On August 10, 2023, the KTDF Advisory Committee considered the following requests regarding Keeneland Assoc. Inc.'s 2023 Fall Race Meet:

The KTDF purse structure will consist of 17 race days beginning Friday, October 6th through Saturday, October 28th. Keeneland is proposing KTDF purses in the range of \$4.9 – \$5.1 million. These projections are based on a KTDF earned balance of \$1.5 million at the end of their Spring Meet. They are projecting additional earnings of \$1.55 million to \$1.7 million by the end of their meet with HHR wagering at Lexington Trots Breeders Association, LLC ("Red Mile") being the primary driver. To encourage participation during the meet, Keeneland will pay out KTDF purses through last place to all KTDF-eligible horses.

To help Keeneland fund their KTDF purses while increasing the strength of the overall Kentucky racing circuit, the following KTDF transfers are requested:

- WKY Development, LLC d/b/a Oak Grove requests to transfer \$1.5 \$1.65 million of KTDF earnings to Keeneland at the conclusion of Keeneland's Race Meet.
- Kentucky Downs, LLC requests to transfer \$1 million to Keeneland at the conclusion of Keeneland's race meet.

In accordance with KRS.230.400, Keeneland is also requesting the use of \$79,800 in KTDF to promote, enhance, improve, and encourage the further and continued development of the Thoroughbred breeding industry in Kentucky.

The KTDF Advisory Committee along with the Kentucky HBPA and the KTA-KTOB recommend approval of these requests.

Keeneland has reviewed our KTDF data and would like to offer approximately \$4,900,000-\$5,100,000 in KTDF money for our upcoming Fall meet.

- 1. We currently have a surplus of \$1,535,636 following the Spring 2023 race meeting;
- We will conduct 17 days of live racing from October 6th through 28th on Wednesdays through Sundays;
- 3. We anticipate KTDF funds to constitute 23.6% of total purses. Breakdown by race type below:
 - a. MSW, ALW, AOC: \$2,732,000 (54.6% of the KTDF allotment)
 - b. CL, MCL, MA, SA: \$974,200 (19.5% of the KTDF allotment)
 - c. Stakes: \$1,300,000 (26.0% of the KTDF allotment)
- 4. We anticipate a payout percentage of 87.0% of the KTDF carded (\$4,263,000-\$4,437,000 paid);
- 5. We intend to utilize \$79,800 of KTDF for advertising. Detailed materials regarding the advertising allotment are included;
- 6. We are projecting Keeneland-Red Mile KTDF carnings from Historical Horse Racing of approximately \$1,550,000-\$1,700,000;
- 7. We anticipate Oak Grove KTDF earning from Historical Horse Racing of approximately \$1,500,000-\$1,650,000 to be transferred at the conclusion of our race meeting per our contract;
- 8. We anticipate a KTDF transfer of \$1,000,000 from Kentucky Downs per agreement;

Keeneland remains committed to improving the on-track experience for patrons and is continuously seeking to improve ticketing, food/beverage, customer service, and promotions/events in order to grow our fanbase, and ultimately increase on-track handle. We continue to utilize our BETologists to increase awareness and engagement with on-track fans to further drive handle. With the opening of sports wagering approaching, we are excited to improve facilities at Keeneland-Red Mile and plan to include displays and signage to encourage patrons to utilize HHR, simulcast, and sports wagering areas this fall. Keeneland will continue to pay out KTDF funds through last place. A table containing the payout percentage by field size is attached. In the event there is a dead heat for finish positions 1 thru 5, the KTDF percentage payout for each position will be aggregated and paid equally to each horse included in the dead heat. If a non-KTDF eligible horse is involved in a dead heat, those funds will revert to the fund.

We will evaluate the earnings and payout percentages several days into our race meet and may need to make adjustments if our actual earnings and payout percentages are significantly different from our assumptions.

KEENELAND DATE PREFERENCE SYSTEM

The Date System of preference will be used at Keeneland Association as described below:

Foal Certificates and Digital Foal Certificates are no longer required to be on file in the racing office to enter or start at Keeneland Association; however, foal certificates and digital foal certificates must be on file to obtain a preference date and to get a horse tattooed.

TO RECEIVE A ZERO (O) DATE, foal certificates and digital foal certificates must be on file with the Horse Identifier by Sunday, October 1, 2023.

