She completed a meet setup in December and then nine days as substitute Race Steward. Her daily tasks include monitoring morning training on the backside, which is to pay attention to safety and welfare. Majority of her time is at the racetracks with the focus on the live meet. There are 15 training facilities statewide, and she tries to stop at those facilities if she's in the area. She works with Dr. Smith and his team two days a week on entry issues involving post-race status or work samples. She also works closely with enforcement on issues involving welfare and equine fatalities. She serves as HISA Jurisdictional Safety Director though our voluntary contract with HISA.	
f. Veterinary Division	30 - 33	Dr. Smith presented two meet reports, the first one being Churchill Downs fall 2024 Meet with 2,245 total starts. There were 594 post-race samples collected; 40 veterinary scratches	

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g. Pari-Mutuel Wagering Division	33 - 36	and 73 horses placed on the vet's list. There was a total of 12 ambulance runs and four racing fatalities, all of which were musculoskeletal in nature.  The second report was from Turfway Park Holiday Meet 2024 with 1,456 total starts. There were 317 post-race samples collected; 33 veterinary scratches and a total of 43 horses places on the vet's list. There were six ambulance runs and two racing fatalities that were musculoskeletal. There were also three training fatalities, of which two were musculoskeletal and two sudden death.  The monthly chart was also presented showing fatalities total since 2007.  Senior Vice President of Gaming, Travers Manley, presented the Pari-Mutuel report that included numbers from November and December 2024 and fiscal year 2025. For Calendar Year 2024, live on track wagers were \$101.8 Million, which was up from \$95.3 Million in 2023. The total for ADW was \$377.1 Million which was down from \$383.7 Million previously; Total simulcast was \$91.3 Million, down from \$96.7 Million, and total HHR was \$10.1 Billion. In 2023 it was just shy of \$9 Billion.  Travers also announced that Melissa Combs-Wright has been promoted as the Director of Pari-Mutuel Wagering.	
h. Sports Wagering	36 – 37	Sports Wagering Director Hannah Simms shared the Sports Wagering Report in the meeting materials. The December numbers were strong at \$293 Million wagered, which was up from \$263.6 Million wagered in December 2023. The all-time

RE: Proposed Amendments to 810 KAR 3:020

On April 1, 2025, the Kentucky Horse Racing and Gaming Corporation Rules Committee recommended the KHRGC Board approve the following amendments to 810 KAR 3:020. A copy of the regulation with the proposed changes is enclosed.

#### 810 KAR 3:020, Section 2: Persons Required to Be Licensed.

Amends the rule to allow a written request for a waiver of licensing requirements for racing participants and new language details the information required when requesting a waiver. The KHRGC may then grant or deny the request based on at least the current licenses issued to the waiver applicant and the best interests and integrity of horse racing, pari-mutuel wagering and sports wagering.

### Section 3: General License Application Requirements for All Applicants.

- Add the language "or request for a waiver in accordance with Section 2" when referencing an application for license.
- Change the earliest date to submit the license application from November 1 to October 1.

### Section 5: Additional Licensing Requirements for Specific Licenses.

Remove the 3-day cap for special events licenses.

- 8 NECESSITY, FUNCTION, AND CONFORMITY: KRS 230.215(2) authorizes the Kentucky
- 9 Horse Racing and Gaming Corporation to regulate conditions under which horse racing shall be
- 10 conducted in Kentucky. KRS 230.310(1) requires the corporation to establish licensing
- 11 requirements for participation in horse racing. This administrative regulation establishes licensing

- person is currently licensed as a veterinarian by the Commonwealth of Kentucky.
- 12 (b) An application from a person desiring to work on association grounds as a veterinary
- technologist or veterinary technician shall be accompanied by:
- 14 1. Evidence that the person is currently registered as a veterinary technologist or veterinary
- technician by the Commonwealth of Kentucky; and

- 11 (a) Cooperate with the corporation or designee during an investigation; and
- 12 (b) Respond correctly to the best of the licensee's knowledge if questioned by the corporation
- or designee about a racing matter.
- 14 (4) A licensee shall consent to out-of-competition testing in accordance with 810 KAR 8:040.
- 15 Section 11. Employer Responsibility.
- 16 (1)
- 17 (a) An employer shall not employ an unlicensed person for a position that requires a license
- under KRS 230.300 or 230.310 or this administrative regulation.
- 19 (b) If an employer violates subsection (a) of this subsection, the employer may be subjected to
- license suspension, denial, or revocation under KRS Chapter 230 or KAR Title 810.
- 21 (2) Every employer shall report in writing to the corporation or its designee, within twenty-four
- 22 (24) hours, the discharge of any licensed employee, including the employee's name, occupation,
- and reason for the discharge.

