There were five horses placed on the vet's list, no ambulance runs and no fatalities.  The last two pages of the report are the informational chart of racing fatalities from 2007 to present. It was noted that these statistics do not include training fatalities.  Director of Pari-Mutuel Wagering Melissa Combs-Wright was assigned the floor and shared the pari-mutuel reports for June 2025 and the entire fiscal year of 2025. The June on track handle was approximately \$5.2 Million, which is down 8% compared to June 2024. The Simulcast handle was approximately \$6.1 Million, which is down 15% compared to June 2024.  The ADW handle for Kentucky residents was approximately \$35.8 Million which is up 2% from June 2024 and the HHR handle for June 2025 was \$907 Million which is up 11% from June 2024.

RE: PROPOSED CONDITIONS ON LICENSES TO CONDUCT LIVE HORSE RACING,

SIMULCASTING, AND PARI-MUTUEL WAGERING FOR 2026

KRS 230.260 states the Kentucky Horse Racing and Gaming Corporation "shall have full authority to prescribe...conditions under which horse racing at a horse race meeting shall be conducted in this state." Further, KRS 230.290 states that all licenses granted under KRS Chapter 230 "shall be subject to all administrative regulations and conditions as may from time to time be prescribed by the corporation." As a condition of licensure to conduct horse racing, simulcasting, and pari-mutuel wagering, it is recommended that each racing association shall certify that it shall comply with certain conditions proposed in the attached.

The conditions cover regulatory notifications, operational reporting, racing integrity requirements, and wagering integrity requirements. KHRG staff recommends approval of the proposed conditions.

#### Kentucky Horse Racing & Gaming Conditions of Licensure Pursuant to KRS 230.260 and 230.290

Pursuant to KRS 230.260 and 230.290, the Kentucky Horse Racing and Gaming Corporation ("KHRG") is authorized to prescribe necessary and reasonable conditions under which horse racing, simulcasting, and pari-mutuel wagering is conducted in the Commonwealth of Kentucky. Therefore, as a condition of licensure by KHRG to conduct horse racing, simulcasting, and pari-mutuel wagering, each licensed association shall certify that it shall comply with the following requirements:

#### 1. Regulatory Notifications

- a. Each licensed association shall notify KHRG of any communication, report, or investigation conducted or to be conducted by any governing body or federal, state, or local regulatory agency that relates to the safety, integrity, or security of the licensed association's operations, its participants, facilities, or that would reasonably be deemed to affect public confidence in the licensed association. This notification includes, but is not limited to, communications, reports, or investigations involving the Thoroughbred Racing Association ("TRA"), Thoroughbred Racing Protective Bureau ("TRPB"), United States Trotting Association ("USTA"), American Quarter Horse Association ("AQHA"), Arabian Jockey Club ("AJC"), National Thoroughbred Racing Association ("NTRA"), the Horseracing Integrity and Safety Authority ("HISA"), the Horseracing Integrity and Welfare Unit ("HIWU"), a sports governing body, or any agency relating to environmental, safety, or public health matters. Notification to KHRG shall include or be supplemented by a copy of the communication, report, or investigation within twenty-four (24) hours of receipt by the licensed association.
- b. Each licensed association shall notify KHRG any time a member of a local, state, or federal law enforcement agency enters licensed association grounds for the purpose of questioning, investigating, or arresting a licensed individual. Such notice shall include or be supplemented by a copy of any report related to the questioning, investigation, or arrest prepared by the licensed association and/or prepared by the law enforcement agency. The report(s) shall be provided to KHRG within twenty-four (24) hours of preparation and/or receipt by the licensed association.

#### 2. Operational Reporting

- a. Each licensed association shall send a copy of any self-reporting document, form, or correspondence to KHRG at the same time that the document, form, or correspondence is filed with the state or federal regulatory agency, or any other organization referenced in Section 1. The licensed association shall identify to KHRG any information contained in submitted reports that the licensed association considers to be confidential or proprietary.
- b. Pursuant to 810 KAR 8:010, Section 20, purse money in thoroughbred, flat racing, and standardbred racing shall be paid, distributed, or made available

- no later than twenty-four (24) hours after notice from KHRG that a final laboratory report has been issued.
- c. Each licensed association shall provide to KHRG a report of purse money no later than seven (7) calendar days after the conclusion of each live race meet. This report shall include the name of the licensed association, the date in which racing occurred, the race number, purse totals attributed to regular stakes, purse totals attributed to the association, purse totals attributed to horsemen, purse totals attributed to state funds, and total purse amounts.

