RE: Proposed Amendments to 810 KAR 6:001

On April 1, 2025, the Kentucky Horse Racing and Gaming Corporation Rules Committee recommended the KHRGC Board approve the following amendments to 810 KAR 6:001. A copy of the regulation with the proposed changes is enclosed.

810 KAR 6:001, Section 1: Definitions

- Edit the definition of "Historical Horse Race" in (38)(a) to state "Was previously run at a licensed pari-mutuel facility located in the United States or a pari-mutuel facility approved by the KHRGC located outside the United States".
- Delete the definition of "Initial Seed Pool" in (41).

- 1 KENTUCKY HORSE RACING AND GAMING CORPORATION
- 2 (Amendment)
- 3 810 KAR 6:001. Definitions for 810 KAR Chapter 6.
- 4 RELATES TO: KRS Chapter 23013
- 5 STATUTORY AUTHORITY: KRS 230.215(2), 230.260(8), 230.361(1), 230.370
- 6 CERTIFICATION STATEMENT: This is to certify that this administration regulation complies
- 7 with the requirements of 2025 RS HB6, Section 8.
- 8 NECESSITY, FUNCTION, AND CONFORMITY: KRS 230.215(2) authorizes the Kentucky
- 9 Horse Racing and Gaming Corporation to regulate conditions under which horse racing shall be
- 10 conducted in Kentucky. KRS 230.260(8) authorizes the corporation to prescribe necessary and
- 11 reasonable administrative regulations and conditions under which horse racing at a horse race
- meeting shall be conducted in Kentucky. KRS 230.361(1) requires the corporation to promulgate
- 13 administrative regulations governing and regulating pari-mutuel wagering on horse races under
- the pari-mutuel system of wagering. This administrative regulation defines the terms used in 810
- 15 KAR Chapter 6.
- 16 Section 1. Definitions.
- 17 (1) "Added money" means:
- 18 (a) Cash, exclusive of trophy or other award, added by the association to stakes fees paid by
- subscribers to form the total purse for a stakes race; or
- 20 (b) In the context of pari-mutuel wagering, any amounts provided by an association in addition
- 21 to the amounts wagered by patrons and any carryover amounts.

- 1 (2) "Age" means the number of years since a horse was foaled, reckoned as if the horse was
- 2 foaled on January 1 of the year in which the horse was foaled.
- 3 (3) "Appaloosa horse" means a horse duly registered with the Appaloosa Horse Club, Inc.,
- 4 Moscow, Idaho.
- 5 (4) "Appaloosa racing" is defined by KRS 230.210(3).
- 6 (5) "Arabian horse" means "arabian" as defined by KRS 230.210.
- 7 (6) "Arrears" means all sums due by a licensee as reflected by his or her account with the
- 8 horsemen's bookkeeper, including subscriptions, jockey fees, forfeitures, and any default incident
- 9 to 810 KAR Chapter 6.
- 10 (7) "Association" is defined by KRS 230.210(5).
- 11 (8) "Authorized agent" means any person currently licensed as an agent for a licensed owner or
- jockey by virtue of notarized appointment of agency filed with the corporation.
- 13 (9) "Betting interest" means a single horse, or more than one (1) horse joined as a mutuel entry
- or joined in a mutuel field, on which a single pari-mutuel wager can be placed.
- 15 (10) "Bleeder" means any horse known to have bled internally or from its nostrils during a
- 16 workout or race.
- 17 (11) "Breakage" means the net pool minus payout.
- 18 (12) "Breeder" means the owner of the dam of a horse when the horse was foaled. A horse is
- "bred" at the place of its foaling.
- 20 (13) "Calendar days" means consecutive days counted irrespective of number of racing days.
- 21 (14) "Carryover" means nondistributed pool monies that are retained and added to a
- corresponding pool in accordance with 810 KAR 6:020.

