INVITATION FOR BIDS FOR MEDICAL AND LASIX SUPPLIES

Kentucky Horse Racing and Gaming Medical and Lasix Supplies IFB IFB-2026-001

This document constitutes an Invitation for Bids for a Personal Service Contract from qualified individuals and organizations to furnish those supplies and/or services as described herein for Kentucky Horse Racing and Gaming (KHRG), an independent, de jure municipal corporation and political subdivision of the Commonwealth of Kentucky. KHRG regulates all forms of live horse racing, pari-mutuel wagering, sports wagering, breed integrity and development, charitable gaming, fixed-odds wagering and fantasy sports.

Offerors are advised that any personal service contract resulting from this IFB must comply with all applicable provisions of KRS 230.225 and KRS 45A prior to becoming effective.

A contract, based on this IFB, may or may not be awarded. Any contract award from this IFB is invalid until properly approved by the President and CEO, KHRG Finance Committee, and/or KHRG Board of Directors, executed by the President and CEO, and filed with the Legislative Research Commission, Government Contract Review Committee.

1.00 Purpose and Background

The purpose of this solicitation is to request vendor responses to provide these items under contract to KHRG as needed.

2.00 Bid Specifications

KHRG is seeking medical and Lasix supplies outlined in the attached Bid Price Sheet (Attachment A). Requirements that include the words “shall”, “will”, “must” indicate a mandatory requirement.

3.00 General

This solicitation specifies requested items. It is not the intention of this solicitation to eliminate vendors or manufacturers of similar or equal equipment of the types specified. It should be noted, however, that these requested items are written around specific needs of KHRG. KHRG reserves the right to consider bids non-responsive if they do not comply with the specifications contained herein.

Utilization of this contract shall be determined on an “as needed” basis, thus the vendor is not guaranteed to receive any compensation pursuant to this contract and any work performed thereunder shall be performed following a request from KHRG.

Warrants of Vendor – The Vendor warrants that it has neither retained nor employed any company or person, other than a bona fide employee working solely for the Vendor, to solicit or secure the contractual agreement and that it has neither paid nor agreed to pay any company or person, other than a bona fide employee working solely for the Vendor, any fee, commission, percent, brokerage fee, gifts, or any other consideration contingent upon or resulting from the award or making of the contractual agreement. For breach or violation of this warranty, KHRG shall have the right to annul any contractual agreement without liability or, at its discretion, to deduct from the contract price on consideration, or otherwise recover, the full amount of such fee, commission, percentage, brokerage fee, gift or contingent fee.

The Vendor certifies that it shall not at any time release or divulge any information concerning the services covered by the contractual agreement to any person or any public or private organization without prior approval of KHRG.

4.00 Initial Contract Period

The contract established from this solicitation shall be for the initial period of one (1) year from the date of award.

5.00 Renewal Clause – Optional Renewal Period

This contract may be extended at the completion of the initial contract period for four (4) additional one-year periods. This extension must have written approval by all parties. If the contract resulting from this solicitation provides for an optional renewal period, KHRG reserves the right to renegotiate any terms and/or conditions as may be necessary to meet requirements for the extended period. The vendor will be advised of any proposed revisions prior to the renewal periods. In the event proposed revisions cannot be agreed upon, either party shall have the right to withdraw without prejudice from either exercising the option or continuing the contract in an extended period.

6.00 Exceptions to Specifications

Vendors are cautioned that changes made to the solicitation other than in the designated fields for response shall render the response invalid and result in a non-responsive bid. Otherwise, it will be considered that items/services offered are in strict compliance with these specifications, and the successful bidder shall be held responsible for delivering materials/services that meet these specifications. Any exceptions shall be marked as such within the body of the bid and explained on a separate page. KHRG is not bound to accept any exceptions.

7.00 Alternate Brands/Specifications – PREFERRED BRANDS ARE LISTED

Unless otherwise specified, brands and specifications referenced in this solicitation are meant to establish a minimum standard of quality only. Bidders may bid brands/specifications they consider to be equal by specifying the brand(s)/specifications and inserting the brand name(s), model number(s), etc. on which they are bidding. Bids offering “equal” products/specifications will be considered for award if such products are clearly identified in the bid and are determined by KHRG to meet or exceed fully the minimum essential specifications and salient characteristics referenced in the Solicitation. Bids that contain products/specifications that fail to meet the minimum essential requirements shall be deemed non-responsive.