#### 3. Racing Integrity Requirements

- a. Each licensed association shall record the date and time (in hours, minutes, and seconds) on all live video feeds originating from a Kentucky track. Each licensed association shall be responsible for recording (in hours, minutes, and seconds) the start/off time of each race. Further, each licensed association shall require the tote company with whom it does business to certify, and provide evidence of such certification, to the Chief State Steward or Presiding Judge of the closure time (in hours, minutes, and seconds) of the betting windows for each race. Records shall be retained for two years after the date of the race. Records shall be submitted to KHRG upon request.
- b. Each of the timing systems mentioned in 3.a. shall be synchronized with the U.S. Naval Observatory Clock at the beginning of each race day.
- c. Each licensed association offering thoroughbred racing shall require owners to deposit the fee for the administration of race-day furosemide, as permitted under Title 810 of the Kentucky Administrative Regulations, into the owner's account with the horsemen's bookkeeper by 12:00 p.m. Eastern Time on the day of the race. Failure of the owner to deposit such a fee may result in the owner being subjected to penalties, including fines or suspension. Each licensed association shall debit the owner's account for the furosemide fee to the credit of KHRG.
- d. Each licensed association for thoroughbred racing shall abide by the applicable safety and security requirements mandated by the Horseracing Integrity and Safety Act of 2020, as set forth in 15 U.S.C. 3051 et seq. ("HISA"), unless otherwise notified in writing by KHRG's President/CEO. Each licensed association for any type of horse racing shall abide by all requirements set forth in KHRG statutes and regulations, to the extent that KHRG statutes and regulations are not preempted by HISA.
- e. All licensed associations shall be subject to inspection by KHRG officials and shall be required to make any repairs or improvements necessary to comply with the applicable safety and security regulations.

#### 4. Wagering Integrity Requirements

 Each licensed association shall notify KHRG if it becomes aware of a wagering anomaly related to racing conducted at that licensed association or related to a race imported for simulcast wagering at the licensed association, even if a report has not been filed with any of the organizations referenced in Section 1. The licensed association shall provide transactional data and video of the race to KHRG. Wagering anomalies are defined as any incident that might reasonably affect the public's confidence in the licensed association's wagering pools. Such incidents include, but are not limited to:

- Past posting, cancel delay, and other instances when wagering occurs after the horses have left the gate;
- ii. Off-shore and account wagering fraud;
- iii. Suspected manipulation through computerized robotic wagering;
- iv. Pool odds manipulation;
- v. Quick pick or random pick malfunction;
- vi. Unusually large cancellation of wagers (especially right as the betting stops);
- vii. Outlets that are habitually late getting into the pools;
- viii. Manual merges;
- ix. Unusual payoffs;
- x. Failing to remove a scratched horse from the pools (which would then require a re-calculation of payoffs);
- xi. Re-entering a scratched horse to the pools without approval from the Stewards or Judges;
- xii. Suspicious wagering patterns;
- xiii. Totalizator or data communications malfunctions: and/or
- xiv. Substantial late ticket cancellations.

The list of wagering anomalies above is meant to be illustrative and not exclusive. It is the licensed association's responsibility to ensure that all wagering anomalies are communicated in a detailed and timely manner to KHRG, whether by the licensed association or related vendor.

- b. Each licensed association shall ensure that the totalizator and video provider are available at least one week prior to the start of the live race meet for testing by KHRG. Each licensed association shall ensure that the totalizator and video provider for its live meet are operating correctly at least 24 hours prior to the start of the live meet. Each licensed association shall ensure the video provider for its live meet performs its duties to the satisfaction of KHRG, including, but not limited to, by having functional cameras and displaying all notifications timely and legibly for the wagering public.
- c. Each licensed association shall require its totalizator, video provider, and teletimer provider to share all racing and wagering data requested by KHRG.
- d. Each licensed association shall post policies and procedures related to parimutuel wagering, including the licensed association's refund policy and self-exclusion policy, on the licensed association's website. Each licensed association shall also post a notice in the racing program and a sign at the association's information window informing patrons where they can access a

- complete copy of the association's policies and procedures related to parimutuel wagering, including the association's refund policy.
- e. Each licensed association shall provide a copy of its mutuel department policies and procedures to KHRG.
- f. Each licensed association shall have protocols in place that mandate exclusion of any receiving track's wagering pool when the licensed association cannot verify that all wagers in the receiving track's pool were received prior to the official start of the race. Copies of these protocols shall be provided to KHRG.
- g. Each licensed association shall have protocols in place and shall publicize to its wagering patrons when, as a receiving track, it is excluded from a host track's wagering pool. These protocols shall include an immediate public announcement and immediate posting on the licensed association's video monitors and websites. Copies of these protocols shall be provided to KHRG.
- h. In the event of exotic wagering hosted by another jurisdiction on a licensed association's race date, whereby a KHRG official's actions pursuant to 810 KAR 2:040 or 810 KAR 2:050 may impact the outcome of the wager, the licensed association must inform KHRG of the following information at least three (3) calendar days prior to such wagering:
  - i. Type, number, and denomination of the wager;
  - ii. The specific performance (including, but not limited to, number, type of race, etc.) and racetrack(s) involved in the wager; and
  - iii. Name and direct phone number for the person responsible for operating the wager for the host site and totalizator company.

