CLO Bailey explained the process to amend regulations. The amendments under discussion included: (1) the amendment of the definition of Historical Horse Race to include previously run horse races at a licensed pari-mutuel facility located in the United States or a pari-mutuel facility approved by the KHRGC located outside the United States and (2) the deletion of the definition of initial seed pool. The amendments were already presented at the Rules Committee meeting and passed without any substantive discussion. The amendments are then presented to the full board and, once approved, go to the Legislative Research Commission and are printed in the register of proposed regulations. Interested parties have time to participate in the public hearing and comment period before the regulation gets placed on the docket for the next administrative regulation review subcommittee with the legislature in Frankfort. At that meeting, legislators on the subcommittee have the opportunity to ask questions of the staff of KHRGC. RE: PATTERSON VETERINARY SUPPLY MASTER AGREEMENT RENEWAL

In August of 2021, the Finance and Administration Cabinet issued a solicitation for a Request for Proposals (RFB 758 2200000155) for Lasix supplies for the former Kentucky Horse Racing Commission. Patterson Veterinary Supply was awarded the solicitation with a bid for supplies totaling \$244,031.36 and entered into the Master Agreement (MA 758 2200000178).

The KHRGC has utilized this Master Agreement for Lasix supplies since October 13, 2021. On June 27, 2025, the Finance and Administration Cabinet assigned the contract to the KHRG upon the transition from the Executive Branch to an independent, de jure municipal corporation and political subdivision of the Commonwealth of Kentucky. The Master Agreement has been renewed three times, with one renewal remaining. The current renewal expires on October 12, 2025.

KHRG staff request the Master Agreement with Patterson Veterinary Supply be renewed for an amount not to exceed \$244,031.36 in order to provide Lasix supplies, as KHRG is required by 810 KAR 8:010 to administer all Lasix shots at racetracks throughout the Commonwealth. Lasix supplies are necessary to the continued function of the KHRG and our veterinary services.

KHRG staff recommends approval pending approval by the Finance Committee at its meeting on August 19th.

RATIFICATION OF PURCHASE REQUEST FOR IT SERVICES WITH PUBLIC PROTECTION

CABINET

For fiscal year ending June 30, 2025, the KHRG received database services for sports wagering license issuance, secure online portal usage and maintenance operations, and website and new application services from the Public Protection Cabinet that expired on June 30, 2025. As a result of the transition, that contract was legally assigned to the KHRG by the Public Protection Cabinet ("PPC"). PPC also provided the same services for Charitable Gaming. KHRGC's quarterly contract for FY2025 with PPC permitted services not to exceed \$150,000 per quarter. Staff received the terms to extend and modify the contract with PPC for the next fiscal year during the last week of June for these IT services. Additionally, PPC is actively working to upgrade Charitable Gaming's application, website and e-services. Changing vendors mid-stream during the development of the upgrades would be detrimental to the project. The impact of not continuing the services would be critical to KHRG's ability to function in maintaining the website and licensing services, and the expenses were included in the FY2026 budget previously approved by the Finance Committee and KHRG Board.

Due to timing of receipt of the contract extension, a Finance Committee meeting was not able to be scheduled before the need to have the contract in place by July 1, 2025. KHRG followed the Emergency Procurement procedures as outlined in the Procurement Policies. These procedures require the following:

- A request, in writing if possible, for a written determination shall be made to the President or her designee
- If she finds the condition exists for KHRGC to purchase through an emergency procurement, KHRGC may proceed with the emergency procurement
- If possible, the determination will be made in writing

Their development of the sports wagering and charitable gaming licensing database and online portals, in addition to their ongoing updates to the charitable gaming system, are critical to the operations of KHRGC. Changing vendors during the middle of development will likely cause delays in implementation of the updated systems. Furthermore, due to the timing of receipt of the terms of the extension of the contract, an emergency condition exists. These systems are currently operating and available on KHRGC's website and would be detrimental to the operations of KHRGC if they became inactive on July 1st. There is an immediate need to continue these services which cannot be met through normal procurement methods and the absense of which would seriously threaten the proper functioning of KHRGC and the preservation of its IT hardware and equipment.

The KHRGC will be unable to maintain its licensure database or online portal for sports wagering and charitable gaming licensing services without the IT services to maintain and upgrade them. Halting the upgrade to charitable gaming's applications would cause irreparable harm to their online licensing system.