Preference by condition eligibility then by:

- 1. In over-filled races, preference will be given to horses in order of their assigned preference dates, earliest date first. Horses having identical dates will be chosen by lot, however, where entry and running dates are the same, the horse with the entry date will have preference.
- 2. All horses intended for racing at Keeneland Association will be assigned a preference date. Dates assigned will be of two types:

E-Date

This date will correspond to:

- a. The day on which a horse's foal papers/digital foal papers and name tag are submitted to the identifier (the earliest date being the day when entries are first taken for the meeting).
- b. The day on which a horse is first entered if his papers are not on file with the identifier.
- c. To qualify for the latter E-Date, a horse must have been excluded from a race which appears on the overnight or he must have been entered in a condition book race which failed to fill through insufficient entries.

R-Date

This date will correspond to:

- a. The day of a horse's most recent race at Keeneland Association.
- b. An R-Date will also be assigned to a horse which scratches (provided the foal papers are on file with the identifier).
- 3. A horse retains his R-Date until he receives a newer R-Date. No horse with an established R-Date may receive an E-Date. A horse whose papers or digital papers are removed from the identifier's office will lose his date and must subsequently re-establish a date in order to receive preference. A horse with an E-Date cannot receive a newer E-Date. Horses starting at another racetrack will forfeit any date they may have at Keeneland Association.
- 4. Preference dates will consist of two categories: Dirt (D) and Turf (T). Preference dates are good for any type of race or distance.
- 5. A horse that runs in a race, which has been taken off the Turf will retain its Turf date and establish a Dirt R-Date. A scratched horse will receive an R-Date from the date scratched for both Turf and Dirt.
- 6. When a race is taken off the Turf, Main Track Only (MTO) horses will receive an R-Date if they run or scratch. If the race remains on the Turf, MTO horses will retain their previous date.
- 7. Horses on the Also-Eligible list shall be permitted to draw into races in order listed. A horse entered as MTO shall be listed as an Also-Eligible. If the race remains on the Turf, a horse listed as MTO shall not be permitted to draw into the race.
- 8. No E-Date will be assigned to the second choice of an unsplit same-owner entry.
- A horse which has been placed on a list (veterinarian, steward, starter or paddock judge) will lose their date and be assigned an R-Date corresponding to the day removed from list.
- 10. A horse which is a scheduled starter in a canceled race will not receive an R-Date for that race but will retain its previous date.
- 11. Stakes and handicap races are not subject to date preference.
- 12. Preference dates are transferred through change of ownership and changes in trainer after the proper transfer procedure have been completed through the Steward's office and delivered to the Racing Secretary's Office.
- 13. Date preference rules will not supersede KHRC rules regarding preference, eligibility or scratches.
- 14. Winners will be preferred in all non-maiden races.

Condition Preference

- Horses are preferred by their available conditions in all allowance races beginning with Graded stake winners (Grade I-II-III), open stakes winners through their allowance conditions providing the horse has finished 1st, 2nd, 3rd or 4th for \$50,000 or more since starting for less than \$50,000. In allowance/optional claiming races a horse's preference cannot exceed the condition of the race. Starter races for less than \$40,000 will not be preferred.
- No entry will be received except upon the condition that all disputes, claims and objections arising out of the racing or with respect to the interpretation of the conditions of any race shall be decided by the officers of the association, or those whom they may appoint and their decision upon all points shall be final.
- No entry shall be accepted from any stable not provided with a trainer's license.

Main Track Only Entries

- Entries will be accepted in turf races (excluding stakes) for Main Track Only (MTO) horses.
- Trainers must declare the horse as MTO at the time of entry.
- A horse entered as MTO shall be listed as Also-Eligible.
- In an over-filled turf race, an M1O shall not be carded to the exclusion of a turf entry. Also-Eligibles (including M1O) shall be assigned a post position by preference. If preference is equal, post positions shall be drawn by lot, unless otherwise stipulated in the published conditions of the race.
- If the race remains on the turf, a horse listed as MTO shall not be permitted to draw into the race. When a race is removed from the turf, MTO horses will lose any date they have if they run or scratch. If the race remains on the turf, MTO horses will retain their previous date.