- 1 (15) "Claiming race" means any race in which every horse running in the race can be transferred
- 2 in conformity with 810 KAR 4:050.
- 3 (16) "Closing" means the time published by the association after which entries for a race will not
- 4 be accepted by the racing secretary.
- 5 (17) "Commission" means: If used in the context of pari-mutuel wagering, the amount an
- association is authorized to withhold from a pari-mutuel wager pursuant to KRS 230.3615, KRS
- 7 230.750, and KAR Title 810. This meaning can also refer to "takeout" as defined by subsection
- 8 (83) of this section.
- 9 (18) "Communications Technology" means the methods used and the components employed to
- 10 facilitate the transmission of information, such as electronic communications, and transmission
- and reception systems based on wire, cable, radio, microwave, light, optics, or computer data
- 12 networks or any similar electronic agent.
- 13 (19) "Control Program" means any software, source language, or executable code that controls
- the entertaining award display, such as software, source language, or executable code associated
- 15 with:
- 16 (a) Race selection or related events;
- 17 (b) Accounting and reporting meter and log information;
- 18 (c) Operation of totalizators; and
- 19 (d) Any other processes established in the internal controls or as approved by the corporation.
- 20 (20) "Corporation" means "Kentucky Horse Racing and Gaming Corporation".
- 21 (21) "Day" means any twenty-four (24) hour period beginning at 12:01 a.m. and ending at
- 22 midnight.

- 1 (22) "Dead heat" means a finish of a race in which the noses of two (2) or more horses reach the
- 2 finish line at the same time.
- 3 (23) "Declaration" means the withdrawal of a horse entered in a race prior to time of closing of
- 4 entries for the race in conformance with 810 KAR Chapter 6.
- 5 (24) "Designated area" means any enclosed area that the corporation has approved for the
- 6 location of terminals used for wagering on historical horse races.
- 7 (25) "Disciplinary action" means action taken by the stewards or the corporation for a violation
- 8 of KRS Chapter 230 or KAR Title 810 and can include:
- 9 (a) Refusal to issue or renew a license;
- 10 (b) Revocation or suspension of a license;
- 11 (c) Imposition of probationary conditions on a license;
- 12 (d) Issuance of a written reprimand or admonishment;
- 13 (e) Imposition of fines or penalties;
- 14 (f) Denial of purse money;
- 15 (g) Forfeiture of purse money; or
- 16 (h) Any combination of paragraphs (a) through (g) of this subsection.
- 17 (26) "Disqualification" means a ruling of the stewards or the corporation revising the order of
- 18 finish of a race.
- 19 (27) "Driver" means a person who is licensed to drive a horse in a harness race.
- 20 (28) "Entertaining Award Display" or "Interactive Award Display" means an entertaining system
- 21 utilizing mechanical or digital components to display the outcome of a pari-mutuel wager through
- 22 the use of spinning reels, wheels, games, or other types of interactive components that are
- 23 represented by animations or audio cues. An Entertaining or Interactive Award Display is

- 1 connected to a totalizator approved by the corporation. Entertaining or interactive displays are
- 2 only used in conjunction with pari-mutuel wagering on a historical horse race or races.
- 3 (29) "Entry" means the act of nominating a horse for a race in conformance with KAR Title 810.
- 4 (30) "Equipment" means:
- 5 (a) Accourrements other than ordinary saddle, girth, pad, saddle cloth, and bridle carried by a
- 6 horse, and includes whip, blinkers, tongue strap, muzzle, hood, noseband, bit, shadow roll,
- 7 martingale, breast plate, bandages, boots, and racing plates or shoes; or
- 8 (b) Racing, system components or other equipment found suitable by the corporation or its
- 9 designee that is required to operate entertaining or interactive award displays and interactive
- 10 terminals.
- 11 (31) "Exhibition race" means a race between horses of diverse ownership for which a purse is
- offered by the association, but on which pari-mutuel wagering is not permitted.
- 13 (32) "Exotic wager" means any pari-mutuel wager placed on a live or historical horse race or
- races other than a win, place, or show wager placed on a live horse race.
- 15 (33) "Field" or "mutuel field" means a single betting interest involving more than one (1) horse
- that is not a mutuel entry.
- 17 (34) "Forfeit" means money due by a licensee because of an error, fault, neglect of duty, breach
- of contract, or alternative ruling of the stewards or the corporation.
- 19 (35) "Free handicap" means a handicap for which a nominating fee is not required to be weighted,
- but an entrance or starting fee can be required for starting in the race.
- 21 (36) "Handicap race" means a race in which the weights to be carried by the horses are assigned
- by the association handicapper with the intent of equalizing the chances of winning for all horses
- entered in the race.