Further, any such wager shall be included in the official race program of the licensed association with the wager for each applicable race date.

- i. Each licensed association that does business with any individual, person, or entity that offers advance deposit account wagering ("ADW") to Kentucky residents shall ensure that the ADW is licensed by KHRG prior to doing business with that ADW.
- j. Each licensed association shall submit an electronic copy of the Kentucky Department of Revenue Forms 73A100 and 73A101 to <a href="mailto:KHRGC.Reports@ky.gov">KHRGC.Reports@ky.gov</a> no later than 4:30 p.m. on the 5th business day (excluding Saturday and Sunday) following the close of each racing week. Note that each licensed association must report its wagers, including any wagers conducted through a subsidiary, on a single return for each period.
- k. Each licensed association shall settle (and pay, as required) all wagering accounts with simulcast partners on a timely basis, in no event exceeding 60 days past any respective due date.
- I. Each licensed association shall ensure sufficient printed copies of the program are made available to KHRG staff and shall provide a digital copy of the program to KHRG via e-mail no later than six (6) hours prior to the first

- race of the program.
- m. All licensed associations are required to have a licensed tote employee on the premises during live racing.
- 5. Each licensed association shall submit to KHRG a full employee list that includes the official title of the employee at the licensed association and the date of the employee's hire. This shall be submitted in a format approved by KHRG on a monthly basis, no later than the 5th business day of the month.
- 6. Each licensed association shall report to KHRG in writing, as required by 810 KAR 3:020, Section 11, the discharge of any licensed employee within 24 hours of the event.
- 7. Each licensed association shall ensure that all vendors and affiliated entities and the employees of all vendors and affiliated entities utilized for the licensed association's operations are properly licensed by KHRG.
- 8. Each licensed association shall require that all vendors and affiliated entities and the employees of all vendors and affiliated entities display a KHRG identification badge while on licensed association grounds.
- 9. All licensed associations must pay for allocated expenses of KHRG pursuant to invoice terms, as set forth in KRS 230.240(3).

All notices required to be given to KHRG under this condition of licensure, unless otherwise stated, shall be provided to KHRG's President/CEO, Chief Operating Officer, Chief State Steward, Presiding Judge, and Senior Vice President of Gaming via hand delivery or electronic mail. In the event a licensed association does not comply with the requirements, KHRG has the authority to assess fines and/or penalties, including, but not limited to, licensure revocation. Additional conditions may be added to an association's license at any time at the discretion of KHRG.

RE: LICENSES TO CONDUCT HORSE RACING, SIMULCASTING, PARI-MUTUEL WAGERING,

AND SPORTS WAGERING FOR 2026

All nine licensed racetracks in Kentucky submitted applications to renew their licenses to conduct horse racing and associated wagering activities in 2026. Additionally, all eight of the racetracks currently holding operator licenses for sports wagering submitted renewal applications for 2026.

Kentucky Horse Racing & Gaming (KHRG) staff thoroughly reviewed each application. Today, KHRG staff recommends approval of the following nine applications for licenses to conduct horse racing, simulcasting, and pari-mutuel wagering, and eight applications for sports wagering operator licenses.

#### **Churchill Downs Racetrack, LLC ("Churchill Downs")**

Churchill Downs conducts thoroughbred racing, simulcasting, pari-mutuel wagering on live and historical horse racing, and sports wagering in Louisville, Kentucky. In addition to the main track site, Churchill Downs offers wagering at Derby City Gaming and Derby City Gaming Downtown in Louisville, Kentucky. Churchill Downs also conducts simulcast wagering and sports wagering at the Louisville Thoroughbred Society. KHRG staff recommends approval of Churchill Downs' application with the following race dates:

- 2026 Spring Meet: April 25, 28, 29, and 30; May 1, 2, 7, 8, 9, 10, 14, 15, 16, 17, 21, 22, 23, 24, 25, 28, 29, 30, and 31; June 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 17, 18, 19, 20, 21, 24, 25, 26, 27, and 28 (43 race days)
- 2026 September Meet: September 10, 11, 12, 13, 16, 17, 18, 19, 20, 23, 24, 25, 26, and 27 (14 race days)
- 2026 Fall Meet: October 25, 28, and 29; November 1, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 18, 19, 20, 21, 22, 25, 26, 27, 28, and 29 (24 race days)
- Total Race Days: 81 race days

Churchill Downs conducts retail sports wagering through an agreement with Sports Information Services Limited d/b/a Kambi, and mobile sports wagering with Out the Gate, Inc. d/b/a Prime Sports, and has requested the renewal of its sports wagering operator license for 2026. KHRG staff recommends approval.

