic copy of the Kentucky Department of Revenue "Race Track Pari-Mutuel and Admissions Report" Form 73A100 (or its equivalent) to the KHRC Director of Pari-Mutuel Wagering via email by no later than 4:30 p.m. on the 5th business day (excluding Saturday and Sunday) following the close of each racing week. A race week begins on Monday and ends on Sunday.
- 24. All notices required to be given to the KHRC under these conditions of licensure, unless otherwise stated, shall be provided to the Executive Director, the Chief State Steward/Presiding Judge, and the Director of Pari-Mutuel Wagering and Compliance via hand delivery and/or electronic mail triggering the notice requirement.
- 25. In the event a racing association does not comply with the requirements of these conditions, the KHRC has the authority to assess fines and/or penalties, including, but not limited to, licensure revocation
- 26. Additional conditions may be added to these requirements at any time at the discretion of the KHRC.

Re: Licenses to Conduct Live Horse Racing, Simulcasting, and Pari-Mutuel Wagering for 2022

Pursuant to KRS 230.377(2), the Kentucky Horse Racing Commission ("KHRC") must meet and award intertrack wagering dates to all associations for the following calendar year. KRS 230.280 outlines criteria against which the KHRC may deem an applicant's suitability. KRS 230.310(1) states that the Kentucky Horse Racing Commission ("KHRC") may issue a license if it finds that the applicant's financial responsibility, age, experience, reputation, competence, and general fitness to perform the licensed activity are consistent with racing's best interest and maintains the honesty, integrity, and high quality of racing. Further, KRS 230.377(3) permits the KHRC to license no more than nine (9) tracks for horse racing, intertrack wagering, and simulcasting.

The following summarizes the requests proposed by each association in its application for a renewal license to conduct live horse racing, simulcasting, and pari-mutuel wagering for the calendar year 2022. The attached exhibit outlines each association's race dates, and host status dates as recommended by the Race Dates Committee. A copy of each requested application will be provided to the commissioners or made available for review at the KHRC office.

Chairman Rabinowitz, Commissioner Simendinger, Executive Director Guilfoil, General Counsel Wolsing, Deputy General Counsel Dutta and Director Ahmed have reviewed eight (8) applications under KRS Chapter 230 and Title 810 of Kentucky Administrative Regulations. It should be noted that any conditions stated explicitly within this memorandum are recommended in addition to the 2022 Conditions of Racing Association Licensing imposed by the KHRC.

Churchill Downs Racetrack, LLC ("Churchill Downs")

Churchill Downs is a thoroughbred racetrack located in Louisville, Kentucky. Churchill Downs was restructured as a limited liability company in 2013 and is a subsidiary of Churchill Downs, Inc. Churchill Downs currently conducts simulcasting and pari-mutuel wagering on live horse racing, in addition to its racing operation. Churchill Downs also conducts simulcasting and pari-mutuel wagering on historical horse racing at Derby City Gaming, a contiguous track facility of Churchill Downs. Additionally, Churchill Downs recently unveiled its plans to offer pari-mutuel wagering on historical horse racing at a non-contiguous track facility in Louisville, Kentucky. A request related to this non-contiguous track facility will be submitted by Churchill Downs once more information is available. Each of the required consent letters for simulcasting has been received from the KHBPA and KTA/KTOB, in accordance with KRS 230.377 and KRS 230.3771. The KHRC staff recommends approval of Churchill Downs' application.

ECL Corbin, LLC ("ECL Corbin")

Upon completion of its facilities, ECL Corbin will be a harness racetrack located in Corbin, Kentucky. ECL Corbin was

formed in 2020 as a limited liability company in Delaware and is currently authorized to do business in the Commonwealth of Kentucky. ECL Corbin has two principal organizations with a substantive interest: ECL Entertainment, LLC and Keeneland Association, Inc. ECL Corbin is a sister association to Kentucky Downs, LLC, a wholly-owned subsidiary of ECL Entertainment LLC. It is important to note that ECL Corbin requests to conduct its 2022 racing operation at another suitable racetrack, similar to the race meeting held in Summer 2021. The required consent letter for simulcasting has been received from the KHHA, in accordance with KRS 230.377 and KRS 230.3771. On October 8, 2021, Director Ahmed asked for additional information related to ECL Corbin's application for a renewal license. Ron W. Winchell, a managing partner of the association, submitted several items responsive to this request. However, much of the information requested by Director Ahmed relates to activities not yet finalized for ECL Corbin. Therefore, KHRC staff recommends approval of ECL Corbin's application contingent upon submission of those items as they become available.