- 1 (37) "Handle" means the aggregate of all pari-mutuel pools, excluding refundable wagers.
- 2 (38) "Historical horse race" means any horse race that:
- 3 (a) Was previously run at a licensed pari-mutuel facility located in the United States or a pari-
- 4 mutuel facility approved by the KHRGC located outside the United States;
- 5 (b) Concluded with official results; and
- 6 (c) Concluded without scratches, disqualifications, or dead-heat finishes.
- 7 (39) "Horse" means any equine (including and designated as a mare, filly, stallion, colt, ridgeling,
- 8 or gelding).
- 9 (40) "Ineligible" means a horse or person not qualified under 810 KAR Chapter 6 or conditions
- of a race to participate in a specified racing activity.
- 11 [(41) "Initial seed pool" means a nonrefundable pool of money that can be funded by an
- 12 association in order to ensure that a patron will be paid the minimum amount required on a
- winning wager on an historical horse race in the event of a minus pool.
- 14 (41)[(42)] "Interactive terminal" or "HHR terminal" means "terminal" as defined by subsection
- (89)(b) of this section.
- 16 (42)[(43)] "Internal controls," "minimum internal control standards," or "control standards"
- means the system of internal procedures, as well as administrative and accounting controls related
- to the integrity of pari-mutuel wagering. This type of system can be required by the corporation
- as a condition to conduct live horse racing, simulcasting, and pari-mutuel wagering.
- 20 (43)[(44)] "Jockey" means a rider currently licensed to ride in races other than harness races as a
- 21 jockey, apprentice jockey, amateur jockey, or a provisional jockey permitted by the stewards to
- ride in three (3) races prior to applying for a license.

- 1 (44)[(45)] "Judge" means a duly appointed racing official with powers and duties established in
- 2 810 KAR 2:050 serving at a current meeting in the Commonwealth.
- 3 (45)[(46)] "Lessee" means a licensed owner whose interest in a horse is a leasehold.
- 4 (46)[(47)] "Licensed premises" is defined by KRS 230.210.
- 5 (47([(48)] "Licensee" means an individual, firm, association, partnership, corporation, trustee, or
- 6 legal representative that has been duly issued a currently valid license to participate in racing in
- 7 the Commonwealth.
- 8 (48)[(49)] "Maiden" means a horse that has never won a race on the flat at a recognized meeting
- 9 in any country. A maiden that was disqualified after finishing first remains a maiden. Race
- 10 conditions referring to maidens are interpreted as meaning maidens at the time of starting.
- 11 (49)[(50)] "Match race" means a race that is between two (2) horses and for which other horses
- are not eligible.
- 13 (50)[(51)] "Meeting" means the entire period of consecutive days, exclusive of dark days, granted
- by the corporation to a licensed association for the conduct of live horse racing that:
- 15 (a) Begins at 10 a.m. of the first racing day; and
- 16 (b) Extends through a period ending one (1) hour after the last scheduled race of the last day.
- 17 (51)[(52)] "Minus pool" means a pari-mutuel pool in which the amount of money to be distributed
- on winning wagers exceeds the amount of money contained in that pari-mutuel pool.
- 19 (52)[(53)] "Month" means calendar month.
- 20 (53)[(54)] "Mutuel entry" means a single betting interest involving two (2) or more horses entered
- in the same race and joined for pari-mutuel purposes because of common ties as to ownership or
- training so that a wager on one (1) horse joined in a mutuel entry is a wager on all horses joined
- in the same mutuel entry.