#### **ECL Corbin, LLC ("Cumberland Run")**

Cumberland Run conducts harness horse racing, simulcasting, pari-mutuel wagering on live and historical horse racing, and sports wagering in Corbin, Kentucky. In addition to the main track site, the track conducts wagering operations at its Williamsburg, Kentucky location. KHRG staff recommends approval of Cumberland Run's application with the following race dates:

• 2026 Meet: October 17, 18, 19, 20, 24, 25, 26, and 27; November 1, 2, 3, 8, 9, and 10 (14 race days)

Cumberland Run conducts retail and mobile sports wagering through agreements with Crown KY Gaming, LLC d/b/a DraftKings and Circa Sports KY, LLC d/b/a Circa Sportsbook. Cumberland Run has requested the renewal of its sports wagering operator license for 2026. KHRG staff recommends approval.

#### Ellis Entertainment, LLC ("Ellis Park")

Ellis Park conducts thoroughbred racing, simulcasting, pari-mutuel wagering on live and historical horse racing, and sports wagering in Henderson, Kentucky. In addition to the main track site, the track conducts wagering operations at Owensboro Racing and Gaming. KHRG staff recommends approval of Ellis Park's application with the following race dates:

• 2026 Meet (\* denotes optional race days): July 2, 3, 4, 5, 6\*, 10, 11, 12, 13\*, 17, 18, 19, 20\*, 24, 25, 26, 27\*, and 31; August 1, 2, 3\*, 7, 8, 9, 10\*, 14, 15, 16, 17\*, 21, 22, 23, and 24\* (25 race days and 8 optional race days)

Ellis Park conducts retail sports wagering through an agreement with Kambi and mobile sports wagering through Penn Sports Interactive, LLC d/b/a ESPN Bet. It has requested the renewal of its sports wagering operator license for 2026. KHRG staff recommends approval.

#### **Keeneland Association, Inc. ("Keeneland")**

Keeneland conducts thoroughbred racing, simulcasting, and pari-mutuel wagering on live horse racing at its track in Lexington, Kentucky. It is also part of a joint-venture agreement with Lexington Trots Breeders Association, LLC to conduct pari-mutuel wagering on historical horse races. Keeneland also conducts simulcasting on leased premises at the same facility while not conducting a racing meet. KHRG staff recommends approval of Keeneland's application with the following race dates:

- 2026 Spring Meet: April 3, 4, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 15, 16, 17, 18, 19, 22, 23, and 24 (15 race days)
- 2026 Fall Meet: October 2, 3, 4, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 14, 15, 16, 17, 18, 21, 22, 23, and 24 (17 race days)
- Breeders' Cup: October 30 and 31 (2 race days)
- Total Days: (34 race days)

Keeneland does not hold an operator license for sports wagering and did not submit an application to obtain one in 2026.

#### Kentucky Downs, LLC ("Kentucky Downs")

Kentucky Downs conducts thoroughbred racing, simulcasting, pari-mutuel wagering on live and historical horse racing, and sports wagering in Franklin, Kentucky. In addition to the main track site, the track conducts wagering operations at its facility in Bowling Green, Kentucky. KHRG staff recommends approval of Kentucky Downs' application with the following race dates:

2026 Meet (\* denotes optional race days): August 27, 28\*, 29, 30, and 31\*;
 September 1\*, 2\*, 3, 4\*, 5, 6, 7\*, 8\*, and 9 (7 race days and 7 optional race days)

Kentucky Downs conducts sports wagering through agreements with DraftKings and Circa Sportsbook. Kentucky Downs has requested the renewal of its sports wagering operator license for 2026. KHRG staff recommends approval.