Ellis Entertainment, LLC d/b/a Ellis Park

Ellis Park is a thoroughbred racetrack located in Henderson, Kentucky. Ellis Park was restructured in 2019 after a recent change of ownership. Ellis Park is a wholly-owned subsidiary of Laguna Development Corporation. On October 17, 2021, Ellis Park amended its application to include a non-contiguous track facility. Ellis Park currently conducts simulcasting and pari-mutuel wagering on live and historical horse racing in addition to its racing operation. Mr. Inman informed Director Ahmed that Ellis Park plans to conduct simulcasting and pari-mutuel wagering on historical horse racing in late 2022 at the requested non-contiguous track facility. Due to the early stages of this operation, Ellis Park will submit a request to offer pari-mutuel wagering on historical horse races once the requirements in 810 KAR 6:010 Section 4 are met. Each of the required consent letters for simulcasting has been received from the KHBPA and KTA/KTOB, in accordance with KRS 230.377 and KRS 230.3771. The KHRC staff recommends approval of Ellis Park's application, including its request to add a non-contiguous facility.

Keeneland Association, Inc. ("Keeneland")

Keeneland is a thoroughbred racetrack located in Lexington, Kentucky. Keeneland was incorporated in 1935 by a group of horsemen and restructured several times after that. Keeneland has one parent that owns a substantive interest of 96%: Keeneland Trustees, Inc. On September 27, 2021, the KHRC requested additional information related to Keeneland's application. On October 20, 2021, Chairman Rabinowitz, Commissioner Simendinger, and Director Ahmed reviewed the additional information provided by Keeneland. During this visit, Keeneland also shared plans to improve its facilities and, once finalized, will submit details to the KHRC. Keeneland currently conducts simulcasting and pari-mutuel wagering on live horse racing in addition to its racing operation. Keeneland is part of a joint-venture agreement with Lexington Trots Breeders Association, LLC to conduct pari-mutuel wagering on historical horse racing. Additionally, Keeneland offers simulcast wagering at a leased facility at The Red Mile when not running a live race meet. Each of the required consent letters for simulcasting has been received from the KHBPA and KTA/KTOB, in accordance with KRS 230.377 and KRS 230.3771. The KHRC staff recommends approval of Keeneland's application.

Kentucky Downs, LLC ("Kentucky Downs")

Kentucky Downs is a thoroughbred racetrack located in Franklin, Kentucky. Kentucky Downs was restructured in 2018 as a limited liability company following a change in ownership. Kentucky Downs is a wholly-owned subsidiary of ECL Entertainment, LLC. ECL Entertainment, LLC is also a principal of ECL Corbin. On October 8, 2021, the KHRC

staff asked for additional information related to Kentucky Downs' application. Ron W. Winchell, a managing partner of Kentucky Downs, submitted the requested items on October 15, 2021.

Kentucky Downs currently conducts simulcasting, pari-mutuel wagering on live and historical horse racing in addition to its racing operation. Kentucky Downs also plans to operate a hotel at its facility in Franklin, KY. Kentucky Downs has requested to conduct simulcasting and pari-mutuel wagering on historical horse racing at its non-contiguous track facility in Bowling Green. This facility was approved by the KHRC on February 20, 2021, and is expected to launch in December 2021. It is anticipated that this facility will open in December 2021. Each of the required consent letters for simulcasting has been received from the KHBPA and KTA/KTOB, in accordance with KRS 230.377 and KRS 230.3771. The KHRC staff recommends approval of Kentucky Downs' application and its supplemental request to offer pari-mutuel wagering at the aforementioned non-contiguous facility contingent on fulfillment of all requirements set forth in 810 KAR 6:010 Section 4.