- 1 (3) Every employer shall be responsible for ensuring compliance with all applicable employment
- 2 laws.
- 3 (4) The license application of an employee shall be signed by the employer.
- 4 (5) A licensed employer shall carry workers' compensation insurance covering his or her
- 5 employees as required by KRS Chapter 342.
- 6 Section 12. Financial Responsibility.
- 7 (1) A licensee shall maintain financial responsibility during the period for which the license is
- 8 issued.
- 9 (2) A licensee's failure to satisfy a final judgment rendered against him or her by a Kentucky
- 10 court, or a domesticated judgment from another jurisdiction, for goods, supplies, services, or fees
- 11 used in the course of any occupation for which a license is required by this administrative
- 12 regulation shall constitute a failure to meet the financial responsibility requirements of KRS
- 13 230.310.
- 14 (3) If the licensee fails to show just cause for his or her failure to satisfy the judgment, then his
- 15 or her license may be suspended or revoked until the licensee provides written documentation of
- satisfaction of the judgment.
- 17 (4) An applicant for a license may be required to submit evidence of financial responsibility to
- the corporation if a judgment has been rendered against him or her.
- 19 Section 13. Voluntary Withdrawal of License Application.
- 20 (1) A license applicant may with the approval of the license review committee voluntarily
- 21 withdraw his or her license application from the license review process.
- 22 (2) If the applicant chooses to voluntarily withdraw his or her application, then the withdrawal
- 23 shall not constitute a denial or suspension of a license and shall be without prejudice.

- 1 (3) The stewards or judges shall issue a ruling noting a withdrawal, and the ruling shall be
- 2 communicated to the Association of Racing Commissioners International.
- 3 Section 14. License Review Committee.

- 23 licensing may deny a license application, and the corporation or chief state steward or presiding

- 2 a licensee, or other person participating in horse racing, for any of the following reasons:
- 3 (a) The public interest, for the purpose of maintaining proper control over horse racing meetings

- 9 (c) The licensee or applicant has pending criminal charges or is criminally charged during the
- 10 license period in any jurisdiction;

- 12 corporation of a state, province, or country denied, suspended, or revoked;
- 13 (e) The licensee or applicant has had a license issued by the Commonwealth revoked,
- suspended, or denied;
- 15 (f) The licensee or applicant has applied for and received a license at less than sixteen (16) years
- of age, except as permitted in Section 3 of this administrative regulation;
- 17 (g) The licensee or applicant has made a material misrepresentation, falsification, or omission
- of information in an application for a license;
- 19 (h) The licensee or applicant has been ejected, ruled off, or excluded from racing association
- 20 grounds in the Commonwealth of Kentucky or a racetrack in any jurisdiction;
- 21 (i) The licensee or applicant has violated or attempted to violate a statute, administrative
- regulation, or similar rule respecting horse racing in any jurisdiction;

- 1 (j) The licensee or applicant has perpetrated or attempted to perpetrate a fraud or
- 2 misrepresentation in connection with the racing or breeding of a horse or pari-mutuel wagering;
- 3 (k) The licensee or applicant has caused, attempted to cause, or participated in any way in an
- 4 attempt to cause the pre-arrangement of a race result, or has failed to report knowledge of this
- 5 kind of activity immediately to the stewards or judges;
- 6 (1) The licensee or applicant has demonstrated financial irresponsibility as described by Section
- 7 12 of this administrative regulation;
- 8 (m) The licensee or applicant has knowingly failed to disclose to the corporation complete
- 9 ownership or beneficial interest in a horse entered to be raced;
- 10 (n) The licensee or applicant has misrepresented or attempted to misrepresent facts in
- 11 connection with the sale of a horse or other matter pertaining to racing or registration of a
- 12 thoroughbred;
- 13 (o) The licensee or applicant has offered, promised, given, accepted, or solicited a bribe in any
- form, directly or indirectly, to or by a person having any connection with the outcome of a race,
- or failed to report conduct of this nature immediately to the stewards or judges;
- 16 (p) The licensee or applicant has abandoned, mistreated, abused, neglected, or engaged in an
- 17 act of cruelty to a horse;
- 18 (q) The licensee or applicant has engaged in conduct that is against the best interest of horse
- 19 racing, or compromises the integrity of operations at a track, training facility, or satellite facility;
- 20 (r) The licensee or applicant has knowingly entered, or aided and abetted the entry, of a horse
- 21 ineligible or unqualified for the race entered;