#### WKY Development, LLC ("Oak Grove")

Oak Grove conducts harness horse racing, simulcasting, pari-mutuel wagering on live and historical horse racing, and sports wagering in Oak Grove, Kentucky. In addition to the main track site, the track plans to conduct wagering operations at Marshall Yards Racing and Gaming in Calvert City, Kentucky in 2026. KHRG staff recommends approval of Oak Grove's application with the following race dates:

2026 Meet (\* denotes optional race days): March 23, 24, 30, and 31; April 6, 7, 13, 14, 20, 21, 27, and 28; May 2\*, 4, 5, 9\*, 10, 11, 12\*, 16\*, 18, 19, 25, and 26; June 1, 2, 8, 9, 15, 16, 22, 23, 24\*, 29, and 30; July 1\*, 6, 7, 8\*, 13, and 14 (34 race days and 7 optional race days)

Oak Grove conducts retail sports wagering through an agreement with Kambi and mobile sports wagering through an agreement with FBG Enterprise OpCo, LLC d/b/a Fanatics. Oak Grove has requested the renewal of its operator license to continue conducting sports wagering in 2026. KHRG staff recommends approval.

#### Lexington Trots Breeders Association, LLC ("Red Mile")

Red Mile conducts harness horse racing, simulcasting, and pari-mutuel wagering on live horse racing in Lexington, Kentucky. Red Mile also conducts pari-mutuel wagering on historical horse racing through a joint-venture agreement with Keeneland. KHRG staff recommends approval of Red Mile's application with the following race dates:

2026 Meet: July 26, 27, and 28; August 2, 3, 4, 5, 9, 10, 11, 12, 16, 17, 18, 19, 23, 24, 25, 26, 30 and 31; September 1, 2, 6, 7, 8, 9, 13, 14, 15, 20, 21, and 22; October 1, 2, 3, 9, 10, and 11 (39 race days)

Red Mile conducts retail and mobile sports wagering through an agreement with American Wagering, Inc. d/b/a Caesars Sportsbook. It has requested the renewal of its operator license to continue conducting sports wagering in 2026. KHRG staff recommends approval.

#### Revolutionary Racing Kentucky, LLC ("Sandy Ridge")

Sandy Ridge conducts simulcasting, pari-mutuel wagering on live and historical horse racing, and sports wagering in Ashland, Kentucky. In 2026, it plans to conduct quarter horse racing at Sandy Ridge in Ashland for the first time. KHRG staff recommends approval of Sandy Ridge's application with the following race dates:

2026 Meet: August 19, 20, 21, 26, 27, and 28; September 4 and 5 (8 race days)

Sandy Ridge is licensed to conduct retail and mobile sports wagering through an agreement with BetMGM, LLC d/b/a BetMGM and mobile sports wagering through Hillside Kentucky, LLC d/b/a bet365. It has requested renewal of its operator license to continue conducting sports wagering in 2026. KHRG staff recommends approval.

#### Turfway Park, LLC ("Turfway Park")

Turfway Park conducts thoroughbred racing, simulcasting, pari-mutuel wagering on live and historical horse racing, and sports wagering in Florence, Kentucky. In addition to the main track site, the track conducts wagering operations at its facility in Newport, Kentucky. KHRG staff recommends approval of Turfway Park's application with the following race dates:

- 2026 Winter/Spring Meet: January 1, 2, 3, 7, 8, 9, 10, 14, 15, 16, 17, 21, 22, 23, 24, 28, 29, 30, and 31; February 4, 5, 6, 7, 11, 12, 13, 14, 18, 19, 20, 21, 25, 26, 27, and 28; March 4, 5, 6, 7, 11, 12, 13, 14, 18, 19, 20, 21, 25, 26, 27, and 28 (51 race days)
- 2026 Holiday Meet: December 2, 3, 4, 5, 9, 10, 11, 12, 16, 17, 18, 19, 23, 26, and 30 (15 race days)
- Total Race Days: 66 race days

Turfway Park conducts retail sports wagering through an agreement with Kambi and mobile sports wagering through Betfair Interactive US, LLC d/b/a FanDuel. It has requested the renewal of its sports wagering operator license for 2026. KHRG staff recommends approval.

KHRG staff recommends approval of licenses to conduct horse racing, pari-mutuel wagering, and simulcasting with the race dates noted in this memorandum and on the enclosed 2026 calendar to Churchill Downs, Cumberland Run, Ellis Park, Keeneland, Kentucky Downs, Oak Grove, Red Mile, Sandy Ridge, and Turfway Park. KHRG staff further recommends approval of sports wagering operator licenses for Churchill Downs, Cumberland Run, Ellis Park, Kentucky Downs, Oak Grove, Red Mile, Sandy Ridge, and Turfway Park.