WKY Development, LLC ("Oak Grove")

Oak Grove is a harness racetrack located in Oak Grove, Kentucky. Oak Grove was formed in 2017 as a limited liability company and is a wholly-owned subsidiary of Churchill Downs, Inc. Oak Grove currently conducts simulcasting and pari-mutuel wagering on live and historical horse racing in addition to its racing operation. The required consent letter for simulcasting has been received from the KHA, in accordance with KRS 230.377 and KRS 230.3771. The KHRC staff recommends approval of Oak Grove's application.

Lexington Trots Breeders Association, LLC ("The Red Mile")

The Red Mile is a harness racetrack located in Lexington, Kentucky. The Red Mile was restructured in 2000 as a limited liability company. Frank J. Antonacci, George Segal, and Joe R. Thompson share equal shares of 100% of membership interests in The Red Mile. The Red Mile currently conducts simulcasting and pari-mutuel wagering on live racing. Through KRM Wagering, LLC, The Red Mile offers pari-mutuel wagering on historical horse racing as a result of a joint-venture agreement with Keeneland. The Red Mile plans to operate a hotel at its main track facility in Lexington, Kentucky. The required consent letter for simulcasting has been received from the KHHA, in accordance with KRS 230.377 and KRS 230.3771. The KHRC staff recommends approval of The Red Mile's application.

Turfway Park, LLC ("Turfway Park")

Turfway Park is a thoroughbred racetrack located in Florence, Kentucky. Turfway Park was formed as a limited liability company in 1998 and recently went through a change of ownership. Turfway Park is now a wholly-owned subsidiary of Churchill Downs, Inc. Turfway Park conducts its racing operation at the main track facility. Due to the ongoing construction, Turfway Park conducts simulcasting and pari-mutuel wagering on live and historical horse racing at its non-contiguous facility: Newport Racing and Gaming. Each of the required consent letters for simulcasting has been received from the KHBPA and KTA/KTOB, in accordance with KRS 230.377 and KRS 230.3771. The KHRC staff recommends approval of Turfway Park's application contingent on Turfway Park submitting any supplemental information related to the Florence track facility as it becomes available.

Date Preference System

The following date system of preference is used at Turfway Park:

Foal certificates no longer are required to be on file in the racing office to enter or start at Turfway Park; however, foal certificates must be on file to obtain a preference date and to have a horse tattooed.

Each day's overnight will list the dates of horses in and on the also-eligible list to enable trainers to see what dates are getting horses into over-filled races.

- 1. In over-filled races, preference will be given to horses in order of their assigned preference dates, earliest date first. Horses having identical dates will be chosen by lot; however, where entry and running dates are the same, the horse with the entry date will have preference.
- 2. All horses intended for racing at Turfway Park will be assigned a preference date. A horse can have only one date at any particular time. Dates assigned will be of two types:

E-Date

This date will correspond to: (a) the date on which a horse's foal papers and name card are submitted to the Identifier (the earliest date being the day when entries are first taken for the meeting). The deadline to submit foal papers/digital foal certificates to receive a dat on day of entry is 9:30 a.m. Eastern. (b) The day on which a horse is first entered if his papers are not on file with the Identifier. To qualify for the latter E-Date, a horse must have been excluded from a race that appears on the overnight or he must have been entered in a condition book race that failed to fill through insufficient entries.

R-Date

This date will correspond to the day of a horse's most recent race at Turfway Park. An R-Date will also

be assigned to a horse that scratches, providing the foal papers are on file with the identifier.

- 3. A horse retains his R-Date until he receives a newer R-Date. No horse with an established R-Date may receive an E-Date. A horse whose papers are removed from the Identifier's office will lose his date and must subsequently re-establish a date in order to receive preference. A horse with an E-Date cannot receive a newer E-Date. Horses starting at another racetrack will forfeit any date they may have at Turfway Park. Additionally, horses racing at Turfway Park without foal papers on site will not retain their R-Date.
- 4. Preference dates are good for any type of race or distance (other than maiden dates).
- 5. Maiden dates will be kept separately and will not have preference in winners' races.
- 6. No E-Date will be assigned to the second choice of an un-split same-owner entry.
- 7. A horse that has been placed on a list (Veterinarian, Steward, Starter, or Paddock Judge) will lose his date and be assigned an R-Date corresponding to the day he is removed from the list.
- 8. Horses on the Also-Eligible list shall be permitted to draw into races and will be assigned post positions in the order of their dates, earliest dates first.
- 9. A horse that is a scheduled starter in a canceled race will not receive an R-Date for that race but will retain his previous date.
- 10. The draw of stake and handicap races is not subject to date preference.
- 11. Preference dates are transferred through change in ownership and changes in trainer only after the proper transfer procedures have been completed through the Stewards' Office and delivered to the Racing Secretary's Office.
- 12. Date preference rules will not supersede KHRC rules regarding preference, eligibility, or scratches.