- 1 (s) The licensee or applicant has possessed on association grounds, without written permission
- from the corporation or the chief state steward or presiding judge, any appliance or device, other
- 3 than an ordinary whip, which could be used to alter the speed of a horse in a race or workout;
- 4 (t) The licensee or applicant has violated any of the alcohol or substance abuse provisions in
- 5 KRS Chapter 230 or 810 KAR 2:030;
- 6 (u) The licensee or applicant has failed to comply with a written order or ruling of the
- 7 corporation, the stewards, or the judges pertaining to a racing matter or investigation;
- 8 (v) The licensee or applicant has failed to answer truthfully questions asked by the corporation
- 9 or its representatives pertaining to a racing matter;
- 10 (w) The licensee or applicant has failed to return to an association any purse money, trophies,
- or awards paid in error or ordered redistributed by the corporation;
- 12 (x) The licensee or applicant has participated in or engaged in any conduct of a disorderly nature
- on association grounds, including:
- 14 1. Failure to obey the stewards' or judges' or other official's orders that are expressly authorized
- 15 by KAR Title 810;
- 2. Failure to race when programmed unless excused by the stewards or judges;
- 17 3. Fighting;
- 18 4. Assaults;
- 19 5. Offensive and profane language;
- 20 6. Smoking on the track in colors during actual racing hours;
- 7. Warming up a horse prior to racing without colors; and
- 22 8. Disturbing the peace;

- 1 (y) The licensee or applicant has used profane, abusive, or insulting language to or interfered
- 2 with a corporation member, employee or agent, or racing official, while these persons are in the
- 3 course of discharging their duties;
- 4 (z) The licensee or applicant is unqualified to perform the duties for which the license is issued;
- 5 (aa) The licensee or applicant has discontinued or is ineligible for the activity for which the
- 6 license is to be issued, or for which a previous or existing license was issued;
- 7 (bb) The licensee or applicant has made a material misrepresentation in the process of
- 8 registering, nominating, entering, or racing a horse as Kentucky owned, Kentucky bred, or
- 9 Kentucky sired;
- 10 (cc) The licensee or applicant has failed to pay a required fee or fine, or has otherwise failed to
- 11 comply with KRS Chapter 230 or KAR Title 810;
- 12 (dd) The licensee or applicant has failed to comply with a written directive or ruling of the
- corporation or the chief state racing steward or presiding judge;
- 14 (ee) The licensee or applicant has failed to advise the corporation of changes in the application
- information as required by Section 17 of this administrative regulation;
- 16 (ff) The licensee or applicant has failed to comply with the temporary license requirements of
- 17 Section 18 of this administrative regulation;
- 18 (gg) The licensee or applicant has violated the photo identification badge requirements of
- 19 Section 21 of this administrative regulation;
- 20 (hh) The licensee or applicant has knowingly aided or abetted any person in violation of KRS
- 21 Chapter 230, KAR Title 810, or any other statute or administrative regulation pertaining to
- 22 horse racing;

- 1 (ii) The licensee or applicant has hired an unlicensed person required by KRS 230.300, 230.310,
- 2 or this administrative regulation to be licensed;
- 3 (jj) The licensee or applicant, being a person other than a licensed veterinarian, has possessed
- 4 on association grounds:
- 5 1. A hypodermic needle, hypodermic syringe, or other device that could be used to administer
- any substance to a horse, except as permitted by 810 KAR 8:010, Section 3(5); or
- 7 2. A medication, stimulant, sedative, depressant, local anesthetic, or any other foreign
- 8 substance prohibited by KRS Chapter 230 or KAR Title 810; or
- 9 (kk) The licensee or applicant has manufactured, attempted to manufacture, or possessed a false
- 10 license photo identification badge.
- 11 (2) A license suspension, revocation, or denial shall be reported in writing to the applicant by the
- 12 chief steward or presiding judge, and to the ARCI by the Division of Licensing, to ensure that
- other racing jurisdictions shall be advised of the license suspension, revocation, or denial.
- 14 (3) A licensee or applicant may appeal the suspension, revocation, or denial in accordance with
- 15 KRS 230.320 and Chapter 13B.
- 16 Section 16. Reciprocity.
- 17 (1) If a person's license has been denied, suspended, or revoked in another jurisdiction, the
- 18 corporation may require reinstatement of the license in that jurisdiction before a license is granted
- 19 by the corporation.
- 20 (2) If a person has been ruled off, excluded, or ejected from a racetrack in Kentucky or in another
- 21 jurisdiction, the corporation may require reinstatement of the person at that track before a license
- is granted by the corporation.
- 23 Section 17. Changes in Application Information.

- 1 (1) The licensee or applicant shall report changes in any information required for licensing in
- 2 writing to the corporation.
- 3 (2) Any change in information required for licensing shall be submitted in writing upon the
- 4 "Change in Application Information Form", KHRGC 3-020-3, signed by the licensee, and filed
- 5 at the corporation central office, within thirty (30) days of the change, unless it is information
- 6 listed in subsection (3) of this section.
- 7 (3) The licensee shall report changes in information in writing within 72 hours of the occurrence
- 8 for these items:
- 9 (a) Criminal charges;
- 10 (b) Criminal convictions;
- 11 (c) License denials and license suspensions of ten (10) days or more;

- 17 (1)
- 18 (a) Only an owner is eligible for a temporary license.
- 19 (b) A horse in a trainer's care shall not start in a race unless the owner has a current license or
- 20 has an application for a temporary license, "Temporary Owner's License Application", KHRGC
- 21 3-020-2, on file with the corporation.
- 22 (c) A licensed trainer may apply for a temporary license on behalf of an owner for whom the
- 23 licensed trainer trains.