## Summary of KTDF Allotment Requests Amended Based Upon the Original Submission and Approval at the October 1, 2025, KTDF Advisory Committee Meeting

#### 2025/2026 Turfway Park's Holiday/Winter/Spring KTDF Allotment Request:

Turfway Park, LLC plans to card KTDF purses in the range of \$13.0M to \$14.0M for their 2025/2026 holiday/winter/spring race meet. Their 2025 Holiday Meet will consist of 14 racing days beginning Wednesday, December 3, 2025, and ending Saturday, December 27, 2025. Their 2026 Winter/Spring race meet will consist of 51 racing days beginning Thursday January 1, 2026, and ending Saturday, March 28, 2026. These projections are based on a KTDF earned balance of \$200K at the conclusion of their 2025 Winter/Spring race meet and anticipated earnings totaling \$8.5M by the end of April 2026 from historical horse racing at Turfway Park Racing & Gaming and Newport Racing & Gaming properties. Additionally, they expect earnings of \$3.0M from Oak Grove. To encourage participation during the race meet, Turfway Park will pay out KTDF purses through last place to all eligible KTDF registered horses.

In accordance with KRS.230.400, Turfway Park is requesting the use of \$235,000 in KTDF to promote, enhance, improve and encourage the further and continued development of the Kentucky Thoroughbred breeding and racing industry in Kentucky.

The Corporation received a letter dated October 15, 2025, from Kentucky Downs, LLC requesting to transfer \$1M dollars in KTDF to Turfway Park, LLC for use during their upcoming 2025/2026 holiday/winter/spring race meet. Turfway Park Racing & Gaming has reviewed our purses and would like to card KTDF purses in the range of \$11.6 million to \$12.4 million for our upcoming Holiday/Winter Spring Meets. We have based the range on the following information:

- 1. At the end of March 2025, Turfway Park ended with a KTDF balance of \$0.2 million.
- 2. The sources of Turfway's KTDF to be used over this period are as follows:
  - Turfway Park/Newport Live and Historical Racing: \$8.5 million projected from April 2025 through March 2026.
  - b. Oak Grove: Transfer of \$2.5 million in KTDF funds from Oak Grove.
- Our 2025 Holiday Meet will consist of 14 racing days beginning December 3<sup>rd</sup> and ending December 27<sup>th</sup>, 2025. Our 2026 Winter/Spring meet will consist of 51 racing days beginning on January 1<sup>st</sup> 2026 and ending on March 28<sup>th</sup>, 2026.
- 4. We anticipate that KTDF will be approximately 32% of total purses. Of the requested KTDF allotment, we anticipate the following payouts:
  - a. ALW, AOC, MSW, MDN: approximately 69% of the KTDF allotment
  - b. BCL, CLM, MCL, STR, WMC: approximately 19% of the KTDF allotment; and
  - c. Stakes: approximately 12% of the KTDF allotment
- 5. For December 2025 through March 2026, we are assuming a KTDF payout percentage of 87% with anticipated KTDF disbursements of \$10.4 million, which is an increase of \$2.2 million from the \$8.2 million paid during the prior year meet. The increase in KTDF purses is driven by increasing maidens to \$90K, 3 additional stakes races and a 10% increase in KTDF on all claiming races.
- Turfway Park is requesting \$235K to be used for marketing our on-track experience.
- To encourage participation during the Meet, we are again planning to pay KTDF purses from first to last to all eligible horses.

#### THE KENTUCKY THOROUGHBRED DEVELOPMENT FUND (KTDF)

Horsemen with Kentucky-sired Kentucky breds have over \$30 million more in purse money to run for in for designated stakes, handicap, allowance, non-claiming maiden races, and claiming races contested at licensed Thoroughbred race meetings in Kentucky.

Eligible races can be readily recognized in the stakes and condition books by the Kentucky Thoroughbred Development Fund seal, which will appear next to each race in the stakes and condition books.

In accordance with KRS 230.400(5)(d), it is mandatory for a horse to be registered prior to time of entry to be eligible to participate in the distribution of Kentucky Thoroughbred Development Fund monies. Registration is only complete once the application is approved, and payment has been received.

All horses of racing age that are both Kentucky-bred and sired by a Kentucky stallion which stood in Kentucky during the entire breeding season the year the horse was conceived are eligible to be registered. Owners of horses of racing age are responsible for registering their horses. Stallion owners are responsible for registering their stallions.





The net increase will be directed towards their administrative budget that has remained the same since 2004 as the official registrar of the Kentucky Thoroughbred Development Fund (KTDF) in accordance with KRS.230.400.

Foals: \$75 to \$95
Yearlings: \$100 to \$140
Racing Age: \$350 to \$700

Following this memorandum is a letter and presentation from Chauncey Morris, Executive Director of the KTOB. Mr. Morris is available to answer any questions about the proposal.

KRS 230.400(6)(a) states in pertinent part, "The registrar may establish and charge, with the approval of the corporation, reasonable registration fees for its services in the registration of Kentucky Thoroughbred stallions and in the registration of Kentucky-bred Thoroughbreds."



