On August 2, 2022, the KTDF Advisory Committee considered the following request from Churchill Downs regarding its KTDF purse structure for their upcoming 2022 September Meet.

Churchill Downs is proposing KTDF purses in the range of \$2.8 – \$3.8 million. These projections are based on their current KTDF earned balance of \$3.2 million at the end of July 2022, with an additional earning projection of \$2.4 million by the end of September with HHR wagering at Derby City Gaming LLC being the primary driver.

To encourage participation during the meet, Churchill Downs will pay out KTDF purses through last place to KTDF eligible horses.

This request is supported by the KyHBPA and the KTA-KTOB.

Churchill Downs has reviewed our purses and would like to card KTDF purses in the range of \$2.8 million to \$3.8 million for our upcoming September Meet. We have based the range on the following information:

- 1. At the end of July 2022, Churchill Downs is projecting an ending KTDF earned balance of \$3,268,889.
- 2. Our 2022 September Meet will consist of 14 racing days beginning Thursday, September 15th and ending Sunday, October 2nd. We are projecting additional earnings of \$2,410,094 by the end of September. The primary driver is the KTDF earned from pari-mutuel wagering from Derby City Gaming LLC ("Derby City") from the beginning of August 2022 through the end of the September Meet.
- 3. We anticipate that KTDF will be approximately 24.9% of total purses. Of the requested KTDF allotment, we anticipate the following payouts:
 - a. ALW, AOC, SMSW, MDN: approximately 60% of the KTDF allotment;
 - b. BCL, CLM, MCL, STR, WMC: approximately 18% of the KTDF allotment, and;
 - c. Stakes: approximately 22% of the KTDF allotment.
- 4. For September 2022, we are assuming a KTDF payout percentage of 86.5% with anticipated KTDF disbursements of \$3.3 million which is \$0.5 million higher than the \$2.8 million paid during the September 2021 Meet. In addition to previously listed drivers of growth, two more days of racing this year and the addition of KTDF on claiming races drives the increase.
- 5. To encourage participation during the September Meet, we are again planning to pay KTDF purses from first to last to all eligible horses.

THE KENTUCKY THOROUGHBRED DEVELOPMENT FUND (KTDF)

Given several years of robust business during the period beginning 2019 through June 2022, the state-of-the-art historical racing machines at nearby Derby City Gaming has generated \$38.8 million in KTDF for horsemen with Kentucky-sired Kentucky-breds to run for in designated stakes, handicap, allowance, non-claiming maiden races, and allowance optional claiming races with a claiming price of not less than twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) contested at Churchill Downs Racetrack. Starting in September 2022, Churchill Downs Racetrack will offer KTDF money on all claiming races.

Eligible races can be readily recognized in the stakes and condition books by the Kentucky Thoroughbred Development Fund seal, which will appear next to each race in the stakes and condition books.

In accordance with KRS 230.400(5) (d), it is mandatory for a horse to be registered prior to time of entry to be eligible to participate in the distribution of Kentucky Thoroughbred Development Fund monies. Registration is only complete once the application is approved and payment has been received.

All horses of racing age that are both Kentucky-bred and sired by a Kentucky stallion which stood in Kentucky the entire breeding season the year the horse was conceived are eligible to be registered. Owners of horses of racing age are responsible for registering their horses. Stallion owners are responsible for registering their stallions.

On August 2, 2022, the KTDF Advisory Committee considered the following request from Keeneland regarding its KTDF purse structure for their upcoming 2022 Fall Meet.

Keeneland initially proposed KTDF purses for \$4,962,200. However, after much discussion during the meeting it was advised that Keeneland incorporate additional KTDF funding in support of their eight Breeders' Cup undercard races. An amendment reflecting that request was submitted August 5, 2022, increasing their proposed KTDF purses by \$260,000 for a total of \$5,222,200 in KTDF purses. These projections are based on projected daily earnings of \$13,833 per day, their current KTDF earned balance of \$1.2 million, KRM/OG earnings of \$2.6 million and \$1 million transferred from Kentucky Downs.

To encourage participation during the meet, Keeneland will pay out KTDF purses through last place to KTDF eligible horses.

Keeneland has reviewed our KTDF data and would like to offer approximately \$4,962,200 in KTDF money for our upcoming Fall meet.

- We are projecting approximate daily earnings of \$13,833 per day, an increase over Fall 2021;
- 2. We have a surplus of \$1,207,877 following the Spring 2022 race meeting;
- 3. We are assuming a payout percentage of approximately 87% of the amount carded;
- 4. We are projecting total KRM and OG earnings of approximately \$2,662,000 plus a KTDF transfer of \$1,000,000;
- 5. We anticipate that KTDF purses will comprise approximately 23.9% of total purses.
 - a. MSW, ALW, AOC: \$2,927,100 (59.0% of the KTDF allotment)
 - b. CL, MCL, SA: \$735,100 (14.8% of the KTDF allotment)
 - c. Stakes: \$1,300,000 (26.2% of the KTDF allotment)
 - i. \$100,000 allocated to Grade 1 stakes
 - ii. \$50,000 allocated to all other stakes

We remain committed to offering competitive purses while also prudently allocating our KTDF funds available. To that end we will increase our KTDF purse amounts and add KTDF funds to claiming, maiden claiming, and starter allowance races for Fall 2022 with the goal of gradually reducing our KTDF surplus over several meets and finding the right balance for our purse levels.

Keeneland will continue to pay out KTDF funds through last place. A table containing the payout percentage by field size is attached. In the event there is a dead heat for finish positions 1 thru 5, the KTDF percentage payout for each position will be aggregated and paid equally to each horse included in the dead heat. If a non-KTDF eligible horse is involved in a dead heat, those funds will revert to the fund.

We will evaluate the earnings and payout percentages several days into our race meet and may need to make adjustments if our actual earnings and payout percentages are significantly different from our assumptions.