- 1 (d) The corporation may refuse the license if the applicant fails to supply a name, Social
- 2 Security number, and mailing address for a temporary license.
- 3 (e) A temporary license shall be valid for no more than thirty (30) days from the date of issuance
- 4 and shall automatically lapse after the 30th day pending completion of all licensing procedures.
- 5 (f) Upon expiration of the thirty (30) day temporary license, the owner's license shall be
- 6 suspended or the owner's horses shall be ineligible to race in Kentucky pending completion of
- 7 all licensing procedures.
- 8 (g) Completion of all owner licensing procedures shall extend the owner's license to the end of
- 9 the calendar year.
- 10 (h) If a temporary license expires prior to the completion of all owner licensing procedures, the
- applicant shall pay an additional licensing fee.
- 12 (2) An owner shall not be eligible to be issued more than one (1) temporary license in any
- 13 calendar year.
- 14 (3) A temporary license shall not be valid for claiming.
- 15 Section 19. Eligibility for Multiple Licenses. More than one (1) license to participate in horse
- 16 racing may be granted to a person except if prohibited by Section 20 of this administrative
- 17 regulation due to a potential conflict of interest.
- 18 Section 20. Conflict of Interest.
- 19 (1) The license review committee and the chief state steward or presiding judge or their designees
- 20 shall deny or refuse to process the license of a person, and the corporation or the chief state
- 21 steward or presiding judge shall revoke or suspend the license of a licensee, who is determined
- 22 to have a conflict of interest. A conflict of interest may exist if a spouse, immediate family
- 23 member, or other person in a similar relationship to the licensee or applicant holds a license that

- 1 the license review committee or chief state steward or presiding judge finds to be a conflict of
- 2 interest with the licensee's or applicant's license. A finding of a conflict of interest may be
- 3 appealed to the corporation pursuant to KRS 230.320 and KRS Chapter 13B.
- 4 (2) A racing official who is an owner of either the sire or dam of a horse entered to race shall not

- 6 (3) A person who is licensed as an owner or trainer, or who has any financial interest in a horse

- 9 (b) Assistant starter;
- 10 (c) Practicing veterinarian for any horse other than the owner's;
- 11 (d) Veterinary technician, veterinary technologist, veterinary assistant, or equine therapist for
- any horse other than the owner's;
- 13 (e) Officer or managing employee;
- 14 (f) Track maintenance supervisor or employee;
- 15 (g) Outrider;
- 16 (h) Race track security employee;
- 17 (i) Farrier;
- 18 (j) Photo finish operator;
- 19 (k) Horsemen's bookkeeper;

Pursuant to the Provisions of KRS 230.225, KHRGC is directed to conduct all procurements in accordance with procedures that are not inconsistent with the provisions of KRS Chapter 45A and KRS Chapter 230. The proposed procurement procedures are specifically designed to provide for the purchase of supplies, equipment, services, and construction items that provide the greatest long-term benefit to the state and the greatest integrity to KHRGC and the public. The procedures provide for an open and fair process that is free of conflicts of interest as KHRG Board Members and employees are subject to the ethical provisions contained in KRS Chapter 11A and Chapter 230.

The following resources were reviewed and relied upon in drafting the proposed procedures:

- KRS Chapter 45A
- Finance and Administration Cabinet Manual of Policies and Procedures
- Kentucky Lottery Corporation Procurement Procedures
- Kentucky Employers' Mutual Insurance Corporation Procurement Procedures

The procedures provide for the usual and customary procurement methods as follows:

The procedures require documentation for each contract and procurement, regular reports to the Board, and issuance of new procurements every 5 years unless the Finance Committee approves otherwise.

The procedures also establish a bid protest process as follows:

- Upon receipt of a protest, KHRGC shall not proceed further with the solicitation or award until all administrative/judicial remedies exhausted or until the President makes a written determination that the award of the contract is necessary to protect the interests of KHRGC.
- The President's decision may be appealed to the Board, which shall investigate the matter.

RE: MODIFICATION TO EXISTING CONTRACT WITH DEAN DORTON

Following an RFP process, Dean Dorton was awarded a contract to provide outsourced finance and human resource services to KHRGC effective January 2, 2025. The contract includes transitioning KHRGC from the state's finance, accounting, and HR systems to independent systems.

As work has progressed to establish these independent systems, it has become clear that many of our technology platforms, workflows, and processes are inconsistent and inefficient. They do not communicate with each other and include many outdated processes, including manual processes, that are inefficient and not cost effective. Modernizing and integrating our technology systems and processes will result in cost savings and efficiencies over time.