Memorandum of Agreement

This Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) is entered into, by and between the Commonwealth of Kentucky, Horse Racing Commission ("the Commonwealth") and the Public Protection Cabinet ("the Contractor") to establish an agreement for Services for Information Technology ("IT") Resources. The initial MOA is effective from April 01, 2025 through June 30, 2025.

Scope of Services:

Section I.2 - Database Services

PPC shall be obligated to perform the following services for KHRGC:

- Development of licensure database

- Customization requests for licensure database

Section I.3 – Secure Portal Use and Maintenance Operations

PPC shall be obligated to perform the following services for KHRGC:

- a. Provision of secure online portal for initial sports wagering license applications
- Provision of secure online portal for sports wagering license renewals
- Provide access interface to back office for sports wagering licensing services.
- Maintenance of online portal.

Section I.4 – Website and New Application Services

PPC shall be obligated to perform the following services for KHRGC:

- Creation/Registration of new online domain
- Maintenance of website
- c. Create Open Records Submission Portal
- d. Development of new applications (whole cost estimate to be provided prior to initiation of development)
- Maintenance of new/existing applications
- Obtaining and maintaining appropriate servers for storage

Section I.5 - Amendment

The Parties agree that amendments to this MOA shall only be by written amendments signed by authorized representatives of both Parties.

Section I.6 - Termination

Both Parties shall have the right to terminate and cancel this MOA at any time not to exceed thirty (30) days' written notice served on the other party's point of contact for the MOA.

- This MOA has been negotiated and prepared by the Parties and their respective counsel, and should any provision of this MOA require judicial interpretation, the court interpreting or construing the provision shall not apply the rule of construction that the MOA is to be construed against the drafter.
- This MOA shall be valid on the date of the last party's execution of the MOA.
- All amendments to this MOA shall be in writing, shall be permitted only upon the agreement of both parties, and may be signed by authorized representatives of the Parties. No oral amendment shall be permitted.
- 6. In case any one or more of the provisions contained in this MOA shall for any reason be held to be invalid, illegal, or unenforceable in any respect, such invalidity, illegality, or unenforceability shall not affect any other provision hereof, and this MOA shall be construed as if such invalid, illegal, or unenforceable provision had never been contained herein
- This MOA shall be construed in accord with the laws of the Commonwealth of Kentucky, and the choice of law is laws of the Commonwealth of Kentucky. The venue for any disputes arising under this MOA shall be the Franklin Circuit Court.
- Each party shall bear its own attorneys' fees and costs that may result from any dispute arising out of this MOA.

Pricing:

Services will be invoiced monthly, with payment due to PPC within thirty (30) days of receipt of an invoice.

Services provided under this agreement shall be billed at a rate of \$80 per hour, not to exceed \$150,000 for FY25 Quarter 4; except that server and storage costs for hosting applications/programs shall be billed at cost (i.e., the cost to PPC will be passed on to KHRGC).

Memorandum of Agreement Standard Terms and Conditions Revised August 2024

1.00 Effective Date

All Memorandum of Agreements are not effective until the Secretary of the Finance and Administration Cabinet or his authorized designee has approved the agreement and until the agreement has been submitted to the government contract review committee. However, in accordance with KRS 45A.700, memoranda of agreement in aggregate amounts of \$50,000 or less are exempt from review by the committee and need only be filed with the committee within 30 days of their effective date for informational purposes.

KRS 45A.695(7) provides that payments on personal service contracts and memoranda of agreement shall not be authorized for services rendered after government contract review committee disapproval, unless the decision of the committee is overridden by the Secretary of the Finance and Administration Cabinet or agency head if the agency has been granted delegation authority by the Secretary.

The vendor shall be paid, upon the submission of proper invoices to the receiving agency at the prices stipulated for the supplies delivered and accepted, or services rendered. Unless otherwise specified, payment will not be made for partial deliveries accepted. Payments will be made within thirty (30) working days after receipt of goods or a vendor's invoice in accordance with KRS 45.453 and KRS 45.454.

2.00 EEO Requirements

The Equal Employment Opportunity Act of 1978 applies to All State government projects with an estimated value exceeding \$500,000. The contractor shall comply with all terms and conditions of the Act.

3.00 Cancellation Clause

Both parties shall have the right to terminate and cancel this contract at any time not to exceed thirty (30) days' written notice served on the Contractor by registered or certified mail.

4.00 Funding Out Provision

The state agency may terminate this agreement if funds are not appropriated to the contracting agency or are not otherwise available for the purpose of making payments without incurring any obligation for payment after the date of termination, regardless of the terms of the agreement. The state agency shall provide the Contractor thirty (30) calendar day's written notice of termination of the agreement due to lack of available funding.