Bidders who propose alternate brands/specifications should enclose descriptive literature with their bids so that the equality can be verified. Failure to enclose sufficient literature may result in a non-responsive bid. If the brands are not changed, the contract will be written accordingly, and the successful bidder shall be required to deliver the brands/specifications stated in the solicitation.

8.00 Recycle Requirements

Prospective bidders are required to comply with Recycle Requirements for the purchase of goods, supplies, equipment, materials and printing with a minimum recycled content to the extent practicable per 200 KAR 5:330.

9.00 Point of Contact

The KHRG Point of Contact named below shall be the sole point of contact throughout the procurement process. All communications, oral and written (regular mail, express mail or electronic mail), concerning this procurement shall be addressed to:

From the issue date of this IFB until a vendor(s) is selected and the selection is announced, Offerors shall not communicate with any other KHRG staff concerning this IFB.

10.00 Questions Regarding this IFB

Questions must be submitted in writing to the KHRG Point of Contact. KHRG will respond to salient questions in writing by issuing an Addendum to the Solicitation. The Addendum shall be posted to the KHRG web page and the Finance and Administration Cabinet's eProcurement website.

11.00 Solicitation Submission Requirements

A. Disposition of Proposals

All proposals become the property of KHRG. The successful proposal shall be incorporated into the resulting contract by reference.

B. Rules for Withdrawal of Proposals

Prior to the date specified for receipt of offers, a submitted proposal may be withdrawn by submitting a signed written request for its withdrawal to the KHRG Point of Contact.

C. Submission of IFB Response

Each qualified vendor shall submit only one (1) proposal. Alternate proposals shall not be allowed. Failure to submit as specified shall result in a non-responsive proposal.

The vendor should complete the **"Vendor" box** on the face of the solicitation. An authorized representative of the vendor **shall sign** where indicated on the face of the solicitation. **If the solicitation is not signed the proposal shall be deemed non-responsive.**

Any Addenda or instructions issued by the KHRG Point of Contact prior to the proposal deadline shall become part of this IFB. Such addenda shall be acknowledged in the Proposal. No instructions or changes shall be binding unless documented by a properly issued addendum. It is the vendor's responsibility to check the web site for any modifications to this solicitation.

Bidders are cautioned to allow adequate delivery time to ensure timely delivery of bid proposals. Late bid proposals are ineligible for consideration.

KHRG is exempt from paying sales or use taxes in Kentucky, except on those items and/or purchase transactions that are specifically exempted by law.

Costs for developing the proposals are solely the responsibility of the Offeror(s). A proposal shall not be considered for award if the price in the proposal was not arrived at independently without collusion, consultation, communication, or agreement as to any matter relating to such prices with any other offeror or with any competitor. In addition, the offeror is prohibited from making multiple proposals in a different form.

D. Format and Submission of IFB Response

Proposals shall be submitted to the KHRG Point of Contact listed in the solicitation and included on the cover page of the IFB. Proposals shall be submitted by the IFB Closing Date and Time (both are identified on the cover page of this IFB). All proposals shall remain valid for a minimum of six (6) months after the proposal due date.

ALL PROPOSALS MUST BE RECEIVED NO LATER THAN 12 NOON EST ON SEPTEMBER 9, 2026.

ANY PROPOSAL RECEIVED AFTER THE CLOSING DATE AND TIME SHALL BE REJECTED.

Completed and Signed Solicitation and Addenda – An authorized representative **MUST** complete and sign the Solicitation form and include the following when submitting the Proposal:

- a. “Vendor” box and “Payment” box should be completed.
- b. Vendor shall indicate ownership type.
- c. Vendor shall provide “FEIN” if applicable.
- d. Vendor shall provide date the form is completed and signed.
- e. Signed face of the most recent Addenda, if applicable.

Proposals may be submitted either by hard/paper copy or electronically as outlined below.

Electronic Proposals Submissions

All bidders are cautioned to begin their electronic submission in sufficient time to complete before the closing date and time. Delays due to technical difficulties or document upload impediments shall not be justification for acceptance of a late bid or proposal. Proposals shall be submitted as one document attachment. Do not submit multiple document attachments. All files shall be labeled accordingly. Attachments may not exceed 65,000KB. Proposals must be submitted electronically via email to the KHRG Point of Contact with the subject line as follows: **“IFB-2026-001 Price – Vendor Name”** and include one (1) document marked **Price – Vendor Name** (in Microsoft Word, Microsoft Excel or PDF format ONLY) attached. Do not include embedded documents, hyperlinks or hyperlinks to videos.