- 1 (54)[(55)] "Net pool" means the total amount wagered less refundable wagers and takeout.
- 2 (55)[(56)] "Nomination" means a subscription or entry of a horse in a stakes or early closing race.
- 3 (56)[(57)] "Nominator" means the person in whose name a horse is entered for a race.
- 4 (57)[(58)] "Owner" means any person who holds, in whole or in part, any right, title, or interest
- 5 in a horse, or any lessee of a horse, who has been duly issued a currently valid owner's license as
- 6 a person responsible for the horse.
- 7 (58)[(59)] "Pari-mutuel wagering," "mutuel wagering", or "pari-mutuel system of wagering" is
- 8 defined by KRS 230.210.
- 9 (59)[(60)] "Pari-mutuel pool" means any pool into which pari-mutuel wagers made by patrons
- are placed. For every wager placed into a pari-mutuel pool by a patron, that patron is eligible to
- 11 receive at least a minimum payout on a winning wager.
- 12 (60)[(61)] "Patron" means an individual present at a track, licensed premises, or a simulcast
- facility who observes or wagers on live or historical horse races.
- 14 (61) [(62)] "Payout" means the amount of the net pool payable to an individual patron on his or
- 15 her winning wager.
- 16 (62)[(63)] "Place," if used in the context of a single position in the order of finish in a race, means
- second; if used in the context of pari-mutuel wagering, a "place" wager means one involving a
- payoff on a betting interest that finished first or second in a race; or if used in the context of
- multiple positions in the order of finish in a race, "place or placing" means finishing first or
- second.
- 21 (63)[(64)] "Player-funded pool" means a pool of money funded by patrons wagering on a live or
- 22 historical horse race or races that is only used to ensure that a patron will receive a payout on a
- winning wager in the event of a "minus pool" as defined in this administrative regulation.

- 1 (64)[(65)] "Post" means the starting point of a race.
- 2 (65)[(66)] "Post position" means the relative place assigned to each horse, numbered from the
- 3 inner rail across the track at the starting line, from which each horse is to start a race.
- 4 $66[\frac{(67)}{}]$ "Post time" means the advertised moment scheduled for the arrival of all horses at the
- 5 starting point for a race.
- 6 67[(68)] "Prize" means the combined total of any cash, premium, trophy, and object of value
- 7 awarded to the owners of horses according to order of finish in a race.
- 8 $68[\frac{(69)}{(69)}]$ "Purse" means the gross cash portion of the prize for which a race is run.
- 9 $69[\overline{(70)}]$ "Quarter horse" is defined by KRS 230.210.
- $70[\frac{71}{1}]$ "Purse race" means any race for which entries close at a time designated by the racing
- secretary, and for which owners of horses entered are not required by its conditions to contribute
- money toward its purse.
- 71[(72)] "Race" means a running contest between horses, ridden by jockeys or driven by drivers,
- over a prescribed course free of obstacles or jumps, at a recognized meeting, during regular racing
- 15 hours, for a prize.
- 72[(73)] "Race day" means any period of twenty-four (24) hours beginning at 12:01 a.m. and
- ending at midnight in which live racing is conducted by an association.
- 18 73[(74)] "Racing official" means a corporation member, corporation staff as duties require, and
- all association racing department employees, as duties require.
- 20 74[(75)] "Recognized meeting" means any meeting with regularly scheduled live horse races for
- 21 thoroughbreds on the flat, licensed by and conducted under administrative regulations
- promulgated by a governmental regulatory body, to include foreign countries that are regulated