5.00 Reduction in Contract Worker Hours

The Kentucky General Assembly may allow for a reduction in contract worker hours in conjunction with a budget balancing measure for some professional and non-professional service contracts.

If under such authority the agency is required by Executive Order or otherwise to reduce contract hours, the agreement will be reduced by the amount specified in that document. If the contract funding is reduced, then the scope of work related to the contract may also be reduced commensurate with the reduction in funding. This reduction of the scope shall be agreeable to both parties and shall not be considered a breach of contract.

6.00 Access to Records

The state agency certifies that it is in compliance with the provisions of KRS 45A.150, "Access to contractor's books, documents, papers, records, or other evidence directly pertinent to the contract." The Contractor, as defined in KRS 45A.030, agrees that the contracting agency, the Finance and Administration Cabinet, the Auditor of Public Accounts, and the Legislative Research Commission, or their duly authorized representatives, shall have access to any books, documents, papers, records, or other evidence, which are directly pertinent to this agreement for

the purpose of financial audit or program review. The Contractor also recognizes that any books, documents, papers, records, or other evidence, received during a financial audit or program review shall be subject to the Kentucky Open Records Act, KRS 61.870 to 61.884. Records and other prequalification information confidentially disclosed as part of the bid process shall not be deemed as directly pertinent to the agreement and shall be exempt from disclosure as provided in KRS 61.878(1)(c).

7.00 Violation of tax and employment laws

KRS 45A.485 requires the Contractor and all subcontractors performing work under the contract to reveal to the Commonwealth any final determination of a violation by the Contractor within the previous five (5) year period of the provisions of KRS chapters 136, 139, 141, 337, 338, 341, and 342. These statutes relate to corporate and utility tax, sales and use tax, income tax, wages and hours laws, occupational safety and health laws, unemployment insurance laws, and workers compensation insurance laws, respectively. Disclosure of any violations is required prior to the award of any state contract and throughout the duration the contract.

Failure to disclose violations, shall be grounds for the Commonwealth's disqualification of a contractor or subcontractor from eligibility for future state contracts for a period of two (2) years.

The Contractor affirms that it has not violated any of the provisions of the above statutes within the previous five (5) year period, aside from violations explicitly disclosed and attached to this contract. Contractor further affirms that it will (1) communicate the above KRS 45A.485 disclosure requirements to any subcontractors and (2) disclose any subcontractor violations it becomes aware of to the Commonwealth.

8.00 Discrimination

This section applies only to agreements disbursing federal funds, in whole or part, when the terms for receiving those funds mandate its inclusion. Discrimination (because of race, religion, color, national origin, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity, age, or disability) is prohibited. During the performance of this agreement, the Contractor agrees as follows:

The Contractor will not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, religion, color, national origin, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity or age. The Contractor further agrees to comply with the provisions of the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA), Public Law 101-336, and applicable federal regulations relating thereto prohibiting discrimination against otherwise qualified disabled individuals under any program or activity. The Contractor agrees to provide, upon request, needed reasonable accommodations. The Contractor will take affirmative action to ensure that applicants are employed and that employees are treated during employment without regard to their race, religion, color, national origin, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity, age or disability. Such action shall include, but not be limited to the following; employment, upgrading, demotion or transfer; recruitment or recruitment advertising; layoff or termination; rates of pay or other forms of compensations; and selection for training, including apprenticeship. The Contractor agrees to post in conspicuous places, available to employees and applicants for employment, notices setting forth the provisions of this non-discrimination clause.

In all solicitations or advertisements for employees placed by or on behalf of the Contractor, the Contractor will, state that all qualified applicants will receive consideration for employment

The Contractor will include the provisions of paragraphs (1) through (7) of section 202 of Executive Order 11246 in every subcontract or purchase order unless exempted by rules, regulations or orders of the Secretary of Labor, issued pursuant to section 204 of Executive Order No. 11246 of September 24, 1965, as amended, so that such provisions will be binding upon each subcontractor or vendor. The Contractor will take such action with respect to any subcontract or purchase order as the administering agency may direct as a means of enforcing such provisions including sanctions for noncompliance; provided, however, that in the event a Contractor becomes involved in, or is threatened with, litigation with a subcontractor or vendor as a result of such direction by the agency, the contractor may request the United States to enter into such litigation to protect the interests of the United States.