Our current contract with Dean Dorton includes creating and improving technology platforms, workflows and processes.

Members of the Dean Dorton Technology Team met with and conducted discovery sessions with leaders of KHRGC and each of our divisions. Because of the volume of need, they have proposed dedicating 256 hours per quarter at a rate of \$51,200 with an additional \$2,000 onetime set-up fee. Unused hours may be rolled to the next quarter, and additional hours can be added at a discounted hourly rate. Software licensing fees would be billed separately. We plan to build these fees into our FY 26 budget.

The current pricing term through June 30, 2026, is \$962,000. We are requesting a modification to the existing Dean Dorton contract by adding a one-time \$2,000 set-up fee and \$51,200 per quarter to the pricing term to accomplish the deliverables outlined in the attached proposal and contemplated in the current contract with Dean Dorton. If approved, total contract price would be \$1,294,000 through June 30, 2026. That price contemplates a start-date of May 1, 2025.

The Finance Committee unanimously approved the modification on April 2, 2025.

Following an RFP process, Dean Dorton and On Plane Consulting were awarded a contract to provide outsourced finance and human resource services effective January 2, 2025. The contract includes transitioning KHRGC from the state's human resource information system to an independent system and reviewing policies to ensure they align with SB 299.

After researching other similar entities in the Commonwealth and in consultation with On Plane, following are proposed personnel policy changes that impact the budget. The proposed changes are within the FY 26 budget as enacted by the biennial budget bill.

- Work hours. Change from current 7.5 day/37.5 week to 8 day/40 week.
- Holidays. Add President's Day and floating holiday to current state schedule and eliminate ½ day on Good Friday. Change from 12.5 day (13.5 presidential election year) to 14 (15 presidential election year).
- Annual Leave.

# Summary of KTDF Allotment Requests at the April 1, 2025, KTDF Advisory Committee Meeting

#### KTDF Yearly Allocation to Kentucky Problem Gambling in Accordance with KRS.230.400

In accordance with KRS.230.400 (1),(b),2. one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) shall be transferred each fiscal year to the Kentucky problem gambling assistance account established in KRS230.826. The advisory committee agreed that the \$100,000 should be split evenly amongst the Commonwealth's five thoroughbred racetracks annually.

#### 2025 Kentucky Downs' KTDF Allotment Request

The KTDF purse structure for Kentucky Downs' 2025 race meet will consist of 7 racing days beginning Thursday, August 28, 2025 and ending Wednesday, September 10, 2025. For their race meet Kentucky Downs' plans to card KTDF purses in the range of \$18 million to \$19 million. Their projections are based on a KTDF earned balance of \$10.5 million by the end of March 2025. They are also projecting an additional \$16 million in KTDF earnings by the end of September with HHR wagering being the primary driver at their Mint Gaming locations located at Kentucky Downs and their facility in Bowling Green. To encourage participation during the meet, Kentucky Downs will pay out KTDF purses through last place on all KTDF eligible horses.

#### 2025 Kentucky Downs' KTDF Advertising Allotment Request

In accordance with KRS.230.400, Kentucky Downs is requesting the use of \$974,000 in KTDF to promote, enhance, improve and encourage the further and continued development of the Kentucky Thoroughbred breeding and racing industry in Kentucky. \$474,000 of the requested funds will be spent in a very similar manner to that which was approved in 2024. The additional \$500,000 is for a unique opportunity with NBC for a two-hour live broadcast on their national network. This broadcast will take place on August 30, 2025, at Kentucky Downs and will feature three stakes races.

# 230.400 Kentucky Thoroughbred development fund -- Contributions -- Purposes -- Distribution -- Advisory committee -- Administrative regulations.