12.00 Acknowledgment of Addenda

It is the vendor's responsibility to check the web site for any modifications to this solicitation. Vendors are encouraged to acknowledge each addendum by signing and submitting the latest addendum with their response. However, signing the face of the solicitation as indicated above constitutes the vendor's acknowledgement of and agreement to be bound by the terms of all addenda issued.

Failure to specifically acknowledge addenda will not excuse the vendor from adhering to all changes to the requirements of the solicitation set forth therein nor provide justification for any pricing changes.

13.00 Method of Award

Best Value-Ranking Approach

KHRG shall conduct a comprehensive, fair, and impartial evaluation of all proposals. KHRG may reject any proposal that is incomplete or in which there are significant inconsistencies or inaccuracies. KHRG reserves the right to reject all proposals. KHRG intends to award a contract to the vendor, whose offer, conforming to the solicitation, is the most advantageous on the basis of “best value” for all products, services, and requirements contained here.

An evaluation committee, or designated individual, will evaluate the information provided by the vendor in response to the established measurable criteria contained in this solicitation.

Criteria	Maximum Points Possible
Price – The bidder with the lowest Price receives the maximum score. The bidder with the next lowest Price receives points by dividing the lowest Price by the next lowest price and multiplying that percentage by the available points. For example, 90 points is allocated to the lowest Price criteria for this procurement, bidder “A” bids \$3.00 as the lowest bidder and receives the maximum 90 points ($\$3.00 / \$3.00 = 1.00 \times 90 = 90$). Assume bidder “B” is the next lowest bidder at \$4.00, then “B” receives 67.5 points ($\$3.00 / \$4.00 = .75 \times 90 = 67.5$).	90 points
Delivery – The bidder shall clearly state the delivery time for this procurement. Delivery time must be specific and such phrases as, “as required”, “as soon as possible”, or “prompt” have no meaning and may result in a non-responsive bid. The bidder with the lowest amount of delivery days (working days) receives the maximum score. The bidder with the next lowest amount of delivery days receives points by dividing the lowest amount of delivery days by the next lowest amount of delivery days and multiplying that percentage by the available points. For example, 10 points is allocated to the lowest amount of delivery days criteria for this procurement, bidder “A” bids 10 working days as the lowest bidder and receives the maximum 10 points ($10 / 10 = 1.00 \times 10 = 10$). Assume bidder “B” is the next lowest bidder at 20 working days, then “B” receives 5 points ($10 / 20 = .5 \times 10 = 5$).	10 points
MAXIMUM POINTS POSSIBLE	100 points

The vendor agrees that when delivery is not made within the contracted due date, one percent (1%) per day shall be deducted from the vendor's invoice for each day the vendor fails to meet the contracted delivery date.

Each vendor is responsible for submitting all relevant, factual and correct information with their offer to enable the evaluator(s) to afford each vendor the maximum score based on the available data submitted by the Vendor.

A bidder shall submit one (1) response to a solicitation and shall not propose more than one (1) model/brand for each item listed in the solicitation, except for requested tier pricing. Multiple or alternate bids offering more than one (1) bid price in total or by line item shall be rejected.

Vendors responding with the minimum Best Value requirements in this solicitation shall not be credited with Best Value points. Vendors responding with greater than the minimum requirements shall receive Best Value points. Failure to provide adequate information will impact the evaluated points awarded to the vendor.

14.00 Tax Exempt Status

Do not include Federal Excise Tax, Kentucky Sales or Use Tax in prices quoted in response to this solicitation.

15.00 Schedule of IFB Activities

16.00 Basis of Price Revisions

PRICE ADJUSTMENTS: Unless otherwise specified, the prices established by the contract resulting from this solicitation shall remain firm for the contract period subject to the following:

- A. Price Increases: A price increase shall not occur during the first twelve (12) months of the contract. A vendor may request a price increase after twelve (12) months of the contract, which may be granted or denied by KHRG. Any such price increase shall be based on industry-wide price changes. The contract holder must request in writing a price increase at least thirty (30) days prior to the effective date, and shall provide firm proof that the price increase(s) is justified. KHRG may request additional information or justification. If the price increase is denied, the contract holder may withdraw from the contract without prejudice upon written notice and approval by KHRG. Provided, however, that the vendor must continue service, at the contract prices, until a new contract can be established (usually within sixty (60) days).
- B. Price Decreases: The contract price shall be reduced to reflect any industry-wide price decreases. The contract holder is required to furnish KHRG with notice of any price decreases as soon as such decreases are available.
- C. Extended Contract Periods: If the contract provides for an optional renewal period, a price adjustment may be granted at the time the contract is renewed, subject to price increase justification as required in Paragraph A "Price Increases" as stated above.