- 7 When a race is taken off the turf, main track only (MTO) horses will receive an R-Date if they run or scratch. If the race remains on the turf, main track only (MTO) horses will retain their previous date and will not be permitted to start.
- 8. No E-Date will be assigned to the second choice of an unsplit same-owner entry.
- 9. A horse which has been placed on a list (veterinarian, steward, starter or paddock judge) will lose their date and be assigned an R-Date corresponding to the day removed from list.
- 10 A horse which is a scheduled starter in a canceled race will not receive an R-Date for that race but will retain its previous date.
- 11. The draw of stakes and handicap race is not subject to date preference.
- 12. Preference dates are transferred through change of ownership and changes in trainer after the proper transfer procedure have been completed through the Steward's office and delivered to the Racing Secretary's office.
- 13 Date preference rules will not supersede KHRC rules regarding preference, eligibility or scratches
- 14. Winners will be preferred in all non maiden races

CONDITION PREFERENCE

Horses are preferred by their available conditions in all allowance races beginning with Graded Stakes winners (Grade I-II-III), providing the horse has finished 1st, 2nd, 3rd or 4th for \$40,000 or more since starting for less than \$40,000. In allowance/optional claiming races a horse's preference cannot exceed the condition of the race. Starter races for less than \$25,000 will not be preferred.

WINNERS ARE PREFERRED IN ALL NON-MAIDEN RACES.

Also-eligibles: If there are any scratches in a race with also-eligibles, the also-eligible horses will be permitted to move into the race in the order listed on the overnight.

810 KAR 4:010. HORSES

The stewards may at any time require presentation of a horse's registration certificate, virtual certificate, or racing permit or other proof of ownership.

Upon claim, sale or any other transfer of ownership, the horse's registration certificate or racing permit shall be given to the new owner, and any virtual certificate shall be transferred to the new owner electronically. The new owner shall report the change in ownership to the stewards.

KENTUCKY HORSE RACING COMMISSION'S FINAL ORDER

Mr. Rossi trained OUR BERNATTETE, who finished fourth in the seventh race at Churchill Downs on November 15, 2017. OUR BERNATTETE subsequently tested positive for dextromethamphetamine during post-race testing. Dextromethamphetamine is "street meth" and is classified as a Class A substance.

On May 17, 2017, the Commission issued Stewards' Rulings 18-0058 and 18-0059. Those rulings suspended Mr. Rossi for 365 days and imposed a \$10,000.00 fine. The rulings also disqualified OUR BERNATTETE and ordered the forfeiture of the purse money. This appeal followed.

An administrative hearing was held on February 1 and 2, 2021 via Zoom. The appellant, Lee J. Rossi, was represented by Jay Ingle and Chris Hopkins. Appellee Kentucky Horse Racing Commission was represented by Jennifer Wolsing and T. Chad Thompson. Hon. Jim Howard presided as hearing officer.

The hearing officer issued his Recommended Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law, and Recommended Order on June 17, 2021 ("Recommended Order"). The Racing

Commission's counsel timely filed exceptions on June 22, 2021. Appellant Lee Rossi responded on July 9, 2021.

At its regular meeting on August 17, 2021, the Kentucky Horse Racing Commission considered the record, the Recommended Order, the Commission's exceptions, and Mr. Rossi's response. The Commission also received independent legal advice from Public Protection Cabinet counsel. The Kentucky Horse Racing Commission now issues its Final Order, which adopts, in part and as modified herein, the Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law, and Recommended Order issued by the hearing officer.