The Charitable Gaming Division of KHRG is seeking authorization to purchase three new 2026 sport utility vehicles for Compliance Officers. The vehicles will be ordered taking approximately 2-3 months to arrive and will replace the following vehicles:

- 2016 Ford Explorer 154,564 miles
- 2017 Ford Taurus 156,449 miles
- 2017 Ford Taurus 154,900 miles

The Commonwealth of Kentucky's master agreements with awarded dealers requires agencies to obtain quotes from a minimum of three awarded dealers. All three Ford dealerships with master agreements were contacted to request quotes, and responses were received from two of the dealerships. Staff's recommendation is to proceed with the lower quote of \$119,208 with Paul Miller Ford. The FY26 budget included up to \$250,000 for Charitable Gaming vehicle purchases, of which \$193,673 is being requested for purchases at the August 19th meeting.

KHRG staff recommends approval pending approval by the Finance Committee at its meeting on August 19th.

The Charitable Gaming Division of KHRG is seeking authorization to purchase one new 2025 Toyota Camry Hybrid LE for a Compliance Officer. The vehicle will replace a 2017 Toyota Camry with 174,000 miles currently assigned to the Compliance Officer.

The Commonwealth of Kentucky's master agreements with awarded dealers requires agencies to obtain quotes from a minimum of three awarded dealers. Only one Toyota dealer was included on the list of awarded dealers, which a quote was requested and received. Additional quotes were requested and received from two awarded Ford dealers for a comparison vehicle (Ford Escape Hybrid). Staff's recommendation is to proceed with the lower quote of \$31,954 with Frankfort Toyota. The FY26 budget included up to \$250,000 for Charitable Gaming vehicle purchases, of which \$193,673 is being requested for purchases at the August 19th meeting.

KHRG staff recommends approval pending approval by the Finance Committee at its meeting on August 19th.

The Charitable Gaming Division of KHRG is seeking authorization to purchase one new 2025 sport utility vehicle for the Branch Manager of Compliance. A Compliance Officer was hired recently, and a vehicle was not available to be assigned to the staff. Therefore, the staff was required to drive a personal vehicle and request travel reimbursement for mileage. Because the Compliance Officer traveled more, the Branch Manager provided his assigned vehicle (2016 Ford Explorer with 85,000 miles) to the staff for use to reduce the amount of travel reimbursement for mileage. This request is to provide the new vehicle to the Branch Manager to avoid the use of personal vehicles and mileage reimbursement.

The Commonwealth of Kentucky's master agreements with awarded dealers requires agencies to obtain quotes from a minimum of three awarded dealers. All three Ford dealerships with master agreements were contacted to request quotes, and responses were received from two of the dealerships. Staff's recommendation is to proceed with the lower quote of \$42,511 with Gary Yeomans Frankfort Ford. The FY26 budget included up to \$250,000 for Charitable Gaming vehicle purchases, of which \$193,673 is being requested for purchases at the August 19th meeting.

KHRG staff recommends approval pending approval by the Finance Committee at its meeting on August 19th.

- Churchill Downs' KTDF Allotment Request for purses in the range of \$3.5 million to \$4.0 million for their 2025 September race meet.
- Churchill Downs' KTDF Allotment Request for purses in the range of \$6.5 million to \$7.5 million for their 2025 fall race meet.
- Kentucky Downs' Request to transfer \$1.25 million in KTDF to Keeneland to be used for KTDF purses during their fall race meet.
- Keeneland's KTDF Allotment Request for purses in the range of \$6.6 million to \$6.8 million for their fall race meet, including the use of \$240,000 to promote their race meet in accordance with KRS.230.400.

A summary of all details pertaining to these requests follow this memorandum.

The KTDF Advisory Committee along with the Kentucky HBPA and KTA-KTOB recommend KHRGC Board approval.

Summary of KTDF Allotment Requests at the August 7, 2025, KTDF Advisory Committee Meeting

2025 Churchill Downs' September KTDF Allotment Request:

The KTDF purse structure for Churchill Downs' 2025 September race meet will consist of 14 racing days beginning Thursday, September 11th and ending Sunday, September 28th. Churchill Downs plans to card KTDF purses in the range of \$3.5M to \$4.0M. These projections are based on a KTDF earned balance of \$600K at the conclusion of their 2025 spring race meet and anticipated earnings totaling \$4.7M by the end of September from historical horse racing at their Derby City Gaming and Derby City Gaming Downtown properties. To encourage participation during the race meet, Churchill Downs will pay out KTDF purses through last place to all eligible KTDF registered horses.