In accordance with KRS 230.811, any individual or entity must first obtain a track license from the Kentucky Horse Racing Commission (KHRC) before applying for a sports wagering license, hereafter referred to as the "Operator License." Guided by the provisions of 810 KAR 3:010E, the KHRC possesses the discretion to issue a temporary sports wagering Operator License while evaluating an applicant's qualifications for an annual Operator License. The following factors may be considered by the KHRC in this assessment:

- Adequacy of the information provided by the applicant in demonstrating suitability;
- The applicant's historical involvement in offering pari-mutuel wagering within the Commonwealth of Kentucky; and,
- Any existing records of the applicant or its parent company in conducting sports wagering or other gaming activities in other jurisdictions.

If a track opts not to independently conduct sports wagering, a formal agreement must be submitted between the track and the selected sports wagering service provider before accepting sports wagers.

The following entities have applied for an Operator License:

- 1. Churchill Downs Racetrack, LLC
- 2. ECL Corbin, LLC
- 3. Ellis Entertainment, LLC
- 4. Lexington Trots Breeders Association, LLC
- 5. Revolutionary Racing Kentucky, LLC
- 6. Turfway Park, LLC

7. WKY Development, LLC

Each of the above entities holds a track license for 2023. As dictated by 810 KAR 3:010E, they have submitted "pages 23 through 31 of Form KHRC 3-010-1" as part of their application for an Operator License for 2023. Additionally, executed agreements between each track and at least one service provider to facilitate sports wagering have been provided.

The KHRC has reviewed all applications. Certain documents, such as formalized internal controls and testing certifications, may only become available closer to the launch date or even afterward, depending on individual procedures. Internal controls and testing certifications may be approved by the KHRC at a later date when they are submitted for review.

The KHRC staff has determined that the aforementioned entities meet the qualifications for a temporary Operator License and strongly recommends granting these licenses under the following conditions:

- 1. Each Operator must comply with KHRC's suitability requirements;
- 2. Operators must respond promptly to any information and documentation requests initiated by the KHRC or its designated representatives; and,
- 3. Lexington Trots Breeders Association, LLC must present its executed agreement with a service provider no later than September 7, 2023.
- 4. Operators must finalize all pending documentation necessary for their applications on or before September 5, 2023. This documentation includes, but is not limited to: floor layouts, wagering menus, internal controls, and other documents.

Pursuant to KRS 230.814, a person seeking a sports wagering service provider license ("Service Provider License") must submit a complete application with the required documentation. The Kentucky Horse Racing Commission (KHRC) has set guidelines under 809 KAR 1:002E for the application process and associated forms.

The KHRC will evaluate an applicant's potential contribution to sports wagering in the Commonwealth. The eligibility criteria, detailed in 809 KAR 1:002E, encompass requirements like age, qualifications of key personnel, compliance with tax laws, and prior experience in the sector.

After its review, the KHRC can offer either a temporary or annual license. Temporary licenses can later be made annual. Both types of licenses, unless revoked or suspended, are valid for one year.

Applicants need to provide a range of documentation, from legal and business information to financial statements and descriptions of services. This comprehensive information aids the KHRC in its assessment.

The KHRC has reviewed submitted documents such as internal controls, contractual agreements with sports wagering operators, and documents regarding the corporate form of each entity. During this review, the KHRC has also conducted interviews with representatives of each entity to inquire about each entity's sports wagering operations in other jurisdictions.

Based on the documents reviewed by the KHRC, the applicants comply with the suitability requirements for temporary licensure. The KHRC staff recommends that, should temporary licenses be approved for these applicants, it should be granted under the stipulation that each applicant adheres to the licensure requirements through the license's duration.

809 KAR 1:002E requires that a service provider must ensure that all sports wagering operations are conducted in accordance with 809 KAR 10:001 through 809 KAR 10:008. This includes soliciting approval from the KHRC through requests for specific items, such as amendments to internal controls, transfers of ownership, or other administrative items integral to the system of sports wagering. Furthermore, as a condition of licensure, the licensee must promptly respond to any information requests or orders issued by the KHRC or its appointed representative, ensuring transparent monitoring and investigation through the license term.

The KHRC staff recommends approval of temporary licenses for sports wagering service providers for the aforementioned entities for 2023.