Summary of Evidence

The Commission adopts the Recommended Order's summary of Barbara Borden's testimony. The Commission adds to that summary the following facts:

- 1. Mr. Rossi suggested at the stewards' hearing that a groom named Mr. Hernandez was responsible for contaminating the horse. The stewards were unable to confirm that theory, despite repeatedly contacting Mr. Rossi for more information following the hearing, and subsequently attempting to locate Mr. Hernandez in order to interview him.
- 2. There was one reference to Mr. Hernandez urinating in a barn, but this occurred in June of 2017, approximately five (5) months before OUR BENATTETE's race."

The Commission also adopts the Recommended Order's summary of Dr. Bruce Howard's testimony. The Commission adopts the Recommended Order's summary of Lorie Bishop's testimony, with the following caveats:

1. Ms. Bishop testified that she did not know whether 675 picograms per milliliter is considered to be a large or small amount of dextromethamphetamine in a racehorse.

The Commission adopts the Recommended Order's summary of Petra Hartmann's testimony, with the exception of the testimony about Ms. Hartmann's participation in a scholarly article. This testimony is irrelevant to the matter at hand, and should be ignored. While the article apparently advocates for a minimum regulatory threshold for dextromethamphetamine, the Commission's regulations do not allow for such a threshold. Instead, the Commission's regulations ban horses from racing while carrying any amount of dextromethamphetamine.

The Commission adopts the Recommended Order's summary of Lee Rossi's testimony.

Findings of Fact

The Commission largely adopts the Recommended Order's factual findings. However, the Commission adds the following facts:

1. Neither party could show where the dextromethamphetamine came from, or how it came to be administered to OUR BERNATTETE. This was in part because Mr. Rossi had already moved his entire operation out of state, to Louisiana, before the test results came back. Therefore, no search was done by the KHRC of the barn or other facilities to find any possible source. Likewise,

Mr. Rossi chose not to hire someone to test the barn or other facilities to find a source after his departure. Moreover, Mr. Rossi did not attempt to drug test any of his employees, or to track down any workers who had left his employment. Therefore, Mr. Rossi was unable to show where the drug came from, offering only speculation concerning a groom, Mr. Hernandez.

The Commission also rejects the following facts:

1. The Recommended Order found that Mr. Rossi did not intentionally administer dextromethamphetamine OUR BERNATTETE, and that OUR BERNATTETE's positive test was the result of "accidental contamination." However, Mr. Rossi did not establish that the dextromethamphetamine found in OUR BERNATTETE was the result of environmental contamination. None of the four witnesses asked to opine on the subject testified that environmental contamination was a certainty—or even a probability. First, when Mr. Rossi's attorney asked Ms. Borden if the level of dextromethamphetamine suggested "environmental contamination," she testified that there was nothing presented to the stewards to make them think that the source of the medication positive was environmental contamination. Likewise, Dr. Howard also testified that he had not been presented with any information that would indicate exposure to OUR BERNATTETE through environmental contamination. Similarly, Ms. Bishop stated that she had not been presented with information that would indicate that OUR BERNATTETE was exposed environmental contamination. Finally, Ms. Hartmann testified that she had also received no information that would lead her to conclude that OUR BERNATTETE's positive was the result of environmental contamination."

Conclusions of Law

The Commission disagrees with the Recommended Order's conclusion that the burden of proof remains with the Commission on all issues. In fact, pursuant to 810 KAR 1:018, Section 2(5), the burden of proof shifted to Petitioner upon the commission laboratory's presentation of a report of positive finding to the commission.

The Commission also disagrees with the Recommended Order's conclusion that the Stewards' Rulings are "disproportionate and unfair." In short, the Commission is not persuaded by the Petitioner's argument that imposing a one-year suspension in this case is disproportionate and unfair. Petitioner's attempt to compare his case with those of David Vance and Luis Jurado is a false equivalence.

Mr. Vance and Mr. Jurado were trainers whose horses tested positive for dextromethamphetamine. Any similarities to Mr. Rossi's case ends with those facts. As Chief Steward Barbara Borden testified, both Mr. Vance and Mr. Jurado were able to identify "physical evidence" establishing the specific and likely source of their horses' positive tests.

Specifically, Mr. Vance drug tested his employees following his horse's medication positive. This testing process established that the source of the positive was likely a groom, who tested positive for dextromethamphetamine after having had regular, close contact with the horse in question. Mr. Jurado tested various locations

to which his horse had been exposed, which demonstrated that the likely dextromethamphetamine source was a horse trailer, which had transported the horse in question on a daily basis.