2025 Churchill Downs' Fall KTDF Allotment Request:

The KTDF purse structure for Churchill Downs' 2025 fall race meet will consist of 26 racing days beginning Sunday, October 26th and ending Sunday, November 30th. Churchill Downs plans to card KTDF purses in the range of \$6.5M to \$7.5M. These projections are based on a KTDF earned balance of \$2.0M at the conclusion of their 2025 September race meet and anticipated earnings totaling \$4.9M by the end of December from historical horse racing at their Derby City Gaming and Derby City Gaming Downtown properties. To encourage participation during the race meet, Churchill Downs will pay out KTDF purses through last place to all eligible KTDF registered horses.

Kentucky Downs' KTDF Transfer to Keeneland:

In accordance with 810 KAR 7:030, Section 3(3)(c), Kentucky Downs has requested to transfer \$1.25M in KTDF funds to Keeneland to be used during their 2025 fall race meet.

2025 Keeneland's Fall KTDF Allotment Request:

The KTDF purse structure for Keeneland's 2025 fall race meet will consist of 17 racing days beginning Friday, October 3rd and ending Saturday, October 25th. Keeneland plans to card KTDF purses in the range of \$6.6M to \$6.8M. These projections are based on a KTDF earned balance of \$3.1M at the conclusion of their 2025 spring race meet. They are also projecting additional earnings in the range of \$1.9M to \$2.2M at Keeneland-Red Mile (KRM) per their contract. Additionally, they expect earnings in the range of \$1.7M to \$2M from Oak Grove per their contract. To encourage participation during the meet, Keeneland will pay out KTDF purses through last place to all KTDF eligible horses.

To help Keeneland fund their KTDF purses while increasing the strength of the overall Kentucky Racing Circuit, they are also seeking final approval of a \$1.25 million KTDF transfer from Kentucky Downs.

In accordance with KRS.230.400, Keeneland is requesting the use of \$240,000 in KTDF to promote, enhance, improve and encourage the further and continued development of the Kentucky Thoroughbred breeding and racing industry in Kentucky.

Churchill Downs has reviewed its purses and would like to card KTDF purses in the range of \$3.5 million to \$4.0 million for our upcoming September Meet. We have based the range on the following information:

- At the end of June 2025, Churchill Downs is projecting an ending KTDF earned balance of \$0.6
 million.
- Our 2024 September Meet will consist of 14 racing days beginning Thursday, September 11th
 and ending Sunday, September 28th. We are projecting additional earnings of \$4.7 million by
 the end of September. The primary driver is the KTDF earned from pari-mutuel wagering at
 Derby City Gaming LLC ("Derby City") and Derby City Gaming Downtown ("Derby City
 Downtown") from the beginning of July 2025 through the end of the September Meet.
- 3. We anticipate that KTDF will be approximately 31% of total purses. Of the requested KTDF allotment, we anticipate the following payouts:
 - a. ALW, AOC, SMSW, MDN: approximately 45% of the KTDF allotment
 - b. BCL, CLM, MCL, STR, WMC: approximately 39% of the KTDF allotment; and
 - c. Stakes: approximately 16% of the KTDF allotment
- For September 2025, we are assuming a KTDF payout percentage of 86.5% with anticipated KTDF disbursements of \$3.3 million, which is consistent with the September 2024 meet.
- To encourage participation during the September Meet, we are again planning to pay KTDF purses from first to last to all eligible horses.

THE KENTUCKY THOROUGHBRED DEVELOPMENT FUND (KTDF)

Given several years of robust business during the period beginning 2019, the state-of-the-art historical racing machines at nearby Derby City Gaming and Derby City Gaming Downtown have generated KTDF for horsemen with Kentucky-sired Kentucky-breds to run for in designated stakes, handicap, allowance, non-claiming maiden races, and allowance optional claiming races with a claiming price of not less than twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) contested at Churchill Downs Racetrack. Continuing in September 2025, Churchill Downs Racetrack will offer KTDF money on all claiming races.

Eligible races can be readily recognized in the stakes and condition books by the Kentucky Thoroughbred Development Fund seal, which will appear next to each race in the stakes and condition books.

In accordance with KRS 230.400(5) (d), it is mandatory for a horse to be registered prior to time of entry to be eligible to participate in the distribution of Kentucky Thoroughbred Development Fund monies. Registration is only complete once the application is approved and payment has been received.