- (1) (a) There is hereby created a trust and agency account for the Kentucky Horse Racing and Gaming Corporation, designated as the Kentucky Thoroughbred development fund, consisting of moneys allocated to the fund under the provisions of KRS 138.510, together with other moneys contributed to or allocated to the fund from all other sources.
  - (b) Moneys to the credit of the Kentucky Thoroughbred development fund shall be transferred in the following order:
    - One hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) each fiscal year to the Kentucky problem gambling assistance account established in KRS 230.826; and
    - 2. Remaining moneys to the Kentucky Horse Racing and Gaming Corporation for the purposes specified in this section.
  - (c) Moneys from the Kentucky Thoroughbred development fund shall be allocated to each licensed association in an amount equal to the amount the association contributed to the fund.
  - (d) Moneys to the credit of the Kentucky Thoroughbred development fund at the end of each fiscal year shall not lapse, but shall be carried forward in such fund to the succeeding fiscal year.
- There is hereby established, under the general jurisdiction of the Kentucky Horse Racing and Gaming Corporation, a Kentucky Thoroughbred Development Fund Advisory Committee. The advisory committee shall consist of five (5) members, all of whom shall be residents of Kentucky, to be appointed by the chairman of the Kentucky Horse Racing and Gaming Corporation by July 1 of each year. The committee shall consist of two (2) Thoroughbred breeders recommended by the Kentucky Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders, Inc.; one (1) Thoroughbred owner recommended by the Kentucky division of the Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association; one (1) officer or director of a licensed association conducting Thoroughbred racing in Kentucky, recommended by action of all of the licensed associations conducting Thoroughbred racing in Kentucky; and one (1) member of the Kentucky Horse Racing and Gaming Corporation. If any member other than the corporation member has not been recommended for appointment by July 1 of each year, the chairman of the Kentucky Horse Racing and Gaming Corporation shall make an appointment for the organization or organizations failing to recommend a member of the committee. The members of the advisory committee shall serve without compensation, but shall be entitled to reimbursement for all expenses incurred in the discharge of official business. The advisory committee shall select from its membership annually a chairman and a vice chairman.
- (3) (a) The Kentucky Thoroughbred Development Fund Advisory Committee shall advise and assist the Kentucky Horse Racing and Gaming Corporation in the development of the supplemental purse program provided herein for Kentucky-bred Thoroughbreds, shall make recommendations to the corporation with respect to the establishment of guidelines, administrative regulations for the provision of supplemental purses, the amount thereof, the

races for which the purses are to be provided and the conditions thereof, manner and method of payment of supplemental purses, registry of Thoroughbred stallions standing within the Commonwealth of Kentucky, registry of Kentucky-bred Thoroughbreds for purposes of this section, nature and type of forms and reports to be employed and required in connection with the establishment, provision for, award and payment of supplemental purses, and with respect to all other matters necessary in connection with the carrying out of the intent and purposes of this section.

- (b) The Kentucky Horse Racing and Gaming Corporation shall employ qualified personnel as may be required to assist the corporation and the advisory committee in carrying out the provisions of this section. These persons shall serve at the pleasure of the corporation and compensation for these personnel shall be fixed by the corporation. The compensation of these personnel and the necessary expenses incurred by the corporation or by the committee in carrying out the provisions of this section shall be paid out of the Kentucky Thoroughbred development fund.
- (4) The Kentucky Horse Racing and Gaming Corporation, with the advice and assistance of the Kentucky Thoroughbred Development Fund Advisory Committee, shall use the Kentucky Thoroughbred development fund to promote, enhance, improve, and encourage the further and continued development of the Thoroughbred breeding industry in Kentucky by providing, out of the Kentucky Thoroughbred development fund, supplemental purses for designated stakes, handicap, allowance, nonclaiming maiden races, and claiming races contested at licensed Thoroughbred race meetings in Kentucky. The Kentucky Horse Racing and Gaming Corporation shall, by administrative regulation promulgated in accordance with KRS Chapter 13A, establish the requirements, conditions, and procedures for awarding and payment of supplemental purses in designated races by Kentucky-bred Thoroughbred horses. That portion of the supplemental purse provided for any designated race shall be awarded and paid to the owner of the horse only if the horse is a Kentucky-bred Thoroughbred duly registered with the official registrar. Any portion of the supplemental purse which is not awarded and paid over shall be returned to the Kentucky Thoroughbred development fund.
- (5) (a) For purposes of this section, the term "Kentucky Thoroughbred stallion" shall mean and include only a Thoroughbred stallion standing the entire breeding season in Kentucky and registered as a Kentucky Thoroughbred stallion with the official registrar of the Kentucky Thoroughbred development fund.
  - (b) Except for Thoroughbred horses foaled prior to January 1, 1980, the term "Kentucky-bred Thoroughbreds," for purposes of this section, shall mean and include only Thoroughbred horses sired by Kentucky Thoroughbred stallions foaled in Kentucky and registered as a Kentucky-bred Thoroughbred with the official registrar of the Kentucky Thoroughbred development fund.
  - (c) Any Thoroughbred horse foaled prior to January 1, 1980, may qualify as a Kentucky-bred Thoroughbred for purposes of this section if the horse was foaled in Kentucky and if the sire of the Thoroughbred was standing at stud within Kentucky at the time of conception of such Thoroughbred, provided