- 1 by a racing authority that has reciprocal relations with The Jockey Club and whose race records
- 2 can be provided to an association by The Jockey Club.
- $75[\frac{76}{7}]$ "Registration certificate" means, with respect to thoroughbreds:
- 4 (a) The document issued by The Jockey Club certifying the name, age, color, sex, pedigree, and
- 5 breeder of a horse as registered by number with The Jockey Club; or
- 6 (b) The document known as a "racing permit" issued by The Jockey Club in lieu of a registration
- 7 certificate if a horse is recognized as a thoroughbred for racing purposes in the United States,
- 8 but is not recognized as a thoroughbred for breeding purposes insofar as registering its progeny
- 9 with the Jockey Club.
- $76[\frac{77}{1}]$ "Result" means the part of the official order of finish in a race used to determine the
- pari-mutuel payoff of pari-mutuel pools.
- 12 77[(78)] "Rulings" means all determinations, decisions, or orders of the stewards or of the
- 13 corporation duly issued in writing and posted.
- $78[\frac{79}{1}]$ "Scratch" means the withdrawal of a horse entered for a race after the time of closing of
- entries for the race in conformance with KAR Title 810.
- 79[80] "Scratch time" means the time set by the racing secretary as a deadline for horsemen to
- indicate their desire to scratch out of a race.
- 18 80[(81)] "Secretary" means the duly appointed and currently serving secretary of the corporation.
- 19 81[(82)] "Simulcasting" is defined by KRS 230.210.
- 20 82[(83)] "Specimen" means a sample of blood, urine, or other biologic sample taken or drawn
- 21 from a horse for chemical testing.
- 22 83[(84)] "Stakes" means all fees:

- 1 (a) Paid by subscribers to an added-money or stakes race for nominating, eligibility, entrance,
- 2 or starting, as required by the conditions of the race; and
- 3 (b) Included in the purse.
- 4 84[(85)] "Stakes race" means a race that closes more than seventy-two (72) hours in advance of
- 5 its running and for which subscribers contribute money towards its purse, or a race for which
- 6 horses are invited by an association to run for a guaranteed purse of \$50,000 or more without
- 7 payment of stakes. With the exception of stakes races in North America, "stakes race" excludes
- 8 races not listed by The Jockey Club Information System International Cataloguing Standards,
- 9 Part One (1).
- 10 85[(86)] "Starter" means a horse in a race when the starting-gate doors open in front of it at the
- moment the starter dispatches the horses for a race.
- 12 86[(87)] Steward" means a duly appointed racing official with powers and duties specified in 810
- 13 KAR 2:040 serving at a current meeting in the Commonwealth.
- 14 87[(88)] "Subscription" means nomination or entry of a horse in a stakes race.
- 15 88[(89)] "Takeout" means "commission" as defined by subsection (17)(b) of this section
- 16 89[(90)] "Terminal" means:
- 17 (a) Any corporation approved self-service device or other totalizator-based peripheral
- equipment used by a patron to place a pari-mutuel wager on a live or historical horse race or
- 19 races; or
- 20 (b) Any corporation approved mechanical, electrical, or other device, contrivance, or machine
- 21 that, upon funding of any pari-mutuel wager on a historical horse race or races, is capable of
- placing a pari-mutuel wager on that historical horse race or races. These devices can provide
- 23 handicapping methods approved by the corporation, in addition to manual handicapping. In the