All horses of racing age that are both Kentucky-bred and sired by a Kentucky stallion which stood in Kentucky the entire breeding season the year the horse was conceived are eligible to be registered. Owners of horses of racing age are responsible for registering their horses. Stallion owners are responsible for registering their stallions.

Registration applications may be obtained from the official registrar, the Kentucky Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders, by contacting:

Churchill Downs has reviewed our purses and would like to card KTDF purses in the range of \$6.5 million to \$7.5 million for our upcoming Fall Meet. We have based the range on the following information:

- At the end of September 2025, Churchill Downs is projecting an ending KTDF balance of \$2.0
 million.
- Our 2025 Fall Meet will consist of 26 racing days beginning Sunday, October 26th and ending Sunday, November 30th. We are projecting additional earnings of \$4.9 million by the end of December. The primary driver is the KTDF earned from pari-mutuel wagering from Derby City Gaming LLC ("Derby City") from the beginning of October 2024 through the end of December.
- 3. We anticipate that KTDF will be approximately 30% of total purses. Of the requested KTDF allotment, we anticipate the following payouts:
 - a. ALW, AOC, SMSW, MDN: approximately 70% of the KTDF allotment
 - b. BCL, CLM, MCL, STR, WMC: approximately 15% of the KTDF allotment; and
 - c. Stakes: approximately 15% of the KTDF allotment
- For Fall 2025, we are assuming a KTDF payout percentage of 86.5% with anticipated KTDF disbursements of \$6.2 million which is consistent with the Fall 2024 Meet.
- To encourage participation during the Fall Meet, we are again planning to pay KTDF purses from first to last to all eligible horses.

THE KENTUCKY THOROUGHBRED DEVELOPMENT FUND (KTDF)

Given several years of robust business during the period beginning 2019, the state-of-the-art historical racing machines at nearby Derby City Gaming and Derby City Gaming Downtown have generated KTDF for horsemen with Kentucky-sired Kentucky-breds to run for in designated stakes, handicap, allowance, non-claiming maiden races, and allowance optional claiming races with a claiming price of not less than twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) contested at Churchill Downs Racetrack. Continuing in October 2025, Churchill Downs Racetrack will offer KTDF money on all claiming races.

Eligible races can be readily recognized in the stakes and condition books by the Kentucky Thoroughbred Development Fund seal, which will appear next to each race in the stakes and condition books.

In accordance with KRS 230.400(5) (d), it is mandatory for a horse to be registered prior to time of entry to be eligible to participate in the distribution of Kentucky Thoroughbred Development Fund monies. Registration is only complete once the application is approved and payment has been received.

All horses of racing age that are both Kentucky-bred and sired by a Kentucky stallion which stood in Kentucky the entire breeding season the year the horse was conceived are eligible to be registered. Owners of horses of racing age are responsible for registering their horses. Stallion owners are responsible for registering their stallions.

Keeneland has reviewed our KTDF data and would like to offer approximately \$6,600,000-\$6,800,000 in KTDF money for our upcoming Fall meet.

- 1. We currently have a surplus of \$3,184,333 following the Spring 2025 race meeting;
- We will conduct 17 days of live racing from October 3rd to 25th on Wednesdays through Sundays;
- We anticipate KTDF funds to constitute 27.6% of total purses. Breakdown by race type below.
 - MSW, ALW, AOC: \$3,133,000 (46.8% of the KTDF allotment)
 - CL, MCL, MA, SA: \$1,011,400 (15.1% of the KTDF allotment)
 - Stakes: \$2,550,000 (38.1% of the KTDF allotment)
- We anticipate a payout percentage of 87.0% of the KTDF carded (\$5,700,000-\$5,900,000 paid);
- We intend to utilize \$240,000 of KTDF for advertising. Detailed materials regarding the advertising allotment are included;
- We are projecting Keeneland-Red Mile KTDF earnings from Historical Horse Racing of approximately \$1,900,000-\$2,200,000;
- We anticipate Oak Grove KTDF earning from Historical Horse Racing of approximately \$1,700,000-\$2,000,000 to be transferred at the conclusion of our race meeting per our contract;
- We anticipate a KTDF transfer of \$1,250,000 from Kentucky Downs per agreement;

Keeneland remains committed to improving the on-track experience for patrons and is continuously seeking to improve ticketing, food/beverage, customer service, and promotions/events in order to grow our fanbase, and ultimately increase on-track handle. Keeneland has begun its major capital improvement project including a permanent Paddock Building, which will increase capacity and provide new dining options. The project will also update the saddling enclosure to promote horse/horsemen safety. We continue to utilize our BETologists to increase awareness and engagement with on-track fans to further drive handle. With the opening of sports wagering, we are excited to improve facilities at

Keeneland-Red Mile and plan to encourage patrons to utilize HHR, simulcast, and sports wagering areas.