17.00 Vendor Terms and Conditions

Solicitation or quotation forms that include terms and conditions not in conformity with the terms and conditions of this solicitation or the Statutes of the Commonwealth of Kentucky may be deemed non-responsive.

KHRG shall not be bound by any part(s) of the bidder's response to this solicitation that contains information, options, conditions, terms, or prices neither requested nor required in the solicitation. In the event of any conflicts between the specifications, terms and conditions indicated by KHRG and those indicated by the contractor, those of KHRG take precedence. The contract supersedes all bids or other prior agreements, oral or written, and all other communications between the parties relating to this subject.

18.00 Post Contract Agreements

The resulting contract shall constitute the entire agreement between KHRG and awarded contractor. Unless contractually provided, **KHRG will not be required to enter into nor sign further agreements, leases, company orders or other documents to complete or initiate the terms of a contract resulting from this solicitation or offer.** Any such documents so obtained will be non-binding on KHRG and will be cause for breach of contract.

19.00 Equipment

Not Applicable

20.00 Quantity Basis of Contract – Estimated Quantities

Any and all quantities mentioned in this solicitation are purely estimates and are not to be implied nor inferred as guarantees. KHRG is obligated to buy only that quantity needed during the term of the contract. Requirements may exceed the quantities shown and the contractor will be required to furnish all requirements shown on Delivery Orders dated during the life of the contract.

21.00 Manuals and Distribution of Literature

Not Applicable

22.00 Vendor's Report

The vendor(s) may be asked to furnish KHRG a report showing volume which has been sold to KHRG each six (6) months of the contract period. This report may be the vendor's computer printout sheet or form. This shall apply to all items which are to become a part of this contract. This report must reference usage by brief description, product number or other format designated by KHRG.

23.00 FOB Basis of Shipment – Vendor Responsible

Quotations of unit prices on this solicitation shall be **F.O.B. Destination Freight Prepaid and Allowed**. The vendor shall be fully responsible for all shipments and freight charges involved to KHRG.

24.00 Cancellation Clause – 30 Days Notice

KHRG may cancel the contract established from this solicitation by giving written notice thirty (30) days prior to effective cancellation date. In the event such action is taken, the contract shall be null and void upon receipt of a Notification of Contract Cancellation from KHRG canceling the contract.

25.00 Exception to Required Use of Contract

The establishment of this contract is not intended to preclude the use of similar products when requested by KHRG. KHRG reserves the right to contract for large requirements by using a separate solicitation.

26.00 Service Performance

All services performed under this contract, if applicable, shall be in accordance with the terms and provisions of the contract. It will be KHRG's responsibility to ensure that such services rendered are performed and are acceptable.

The relationship between KHRG and the Contractor is that of client and independent contractor. No agent, employee, or servant of the contractor or any of its subcontractors shall be or shall be deemed to be an employee, agent, or servant of KHRG for any reason. The contractor will be solely and entirely responsible for its acts and the acts of its agents, employees, servants and subcontractors during the performance of this contract.

Major deviations of services performed will not be made without the written approval of KHRG. Problems that arise under any aspect of performance should first be resolved between the vendor and KHRG Point of Contact for day to day operations. Either party should refer in writing any such problems and/or disagreements that cannot be resolved to KHRG Legal Department for settlement.

27.00 Addition or Deletion of Items or Services

KHRG reserves the right to add new and similar items, with the consent of the vendor, to any contract awarded from this solicitation. KHRG will issue a contract Amendment or Modification to effect this change. Until such time as the vendor receives a contract Amendment or Modification, the vendor shall not accept Delivery Orders referencing such items or services.

28.00 Agreement between Parties

By submitting a bid, the bidder acknowledges and agrees to be bound by the terms and conditions of the solicitation.

The bidder agrees that a resulting contract is the complete and exclusive statement of the agreement between the parties, which supersedes all prior agreements, oral or written, and all other communications between the parties relating to the subject matter of this solicitation. It is further agreed between the parties, that any valid modification of contractual agreement must be formalized by issuance of a Contract Modification from KHRG.