- 1 event of a winning wager, a terminal displays and either delivers or entitles the patron to receive
- 2 a payout pursuant to 810 KAR 6:030. Payouts are issued by the terminal itself or by the licensed
- 3 association approved to operate the interactive terminal and related pari-mutuel pool.
- 4 90[(91)] "Thoroughbred racing" is defined by KRS 230.210.
- 5 91[(92)] "Totalizator" means the system, including hardware, software, communications
- 6 equipment, and electronic devices that accepts and processes the cashing of wagers, calculates
- 7 the odds and prices of the wagers, and records, displays, and stores pari-mutuel wagering
- 8 information.
- 9 92[(93)] "Unplaced" means a horse that finishes a race outside the pari-mutuel payoff.
- 10 93[(94)] "Wagering pool" means "pari-mutuel pool" as defined by this administrative regulation.
- 11 94[(95)] "Walkover" means a race in which the only starter or all starters represent single
- 12 ownership.
- 13 95[(96)] "Weigh in" means the presentation of a jockey to the clerk of scales for weighing after
- 14 a race.
- 15 $96[\frac{97}{9}]$ "Weigh out" means the presentation of a jockey to the clerk of scales for weighing prior
- to a race.
- 17 97[(98)] "Weight for age" means the standard assignment of pounds to be carried by horses in
- races at specified distances during specified months of the year, scaled according to the age of
- the horse as established in 810 KAR 4:020.
- 20 98[(99)] "Workout" means the training exercise of a horse on the training track or main track of
- an association during which the horse is timed for speed over a specified distance.
- 22 99[(100)] "Year" means twelve (12) consecutive months beginning with January and ending with
- 23 December.

- 1 Section 2. Severability. If any provision or administrative regulation of this chapter is found to be
- 2 invalid, the remaining provisions of this chapter shall not be affected nor diminished thereby.

Summary of KTDF Allotment Requests at the May 7, 2025, KTDF Advisory Committee Meeting

Kentucky Downs' KTDF Transfer to Ellis Park

In accordance with 810 KAR 7:030, Section 3(3)(c), Kentucky Downs has requested to transfer \$2.25 million dollars in KTDF funds to Ellis Park to be used during their 2025 race meet.

2025 Ellis Park's KTDF Allotment Request

The KTDF purse structure for Ellis Parks' 2025 race meet will consist of 25 racing days beginning Thursday, July 3, 2025, and ending Monday, August 25, 2025. Ellis Park plans to card KTDF purses in the range of \$7 million to \$8 million dollars. These projections are based on a KTDF earned balance of \$332,826 at the conclusion of their 2024 race meet, anticipated earnings totaling \$3.4 million from historical horse racing from both Ellis Park and their new facility, Owensboro Racing & Gaming, the \$2.25 million transfer from Kentucky Downs, and an additional \$1.75 million from their sister property, Oak Grove. To encourage participation during the meet, Ellis Park will pay out KTDF purses through last place to all eligible KTDF registered horses.

2025 Ellis Park's KTDF Advertising Allotment Request

In accordance with KRS.230.400, Ellis Park is requesting the use of \$115,000 in KTDF to promote, enhance, improve and encourage the further and continued development of the Kentucky Thoroughbred breeding and racing industry in Kentucky during their 2025 race meet.

Ellis Park has reviewed our purses and would like to card KTDF purses in the range of \$7.0 million to \$8.0 million for our upcoming Summer Meet. We have based the range on the following information:

- 1. At the end of the 2024 race meet there was a KTDF surplus of \$332,826.
- 2. Since the end of August 2024, we have generated and expect to generate KTDF from the following sources through the end of August 2025:
 - a. Transfer of \$2.25 million from Kentucky Downs.
 - b. Transfer of \$1.75 million in KTDF funds from Oak Grove
 - c. Ellis Park and Owensboro historical racing machine contribution of \$3.4 million
- 3. Our summer meet will consist of 25 racing days beginning July 3, 2025 and ending Monday August 25, 2025.
- 4. We anticipate that KTDF will be approximately 41% of total purses. Of the requested KTDF allotment, we anticipate the following payouts:
 - a. ALW, AOC, MSW: approximately 71% of the KTDF allotment
 - b. BCL, CLM, MCL, STR, WMC: approximately 10% of the KTDF allotment
 - c. Stakes: approximately 19% of the KTDF allotment
- 5. For summer meet 2025, we are assuming a KTDF payout percentage of 95% with anticipated KTDF disbursements of \$7.4 million which is an increase from the \$5.7 million paid during the summer 2024 meet.
- 6. To encourage participation during the summer meet, we are again planning to pay KTDF purses from first to last to all eligible horses.