Keeneland will continue to pay out KTDF funds through last place. A table containing the payout percentage by field size is attached. In the event there is a dead heat for finish positions 1 thru 5, the KTDF percentage payout for each position will be aggregated and paid equally to each horse included in the dead heat. If a non-KTDF eligible horse is involved in a dead heat, those funds will revert to the fund.

We will evaluate the earnings and payout percentages several days into our race meet and may need to make adjustments if our actual earnings and payout percentages are significantly different from our assumptions.

REQUEST FOR APPROVAL OF SPORTS WAGERING CATALOG RECOMMENDATIONS

In accordance with 809 KAR 10:002, a licensee is prohibited from offering sports wagering on any event that has not been approved by Kentucky Horse Racing & Gaming (KHRG). This memorandum presents proposed updates to KHRG's Sports Wagering Catalog, ensuring compliance with KHRG regulations. The proposed changes include staff recommendations regarding requests for new sporting events or clarifications from licensed service providers.

KHRG staff has thoroughly reviewed these requests against the criteria for allowable wagers as established in 809 KAR 10:002, Section 2. This review focused on the overall integrity of the sporting events associated with each request and their suitability for offering in Kentucky. KHRG staff evaluated each event to ensure it meets the regulatory standards for transparency, integrity, and relevance to the field of play.

New Requests and Clarification

The requests on the following pages, submitted by service providers, have been reviewed and evaluated by KHRG staff. Below is additional information regarding each request, along with corresponding recommendations:

KEENELAND DATE PREFERENCE SYSTEM

The Date System of preference will be used at Keeneland Association as described below:

Paper foal certificates and digital foal certificates (collectively, "Foal Certificates") are no longer required to be retained on file in the racing office to enter or start at Keeneland; however, Foal Certificates must be on file to obtain a preference date and to get a horse digitally tattooed.

TO RECEIVE A ZERO (0) DATE, Foal Certificates must be on file with the Horse Identifier by Sunday, September 28.

Preference by Keeneland condition preference then by:

- 1. In over-filled races, preference will be given to horses in order of their assigned preference dates, earliest date first. Horses having identical dates will be chosen by lot; however, where entry and running dates are the same, the horse with the entry date will have preference.
- All horses intended for racing at Keeneland will be assigned a preference date. Dates assigned will be of two types:

E-Date

This date will correspond to:

- a. 'The day on which a horse's Foal Certificate and name tag are submitted to the Horse Identifier (the earliest date being the day when entries are first taken for the meeting). An unnamed horse will not receive and E-Date.
- b. The day on which a horse is first entered if his papers are not on file with the Horse Identifier.
- c. To qualify for the latter E-Date, a horse must have been excluded from a race which appears on the overnight or he must have been entered in a condition book race which failed to fill through insufficient entries.

R-Date

This date will correspond to:

- a. The day of a horse's most recent race at Keeneland.
- b. An R-Date will also be assigned to a horse which scratches (provided the Foal Certificates are on file with the identifier).
- 3. A horse retains his R-Date until he receives a newer R-Date. No horse with an established R-Date may receive an E-Date. A horse whose Foal Certificates are removed from the Horse Identifier's office will lose his date and must subsequently re-establish a date in order to receive preference. A horse with an E-Date cannot receive a newer E-Date. Horses starting at another racetrack will forfeit any date they may have at Keeneland. Additionally, horses racing at Keeneland without Foal Certificates on site will not retain their R-Date.
- 4. Preference dates will consist of two categories: Dirt (D) and Turf (1). Preference dates are good for any type of race or distance.
- A horse that runs in a race, which has been taken off the Turf will retain its Turf date and establish a Dirt R-Date. A scratched horse will receive an R-Date from the date scratched for both Turf and Dirt
- 6. Horses on the Also-Eligible list shall be permitted to draw into races in order listed.
- 7. No E-Date will be assigned to the second choice of an unsplit same-owner entry.
- 8. A horse which has been placed on a list (veterinarian, Steward, starter or paddock judge) will lose their date and be assigned an R-Date corresponding to the day removed from list, provided the Foal Certificates are on file with the Horse Identifier.