Purchase or Sales Agreements, supplied by the bidder making an offer, in reply to the solicitation, will not be accepted. The only terms and conditions acceptable to KHRG are as outlined in the solicitation. Bids not conforming will be considered as non-responsive.

29.00 Governmental Restrictions

In the event any Governmental restrictions may be imposed which would necessitate alteration of the material, quality, workmanship, or performance of the items offered on this proposal prior to delivery, it shall be the responsibility of the successful bidder to notify KHRG in writing, indicating the specific regulation which requires such alterations. KHRG reserves the right to accept any such alterations, including any subsequent price adjustments, or to cancel the contract.

30.00 Payments

The vendor shall be paid, upon the submission of proper invoices to KHRG at the prices stipulated for the supplies delivered and accepted, or services rendered. Unless otherwise specified, payment will not be made for partial deliveries accepted. Payments will be made within thirty (30) working days after receipt of goods or a vendor's invoice.

31.00 Inspection

All supplies, equipment and services shall be subject to inspection or tests by KHRG prior to acceptance. In the event supplies, equipment or services are defective in material or workmanship or otherwise not in conformity with specified requirements, KHRG shall have the right to reject the items or services or require acceptable correction at the Vendor's expense.

32.00 Subcontracts

The contractor is permitted to make subcontract(s) with any other party for furnishing any of the work or services herein. The contractor shall be solely responsible for performance of the entire contract whether or not subcontractors are used. KHRG shall not be involved in the relationship between the prime contractor and the subcontractor. Any issues that arise as a result of this relationship shall be resolved by the prime contractor.

All references to the contractor shall be construed to encompass both the contractor and any subcontractors of the contractor.

33.00 Subcontracts Federal Tax Exempt Purchases by KHRG

Contracts Direct With Manufacturer: In the event a manufacturer bids direct and is awarded a contract, KHRG shall request the contractor to furnish evidence of registration with the U.S. Internal Revenue Service. This registration shall be in accordance with the "Temporary Rules, 1958 Excise Tax Act". After such registration, individual Excise Tax Exemption Certificates are not necessary on each individual order issued against the contract by KHRG. Therefore, quoted prices must be exclusive of Federal Excise Taxes.

Contract With Other Than Manufacturer: If successful bidder is other than the manufacturer, KHRG will furnish a Tax Exemption Certificate with each individual order issued against this contract. Therefore, quoted prices must be exclusive of Federal Excise Taxes.

34.00 EEO Requirements

The Equal Employment Opportunity Act of 1978 applies to KHRG projects with an estimated value exceeding \$500,000. The contractor shall comply with all terms and conditions of the Act.

35.00 Governing Law

This contract shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the Commonwealth of Kentucky. Any action brought against KHRG on the contract, including but not limited to actions either for breach of contract or for enforcement of the contract, shall be brought in Fayette Circuit Court, Fayette County, Kentucky.

36.00 Protest

KHRG's President and CEO, or his/her designee, shall have authority to determine protests and other controversies of actual or prospective offerors in connection with the solicitations or selection for award of a contract.

37.00 Access to Records

KHRG certifies that it is in compliance with the provisions of KRS 45A.695, "Access to contractor's books, documents, papers, records, or other evidence directly pertinent to the contract." The Contractor, as defined in KRS 45A.030, agrees that KHRG shall have access to any books, documents, papers, records, or other evidence, which are directly pertinent to this agreement for the purpose of financial audit or program review. The Contractor also recognizes that any books, documents, papers, records, or other evidence, received during a financial audit or program review shall be subject to the Kentucky Open Records Act, KRS 61.870 to 61.884. Records and other prequalification information confidentially disclosed as part of the bid process shall not be deemed as directly pertinent to the agreement and shall be exempt from disclosure as provided in KRS 61.878(1)(c).

38.00 Registration with the Secretary of State by a Foreign Entity

KHRG shall not award a contract to a person that is a foreign entity required by KRS 14A.9-010 to obtain a certificate of authority to transact business in the Commonwealth ("certificate") from the Secretary of State under KRS 14A.9-030. Therefore, foreign entities should submit a copy of their certificate with their solicitation response. If the foreign entity is not required to obtain a certificate as provided in KRS 14A.9-010, the foreign entity should identify the applicable exception in its solicitation response.

39.00 Accessibility

Vendor hereby warrants that the products or services to be provided under this contract comply with the accessibility requirements of section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended (29 U.S.C. § 794d), and its implementing regulations set forth at Title 36, Code of Federal Regulations, part 1194. 42.00 Discrimination