THE KENTUCKY THOROUGHBRED DEVELOPMENT FUND (KTDF)

Given several years of robust business during the period beginning 2019 through May 2025, state-of-the-art historical racing machines have generated KTDF for Horsemen with Kentucky-sired Kentucky-breds to run for in designated stakes, handicap, allowance, non-claiming maiden races, and claiming races contested at licensed Thoroughbred race meetings in Kentucky.

Eligible races can be readily recognized in the stakes and condition books by the Kentucky Thoroughbred Development Fund seal, which will appear next to each race in the stakes and condition books.

In accordance with KRS 230.400(5) (d), it is mandatory for a horse to be registered prior to time of entry to be eligible to participate in the distribution of Kentucky Thoroughbred Development Fund monies. Registration is only complete once the application is approved and payment has been received.

All horses of racing age that are both Kentucky-bred and sired by a Kentucky stallion which stood in Kentucky the entire breeding season the year the horse was conceived are eligible to be registered. Owners of horses of racing age are responsible for registering their horses. Stallion owners are responsible for registering their stallions.

RE: REQUEST TO PROCURE INDEPENDENT AUDIT SERVICES FOR FISCAL YEAR 2025

Pursuant to SB 299, KHRGC shall conduct an annual audit. In discussions with the offices of the Auditor of Public Accounts (APA) and the Controller, there was some confusion about when the first audit would occur. During the 2025 General Assembly session, HB 566 provided that the first audit would be for FY 26. However, HB 775 made clear that the first audit is to be for the current fiscal year, FY 25. Since we are a component unit of the Commonwealth, the Controller was concerned that failure to conduct an audit this fiscal year could impact the Commonwealth's bond rating.

The APA has declined to perform the audit for FY 25 and indicated it is unable to contract with an outside firm due to previous commitments and time constraints. The APA has authorized KHRGC to contract directly with an outside firm to perform the audit.

Pursuant to KHRGC Procurement Procedures adopted by the Board on April 22nd, "Noncompetitive negotiations may be used to purchase ... services when the President or his/her designee makes a written determination that competition is not feasible or practicable." In order to meet the deadlines of the Controller, audit work must begin in May. Given the time constraints, it is not feasible to bid the audit work.

However, in order to ensure transparency and fairness, we asked for recommendations from the offices of the Controller and the APA for firms that had gone through the public bid process. Cherry Bekaert was recommended as they have been selected following a public bid process many times, including by the APA to perform independent audits of Lottery. Additionally, they have been selected following a public bid process by other quasi-governmental organizations, including the Kentucky Court of Justice, Kentucky State Fair Board, Kentucky Higher Education Authority, and the Kentucky Economic Development Authority among others.

Cherry Bekaert has provided a quote of \$41,343.75, plus reimbursement for allowable out-of-pocket expenses, which is consistent with or lower than other reviewed independent audit contracts.

Upon approval, the contract will be filed with the Government Contract Review Committee of the Legislative Research Commission.

Pursuant to the KHRGC Procurement Procedures adopted by the Board on April 22, 2025, a request for written determination to proceed with a Noncompetitive Negotiation process to retain Cherry

Bekaert for auditing services for a total contract price of \$45,000 for FY 25 was requested and approved by President Eads for the following reasons:

- There is not sufficient time to issue an RFP
- Cherry Bekaert was recommended by the offices of the Controller and Auditor
- Cherry Bekaert has current contracts with the Commonwealth to perform independent audits pursuant to a public bid process
- Cherry Bekaert has experience conducting audits of other quasi-governmental, non-major component units of the Commonwealth, such as Lottery
- The quote of \$41,343.71, plus reimbursement of allowable out-of-pocket expenses, is consistent with or less than other contracts for auditing services for non-major component units

No renewals are included in the contract. If the APA determines that KHRGC should hire its own independent auditing firm directly next fiscal year, or in future years, an RFP will be issued.

The request was considered and approved for recommendation to the Board by the Finance Committee at its May 7th meeting.

For the above reasons, approval is requested.