In this case, however, no such source was shown. Mr. Rossi admitted that he did not know whether Mr. Hernandez had actually administered or exposed dextromethamphetamine to OUR BERNATTETE. He further acknowledged that he did not even know whether Mr. Hernandez used dextromethamphetamine. In short, Petitioner had presented no evidence whosoever regarding the source of the dextromethamphetamine positive, other than his own self-serving speculation.

Although the Commission must consider "any mitigating circumstances presented by the trainer," the 2017 version of Kentucky's trainer responsibility rule holds that a horse's trainer is "strictly liable for any drug or medication violation." *Kentucky Horse Racing Comm'n v. Motion*, 592 S.W.3d 739, 752 (Ky. App. 2019). "[I]t would be virtually impossible to regulate the administering of drugs to race horses if the trainers . . . could not be held accountable for the illicit drugging of their horses or for the failure either to safeguard their horses against such drugging or to identify the person actually at fault." *Allen v. Kentucky Horse Racing Auth.*, 136 S.W.3d 53, 62 (Ky. App. 2004). Therefore, in this case, as all others before the Commission, it is "really immaterial whether 'guilt' should be ascribed either directly or indirectly to the trainer." *Motion*, 592 S.W.3d at 752.

As such, Mr. Rossi's denials of administering dextromethamphetamine to OUR BERNATTETE, without further corroborating evidence, cannot constitute an

affirmative defense, lest the exception swallow the rule. "Horse racing, at its best, is difficult to control, and would be practically impossible to regulate if every governing rule and regulation was made dependent for validity upon the knowledge or motives of the person charged with a violation." *Allen*, 136 S.W.3d at 62. It would be "almost impossible to prove guilty knowledge or intent in [medication violation cases] and the futility of prosecutions under a rule requiring probative evidence of guilty knowledge and intent would eventually leave the public interest and welfare to the mercy of the unscrupulous." *Id*.

Final Order

Therefore, based upon the foregoing findings of fact and conclusions of law, and pursuant to KRS 13B.120 and 810 KAR 1:018 Section 15 (2017), the Kentucky Horse Racing Commission HEREBY ORDERS AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. Except as modified herein, the Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law, and Recommended Order issued by the Hearing Officer on June 17, 2021, and attached hereto, are adopted in full and incorporated by reference into this Final Order.
- 2. Stewards' Rulings 18-0058 and 18-0059 are hereby affirmed.
- 3. OUR BERNATTETE is hereby disqualified and all purse money is forfeited. Pari-mutuel wagering is not affected by this Final Order. All purse monies must be returned to the association. The purse of this race is ordered to be redistributed as set forth in Stewards' Ruling 18-0059.

4. Petitioner Lee Rossi is hereby suspended THREE HUNDRED SIXTY FIVE (365) days: December 1, 2021 through December 1, 2022 (inclusive) and fined TEN THOUSAND (\$10,000.00) DOLLARS. Entry of all horses owned or trained by Mr. Rossi is denied pending transfer to persons acceptable to the stewards. Upon receipt of this ruling, Mr. Rossi is required within thirty (30) days to pay any and all fines imposed to the Kentucky Horse Racing Commission. Failure to do so will subject him to summary suspension of his license per 810 KAR 1:025 Section 14(cc).

Notice

This is a FINAL AND APPEALABLE ORDER. The effective date of this Order shall be the date reflected on the certificate of service attached to this Order.

A final order of the Kentucky Horse Racing Commission may be appealed pursuant to KRS 13B.140(1), which states:

All final orders of an agency shall be subject to judicial review in accordance with the provisions of this chapter. A party shall institute an appeal by filing a petition in the Circuit Court of venue, as provided in the agency's enabling statutes, within thirty (30) days after the final order of the agency is mailed or delivered by personal service. If venue for appeal is not stated in the enabling statutes, a party may appeal to Franklin Circuit Court or the Circuit Court of the county in which the appealing party resides or operates a place of business. Copies of the petition shall be served by the petitioner upon the agency and all parties of record. The petition shall include the names and addresses of all parties to the proceeding and the agency involved, and a statement of the grounds on which review is requested. The petition shall be accompanied by a copy of the final order.