- the Thoroughbred is duly registered as a Kentucky-bred Thoroughbred with the official registrar of the Kentucky Thoroughbred development fund.
- (d) In order for an owner of a Kentucky-sired Thoroughbred to be eligible to demand, claim, and receive a portion of a supplemental purse provided by the Kentucky Thoroughbred development fund, the Thoroughbred horse in a designated race for which a supplemental purse has been provided by the Kentucky Thoroughbred development fund must have been duly registered as a Kentucky-bred Thoroughbred with the official registrar of the Kentucky Thoroughbred development fund prior to entry in the race.
- (6) (a) Kentucky Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders, Inc., is hereby recognized and designated as the sole official registrar of the Kentucky Thoroughbred development fund for the purposes of registering Kentucky Thoroughbred stallions and Kentucky-bred Thoroughbreds in accordance with the terms of this section and any administrative regulations promulgated by the Kentucky Horse Racing and Gaming Corporation. When a Kentucky-bred Thoroughbred is registered with the official registrar, the registrar shall be authorized to stamp the Jockey Club certificate issued for the Thoroughbred with the seal of the registrar, certifying that the Thoroughbred is a duly qualified and registered Kentucky-bred Thoroughbred for purposes of this section. The registrar may establish and charge, with the approval of the corporation, reasonable registration fees for its services in the registration of Kentucky Thoroughbred stallions and in the registration of Kentucky-bred Thoroughbreds. Registration records of the registrar shall be public records and open to public inspection at all normal business hours and times.
  - (b) Any interested party aggrieved by the failure or refusal of the official registrar to register a stallion or Thoroughbred as a Kentucky stallion or as a Kentucky-bred Thoroughbred shall have the right to file with the corporation, within thirty (30) days of such failure or refusal of the registrar, a petition seeking registration of the Thoroughbred. The corporation shall promptly hear the matter de novo and issue its order directing the official registrar to register or not to register as it may be determined by the corporation.
- (7) The Kentucky Horse Racing and Gaming Corporation shall promulgate administrative regulations as may be necessary to carry out the provisions and purposes of this section, including the promulgation of administrative regulations and forms as may be appropriate for the proper registration of Kentucky stallions and Kentucky-bred Thoroughbreds with the official registrar, and shall administer the Kentucky-bred Thoroughbred program created hereby in a manner best designed to promote and aid in the further development of the Thoroughbred breeding industry in Kentucky, to upgrade the quality of Thoroughbred racing in Kentucky, and to improve the quality of Thoroughbred horses bred in Kentucky.

Committee Members,

Kentucky Downs has reviewed our purses and would like to offer KTDF purses in the range of \$18 Million to \$19 Million for the upcoming August/September race meet. We have based the range on the following information.

- At the end of March 2025, Kentucky Downs is projecting an ending KTDF earned balance of approximately \$10.5 million.
- Our August/September meet will consist of 7 racing days, beginning on August 28 and ending on September 10th. We are projecting additional earnings of \$16 million by the end of September. The primary driver is the KTDF portion of the HHR revenue from The Mint Gaming Hall at Kentucky Downs and The Mint in Bowling Green.
- 3. We anticipate that KTDF will be approximately 45% of total purses. Of the requested KTDF allotment, we anticipate the following payouts:
  - a. ALW, AOC, MSW: approximately 39% of the KTDF allotment
  - b. Stakes: approximately 61% of the KTDF allotment
- For August/September 2025, we are assuming a KTDF payout percentage of approximately 90% with anticipated KTDF disbursements of \$16.65 million which is an increase of \$2.2 million, or 17% higher than 2024.
- Kentucky Downs remains committed to improving the on-track experience for guests and is continuously seeking to improve ticketing, food and beverage, and guest

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services in order to grow our fanbase. Our recent capital projects have included an on property suite hotel, 2 new barns, expanding our popular Finish Line Pavilion for our horsemen, improving the paddock for our horse owners, creating private party suites, developing new camera locations, including the use of a drone, completely remodeling our simulcast room and building a 10,000 square foot sportsbook.

Thank you for your assistance with our pursuit of improving horse racing in Kentucky.

### The Kentucky Thoroughbred Development Fund

Given several years of robust business during the period beginning in the Spring of 2015 and continuing to present day, the state-of-the-art historical racing games at The Minf at Kentucky Downs and Bowling Green have generated nearly \$100 million in KTDF for horsemen with Kentucky-Breds to run for all the different types of races, including claiming races.

Eligible races can be readily recognized in the stakes and condition books by the KTDF seal, which will appear next to each race in the stakes and condition books.

In accordance with KRS 230.400(5) (d) it is mandatory for a horse to be registered prior to time of entry to be eligible to participate in the distribution of the KTDF monies. Registration is only complete once the application is approved, and payment has been received.

All horses of racing age that are both Kentucky-bred sired by a Kentucky stallion which stood in Kentucky the entire breeding season the year the horse was conceived are eligible to be registered. Owners of horses of racing age are responsible for registering their stallions.

For those horses that are registered and eligible according to the conditions listed above, fund monies will divided as follows:

60% to the winner'

20% to second 10% to third 5% to fourth 3% to fifth

The remaining 2% divided among the starters based on the schedule listed above.

Unearned fund monies revert to the KTDF. Additionally, if a non-KTDF eligible horse is involved in a dead heat, those funds will revert to the fund.

RE: REQUEST FOR APPROVAL OF SPORTS WAGERING CATALOG ADDITIONS AND CLARIFICATIONS

In accordance with 809 KAR 10:002, a licensee is prohibited from offering sports wagering on any event that has not been approved by the Kentucky Horse Racing and Gaming Corporation (KHRGC). This memorandum presents proposed updates to the KHRGC's Sports Wagering Catalog, ensuring compliance with KHRGC regulations.