- 9. A horse which is a scheduled starter in a canceled race will not receive an R-Date for that race but will retain its previous date.
- 10. Stakes and handicap races are not subject to date preference.
- 11. Preference dates are transferred through change of ownership and changes in trainer after the proper transfer procedure have been completed through the Steward's office and delivered to the Racing Secretary's Office.
- 12. Date preference rules will not supersede KHRGC rules regarding preference, eligibility or scratches.
- 13. Winners will be preferred in all non-maiden races.

Condition Preference

- Horses are preferred by their available conditions in all allowance races beginning with Graded stake winners (Grade 1-II-III), open stakes winners through their allowance conditions (when allowance conditions are equal, an open stakes winners shall be preferred) providing the horse has finished 1st, 2nd, 3rd or 4th for \$50,000 or more since starting for less than \$50,000. In allowance/optional claiming races a horse's preference cannot exceed the condition of the race. Starter races for less than \$40,000 will not be preferred.
- No entry will be received except upon the condition that all disputes, claims and objections arising
 out of the racing or with respect to the interpretation of the conditions of any race shall be decided
 by the officers of the association, or those whom they may appoint and their decision upon all points
 shall be final.
- No entry shall be accepted from any stable not provided with a trainer's license.
- Keeneland will no longer accept Main Track Only (MTO) entries.

The Date System of preference will be used at Churchill Downs as described below:

Foal Certificates and digital foal certificates no longer are required to be on file in the racing office to enter or start at Churchill Downs; however, foal certificates and digital foal certificates must be on file to obtain a preference date and to get a horse tattooed.

Each day's overnight will list the dates of horses in and on the also-eligible list to enable trainers to see what dates are getting horses in over-filled races.

- 1. In over-filled races, preference will be given to horses in order of their assigned preference dates, earliest date first. Horses having identical dates will be chosen by lot, however, where entry and running dates are the same, the horse with the entry date will have preference.
- **2.** All horses intended for racing at Churchill Downs will be assigned a preference date. Dates assigned will be of two types:
- 3. **FOR A ZERO DATE** foal papers and digital foal papers must be turned into the identifier by Thursday, September 4, 2025.

E-Date

This date will correspond to:

- a) The day on which a horse's foal papers or digital foal papers are submitted to the identifier (the earliest date being the day when entries are first taken for the meeting). An unnamed horse will not receive an E-date.
- b) The day on which a horse is first entered if his papers or digital foal papers are not on file with the identifier.

To qualify for the latter E-date, a horse must have been excluded from a race which appears on the overnight or he must have been entered in a condition book race which failed to fill through insufficient entries.

R-Date

This date will correspond to the day of a horse's most recent race at Churchill Downs. An R-Date will also be assigned to a horse which scratches.

- 4. A horse retains his R-Date until he receives a newer R-Date. No horse with an established R-Date may receive an E-Date. - 9. A horse which is a scheduled starter in a cancelled race will not receive an R-Date for that race but will retain its previous date.
- 10. The draw of stakes and handicap race is not subject to date preference.
- 11. Preference dates are transferred through change of ownership and changes in trainer after the proper transfer procedure have been completed through the Steward's office and delivered to the Racing Secretary's office.
- 12. Date preference rules will not supersede KHRC rules regarding preference, eligibility or scratches.
- 13. Winners will be preferred in all non-maiden races.

CONDITION PREFERENCE

Horses are preferred by their available conditions in all allowance races beginning with Graded Stakes winners (Grade I-II-III), down through their allowance conditions (when allowance conditions are equal, an open stakes winner shall be preferred) providing the horse has finished 1st, 2nd, 3rd or 4th for \$50,000 or more since starting for less than \$50,000. In allowance/optional claiming races a horse's preference cannot exceed the condition of the race. Starter races for less than \$40,000 will not be preferred.

The General Fund line includes amounts that are deposited to various accounts. These caps are calculated from deposits resulting from the excise tax for conducting pari-mutual wagering on historical horse racing. Since these amounts are calculated as a whole and not per licensee, a one-time transfer will be made once the caps are met within the fiscal year. At the end of the fiscal year, approximately \$2M must be deducted from this line in order to determine the actual amount retained by the General Fund. These caps are calculated from deposits resulting from the excise tax for conducting pari-mutuel wagering on historical horse racing. Since these amounts are calculated as a whole and not per licensee, a one-time transfer will be made once the caps are met within the fiscal year. At the end of the fiscal year, approximately \$2M must be deducted from this line in order to determine the actual amount retained by the General Fund.