### Date Preference System:

The following date system of preference is used at Turfway Park:

Foal certificates no longer are required to be on file in the racing office to enter or start at Turfway Park; however, foal certificates must be on file to obtain a preference date and to have a horse tattooed.

Each day's overnight will list the dates of horses in and on the also-eligible list to enable trainers to see what dates are getting horses into over-filled races.

- In over-filled races, preference will be given to horses in order of their assigned preference dates, earliest date first. Horses
  having identical dates will be chosen by lot; however, where entry and running dates are the same, the horse with the entry date
  will have preference.
- 2. All horses intended for racing at Turfway Park will be assigned a preference date. A horse can have only one date at any particular time. Dates assigned will be of two types:

#### E-Date

This date will correspond to: (a) the date on which a horse's foal papers and name card are submitted to the Identifier (the earliest date being the day when entries are first taken for the meeting). The deadline to submit foal papers/digital foal certificates to receive a date on day of entry is 9:30 a.m. Eastern. (b) The day on which a horse is first entered if his papers are not on file with the Identifier. To qualify for the latter E-Date, a horse must have been excluded from a race that appears on the overnight or he must have been entered in a condition book race that failed to fill through insufficient entries.

#### R-Date

This date will correspond to the day of a horse's most recent race at Turfway Park. An R-Date will also be assigned to a horse that scratches, providing the foal papers are on file with the identifier.

- 3. A horse retains his R-Date until he receives a newer R-Date. No horse with an established R-Date may receive an E-Date. A horse whose papers are removed from the Identifier's office will lose his date and must subsequently re-establish a date in order to receive preference. A horse with an E-Date cannot receive a newer E-Date. Horses starting at another racetrack will forfeit any date they may have at Turfway Park. Additionally, horses racing at Turfway Park without foal papers on site will not retain their R-Date.
- Preference dates are good for any type of race or distance (other than maiden dates).
- 5. Maiden dates will be kept separately and will not have preference in winners' races.
- No E-Date will be assigned to the second choice of an un-split same-owner entry.
- A horse that has been placed on a list (Veterinarian, Steward, Starter, or Paddock Judge) will lose his date and be assigned an R-Date corresponding to the day he is removed from the list.
- Horses on the Also-Eligible list shall be permitted to draw into races and will be assigned post positions in the order of their dates, earliest dates first.
- 9. A horse that is a scheduled starter in a canceled race will not receive an R-Date for that race but will retain his previous date.
- The draw of stake and handicap races is not subject to date preference.
- 11. Preference dates are transferred through change in ownership and changes in trainer only after the proper transfer procedures have been completed through the Stewards' Office and delivered to the Racing Secretary's Office.
- 12. Date preference rules will not supersede KHRC rules regarding preference, eligibility, or scratches

RE: REQUEST FOR APPROVAL OF SPORTS WAGERING CATALOG RECOMMENDATIONS

In accordance with 809 KAR 10:002, a licensee is prohibited from offering sports wagering on any event that has not been approved by Kentucky Horse Racing and Gaming (KHRG). This memorandum presents proposed updates to KHRG's Sports Wagering Catalog, ensuring compliance with KHRG regulations. The proposed changes include staff recommendations regarding requests for new sporting events, leagues, or awards from licensed service providers.

KHRG staff has thoroughly reviewed these requests to ensure they adhere to the criteria for allowable wagers as established in 809 KAR 10:002, Section 2. This review focused on the overall integrity of the sporting events associated with each request and their suitability for offering in Kentucky. KHRG staff evaluated each event to ensure it meets the regulatory standards for transparency, integrity, and relevance to the field of play.

### **New Requests and Clarification**

The following requests, submitted by service providers, have been reviewed and evaluated by KHRG staff. Below is additional information regarding each request, along with corresponding recommendations:

The following is a non-exhaustive list of notable activities related to the Corporation that have taken place since the last update on June 24, 2025. This is for informational purposes only.

### Personnel Updates:

- Twenty employees of the Department of Charitable Gaming joined the team on July 1, 2025.
   Kim Sutherland, Director of Charitable Gaming, Henry Boone, Compliance Branch Manager, and Farrah Keith, Licensing Branch Manager lead the division and have over 60 years of state service specific to charitable gaming.
- Two veterinarians joined the Division of Veterinary Services.
- KHRG added one licensing administrator, one administrative assistant and one compliance analyst.