KHRGC staff has thoroughly reviewed requests from service providers to add sports or governing bodies to the sports wagering catalog to ensure they adhere to the criteria for allowable wagers as established in 809 KAR 10:002, Section 2. This review focused on the overall integrity of the sporting events associated with each request and their suitability for offering in Kentucky. KHRGC staff evaluated each request to ensure it meets the regulatory standards for transparency, integrity, and relevance to the field of play.

#### **New Requests and Clarification**

The following requests, submitted by service providers, have been reviewed and evaluated by KHRGC staff. Below is additional information regarding each request, along with corresponding recommendations:

### DATE PREFERENCE SYSTEM

The Date System of preference will be used at Churchill Downs as described below:

Foal Certificates and digital foal certificates no longer are required to be on file in the racing office to enter or start at Churchill Downs; however, foal certificates and digital foal certificates must be on file to obtain a preference date and to get a horse tattooed.

Each day's overnight will list the dates of horses in and on the also-eligible list to enable trainers to see what dates are getting horses in over-filled races.

- 1. In over-filled races, preference will be given to horses in order of their assigned preference dates, earliest date first. Horses having identical dates will be chosen by lot, however, where entry and running dates are the same, the horse with the entry date will have preference.
- 2. All horses intended for racing at Churchill Downs will be assigned a preference date. Dates assigned will be of two types:
- 3. **FOR A ZERO DATE** foal papers and digital foal papers must be turned in to the identifier by Monday, April 21, 2025.

### E-Date

This date will correspond to:

- a) The day on which a horse's foal papers or digital foal papers are submitted to the identifier (the earliest date being the day when entries are first taken for the meeting). An unnamed horse will not receive an E-date.
- b) The day on which a horse is first entered if his papers or digital foal papers are not on file with the identifier.

To qualify for the latter E-date, a horse must have been excluded from a race which appears on the overnight or he must have been entered in a condition book race which failed to fill through insufficient entries.

### R-Date

This date will correspond to the day of a horse's most recent race at Churchill Downs. An R-Date will also be assigned to a horse which scratches.

- 4. A horse retains his R-Date until he receives a newer R-Date. No horse with an established R-Date may receive an E-Date. A horse whose papers or digital papers are removed from the identifier's office will lose his date and must subsequently re-establish a date in order to receive preference. A horse with an E-Date cannot receive a newer E-Date. Horses starting at another race track will forfeit any date they may have at Churchill Downs.
- 5. Preference dates will consist of two categories: Dirt (D) and Turf (T). Preference dates are good for any type of race or distance.
- 6. A horse that runs in a race, which has been taken off the turf will retain its turf date. A scratched horse will receive an R-date from the date scratched.
- 7. When a race is taken off the turf, main track only (MTO) horses will receive an R-Date if they run or scratch. If the race remains on the turf, main track only (MTO) horses will retain their previous date and will not be permitted to start.
- 8. No E-Date will be assigned to the second choice of an unsplit same-owner entry.

- 9. A horse which has been placed on a list (veterinarian, steward, starter or paddock judge) will lose their date and be assigned an R-Date corresponding to the day removed from list.
- 10. A horse which is a scheduled starter in a cancelled race will not receive an R-Date for that race but will retain its previous date.
- 11. The draw of stakes and handicap race is not subject to date preference.
- 12. Preference dates are transferred through change of ownership and changes in trainer after the proper transfer procedure have been completed through the Steward's office and delivered to the Racing Secretary's office.
- 13. Date preference rules will not supersede KHRC rules regarding preference, eligibility or scratches.
- 14. Winners will be preferred in all non maiden races.

### **CONDITION PREFERENCE**

Horses are preferred by their available conditions in all allowance races beginning with Graded Stakes winners (Grade I-II-III), down through their allowance conditions (when allowance conditions are equal, an open stakes winner shall be preferred) providing the horse has finished 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup> or 4<sup>th</sup> for \$50,000 or more since starting for less than \$50,000. In allowance/optional claiming races a horse's preference cannot exceed the condition of the race. Starter races for less than \$40,000 will not be preferred.

### WINNERS ARE PREFERRED IN ALL NON-MAIDEN RACES.

### **Also-Eligibles**

If there are any scratches in a race with also-eligibles, the also-eligible horses will be permitted to move into the race in the order listed on the overnight.

### 810 KAR 4:010. HORSES

The stewards may at any time require presentation of a horse's registration certificate, virtual certificate, or racing permit or other proof of ownership.

Upon claim, sale or any other transfer of ownership, the horse's registration certificate or racing permit shall be given to the new owner, and any virtual certificate shall be transferred to the new owner electronically. The new owner shall report the change in ownership to the stewards.
