

Bill Redwine

Bill Redwine is an outspoken advocate for technology in education and a longtime leader at Morehead State University, where he served as Director of Auxiliary Services from 1998–2006 and Assistant Vice President until his 2019 retirement. He oversaw the University Bookstore, Dining and Postal Services, EagleCard Office, Environmental Health & Safety, Risk Management, and more driving major technology upgrades across campus.

A native of Sandy Hook, Kentucky, Bill spent 15 years in Alumni Relations and Development, ultimately as Director, where he launched a computerized alumni database and helped the University surpass \$2 million in private gifts for the first time. He holds a bachelor's degree in government and public affairs from MSU, with graduate studies in higher education, business, and sociology.

Bill's professional leadership includes serving as President of NACAS-South, NACAS national President (2017), and a member of the NACAS Foundation Board. NACAS honored him in 2018 with its highest recognition, the Robert F. Newton Award.

Active in the Morehead community, Bill served 26 years on the Rowan County Board of Education, five as Chair, and currently leads the Morehead Optimist Club. He also chairs or serves on multiple civic and healthcare boards, including Board Chair for UK/St. Claire Healthcare. In 2022, the Morehead Chamber of Commerce presented him its top honor, the Ora Cline Award.