### Board and Committee Updates:

- Governor appointed Jason Chinn, Gregory L. "Bernie" Mason, and William Redwine on September 19, 2025.
- The Corporation's Board met on August 19 and October 2, 2025.
- Finance Committee met on August 19 and October 2, 2025.
- KTDF Advisory Committee met on August 7 and October 1, 2025, to consider and recommend
  purse supplements for Churchill Downs' September and Fall Meets, Keeneland's Fall Meet,
  Turfway Park's Holiday and Winter/Spring Meets along with advertising for the entire
  thoroughbred circuit in Kentucky.
- License Review Committee met on July 8, 2025 and considered two standardbred licensees.

#### Notable Business:

- July 1: Regulation requiring entry examination by attending veterinarians became effective.
- July 8: KHRG's announced new logo and tag line, Kentucky's Safe Bet.
- July 9: Jamie Eads and Travers Manley met with idPair, a responsible gaming company focused on research and technology.

- July 9: GLI seminar at NCLGS, Jamie Eads participated as a panelist on the impacts and challenges of regulating historical horse racing in Kentucky.
- July 9 July 12: team members of pari-mutuel wagering and charitable gaming participated in NCLGS conference in Louisville, Ky. Jamie Eads gave the welcome keynote on July 10.
- July 31: Jamie Eads participated in The Jockey Club Round Table.
- August 11 August 14: Jamie Eads participated in the ARCI model rules and board meeting as a voting member and the Racing and Gaming Symposium in Saratoga Springs, NY.
- August 26: Hannah Simms coordinated a KHRG 101 so that staff could better understand responsibilities of each division.
- September 3: Chair Rabinowitz, Members May, Parke, Romans, and Worley along with Jamie Eads and Dr. Mundy conducted a site visit of Sandy's in Ashland, Ky. RRKY leadership and community officials were present to answer questions.
- September 15: Drew Conners participated in the Kentucky Racing Health & Welfare Fund (KyRHWF) board meeting. This Fund receives uncashed pari-mutuel tickets (thoroughbred), and Drew participates as a non-voting member to keep both KyRHWF and KHRG up to date.
- September 23: KHRG's first biennial report covering 2023 and 2024 was submitted to Governor Beshear and the General Assembly as well as members of the board.
- September 25: Jamie Eads along with leadership from Charitable Gaming, Pari-mutuel wagering and sports betting, testified in front of the Licensing and Occupations Committee.
- October 6: Jamie Eads, Dr. Mundy, Dr. Smith met with the KyHBPA and trainers to continue the discussion on vet list works and state vet scratches. Member Landes attended the meeting.
- October 8: KHRG submitted to the General Assembly and Governor's Office audited financial statements for fiscal year ending June 30, 2025.
- October 14: Ashleigh Bailey and Jamie Eads presented 810 KAR 6:001, 810 KAR 7:060 and 810 KAR 7:080 to AARS. Regulations moved to L&O.

#### Other Activities:

- Churchill Downs spring meet opened April 26 and concluded June 29, 2025, with \$10,850,401 in supplemental purses paid from KTDF.
- KY Proud Series, harness racing at county fairs, concluded July 20, 2025, with \$2,190,625 in KSDF purses paid.
- Oak Grove concluded July 15, 2025, with \$4,870,000 in KSDF purses paid.
- Ellis Park opened July 3 and concluded August 31, 2025. The race meet included \$7,326,802 in supplemental purses paid from KTDF.
- Red Mile opened July 20 and concluded their regular meet on September 16, 2025 with \$11,355,000 in KSDF purses paid. Grand Circuit took place the following two weekends after the Sire Stakes Championships and paid over \$4.2 million in purses.
- August 15: KTBIF nominations totaled 8,623 and generated \$526,530 in nomination fees.
- Kentucky Downs opened August 27 and concluded September 10, 2025. The race meet included \$16,269,381 in supplemental purses paid from KTDF. This meet was highlighted with a 3-hour prime time broadcast on NBC that included interviews with Governor Beshear, Chair Rabinowitz, and Vice-Chair O'Connor.
- Churchill Downs September opened September 11 and concluded September 28, 2025. The race meet included \$3,544,649 in supplemental purses paid from KTDF.

- Keeneland Fall Meet opened October 3.
- Cumberland Run Fall Meet opened October 12.
- Sport wagering total handle from January through August 2025, exceeded \$1.75 billion. More than \$1.6 billion in winnings was returned to players, while the state collected \$27.2 million in excise tax during this period. This reflects a year-over-year increase excise tax revenue of more than 18% for the same timeframe.
- Pari-mutuel wagering handle for June 1 September 30, 2025, exceeded \$3.9 billion, which is a 13% increase from same period in 2024.
- Gaming division staff approved 51 game floor request at all 13 properties and reviewed 390 requests for determinations of suitability for historical horse racing.




